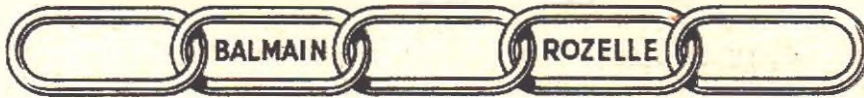

# PLANS "AFFECT LIVING"

The measure of interference with the comfort of Balmain-Rozelle residents created by proposals to extend industrial activities was the subject of keen debate at last week's meeting of Leichhardt Council.

Some critics declare that the moves will seriously affect living conditions in the area.

Two plans before Council were a new proposal by the Australian National Line to use considerably more land in the Mort Bay area for extension of existing activities, and the much-attacked plan of Terminals Pty. Ltd. to erect underground chemical storage tanks near the corner of Stephen and Vincent Streets.

## Containers

The A.N.L. proposal was in the form of advice that it had acquired further land for its activities, including provision of a second berth at its Tasmanian ferry terminal.

The land involved had been the subject of an appeal by Associated Steamships Pty. Ltd. to the State Planning Authority against Leichhardt Council's decision not to permit construction of a container handling complex.

Apparently the container plan has now lapsed, and has been replaced by the A.N.L. plan to extend its roll-on-roll-off ferry activities.

Aldermen representing Balmain spoke strongly against the new plan,

declaring that it, too, would seriously affect residents' comfort. Some people were already complaining of interference with their sleep by the noise of traffic generated by the terminal.

One point made was that the streets in the district were not wide enough to cope with extra traffic, which would create much congestion.

Upshot of the debate was a decision to meet A.N.L. representatives to discuss the proposal, at a special Works Committee meeting to be held in camera last night (Tuesday).

## Those Tanks

The second plan which has created uproar among Balmain residents and representative aldermen — to build chemical storage tanks — finally received Council's approval at this meeting.

Council decided to affix its seal to the agreement with Terminals Pty. Ltd.

Balmain aldermen expressed concern that Council had relaxed its conditions regarding distance of the tanks from existing buildings (in-

cluding houses)—reducing this from 100 ft. to 50 ft.

Ald. I. Wyner said that even 100 ft. would have been unsatisfactory. To reduce it to 50 ft. would only increase the danger. Also he read the agreement as permitting the company to remain at Balmain after 1980. That was not the spirit of the agreement, Council having decided that activities should be transferred from Balmain then.

## "Serious"

Fears that construction of an additional Mort Bay terminal would have a serious effect on living conditions in the district have been expressed to "The Link" by several residents and former residents.

A former resident, Mrs. Leigh Roussos, considers that the move would seriously affect Balmain as a residential area.

"Nobody in his right senses," she said, "could imagine that traffic from such a complex would not affect residents. The scheme must result in wholesale resumptions."

# GIRLS' SCHOOL PROBLEMS

We pass on an appeal directed specially to mothers of girls attending Riverside Girls' High School, Gladesville: The school's "Mothers' Club" is feeling the strain, and wants help in providing amenities for pupils, who are seriously handicapped for lack of them.

Riverside caters for girls living mostly in Balmain, Rozelle, Five Dock, Drummoyne, with a few attending from Gladesville and Ryde.

Most high schools boast of a Parents and Citizens' Association as well as a Ladies' Auxiliary to provide amenities for pupils outside the usual provisions by the educational authorities, but Riverside's only organisation for fund-raising is the Mothers' Club.

Its officers include Mrs. D. Kime, president; Mrs. E. Potts, secretary; Mrs. V. Dymond, treasurer; and Mrs. V. J. Drayton, publicity officer.

Mrs. Drayton told "The Link" that they were in urgent need of more active support of the club's meetings and functions.

For some time now there had been an average attendance of only 19 or 20 mothers. Some of these had been consistent workers for many years, but no longer had daughters at the school.

"It doesn't seem fair that we should have to

depend on these mothers to help so much, considering the school enrolment exceeds 900," said Mrs. Drayton.

"We appreciate the fact that our society today makes severe demands on our income. However, the Education Department does not—and cannot—supply the complete needs for education.

"We try to give the students at Riverside facilities comparable with those available at other schools, hence there is a constant need for continued support.

"Do you know we have no assembly hall, no lighting or heating in some of the classrooms? The canteen is the original one—planned to cater for 300 students; it now has to do duty for 900.

"We repeatedly bring these needs to the attention of the Education Department, but always receive the same answer: we shall have to wait.

"Our piano—serving the gymnasium, choir, etc.—will need replacing very shortly. We

hope it will last out the year.

"Since it is a Mothers' Club, we meet in the day time. We recognise, of course, that a large percentage of mothers are working. Those who are not could come along and help us. They may have some suggestions, too, which could be very valuable.

"Riverside is a beautiful school, situated in a very enviable position, and we want to make it one of the best schools."

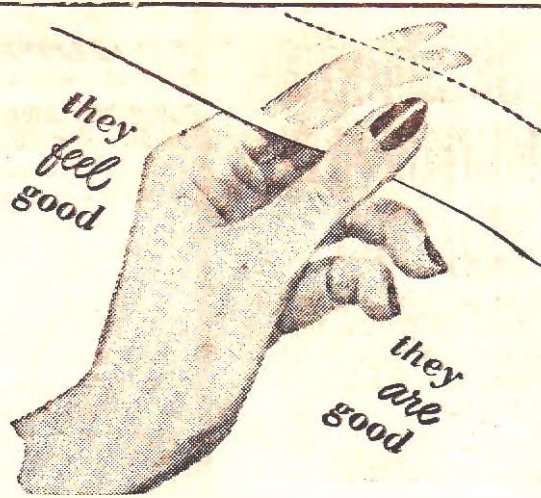

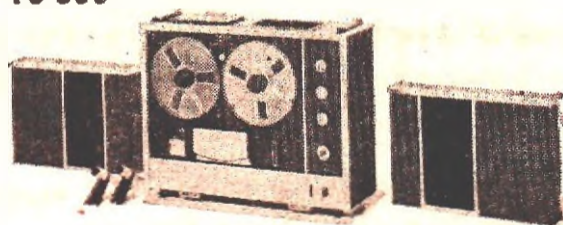

The team our selectors sent on to the Cricket Ground before 24,000 spectators had no penetration, defence or any semblance of organisation. Apart from Keith Outten, Peter Jones and Peter Provan, the team had no idea of the fundamentals of the game.

Loose tackling around the rucks allowed Souths' Ivan Jones to dictate play, and he was instrumental in each of their four tries. It was incredible the way he was allowed to run and run and pass when he felt like it.

Dennis Pittard was also given far too much latitude and was a constant threat to Balmain.

The less said about our forwards the better. Attacking moves from them were non-existent, as was defence. Against Souths' forwards you need someone who can give a bit back if need be, but our forwards had no idea how to retaliate and were a complete lost cause.

## Reserve

Harold Browne made a successful return to the game in reserve grade, and later first grade as a reserve, following a severe injury to his shoulder. It was good to see him run and tackle hard with no apparent discomfort. It's to be hoped he can quickly hit his top and regain a first grade berth, as his penetration is sorely needed.

If there is any possible excuse it could be that Balmain were badly

beaten for the ball—and let's face it, it's not easy chasing it all day. I think this may have had something to do with some of the less experienced players appearing as though they were on a training run. Some of these just couldn't—or wouldn't—tackle, and until they learn this phase of the game I hope they don't appear in first grade again.

I still think Balmain will make the semis. However, they'll need to improve enormously on Saturday's game and make every post a winner. Thanks to Bob Boland's boys beating

Canterbury, Balmain's task is made just that little bit easier.

## Award

The Bennetts' of Balmain Best and Fairest award wasn't hard to pick. It went to Keith Outten, with 2 points going to Keith Barnes and one to Peter Jones.

Reserves scraped through 6-2. They will also need to improve to maintain their place in the premiership ladder.

Third grade continued their winning way with a very impressive win, consolidating their position at the top of the ladder. P. O'Brien was judged the Best and Fairest, with 2 points to M. Ross and 1 to L. Anderson.

Recently he spent a holiday in New Zealand. He travelled by air, and on arrival there found that a relative had no accommodation for him. The Salvation Army came to his rescue, and that holiday proved one of the best this man has ever known.
