HEAT AT COUNCIL MEETING

Several matters closely affecting the Balmain-Rozelle area again generated heat at last week's adjourned meeting of Leichhardt Council. At one time fisticuffs almost occurred between an alderman and a member of the public gallery.

The subject which created most heat was a notice of motion, moved by Aldermen N. Origlass, J. Wyner and R. G. Walker, to rescind the Council's resolution of June 5 regarding construction of container wharves at White Bay.

On that occasion it was decided to "receive" a letter from Mr. R. Degen, M.L.A., forwarding a copy of a letter from the Acting Premier on the subject.

"Eyesore"

The motion of rescission urged that Council now issue a stop-work order on the builders of the container structure.

Their view was that the big shed now being built was an eyesore and an infringement on the rights of local residents. The Maritime Services Board, for which the building was being erected, had changed its mind on the building's dimensions; it should be asked to conform to its original design, as submitted to the Council.

The Balmain district—it was claimed—was being unduly pressed in regard to industrialisation.

Ald. Casey, who was the mover of the original motion whose rescission was sought, found himself under verbal attack by a man in the public gallery, who said the alderman was a liar.

"Step outside and repeat that," replied Ald. Casey.

The interjector obliged. An eye witness of the scene told "The Link" that matters were warming up when another alderman pulled Ald. Casey away and persuaded him to go back into the Council chamber and let the matter drop.

The motion was rejected—on party lines (8 votes to 6).

Terminal

A second subject to generate heat was a letter from the Australian National Line, expressing regret that Council had cause to complain about the activities of the terminal on Sunday, July 21.

It was unfortunate—said the letter—that a series of accidents beyond the company's control had led to emergency use of the terminal.

The company assured the Council that there would be no grounds for complaint in the future.

Ald. Foley moved that the letter be received. It indicated a reasonable approach, he said.

Interjections

A gallery interjector: "It's still going on!"

Ald. Wyner thought the assurance that the incident would not be repeated was insufficient. The company had not outlined its plan to obviate future incidents, he said.

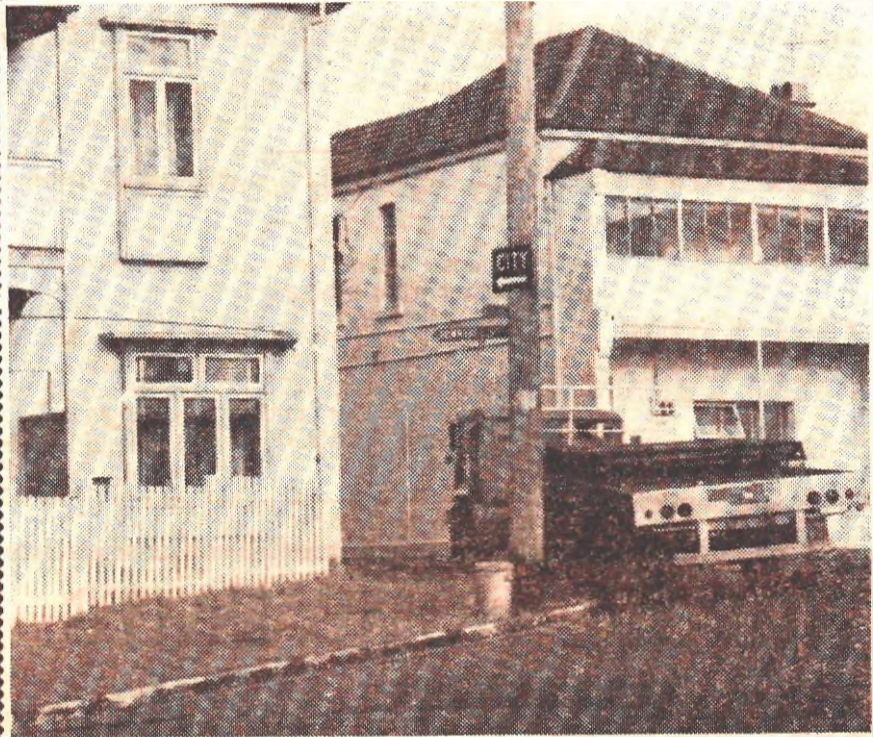
Council, however, agreed to receive the letter.

At one stage of the meeting two aldermen drew the attention of the Mayor to the fact that there had been interjections from the gallery, and suggested that it be closed.

One interjector, who had a loud voice, was particularly pressing, causing Ald. Origlass to ask that the interjector be given an extension of time.

The Mayor (Mrs. Cashman) told Ald. Origlass to continue his own speech.

Is This The Way To Run A City?



People visiting Sydney—and Sydney folk leaving for Tasmania—via the attractive Tasmanian vehicular ferry, whose terminal is on the harbour at one corner of the Balmain peninsula, will be "impressed" by the shameful arrangements made for traffic near the terminal.

This is an only-too-common view of a heavy goods vehicle leaving the harbour scene via the "main" route—Ballast Point Road and Rowntree Street, Birchgrove.

Rowntree Street, into which the truck is seen turning, is at this point a magnificent 21 feet wide, and carries two-way local traffic.

The best the authorities can manage in the way of traffic control is

a sign a few hundred yards along Rowntree Street, at the intersection of Dock Road (a very short street, entering Ballast Point Road just to the right of our picture).

This sign faces traffic coming in the opposite direction along Rowntree Street, and is not mandatory, but merely informative, advising transport drivers that the way to the terminal is to the left, along Dock Road.

Providing drivers proceeding to the terminal take that turn and keep out of the end of Rowntree Street, they do not clash with drivers coming from the terminal. However, the drivers of very big vehicles leaving the terminal and en-

tering Rowntree Street (as the vehicle in our picture is doing) at times must stop and reverse and have another go at entering this narrow street.

Local residents at times find grim humour in this atmosphere, but generally their thoughts are pretty bitter when terminal traffic is at its peak. They certainly do not think this is the way to operate an important commercial enterprise in one of the world's major cities.

Isn't it about time the authorities got together on the Balmain traffic problem generally—and the terminal problem in particular—and untwisted some of the snarls which bring such shame to them, and such annoyance to residents?

Column NINE

PREVENTION OF CRIME

Balmain's shopping centre was again visited by burglars last week, leading us to reconsider the question of adequacy of police supervision.

Some people are asking whether the local police are patrolling the area as effectively as they might. The answer to this we must leave to the police.

Several times we have suggested that, since the best deterrent of crime is the obvious presence of police, some thought should be given to more active patrolling by men on foot. We cannot, however, get the police to agree. They say they must remain highly mobile, in cars good enough to cope with mobile thieves.

We agree regarding the necessity for mobility, but still must urge that patrolling be carried on in the Balmain-Rozelle shopping areas as constantly and as vigorously as staff permits, including foot patrol.

One school of thought considers it better that police remain out of sight when patrolling, although keeping a close watch, on the principle that criminals bide their time while police are around, and that the element of surprise, resulting in apprehension, is a far more effective police weapon.

We do not subscribe to that. Prevention of crime is far preferable to punishment after a crime has been committed.

Our local police—like police everywhere—point out that a police force loses much of its strength without active public co-operation, and through this column urges citizens to inform them immediately when suspicious actions (including the offering of "cheap" goods by strangers) are noticed. This we heartily endorse.

Second Thoughts On Wharf Plan?

"The Link" believes that the last has not been heard of the decision by Leichhardt Council at its last meeting not to object to the proposed extensions to the R. W. Miller wharf at 113 Louisa Road, Birchgrove.

Objections to the decision, we understand, have been made by several widely representative groups, and the subject is likely to be raised again immediately.

Probably the attitude most worrying to the majority group of aldermen is that of the Balmain Branch of the A.L.P., which, as reported in last week's issue, decided that Leichhardt Municipal Council should oppose extension of the wharf into Snail's Bay.

Council's decision followed the inspection by its representatives and local residents of the site of the proposed extensions.

About 12 local residents were joined at the inspection by representatives of various industrial unions affected.

Subsequently the Works Committee of the Council recommended that no objection be raised, and this was agreed to, although opposed by Aldermen Origglass, Wyner and Lewis.

Ald. Wyner said that

only a small percentage of local residents were employed by the enterprise, despite union representatives' claim that a great percentage of the employees were local residents.

Ald. Lewis thought there were already sufficient facilities at the spot for the company's requirements.

Ald. Origglass sought an adjournment of the matter to enable investigation to be made of reports of the possibility of considerable expansion by the company's ship repair activities, which would have a substantial effect on residential conditions.

The objections, however, were over-ruled by the majority, which decided that the company would be informed to that effect, although the lease would provide that the company should comply with any Council direction regarding effect on residential amenities, and be automatically cancelled in the event of non-compliance.

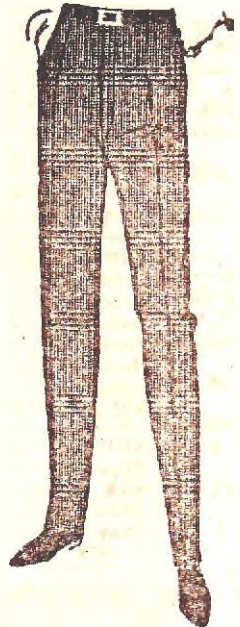
