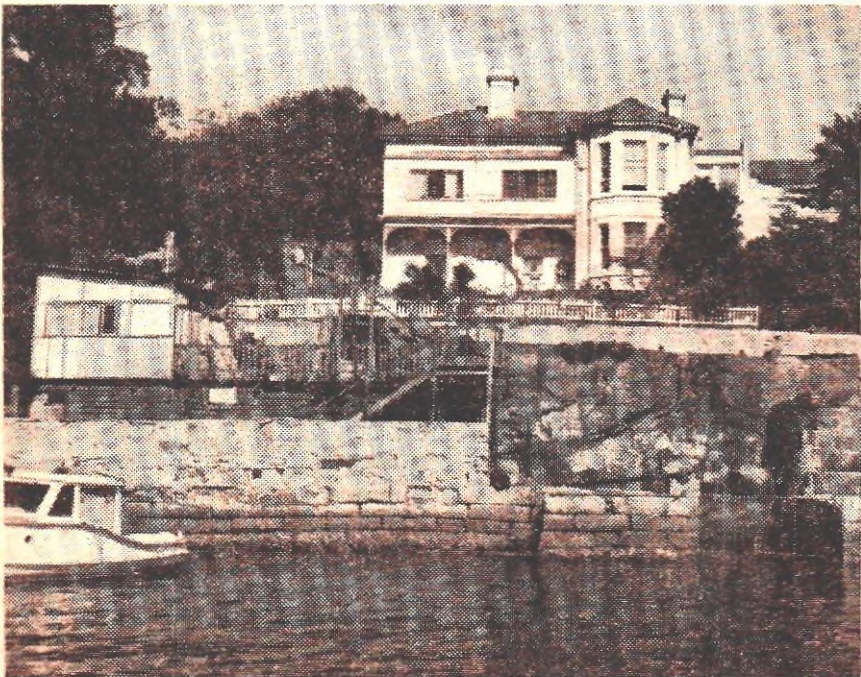

WHARF PLAN INSPECTION

Approval of an application by R. W. Miller & Co. Pty. Ltd. to carry out extensions to its wharf at No. 113 Louisa Road, Balmain, was deferred by Leichhardt Council at its last meeting pending a works inspection of the site.

The inspection was fixed for this afternoon, Wednesday, August 14. The decision to make an inspection and secure the views of local resi-

dents as to the possible effects of the plan followed a motion by Ald. N. Origlass.

He moved an amendment to that effect to a motion before Council, the motion being that no objection to the proposed extensions be made provided the company's lease with the Maritime Services Board contained a provision requiring the company to comply with any Council direction in re-

gard to any effect on the amenity of neighbouring residents by undue emission of smoke or noise from ships berthed at the premises and undergoing repairs.

The suggestion that the lease contain such a clause had been made by the M.S.B. in a letter to Council concerning the company's plan.

Ald. Origlass was supported in his move by Ald. Lewis and Ald. Wyner.

CONTROL OF AIR POLLUTION

The considerable part being played by Leichhardt Municipality in prevention and control of air pollution was outlined before the Senate Select Committee on Air Pollution recently by the municipality's Health Surveyor and Building Inspector, Mr. R. S. Williams.

Mr. Williams made his submission the subject of a special report to last week's meeting of the Council.

The committee, which consists of six senators under the chairmanship of Senator G. H. Branson (W.A.), met in Sydney on July 22-23, and heard evidence from representatives of the Chamber of Manufacturers of N.S.W., Municipalities of Bankstown, Leichhardt and Botany, Stanton Pipes of Aust. Pty. Ltd., Clean Air Society of Australia and N.Z., Labor Council of N.S.W., Boral Ltd., and B.H.P. Co. Ltd.

Committee

Mr. Williams told the committee he was a member of the N.S.W. branch committee of the Clean Air Society of Australia and N.Z., and a member of the committee organising the third international conference of that body to be held in Sydney in 1969.

In 1954 he recommended to Leichhardt Council that an air pollution committee be formed in view of an alarming increase in the rate of respiratory cases and an upsurge of air pollution problems in the municipality.

Council adopted the report and asked him to form the committee — called the Smoke Abatement Advisory Panel—which held its first meeting in 1955. It consisted of experts acting voluntarily, Council aldermen and himself.

The experts were in the main engineers representing the Australian Gas Light Company, Australian Coal Association (Research) Ltd., Joint Coal Board, Air Pollution Branch (Sydney), Institute of Marine and Power En-

gineers, Society of Mechanical Engineers of Aasia, Westgate Chamber of Commerce, and a Joint Coal Board fuel technologist.

Objects of the committee included investigation of complaints and combustion problems, and the offering of technical advice to remedy conditions or the advocacy of statutory pressure when necessary.

The committee met monthly for some years, and now met every two months as its work had been reduced by solution of earlier problems.

In dealing with problems the committee sought co-operation of the industry concerned. That approach was usually successful. On-site inspections were held regularly.

Amounts spent by industry within the municipality in the past eight years on implementing the panel's recommendations indicated the support given to the committee. They ranged from \$6,472 in 1960 to \$895,496 in 1965.

The Bureau of Census and Statistics recorded that there were now 643 factories in Leichhardt Municipality, compared with 801 in 1955-56.

Control

The N.S.W. Clean Air Act, which came into effect in 1962, scheduled premises under the direct control of the Air Pollution Branch, Department of Public Health, and in Leichhardt Municipality in 1966 there were 28 such premises.

Premises not so listed came under the direct control of the local authority, and 79 factories of that type were dealt with by Leichhardt Council as the local authority.

Mr. Williams said that in the area one of the most pressing problems, apart from the effect on health, was damage to and disfiguration of property by fall-out material, and interference with home cleanliness.

He submitted that property owners could be reimbursed to the tune of 10c in the \$ for the cost of renewing property because of air pollution. The local authority could authenticate all claims and in turn be reimbursed for administrative expenses.

Establishment of a fund for that purpose could be by direct grant from the Commonwealth, and perhaps industry concerned in creating atmospheric pollution could contribute (although naturally would be excluded from the scheme's benefits).

Research

The Commonwealth, said Mr. Williams, could also encourage research into preventive measures, such as development of anti-corrosive agents for metal building materials by filming or impregnation in manufacture.

Inducement could also be offered to industry (in the form of income tax deduction) to purchase air pollution control appliances, such as alarm controls, photo-electric cells, grit arrestors, and use of low sulphur content fuels.

Mr. Williams also mentioned the need to control use of domestic and commercial incinerators and their eventual banning; the effect on health of emissions from motor vehicles; and establishment of large capacity regional incinerators for destruction of garbage, trade refuse and industrial waste.

Column NINE

POLICE PATROL

In the past it has been pointed out that a police foot patrol was needed in the Balmain and Rozelle shopping centres. There is no evidence that this suggestion was taken up by the local constabulary.

No better deterrent is known than the obvious presence of a policeman — not in a patrol wagon or a police station, but in full view, so that law-breakers are aware of the arm of the law.

Over the past week stealing and shop-breaking have flared up again, and it is essential that some form of foot patrol should be commenced before the position deteriorates.

Police can be provided in numbers when some V.I.P. visits this country, yet it seems almost impossible to provide them for the protection of local property.

The time to stop a cycle of stealing and shopbreaking is the moment it shows up — and that time is right now!

The big deterrent to a lawbreaker is the knowledge that police are in close proximity. Much time, however, is lost between contact with the police patrol and their arrival at the scene of the crime.

When these hit-and-run types are aware of police in the area, they generally move their attentions elsewhere.

So, Mr. Inspector, please oblige with the commencement of a regular shopping centre foot patrol, day and night, until these hoodlums get the message.

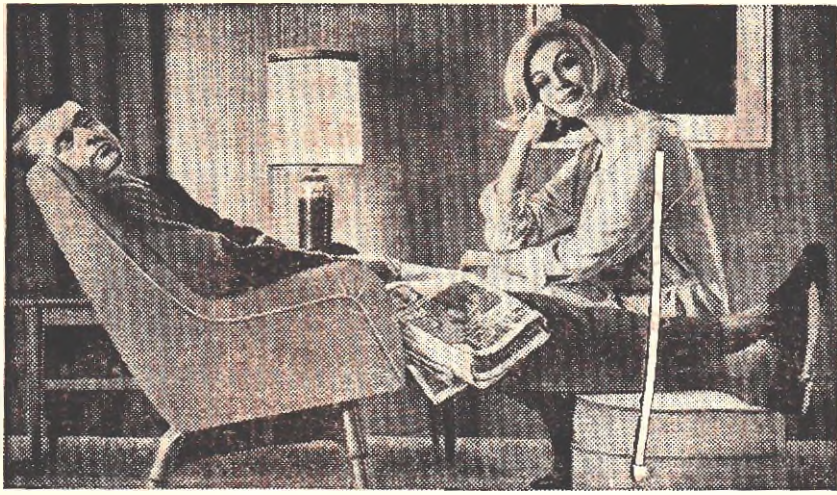
The critical hours are known to the police, and their presence then would be rewarded by the cessation of broken windows.

Heavy Traffic Ruining Local Roads

The increasing burden being placed by industry upon some lightly constructed roads serving the Balmain peninsula is building up a major problem for Leichhardt Municipality and its ratepayers.

Despite a strong warning by the Municipal Engineer, Mr. G. A. Wilson, that there was urgent need of reconstruction of Lilyfield Road between Mary Street and Balmain Road, and of Balmain Road between Moore Street and Parramatta Road, Leichhardt Council last week deferred the proposal until next year's estimates are to be considered.

Consensus of opinion of aldermen was: "We just haven't got the money, neither can we at this stage set aside sufficient to finance loans for the purpose."

"Essential"

In his report, the engineer said loan borrowing was the only means available to Council to finance works of magnitude, apart from building up reserves over a number of years.

Reconstruction of Lilyfield and Balmain Roads—at a cost to the Council of \$200,000—was an essential and urgent project, he said, but was at present held up without any promise of future finance. He suggested that loan funds be sought for the work.

Prolonged wet weather,

er, he added, could result in complete road pavement failure in Lilyfield Road under the traffic loading now imposed on it.

The life of Balmain Road pavement seal was at its end, and to lay a further surface coating on it would be extremely unfortunate.

He foresaw no likelihood of the engineering works in the municipality lessening.

The Town Clerk, Mr. E. A. Bassett, pointed out that loan indebtedness at December last was \$1,295,942, and repayments of principal and interest for 1968 would be \$185,000. If Council were to borrow the \$200,000 as suggested by the engineer, annual payment of principal and interest would be about \$20,000.

No provision had been made in the 1968 estimates for repayment of further loans.

"Frightening"

Commenting on Council's decision, Ald. N. Origlass, told "The Link" that residents generally did not need heavy duty roads. They needed only average suburban roads for their cars.

Although the Depart-

ment of Main Roads made a 50 per cent contribution to the cost of secondary roads—and the two roads in question were classified thus—the cost to the Council was still excessive.

Ald. Origlass said that because of the use being made of roads around Balmain, they needed rebuilding, at a cost of about \$3½ million, which included widening, property acquisition and pavement strengthening.

However, in the Balmain-Rozelle area—the portion north of Victoria Road—the burden of paying for road-building rested entirely on ratepayers, since the Department of Main Roads had not classified any of the roads now being used by industrial traffic as main or secondary roads.

Thus they earned no subsidy from the department, even though they were at times used extensively by heavy industrial traffic.

Ald. Origlass considered that the department should as a matter of urgency be approached for a subsidy for those industrially-used roads, which should be classified immediately as more than local roads.

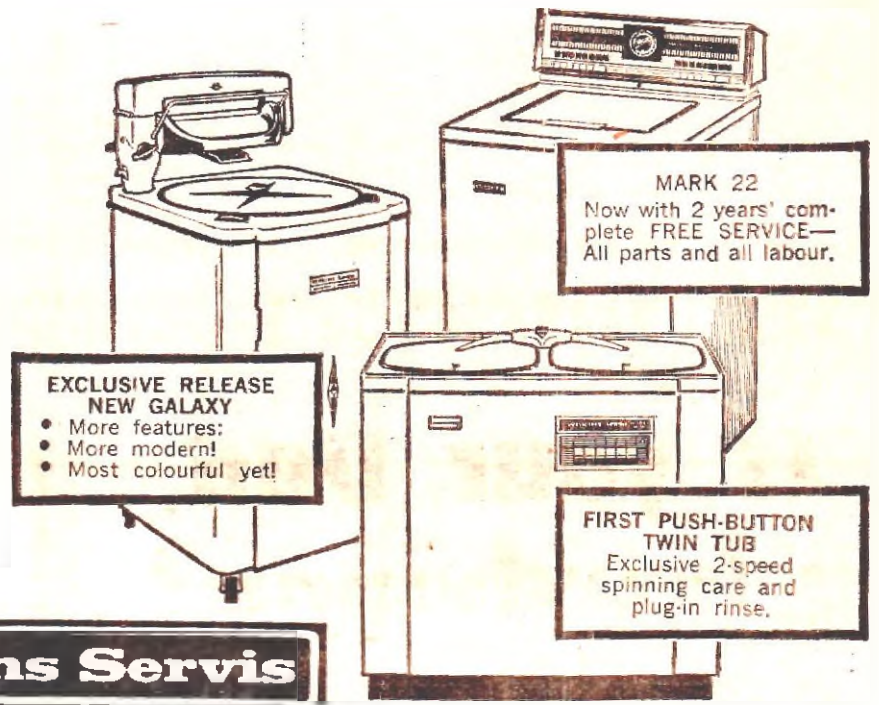
