## Grassy Streets

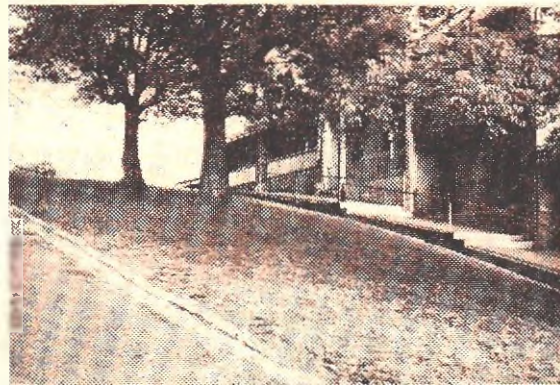
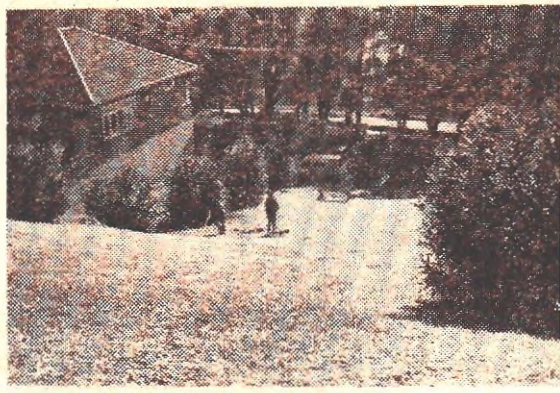
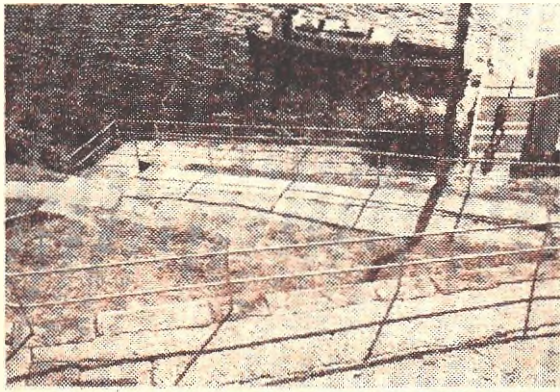

# EFFECT OF ELECTORAL PROPOSALS

**Balmain and Rozelle residents are closely involved in the plans for a sweeping re-distribution of Federal Parliamentary seats throughout Australia, announced last week by the Electoral Commissioners.**

The existing seat of Dalley, in which Balmain and Rozelle are situated, will be abolished, and the present sub-divisions of Balmain, Balmain East and Rozelle will be included in the division of West Sydney, which will be re-named "Sydney".

Two other neighbouring seats — East Sydney and Watson — are also to be abolished.

Dalley is now represented by Mr. W. P. O'Connor, West Sydney by Mr. D. Minogue, East Sydney by Mr. L. T. Devine, and Watson by Mr. J. F. Cope — all Labor men.

The new electorate of Sydney, as well as taking in over 23,000 electors from the present West Sydney electorate, will take in also 13,379 from Dalley (comprising the three Balmain-Rozelle sub-divisions), 13,203 from Watson, and 9,590 from East Sydney.

### Enrolment

The new Sydney electorate will, under the proposal, have an enrolment of 59,967, compared with West Sydney's present enrolment of 29,243.

It gains Balmain (4,462), East Balmain (4,854) and Rozelle (4,063), now in the seat of Dalley (to be abolished).

Other new sub-divisions of Sydney will be: Paddington West, St. Vincent's and Surry Hills (from the abolished seat of East Sydney); Alexandria, part of Mascot, Redfern, Rosebery, part of St. Peters and Waterloo (from the abolished seat of Watson).

Mr. O'Connor, Member for Dalley, told "The Link" that he would be

following his political fortunes in the area which now constituted Dalley. He would be standing for Labor pre-selection either for the Sydney seat or for the adjoining electorate of Grayndler. He would study the situation before making up his mind.

He added that the attitude of the Labor Party to the redistribution plans as they affected N.S.W. would be determined at a meeting of Parliamentarians and Party officers in Sydney next Friday, and an official announcement would then be made.

He said the effect of the proposed redistribution had been to divide Dalley into two sections. One, representing about 38 per cent, would go into the new seat of Sydney, and the remaining 62 per cent would go into Grayndler.

The Member for Watson, Mr. Cope, is reported as saying that he would seek Party pre-selection for Sydney, because 13,203 of his constituents had been transferred there.

Political observers believe that Mr. Devine, Member for East Sydney, may also seek pre-selection on the same basis, although they point out that Mr. Minogue, Labor M.P. for West Sydney, could well claim to be the sitting member for "Sydney", since the Commissioners described Sydney as a renaming of the existing electorate of West Sydney.

The final boundaries of electorates throughout Australia as affected by the redistribution proposals will be subject to public appeal for the next 30 days. They will have to pass through both Houses of Parlia-

ment during the Budget sittings commencing August 13 if an election is to be held on the new boundaries this year.

### Losses

In making the redistribution, the Electoral Commissioners had to take account of substantial losses of enrolments in some seats and substantial increases in others.

They said that since 1955, date of the last redistribution, enrolment in many inner suburbs of Sydney had fallen appreciably, and enrolments in many outer suburbs had increased rapidly.

"The Link" trusts that when candidates are finally selected for the next election campaign, those fighting to represent the Balmain-Rozelle region — whether it be in the present seat of Dalley or (if the redistribution plans go through) in the enlarged and renamed seat of Sydney — will keep in mind the special claims of this region for a "roads and bridges" approach of the old school.

This area has special problems, calling for sympathetic individual treatment outside Party politics.

This is a question which vitally affects the future expansion and beautification of this suburb, and it also vitally affects the value of your property.

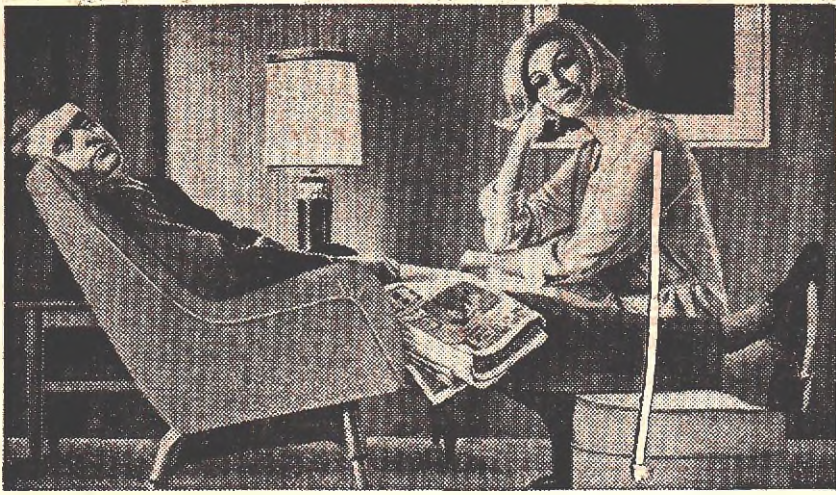

## What Is A "Sea Scout"?

What is "sea scouting"? Who are the Sea Scouts? First Leichhardt Scouts Sea Scouts' sub-committee has learnt with surprise that the general public is unaware of the connection with sea scouting of the Boy Scout Movement.

Sea Scouting is part of the Boy Scout Movement, created to build tomorrow's citizens by engaging in a worthwhile activity in company with his fellows. Originator of Scout-

ing, Baden Powell, put it this way:

"The idea behind sea scouting is to sound the call of the sea in the ears of our boys in cities and seaports and to give them an elementary training which will be useful, whether in starting them on a seaman's career or in making them handy men for any branch of life."

### Instruction

Sea Scouts are Boy Scouts with a leaning towards aquatic activities, who, in addition to the normal Scout training, desire instruction in boat management, single handed and as a crew;

steering and elementary navigation by chart or leading marks; a general knowledge of compass, stars and tides; knotting and splicing; throwing a line, swimming, lifesaving and ability to climb a rope or spar.

Membership is open to all boys aged 11 to 18, after which they can continue as Rovers.

# Attracting Home Building

Some of the problems facing extension of residential re-development in the Balmain-Rozelle area have been outlined to "The Link" by a well-known real estate agent, Mr. B. A. Shaw.

Mr. Shaw, of the Balmain firm of Jack Zuber, Shaw & Co., said he was interested to read our front page article concerning the problems of residential as opposed to industrial development at Balmain.

"I feel," he said, "that you are taking an unduly pessimistic view of the current trends when you point to possible expansion of the activities of the Australian National Shipping Line and the Maritime Services Board as likely to lead to higher land values."

"The activities you mention are Government or semi-governmental activities, and in themselves are unlikely to lead to a greater demand from private industry for sites in this area. In fact, the trend seems to be in the other direction."

## Economics

Mr. Shaw said there was strong evidence to suggest that private industrial undertakings were no longer interested in paying the high prices for land on or near

the water unless it was absolutely essential that they have access to water transport.

Economics seemed to be forcing industry out into the western areas beyond Parramatta, where the land was flat and comparatively cheap, and near rail transport.

"I am sure the local Council is aware of these trends," he added, "and would encourage developers and support applications for re-zoning of suitable sites."

"However, any re-zoning proposals from industrial to residential would probably be opposed on principle by the Department of Industrial Development, and this is where the real problem lies."

"There is an acute shortage of industrial land in Sydney, and that department is reluctant to sanction the change of zoning from industrial unless the application is supported by the very strongest evidence that the land is absolutely unsuited for continued use by industry."

"This inevitably leads to lengthy delays in having a piece of land re-zoned to residential, and developers are not prepared to go to the trouble involved."

Mr. Shaw added that those areas where there was a minimum of zoning problems and where they received active encouragement from the local Council.

The sloping sites in many parts of Balmain were particularly suitable for economic low rise residential flat development, and once a formula had been devised to enable land to be re-zoned without undue delay there would be a marked increase in the number of flat and unit buildings being erected.

## "Tradition"

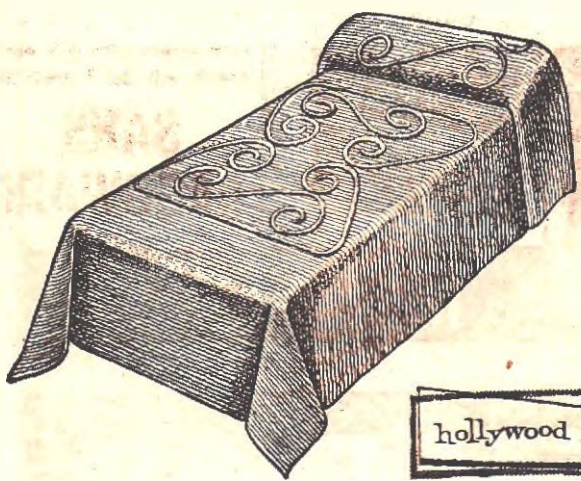
"The Link" referred Mr. Shaw's comments on the subject of zoning to the Department of Industrial Development, whose spokesman gave the Department's attitude to the subject.

He said the Department had examined the Leichhardt Planning Scheme and had asked the Council to consider retention of certain land on the waterfront for industrial use. The land in question was traditionally industrial.

It should not be forgotten, he said, that there were many people living in the area who were employed in the waterfront industries, and it was in their interests that portion of the area be retained for industrial use.

He disagreed, however, with the contention that his Department had power to prevent re-zoning. It had no statutory power in that respect, the authority for re-zoning resting with the State Planning Authority.

However, his Department considered there was a serious shortage of waterfront land suitable for industry in N.S.W. and its duty was to draw attention to that fact, especially in regard to areas which were traditionally industrial and which if felt should be preserved as such.

## YOUR OPINIONS

### Balmain Association

"Column 9" of July 17 was generous in its praise of this Association's report on the Town Plan, but rather curiously goes on to suggest that we have not put forward any positive proposals for redevelopment of our suburb.

This suggestion seems to underestimate the importance of the Plan itself for the future of our community. If our suggestions were to be incorporated into the final version of the Plan, both private and public capital would be encouraged to participate in a good deal of needed residential redevelopment, in such a way as not to threaten the overall character of Balmain, which must, of course, be preserved.

The Association 18 months ago prepared a report which set out schemes for redevelopment of two crucial sites — Mort's Dock and Dickson Primer — in such ways that the residential character of the suburb would be enhanced rather than threatened.

It is hard to see how we could move directly into the field of redevelopment ourselves, for our income from subscriptions (\$1 per year) and fund-raising functions is spent largely on restoring the Watch House.

This building will, however, be an asset for large numbers of the Balmain community, as the activities to be conducted there will be of interest to many who are not Association members.

Your columnist also urges us "to make the people conscious of those who intend to stand for Council". We have already engaged in activities of that kind, having provided a platform for candidates for the 1965 municipal elections, and the State elections earlier this year. We intend to do this again when the campaign gets under way for the December municipal elections.

As for the fostering of civic pride, which your columnist so rightly stresses, we have not been idle, engaging in such activities as the recent highly successful "Balmain in Focus" photographic competition and

exhibition, continuous research into our community's history, and the relaying of suggestions for district improvements from our members to aldermen and parliamentary representatives. In addition, we have helped to make Balmain known to the general public by assisting such bodies as the National Trust and R.A.H.S. to arrange tours of the suburb.

Much more requires to be done. We are always in need of new members who may have new ideas. Readers who share your concern for the future of our suburb will be most welcome at our annual general meeting, to be held in Balmain Town Hall on Thursday, August 8, at 8 p.m.

# VICIOUS FOOTBALL

Following a very hard-fought and sometimes vicious game on the Lidcombe "Dustbowl", Balmain's Tigers advanced a further two points towards the semi's with a well-earned 12-7 victory against Wests.

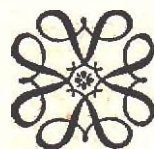
