Controversial Traffic Moves



Our pictures show implementation of traffic changes in Victoria Road, Rozelle, subject of recent controversy.

ABOVE: Darling Street intersection, where a ban has been placed on the right turn from Darling Street into Victoria Road (affecting traffic from the Balmain peninsula heading towards Iron Cove Bridge and beyond).

We don't offer a prize to anybody able to find in this picture the official sign banning the turn, but we do ask the authorities if they expect a driver in a moving car unfamiliar with the ban to pick up the sign. There's a similar sign on the right-hand side of the intersection.

If a stranger really keeps his eyes open, although not knowing of the prohibition, he might sight it just as he is about to make the turn, providing the state of the traffic permits him to send his eyes roving around near shop awnings.

"The Link" believes that in the interests both of justice

to drivers (who no doubt will be fined if they turn against the sign) and of efficiency of traffic control, an advance warning sign should be erected a couple of intersections back in Darling Street.

Road, shutting off through traffic in Evans Street. This work was stopped just after it commenced pending reconsideration of the move by Leichhardt Council. In the absence of an official statement we can only assume that everybody is now satisfied (except the earlier critics, of course).

ASSURANCE ON WATER FOR FIRES

Both the Sydney Water Board and the Board of Fire Commissioners have assured "The Link" that they are fully conscious of the fire-fighting needs of the Balmain-Rozelle area as affected by increasing industrialisation.

They gave this assurance when "The Link" asked if there was any significance as far as this area was concerned in conditions in neighbouring districts, such as Glebe, where a claim had been made that low water pressures had made it difficult for firemen to fight a recent big blaze.

The fire in question swept through a factory, causing an estimated \$300,000 worth of damage, and a spokesman for the owners said that water pressure from the mains was such that flow from fire hoses had been reduced to a feeble trickle.

A Water Board spokesman was subsequently quoted in the Press as saying that the factory was in a residential area where mains were smaller than those in an industrial district.

"The Link" was told by the Secretary of the Board of Fire Commissioners (Mr. Webb) that he had called for a report of the whole circumstances. At this stage he could not say more than that the responsibility for the water supply was the Water Board's.

Report

Since his officers had not made any reports of inadequacy of pressure, he said he must accept the position as being quite adequate.

"We carry out regular inspections of fire hydrants and the adequacy of water mains," Mr. Webb added. "Our local brigades do this from time to time on routine exercises. They are always mindful of the development of any particular area, and if there has to be any adjustment made we take steps accordingly. We bring to the notice of the Water Board the need for bigger mains."

Asked if he could say whether such an inspection had been made in Balmain recently, particularly with an eye on increasing industrialisation, Mr. Webb said he could not say at this stage.

Development

A spokesman for the Water Board told "The Link" that the Board would keep pace with development in Balmain as and when required. The supply of water to the district would be increased and the area of the pipes amplified when required.

"The Board is aware of the problem," he said. "It is quite aware

Mains Sizes

A Water Board spokesman said that there were 4" mains in residential areas and 6" in industrial areas (especially for fire fighting). Pressure in the mains was above the minimum that the Board was required to supply.

The Board would consider as a long term plan the idea of upsizing the mains from 4" to 6", although that involved a very great deal of money.

"We work pretty closely with the Fire Board," he added. "On outbreaks of fire our district water service operators are quickly on the scene, manipulating valves to direct water where most pressure is required."

QUESTION TIME!!

Eighteen months have passed since, through this column, we asked: "What does the future hold for Balmain and Rozelle?" With two different State Members and a Council, not one reply has been received to inform residents whether there is a high density plan or not for this area.

Our neighbouring suburbs are experiencing mammoth development that has now put us further behind the eight ball. How is it possible that home development is at its peak less than five miles away, yet little or nothing is taking place here?

Developers show no interest, because land values are far too high—small frontages require purchase of many properties to acquire enough land to develop—hence the land cost per unit is too high.

Choice portions of land have been allowed to remain "industrial", and this can be attributed only to the lack of foresight by the Council and State Members.

WHY? No explanation has been given. Isn't it time someone spoke, or are we to continue with administration that tells nothing of what the future holds?

The local Members have never stood up and put forward an idea for Housing Commission development that would capture the interest of the big papers and television.

Strange, isn't it? No information, and no publicity, whether it be good or bad—just complete SILENCE.

Is it policy to ignore this question? Is anything being done to rejuvenate this area? If so, what is it?

Only time can tell—but 18 months have passed and nothing has been told. Is this to continue?

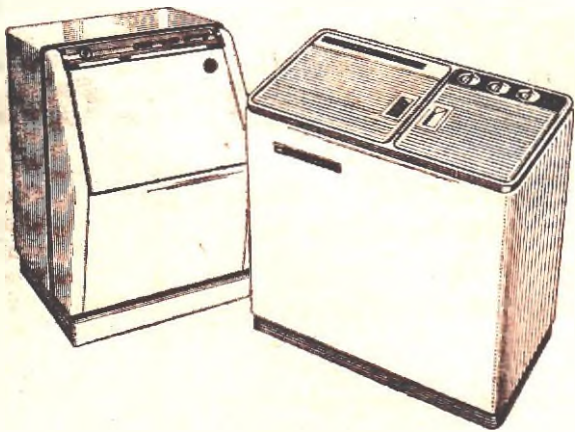

Expressway Problem

Property owners affected by the proposed Western and North-Western expressways should be able to sell to the Department of Main Roads without delay, Mr. R. Degen, State Member for Balmain, said in Parliament recently.

Delivering his maiden speech during the Address-in-Reply debate, Mr. Degen said the freezing of property along the route of the expressways was causing hardship to property owners.

They could neither sell their properties nor raise finances on them because of pending resumption.

He said the D.M.R. would buy properties where hardship could be established, and he believed the Department should be given sufficient finance to purchase properties from people who wished to sell, irrespective of the degree of hardship.

Snide operators had offered to buy houses at prices below current

market value, knowing the D.M.R. would pay current market values when it resumed the properties.

High School

Mr. Degen also appealed to the Government to build a new six-year high school on the Balmain peninsula.

He said there was only one such school in the Balmain electorate—Ibrox Park, which had one of the largest rates of room occupancy of any metropolitan secondary school. The Education Department's Smith Street property could be used as the site when it was vacated by Balmain Teachers' College students.

Leichhardt Rotary

The Rev. Dr. H. L. Hawkins, O.B.E., Administrator of the Leichhardt Homes and Institutions, was guest speaker at Leichhardt Rotary meeting on August 1.

He recounted the growth of the social services enterprises associated with the mission over the past 16 years, in which there has been a capital expenditure of \$2½m., providing homes and care for 430 senior citizens.

Outstanding features of the work are that the basic charges are less than the pension, and the four stages of care allow people to take up permanent residence, with the assurance of hospitalisation when needed.

Improvements At Hospital

Children (and their parents) will appreciate the "new look" of the children's ward at Balmain and District Hospital. It has been remodelled, improving both its comfort and appearance.

Mr. K. R. Boylan, Chief Executive Officer, states that the work has produced a most attractive area.

The room has been repainted and vinyl floor tiles have been laid. Two window-type air conditioners enable the ward to be warmed in cold weather and cooled in hot.

In addition the ceiling has been lined with insul-wool for protection against extreme temperatures, and throwout aluminium blinds have been fitted on the western wall to keep out hot sun.

Purpose of these improvements has been to prevent distress to children in hot or cold weather.

The air conditioners are so effective in warming the ward that one has been turned off, although it is expected that both will be needed for cooling in midsummer.

A further improvement has been the replacement of the three-quarter beds with new durallium dropside cots, of excellent, safe design.

The ward caters for ten to 12 children up to the age of six years.

School Help

The function held at Rozelle Boys' Junior High School on August 8 to raise funds for Balmain Hospital, as part of the school's Education Week activities, resulted in \$117 being handed to the institution.

Of this amount, \$42 was raised by pupils of the infants' school, and \$75 by the primary school.

The contributions were largely those of the children themselves, out of their pocket money.

Earlier this year the boys in the secondary department of the school contributed \$100 for the same purpose.

The money raised on this latter occasion was presented during a brief ceremony next day to Mr. W. F. Pinerua, President of the Hospital

Board, who was accompanied by the Matron, Miss J. MacLaren, and the Assistant Secretary, Mr. A. H. Dower.

Each year pupils of this school have been raising money for Balmain Hospital, and many items in the children's ward have been replaced over the years as a result. Each of these replacements carries a small plaque indicating that it has been provided by the school.

Schoolboys' Athletics

Ideal conditions and boyish enthusiasm saw 17 new records set at Rozelle Boys' Junior High School's athletic championships in the 11-day carnival at Leichhardt Oval, 127 events being contested.

For the second year running, Mort House won the house championship with 1088 points. Balmain and Evatt tied for second (875), with Elliott scoring 774.

Age championships resulted: 12-year, W. Dunks (Mort House), 13. H. Cleaver (Evatt), 14. P. Ferguson (Mort), 15. P. Lytham (Elliott), 16. G. Starling (Balmain).

Geoff Starling won 8 events and set new records in the 80 metres hurdles, 100 metres, high jump, long jump, triple jump and shot put.

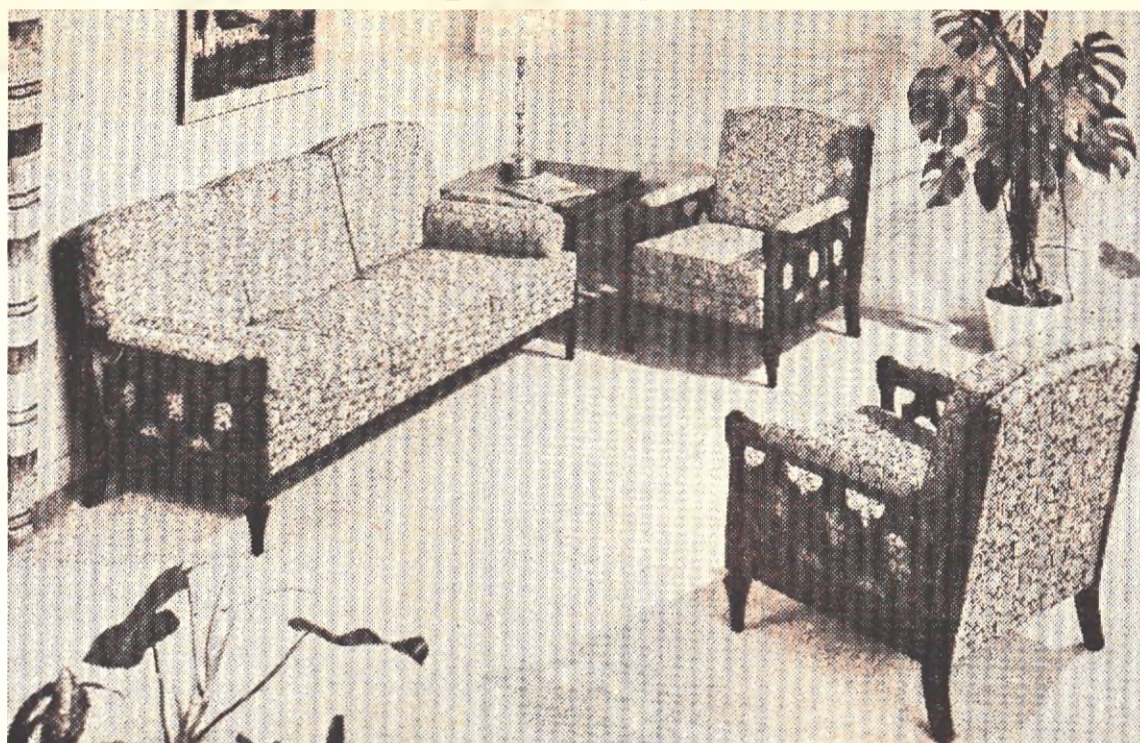
