

Our pictures, by courtesy of The Balmain Association, show three of these spots. TOP: The north-west end of Cove Street.


CENTRE: Northeast end of Ballast Point Road.

This is a question which vitally affects the future expansion and beautification of this suburb, and it also vitally affects the value of your property.




