

ON HOLIDAY

Recently he spent a holiday in New Zealand. He travelled by air, and on arrival there found that a relative had no accommodation for him. The Salvation Army came to his rescue, and that holiday proved one of the best this man has

ever known.

Barry Hourn works full-time for the Wheel-chair and Disabled Association, and is now a taxpaver and a socially contributing citizen.
