

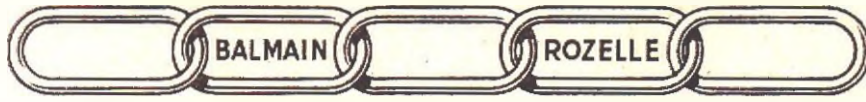

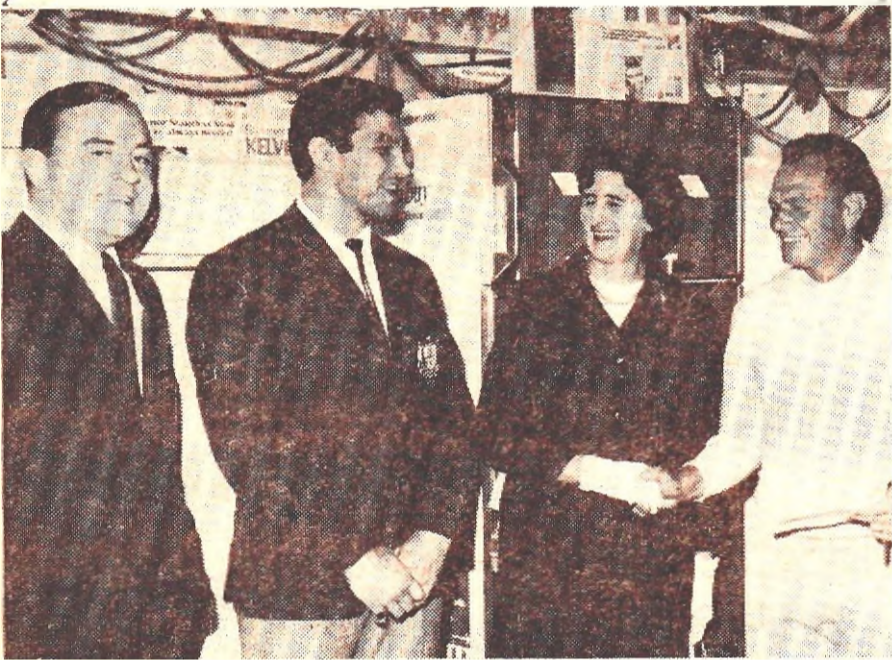

INDUSTRIAL SAFETY

How an employee became an accident victim due to an unforeseeable set of circumstances was the subject of study at last month's meeting of the Balmain District Safety Group.

The accident studied had occurred at the plant of Nestle Company (Aust.) Ltd., and involved a foreman who

was injured when cleaning a guillotine blade of a cutting machine.

In normal circumstances the blade was acceptably guarded. The conditions contributing to the accident had now been made impossible by making the machine inoperable when being cleaned.

The case study was

presented by Mr. J. Webster.

Afterwards Mr. Blackmore delivered an informative address on various aspects of the Inflammable Liquids Act.

GOVERNMENT BUNGLE!!

Whilst suffering from the wildest imagination, could one concur with the Government announcement to move Sydney Hospital to Parramatta?

This decision to move a necessary public utility has been made by the same administrators that encourage Sydney to be built up with multi-storey home units such as the latest blot on the city—"The Park Regis".

One could imagine that the hospital should be moved if city dwelling was banned and people encouraged toward suburban living.

The announcement is the decision of Parliament, who once again show they have little knowledge of the needs of a metropolis.

A huge area of parkland exists at the rear of Sydney Hospital, and to use portion of it seems the simple way of providing Sydney with a new hospital.

The present site could then be demolished and provide a parking area for doctors and visitors, who spend valuable time seeking a position for their cars.

Sydney needs a medical centre to receive critical cases, and it also needs a receiving centre to diagnose and farm out-patients to the hospital most capable of handling their problem.

Sometimes immediate hospitalization means life or death to a patient, and city dwellers are also entitled to that.

For the masses would it not be wiser to demolish Parliament House and rebuild it elsewhere—

A hospital in Sydney on or near its present location serves the many residents of the city and their near suburban neighbours.

HOSPITAL'S ACTIVITIES

From Balmain and District Hospital comes news of implementation of its policy of encouraging the staff to keep abreast of modern developments in the various techniques and professions involved.

The Chief Executive Officer of the hospital, Mr. K. R. Boylan, told "The Link" that the special fund raised as a result of approaches to various organisations from time to time, to be used solely for educational purposes, was being employed for the purpose.

Each year the hospital planned to use such funds to allow four or five staff members in various categories—nursing, physiotherapy, pathology, pharmacy, etc.—to further their training.

The activities encouraged include participation in symposia, conferences and short courses.

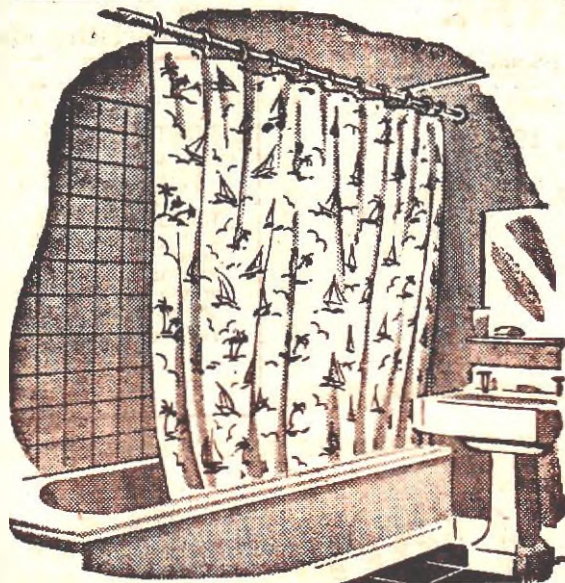

At this stage of the semi's race it appears that the Tigers' only hope is for either St George, Manly or Souths to be beaten. Their best chance lies with Easts lowering Souths' colours in the final round, which would result in a Balmain-Souths play-off, providing of course, we win our last three games against Penrith, Canterbury and Norths.

Are Your Child's Clothes "Flammable"

Mothers of young children: Will you let your children this year wear warm night clothes which could easily burst into flames if near a lighted match, a radiator, a stove?

Britain has already, various otherwise danted to check the sale of garments made of such fabrics as flannel-ette or light cottons, unless the articles are flame-proofed. A patent process has been perfected in Britain for making

various otherwise dangerous materials flame-resistant.

The Standards Association of Australia has a committee (with two sub-committees) at work studying flame resistance and children's clothing.

and this may produce a protective "code" by next year (says the Australian Medical Association). Meanwhile, what is possible for mothers who are aware of the risks of "flammable" garments? (This word should be used instead of the traditional "inflammable", which logically should mean flame-proof).

First, then—there are materials which naturally have a measure of resistance: wool, for instance, though it may cost more than some of the others. An alternative is to use garments made of the British flame-proof materials (obtainable at some of our leading stores).

Further . . . consider the style of clothing itself. Note that flowing garments, such as the night dress and dressing gown, are more risky than would be those of the same materials cut to cling close to the body. For this reason the track suit style has become popular in Britain.

With all these precautions should go education, of both children and adults, in avoidance of risk . . . the match or the cigarette butt dropped or thrown away while still alight or smouldering; the near approach (even without direct contact) to a glowing radiator; the wood in the grate which has no firescreen, against either a fall or a spark thrown out.
