

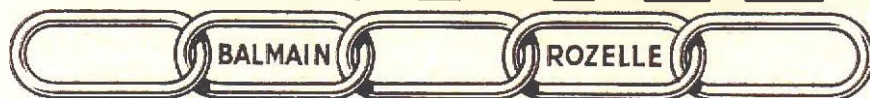

## First Local "Drive-in"

# PETITION ABOUT TRAFFIC

This modern amen-

ity — which solves motorists' parking problems when desiring to make quick purchases — occupies part of the car park at the rear of the hotel. Motorists may purchase their bottle

requirements without leaving the driving seat.

The drive-in itself accommodates 17 cars at the one time

Two-thirds of the former car park remain, permitting clients to leave their vehicles if they wish.

Licensee of the hotel, Mr. Norman Byrne, told "The Link" he understood that the drive-in was the first to be built in an inner suburb of Sydney, its nearest neighbours being Kings Cross on one side of the city, and Hunters Hill on the other.

The project was part of extensive renovations of the hotel by Toohy's Ltd. and was the first drive-in bottle department built by that company for a licensee (others having been built for managed hotels).

Total cost of the renovations was about \$100,000, which covered also work on the public and saloon bars, installation of two new cold rooms, and construction in the car park of a small garden lounge.

The garden lounge, which was for warm weather use, would seat about 40, and had the atmosphere of a beer garden, with tables made from cut-down 18-gallon kegs which had been provided with new tops.

A petition, urging that something be done to prevent nuisance by drivers of heavy vehicles, is being circulated among Balmain, Birchgrove and Rozelle residents for signature and presentation to Leichhardt Council.

The petition was initiated at the last meeting of the Balmain-Leichhardt Labor Party, the new party recently formed to contest the next municipal elections.

At that meeting concern was expressed at the conditions created by many big trucks using streets on the Balmain peninsula, many carrying filling.

It was reported by speakers that there was a certain amount of spillage from the trucks, which muddied the road. Also some drivers were breaking traffic regulations because of the narrowness of the streets they passed through, having to veer over to the wrong side of the road when taking corners.

### Appeal

The petition makes the following points:

Residents make an urgent appeal to Leichhardt Council to use whatever powers and functions are available to it to remove the nuisance and danger arising from the noise, vibration, fumes and general disruption of normal living created by heavy vehicles now swarming over the suburban streets.

The annoyance has reached such proportions that immediate redress is demanded.

Streets particularly affected are: Ballast Point Road, Dock Road, Rowntree, Mullens, Montague, Cameron, Mort and Church Streets, Curtis Road, and Beattie, Darling, Palmer, Wortley, Booth, Reynolds, Ewell, Evans, Wise, Terry, Glassop and Donnelly Streets.

### Breaches

Residents are concerned at the apparent lack of control over these vehicles in what the petition describes as their rush to make as many journeys as possible each day on piece-work contracts.

Matters instanced particularly are:

(a) Travelling on the wrong side of the road to negotiate narrow corners and bends such as the junction of Ballast Point Road and Rowntree Street, Ballast Point Road and Dock Road, Reynolds and Mullens Streets, Mullens and Robert Streets, Wortley and Palmer Streets, Evans-Ewell-Reynolds Streets, and the bend in Rowntree Street near Curtis Road.

(b) Speeding in narrow streets, none of which is suitable or adequate for even slow-moving vehicles.

(c) Strewing spoil over roads, creating a disgraceful mess, as a result of overloading, failure to cover loads properly, open tail boards and bad cornering.

(d) Failure to respect Stop signs as at the junction of Evans-Reynolds-Ewell Streets.

(e) Creation of a general racket by faulty engines and/or faulty or no springing of truck bodies (noticed especially when empty).

### "Shattered"

Peace, order and serenity in the local community have been shattered almost completely — says the petition — now that trucking has become so rife here.

The petition looks to the local governing authority to make a declaration and adopt the appropriate measures aimed at restoring the district as a true living area.

"The Link" understands that the petition will be presented to Leichhardt Council very shortly, probably at its next meeting.

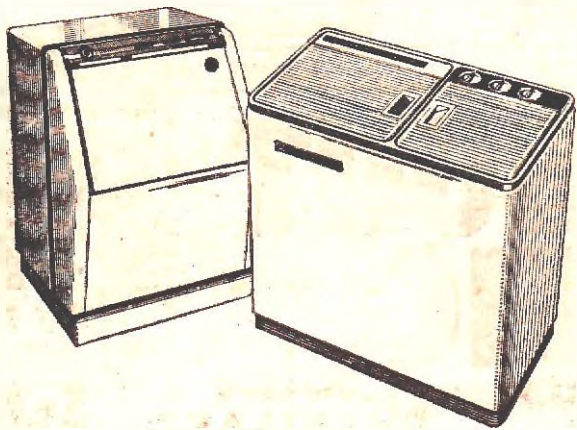

# A.L.P. BRANCH ACTIVITIES

Matters concerning local ferry services came in for much discussion at the August meeting of the Balmain Branch of the A.L.P.

Mr. F. Turner spoke about the curtailment of night services from Darling Street to Circular Quay.

He also said that the name "Balmain" was displayed in an unsuitable manner at the Quay, and stressed the difficulties people would face trying to find a Balmain ferry.

The meeting decided to protest to Sydney Harbour Ferries on these matters.

A second resolution passed requested Leichhardt Municipal Council to install lighting in the waiting shed at Darling Street Wharf.

Mr. R. C. Degen, M.L.A., told members that he would raise the matter of ferry services to Balmain with the Minister for Transport (Mr. Morris).

He tabled a letter from Mr. Morris saying that, in answer to branch representations, ferry timetables had been installed at Yeend, Thames

and Darling Street Wharves. Members expressed disappointment with these timetables.

The Minister's letter also stated that the Police Department was investigating whether a marked footcrossing in Darling Street on the eastern side of Loyalty Square was justified.

A resolution was carried that Leichhardt Municipal Council should oppose the extension into Snail's Bay of the wharf at Jubilee Engineering.

Several items were submitted for consideration by Leichhardt Municipal Assembly for inclusion in the Labor policy for the Local Government election on December 7.

A letter was received from the Federal Member, Mr. W. O'Connor, informing branch members that if the proposed re-distribution of electoral boundaries was carried by Parliament,

he would seek pre-selection for the seat of Grayndler, since the major part of Dalley had been included in that electorate.

## Fete At Hospital

Funds raised will go to the new cardiac emergency unit.

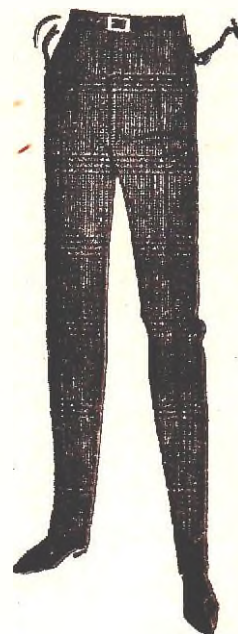

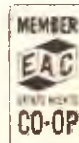
