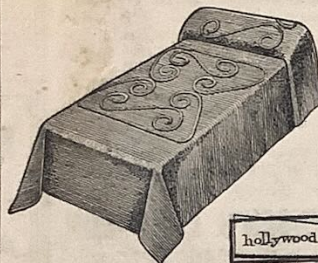

Better Ferry Service sought by M.L.A.

A move was made in State Parliament last week by the Member for Balmain, Mr. Roger Degen, for improvements to the ferry service to the Balmain area.

Mr. Degen received an assurance from the Minister for Transport, Mr. Morris, that investigations would be made into the possibility of providing a better service. Mr. Degen said the Government had decided to spend large sums of money on improvements

to ferry services serving the north side of the harbour.

It had a responsibility to ensure that the people of Balmain received the same consideration.

Mr. Degen said that the Government's first move should be directed towards providing a more frequent service during peak hours.

He was convinced that such a service would be well patronised and could then be extended to off-peak hours.

Electrical Fatalities During 1967

There were 20 deaths from electric shock during 1967. This was 14 fewer than in 1966, and it was the lowest number in any year since 1943, when there were also 20 deaths.

These figures were released by Mr. F. H. Campbell, Chairman of The Electricity Authority of New South Wales.

Mr. Campbell added that while the drop in the number of electrical fatalities in 1967 was welcome, the indications were that the low figure would not be maintained in 1968. There had already been ten deaths from electric shock since the commencement of the present year.

Mr. Campbell commented that the greatest single cause of electrical fatalities was defective conditions in flexible cords, and plugs and

adaptors used with appliances. Nine of the fatalities in 1967 and five of those which had already occurred in 1968 were from this cause.

The high proportion of deaths associated with flexible cords and cord fittings must be taken as a firm reminder that cords, plugs and adaptors, if damaged or deteriorated, or if incorrectly wired up, could render unsafe what were otherwise perfectly safe electrical appliances. The hazards which they created were particularly serious in the case of electric drills or other such tools normally used while standing on the ground. It was significant that in the case of four of the ten fatalities so far this year the shock was received from a hand-held electric drill or sander because of a defective condition in the flexible cord or a cord fitting.

Mr. Campbell emphasised that a regular check should be made. If there was any doubt as to the safety of any flexible cord or its associated plug or other fitting, the services of a qualified electrical tradesman should be sought.

Askin, who is Ministerial head of the Maritime Services Board. Mr. Degen's question concerned the development of land on the Balmain foreshore owned by the Board. He said three actions of the Board were causing grave concern to local residents. They were: The leasing of land at the corner of Vincent and Stephen Streets to a company that had applied for permission to erect a liquid chemical storage depot.

A proposal to erect an incinerator at Rozelle Bay for the disposal of ships' garbage. The carting of sludge dredged from the Mort Bay terminal through the streets of Balmain.

Mr. Degen said the Board's actions were causing health and other hazards to local residents. He asked Mr. Askin to instruct the Board to confer immediately with Leichhardt Council to overcome the problems. Mr. Askin said he would have inquiries made into the matters raised by Mr. Degen and inform him of the results at a later date.
