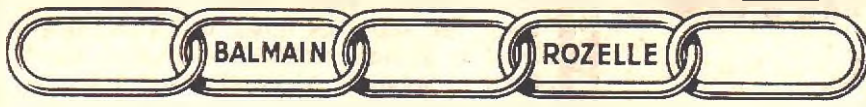

Balmain's Deputy Matron Retires

It was an important occasion for the staff of Balmain and District Hospital when their Deputy Matron, Miss Valerie Davenport, was given a farewell party on her retirement. About 300 attended the party, held at the hospital, to wish her happiness.

Arranged by the nursing staff, the party was attended by present and former nursing and medical staffs, auxiliaries, Board members and friends, and speakers stressed her reliability and devotion to duty.

She was presented with a gold watch and a cheque.

In reply she thanked them for the kind things said of her, and spoke of her very happy memories of her association with the hospital.

Unlike most nurses, Miss Davenport had all her experience at the one hospital. She commenced as a trainee general nurse at Balmain in December, 1924, became theatre sister in 1930, senior sister in 1950, and deputy

matron in August, 1960.

It was quite a feather in her cap that she became a deputy matron of a major hospital with a single certificate. This, according to the matron, Miss J. MacLaren, would be a very rare occurrence today.

Miss Davenport would have started her training on a wage of 147 a week. She has seen Balmain Hospital grow from a 60-bed to a 230-bed institution.

Miss Davenport said on her retirement that tremendous changes had taken place in nursing technique during her 43 1/2 years' experience, but personal concern for a patient's welfare still counted the most.

New drugs and modern surgery techniques had not altered the fact that tender, loving care was still the main ingredient in nursing a patient back to health.

"These days a higher standard of education is needed for a girl to assimilate current nursing procedures," she said, "but physically the job is less exhausting than it used to be."

"Domestic chores have been reduced to a minimum and the advent of drugs such as penicillin has cut the convalescent time of patients in hospital so that a nurse really is concerned with nursing those seriously ill and in need of care and know-how."

FUTURE HOPE IN STORAGE TANKS FIGHT?

Balmain residents who have so strongly fought against the move to build underground chemical storage tanks near the corner of Stephen and Vincents Streets, will have to lick their wounds and wait until 1980 for the next round.

Leichhardt Council last week rejected their complaints, and voted final approval of the plans of Terminals Pty. Ltd. to construct the tanks in this area.

Residents have heatedly opposed the plan, because the location is near two schools, a hospital and a number of homes. They fought to have the tanks placed elsewhere in view of the explosive nature of the chemicals to be stored in them.

Stipulations

Council, however, has laid down certain stipulations in regard to the construction, including direct communication between the pipe line and the fire station.

Council considers also that the right of the company to carry on its enterprise should be reviewed in 1980, when application for permission to continue it would be necessary. Council would then reconsider its attitude.

The feeling of last week's meeting was that council approval should be terminated in 1980.

Observers, however, point out that should the council at that time refuse the application to continue, the applicants would, if they so desired, have access to the Land and Valuations Court, which would either confirm or quash the council's objections.

The observers point out that in only one instance—in the case of a haulier's depot—has an industry in the Balmain area been terminated,

and this was done by the Minister for Local Government.

Right Time

Once an industry has been permitted to operate, they say, it is very difficult to terminate it, so that generally council approval means that it is there for good: proving the point made by objectors that the time to fight on the ground of undesirability is before the matter approaches finality.

Last week's motion was carried on the voices. Two former Labor aldermen, N. Origglass and J. Wyner, who crossed the floor of the council chamber last December to vote against the earlier motion on the installation of the tanks, asked that it be noted

that they voted against the motion.

Public Anger

Readers will remember the uproar at previous meetings of the council when the proposal to construct the tanks was debated, especially at the February 6 meeting when about 300 angry residents packed the public gallery, and the December 13 meeting when police were called in to control the situation after 150 people in the public gallery forced a temporary closure of the meeting.

Last week only about 20 people attended the meeting, and kept quiet until the vote was taken. Then some of them shouted "God save Balmain" and called aldermen "Judases".

PARKING FOR OUR SHOPPERS

Businessmen in the Leichhardt shopping centre have repeatedly requested the Council to make parking space available. Shoppers demand parking areas. If they are not provided, the shoppers will travel to distant places to get it.

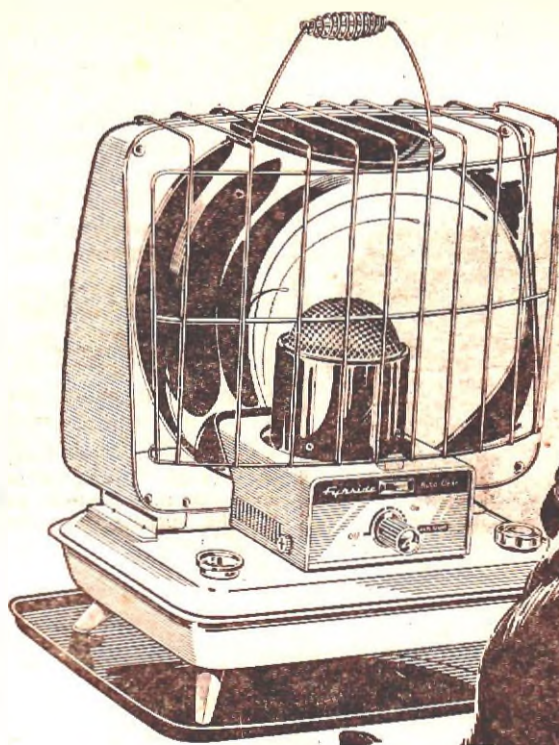

A pedestrian underpass is to be built at the Rozelle end of Iron Cove Bridge.

The State Member for Balmain, Mr. R. Degen, has been advised of the decision by the Minister for Transport, Mr. Morris.

The underpass will be necessary when new traffic arrangements for the bridge come into operation, following provision for an additional traffic lane on the bridge.

Mr. Degen has also made representations to the Minister for provision of a pedestrian crossing at the intersection of Darling and Nicholson

Streets, Balmain.

His action followed requests by the Parents and Citizens' Association of Nicholson Street Public School, in view of many near-accidents to children and the classification of School Street as a one-way thoroughfare.

Some motorists appear to be ignorant of the meaning of the amber traffic light, according to the N.R.M.A.

When the amber light appears, you must stop, unless you have crossed the stop line or are so close to it that you cannot reasonably stop before reaching the lights.

What Traffic Lights Mean

The onus generally will be on you to show you were unable to stop in time.

The N.R.M.A. explains the meaning of each light, in view of the use of the relatively new system of turning arrows.

Red: Don't drive beyond the stop line. If

there's no stop line, don't enter the intersection.

Amber: A change to red is imminent, and it should be regarded as a stop signal. The amber arrow has the same meaning for turning traffic.

Green: You may go straight through, or turn

right or left into a street showing a red circle, provided the action is safe.

Green Arrow: You may turn in the direction of the arrow, even though a red circle may also be showing.

Red Arrow: You may not turn in the direction of the arrow, even though a green circle may also be showing.

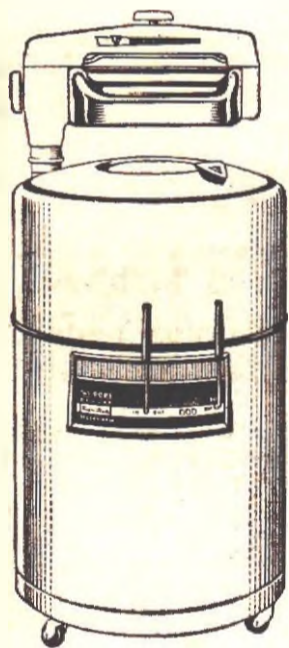

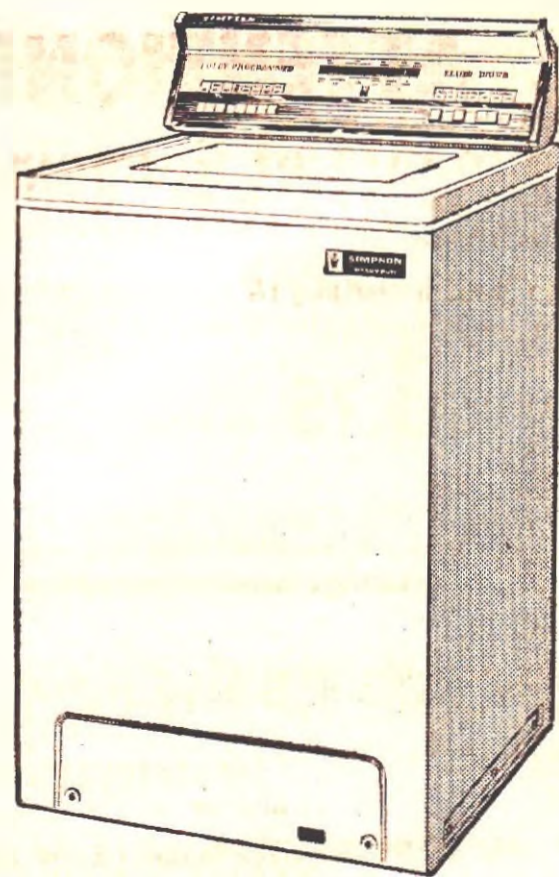

SNOWY TOUR

Visitors to the Snowy Mountains between May and November should reserve accommodation well in advance.

During those months cars visiting the area should carry wheel chains.

Have an anti-freeze solution added to your car radiator for the trip; alternatively, drain radiator and engine block overnight.

Latest road conditions should be sought before entering the Snowy area—from the Snowy Mountains Authority at Cooma North or Khancoban, or from the Cooma Visitors' Centre.

The N.R.M.A. has available for members' information on snowfield accommodation, parking and tours.

WINTER ON THE ROAD

People who drive with their car windows shut against cold draughts risk asphyxiation by carbon monoxide, says the N.R.M.A.

In addition a befogged atmosphere causes drowsiness, with consequent reduction in driver concentration.

The Association's safety experts draw attention to the 50 deaths and 784 cases of injury on N.S.W. roads last year as a result of "Driver asleep or drowsy".

Carelessness in not refitting missing plastic or rubber blanking plugs in drain and constructional jig holes on a car body

encourages the entry of vagrant exhaust gas, along with dust and water.

Badly fitting doors and boot lids also can be a source of entry of exhaust gas.

Medical authorities say that even small doses of carbon monoxide can be lethal.

PRECAUTIONS

The precautions are simple, but also simple to overlook:

Always keep a window partly open to draw out stale air and promote circulation.

Check flange gaskets, exhaust muffler and pipe joints for a gas-tight fitting, and make sure tail pipes are clear of the body and bumper bar.

Where a scuttle vent is provided, by opening the vent and lowering a window or two for even half an inch or so it is possible to keep a pleasant and safe current of air circulating throughout the car.

And for cars equipped with heating systems: few of these work properly unless a window is partly open to give an air-extractor effect.

TO QUEENSLAND

North Queensland is a target for many motor-ing tourists from N.S.W. in winter. Two N.R.M.A. warnings:

When travelling on Bruce Highway in Queensland, watch for train crossings and trucks with wide, overhanging loads, as this is the cane-cutting season.

Windscreen breakages are a constant risk on this highway. Slow down for approaching vehicles or when overtaken.
