**Preparing Path  
For Containers**



Our photographer recently caught this glimpse in progress bridging the stormwater canal running parallel with Robert Street, Rozelle, to enable the road providing access to the White Bay container terminal to be widened.

The bridging work, costing the Maritime Services Board \$110,000, is over an 850 ft. length of the

canal, and when completed will enable Robert Street to be widened by 25 ft. to provide a 60 ft. wide road from Victoria Road to connect with the internal wharf roadway in the terminal area.

The M.S.B. will contribute to the cost of widening Robert Street. Leichhardt Council will surface the road and kerb and gutter it.

The present Robert Street is seen to the right of the picture. It joins with Mullens Street just beyond the building at top right of the picture.

**DELAYED  
COUNCIL  
MEETINGS**

Observers of Leichhardt Council meetings are wondering how long the majority of aldermen are going to put up with the conditions which resulted in the last meeting finishing at 3.30 a.m.

Recent meetings saw unfinished business mounting, some of the most controversial topics—such as the effects of increased industrialisation on Balmain-Rozelle living conditions—being among those not dealt with at the meeting for which they were listed.

In an endeavour to catch up, Council proceeded at its last meeting—September 16—to deal with all the items before it, including delayed and adjourned ones.

Some observers would no doubt say that one of the reasons for lengthy deliberations is the undoubted "gift of the gab" of some of the aldermen.

This paper agrees that this is probably so. Yet aldermen (like Members of Parliament) naturally must be adequately equipped with debating ability, whether in opposition or not.

**Debating**

Also, there is no doubt that there is plenty to talk about these days in regard to Balmain-Rozelle local government matters.

There is one school of thought—with which this paper feels inclined at times to agree—that Balmain-Birchgrove-Rozelle interests are not being dealt with sympathetically by the Council majority.

Party politics aside, public interest does not appear to be served by meetings which start late and are interrupted by committee meetings which deal with matters in camera.

A greatly interested public, which turns up to listen to the debate and see how important

subjects are treated, is asked to leave the gallery just after the start of the public meeting and to cool its heels (sometimes for an hour) until the meeting is again open to the public.

This sort of thing does not earn the Council a favourable image, and, in this paper's opinion, should be altered.

One of the main causes for this haphazard, stop-go procedure—and here we quote the thoughts of one of our local aldermen, Ald. I. Wyner—is Council's decision three months ago to put the committee meetings back from Monday night to Tuesday night (from 7.30 p.m. to 8.30 p.m.).

**Committees**

"More often than not," says Ald. Wyner, "it is impossible to complete committee business within one hour, except, of course, if the Labor majority were permitted to have its own way in everything; no opposition, no challenges, no questioning of their incompetent or unsatisfactory decisions.

"The fact that the greater part of the business done in committee should be done in public aggravates the position."

As this paper said last June: the public deserves a better deal than that.

**EASIER TO  
STRIKE?**

What a shocking state of affairs has developed when teachers resort to direct action!

The real issues at stake are not fully known to the ordinary man, and therefore we cannot comment on their rights or wrongs.

However, strike action is the last card in the pack, and it is difficult to understand why educated men and women have allowed themselves to become involved.

The loss of one day's schooling will not impair the chances of any child, but it does break down the teachers' standard.

If classes are too big, teachers are in short supply and hours are too long, and there are many other grievances—strike action will not elevate those involved.

This profession gives a good remuneration for services, plus many other amenities which are not shared by the ordinary man and woman.

Surely the teaching group have within their midst someone capable of attacking their problems by a method less distasteful than striking.

Solving the teachers' problem without a strike would have set an example to the rest of the community. There must be some other way—or is it easier when you don't get what you want to STRIKE?

**TRAFFIC ROUTE  
IS CHANGED**

Traffic to and from the White Bay container terminal will no longer use the road system of the "Balmain peninsula".

This welcome news comes from the President of the Maritime Services Board, Mr. W. H. Brotherson.

In a letter to the editor of "The Link", Mr. Brotherson said:

"Reference is made to the leading article which appeared in last week's (Sept. 18) edition of your paper and in which you refer to certain aspects of road usage in the Balmain peninsula.

"The article indicates that a great deal of heavy vehicular traffic is moving through the narrow streets of the district to the White Bay container terminals being constructed by the Board.

"I am now able to advise that the road connections from the peninsula via Stephen Street and Booth Street to the lower level of the Board's container terminals have now been severed

Industrial vehicular

traffic associated with the construction of the terminals and the vehicular traffic which will be used in conjunction with the operation of the terminals for cargo handling purposes will, from now on, utilise the Board's low level internal road and will not move along the road system of the Balmain peninsula."

## YOUR OPINIONS

### Municipal Libraries

I read with satisfaction the front-page story on public libraries in your issue of September 25, and noted that its tone obviously indicated that editorially you supported their establishment.

It is of course as certain as the sunrise that libraries will be established in this municipality eventually. Their postponement merely means, first, that the cost will be greater when they are established; and, second, that the present population is deprived of an amenity essential in modern life.

The knowledge gained in the next 15 years will equal that gained in the whole of recorded history, hence living without up-to-date books is like trying to build the Hawkesbury expressway with picks and shovels.

Your criticism that the cost of Glebe library (\$18,000), on the edge of

the municipality, will be met from the general fund without Government subsidy was properly made. The possibility is that the expenditure of a like sum upon a second branch would, with the acceptance of the Library Act, lead to a Government subsidy of \$18,000. Such a step would be sound business, but the argument is too complicated to pursue here.

You do good service to the whole of this community, particularly perhaps to school children, when you associate yourself with a movement to establish libraries in Leichhardt.

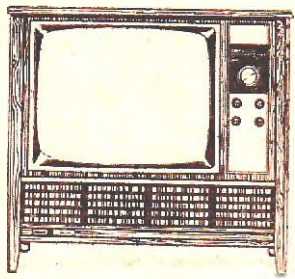

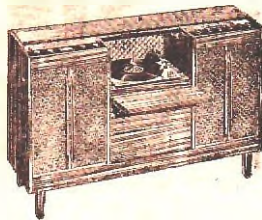

# Better Hospital Records Service

Building extension which Balmain and District Hospital has just commenced will increase its efficiency in a vital direction: that of medical records of in-patients.

Details supplied to "The Link" by the Chief Executive Officer, Mr. K. R. J. Boylan, tell of plans to centralise and modernise the hospital's medical records service.

Approval has been received to commence extension of the medical records section, at a cost of \$12,000. Foundation work has already started, and the work is expected to be completed in about 12 weeks.

At present the medical records of in-patients are scattered throughout the hospital, in about five separate areas. This produces serious inconvenience, for when one is

required quickly it is sometimes difficult to locate.

Extensions to the existing records section will permit all records to be located in the one room. It will be possible to house 15 years' records there, representing roughly 100,000 individual histories.

Reference to these may be required from time to time, sometimes urgently and critically, for the welfare of the patients concerned.

In addition to storage of records, the extension plans provide for the installation of a special reporting table for the

use of medical men at the institution.

The table will contain sound-proof cubicles in which doctors will be able to compile their records.

It will have outlets into which tape recorders may be plugged, allowing the doctors to dictate their reports. Later the tapes will be collected by a medical typist, who will type out the reports and place them in pigeon holes for checking and signing by the doctors at their convenience.

The table will be about 20 ft. long, and be divided into 6 or 7 cubicles, enabling multiple use of the facility.

A feature of the building extension is that it will have a flat concrete roof, which will be connected to the administrative staff tea room and thus function as a recreation area, thereby helping to overcome lack of amenities at the hospital.

It will be equipped to cater for the requirements of about 30 female members of the administrative staff.

# COUNCIL NEWS IN BRIEF

Here are brief reports of some of the matters dealt with at the mammoth meeting of Leichhardt Council on September 17 for which we did not have room in our last week's issue:

## INDUSTRY

Approval was granted, by majority vote, to Australian Insulators Ironwork Ltd. to extend its business by erecting a 3-ton gantry crane and a fibro building to house screwing, drilling and light forging machines, presses, multiple drill, draw bench and capstan lathes.

Council's Municipal Health Surveyor stated: "It is evident from the list of machinery to be installed, this industry will generate noise emissions."

An amendment (moved by Ald. Origlass and Wyner) to inspect the area before making a decision was rejected.

## PETITION

A further petition submitted by the Balmain-Leichhardt Labor Party on behalf of 304 residents of Balmain and Rozelle, in similar terms to the petition dealt with at the previous meeting, was again referred to "the appropriate authority".

A proposal by Ald. Wyner and Origlass, in similar terms to that put to the previous meeting, was rejected without comment.

## "TOLERANCE"

Council "received and noted" a letter from the Bramble's Industries

Ltd. thanking Council and the people of Balmain for "tolerance displayed over the trucking of stone to the White Bay container berth".

## TERMINAL

A letter from the Maritime Services Board — advising that the Board was taking action to ensure that noise generation at the container berths at Balmain would be kept to a minimum level commensurate with the efficient and economical generation of the facility — was received and noted.

A letter from the Premier regarding the container building at White Bay, and mentioning the possibility of other similar buildings to be erected, was received and noted.

Council received and noted a letter from the Minister for Local Government regarding the container building, advising that "problems and embarrassment would be caused if the terminal were unable to fully cater for container shipping" and that "the only relief that can be afforded to Grafton Street property owners whose views will be affected by the building is purchase of their properties by the Maritime Services Board".

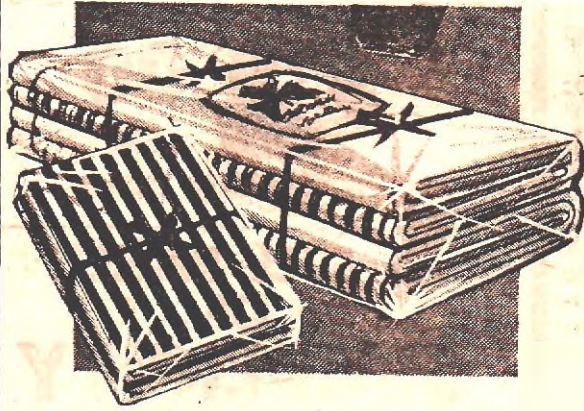

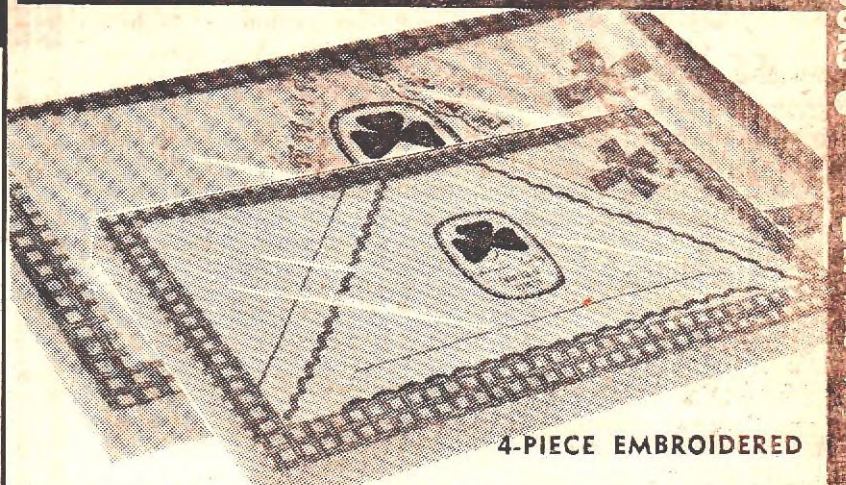

**Breakage Of Your  
Car Windscreen**

*A smashed windscreen is one of the commonest hazards the motorist faces whenever he travels in country areas—and, for that matter, in many metropolitan districts, including suburbs where faster roads have been resurfaced and temporarily covered with loose metal.*

A broken windscreen is not only dangerous, but always inconvenient and hard on the pocket. How, then, can the motorist avoid this kind of trouble?

N.R.M.A. investigations show that most windscreen breakages occur when two vehicles, travelling on a loose surface, pass each other from opposite directions.

A stone is flung out from the rear wheels of one vehicle, and the vehicle going in the opposite direction "runs into" the stone.

Some windscreens, of course, are broken by stones thrown up from one car on to a following car, but most drivers anticipate this and keep well out of range.

In the first and most common situation, it appears that the speed of the car that is struck by the stone is one of the main factors. If this car is travelling slowly, the chances are that the stone will not shatter the windscreen.

The best advice, then, is to drive slowly when another vehicle approaches on a road that has a loose topping (particularly on newly surfaced roads), and keep well across to the left-hand side of the road. Even if the other vehicle doesn't slow down, you will have reduced the risk considerably.

What steps can a motorist venturing into the country take to

**prevent windscreen breakage?**

Apart from driving slowly near other vehicles, a number of useful devices have been developed to protect screens.

Most of these consist of perspex sheeting, which is clipped across the windscreen to take the impact of flying stones.

Another type is a plastic mesh screen which can be pulled into place from the driver's seat by means of a cable. This acts as a barrier to flying stones.

**Remedial**

What should you do when your screen shatters?

Many windscreens incorporate a "safety zone" in front of the driver, which should allow you to see well enough to pull off the road.

Failing that, some people retain a mental picture of the road ahead
