WAGE INCREASE FOR STUDENT TEACHERS

Allowances paid to New South Wales Teachers College students will be increased in the 1967-68 budget, the Deputy Premier and Minister for Education and Science, Mr. C. B. Carter, said recently.

He said the amount to be increased will be determined after the Premier's Conference in June.

Mr. Carter said today that a review of allowances to Teachers College students was at present being carried out, but a report was not yet available.

At present allowances range from \$500 to about \$1,500.

The allowances vary according to the student's age, marital status, year of study and whether the student is living at home or away from home.

Old Age and Invalid Pensioners—

1. A rebate of the TOTAL amount of municipal rates payable on premises OWNED AND OCCUPIED by the applicant will be granted provided such residence or the land is a "single dwelling house" used or adapted for use solely for habitation by not more than one (1) family and does not include a flat—the applicant to be a ratepayer or resident of the Municipality for a period of five (5) years prior to 1st January, 1967.
2. The applicant has no other source of income other than the pension and that no other persons in receipt of any income are residing on the property.

(NOTE—Where other persons in receipt of any income are residing on the property and the applicant can prove that the payment of rates levied would cause hardship Council will give consideration to the postponement of payment of such rates.)

Civilian and War Widow Pensioners—

1. A rebate of the TOTAL amount of municipal rates payable on premises OWNED AND OCCUPIED by the applicant will be granted provided that the applicant has been a ratepayer or resident of the Municipality for a period of five (5) years prior to 1st January, 1967.
2. That the applicant has no other source of income other than the pension and that no other persons in receipt of any income are residing on the property.

(NOTE—Where other persons in receipt of any income are residing on the property and the applicant can prove that the payment of rates levied would cause hardship Council will give consideration to the postponement of payment of such rates.)

Repatriation Service Pensions and Totally and Permanently Incapacitated Pensioners—

A rebate of 66 2/3% of the amount of rates payable will be granted subject to the same conditions as those applicable to Civilian and War Widow Pensioners.

SPECIAL ATTENTION IS DRAWN TO THE FOLLOWING—

PROPERTY VALUATIONS AFFECTED BY TOWN PLANNING SCHEMES. Section 160C, Local Government Act, 1919, as amended.

Where part of the Unimproved Capital Value of any parcel of land upon which is erected a "single dwelling house" (used or adapted for use solely for habitation by not more than one (1) family and does not include a flat) is attributable to the fact that such parcel is within a zone or reservation in which land may be used for the purposes of industry, commerce or the erection of residential flat buildings, the rateable person in respect of such land may apply to Council for relief from payment of part of the rates levied on the land.

MOTORING HINTS

Tests have shown that, in a normal person, fatigue begins to show after about 45 minutes of continuous driving at normal speed and under ordinary traffic conditions. To keep complete alertness, it is wise to reduce the effects of fatigue by making a very brief stop and taking a short walk, eating sweets, which cause the driver's blood sugar to rise, or at least stretching in the seat and adjusting the sitting position. Inattention is a prominent cause of road accidents and, in many cases, is due to the driver being tired.

N.R.M.A. NOTES

Six Basic Checks For Winter

Falling leaves and falling temperatures mean that the bite of winter will not only be felt by motorists themselves, but by their vehicles as well.

The N.R.M.A. engineers say that motorists should prepare their cars now for winter to prevent any unnecessary troubles which may be caused by cold weather.

They say six basic checks should keep the car in top trim and assure easy starting on the frosty mornings to come. These are:

1. Check with the local service station to see that the right grade of oil is being used for winter conditions.
 2. Check the operation of the choke, manual or automatic.
 3. Check the battery any battery leads.
 4. Check the car's points, plugs and condenser.
 5. Pressure test the car's cooling system.
 6. Check the thermostat, heater and demister.
- Also, if you are living in or driving to an area where freezing is a problem, make sure anti-freeze is added to the radiator. Some cars have a sealed cooling system

to which anti-freeze is already added; others have a sealed system which requires special attention when adding anti-freeze to ensure that the cooling system is completely refilled. Motorists are advised to check with their dealer upon correct procedures.

All cars, regardless of age or mileage, need checking and preparation for easy winter starting.
