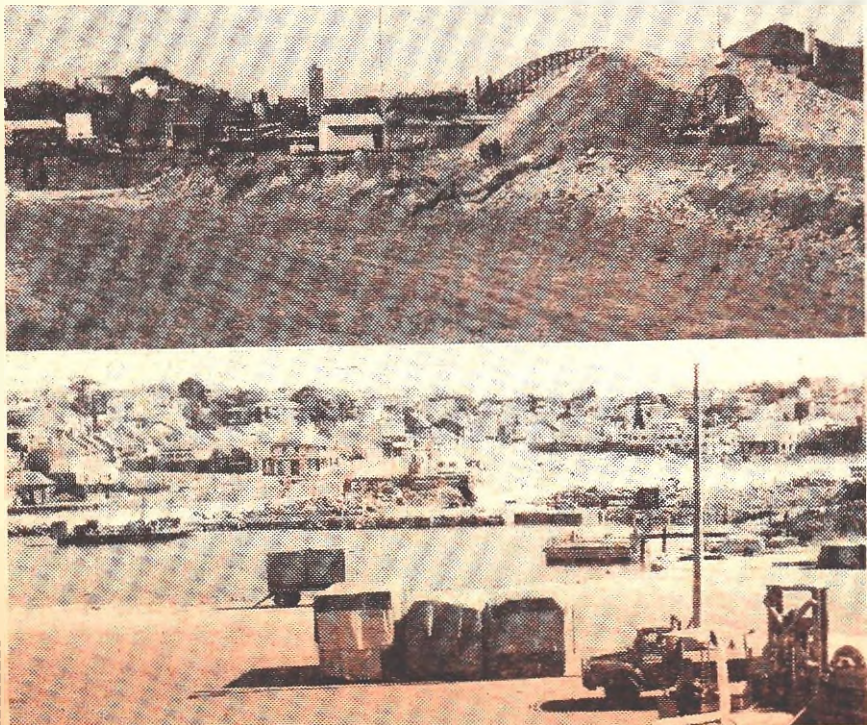

## Constructing new Terminal



Our composite picture is of the scene last week at Mort Bay, Balmain, showing earth works on the site of the new container terminal for the Australian National Line.

This preliminary work is being performed under contract by Leewil Constructions Pty. Ltd., of Fairfield, at a cost of about \$400,000. Work commenced last January and is due for completion next January.

It has involved rock excavation, some reclamation, dredging, underwater excavation (including blasting) to deepen the water near the site of the berth, and filling in of old Mort's Dock.

Work on constructing the new terminal is expected to start in about a month's time. Tenders for it are now being examined.

# LIBRARY PLAN IS REJECTED

At last week's meeting of Leichhardt Council the "majority" rejected unceremoniously, and in one case, cavalierly, three moves designed to keep open the door on the subject of municipal libraries.

Once again ratepayers and residents were discouraged from attending to watch the proceedings.

The usual committee meetings (held in camera) commenced at 7.30 p.m., and when the normal time came for the ordinary Council meeting (to be held in public), there were about 50 members of the public in attendance.

Their enthusiasm gradually subsided, however, and by the time the public meeting actually commenced, not one spectator was to be seen.

This was not at all surprising—for the clock then showed 12.20 a.m.!

### Rescission

One of the moves was a notice of motion by Aldermen Origlass, Wyner and Walker to rescind the motion passed a few weeks ago by which Council decided not to sign the Library Act (and thus qualify for a Government subsidy), but to confine its activities in the library field to paying for the cost of the Glebe Municipal Library (taken over from the City Council).

The rescission motion sought to have adopted the former amendment proposed by Ald. Origlass, that the Town Clerk report on the possibility and cost of extending the library ser-

vice to locations in other Council property, such as Balmain Town Hall and Annandale Council Chambers, so as to qualify for the Library Act subsidy, rather than carry the unsubsidised cost of one library on the extremity of the municipality.

Ald. Origlass said he believed the institution of two more library locations, or even only one more, would attract the subsidy. It seemed reasonable that Council could expand the library service at low cost, and that the move would demonstrate the Council's bona fides.

It would be short-sighted to refuse to go into this question by having the Town Clerk investigate the possibility, he added.

However, the Council "majority" refused to be invigled into reconsidering its attitude. It promptly rejected the motion.

### Committee

A gentler, although probably just as decisive, temporary fate met a letter from the Committee for the Promotion of Public Libraries in Leichhardt Municipality, which represents 40 local organisations, including every educational group in the community.

This letter put the following views to Council:

- It was pleasing that arrangements could be made to keep the Glebe Library open.

- Concern was expressed that co-operation with the City of Sydney seemed to depend upon acceptance of the Library Act and that such action was apparently not contemplated by Council.

- Since money paid from the general funds for Glebe Library would not be subsidised, acceptance of the Library Act with the inevitable extension of some facilities to other wards would be

both beneficial and economical for the community.

- Council should advertise widely the fact that Glebe facilities were open to all residents of the municipality.

Council, however, refused to do anything about the committee's approach. It simply "received and noted" the letter.

### By-passed

The third move received quite cavalier treatment, and brought protests from the "opposition" that the majority were disregarding the normal rules of debate.

It was a proposition by Ald. Walker (Glebe), which had been on the notice paper for quite a while, that an inquiry be made from Northcott Council as to the possibility and cost of continuing the mobile library which used to visit parts of Glebe before the split-up of the City Council area.

At the previous Council meeting the majority decided that the matter be deferred and an inspection be made of the area in which the mobile library operated.

At last week's meeting Ald. Walker was still not allowed to move his motion. His effort was by-passed by a motion from another alderman—which was carried—that nothing be done about the library until after the Northcott election.

## Column NINE

### CONTROL THOSE DOGS!

Control over dogs in this area seems to be sadly lacking, and a clean sweep is urgently needed.

The strays around the suburbs continually make a nuisance of themselves, leaving their trademarks—some not so pretty.

Dogs are a wonderful comfort and great friends. However, their place is in the backyard, not wandering around despoiling other people's property. It's bad enough when one has to clean up after one's own pet without being subjected to cleaning up after someone else's.

People with dogs even on a leash have been seen to stand while their pets cover the footpath and shopfronts with a great mess, which is then left for those with a sense of pride to clean up.

Shopping and dogs do not go together. It is quite inconsiderate to take them into stores. They can—and do—cause a great deal of damage when they are taken in. This reflects a nonchalant, careless attitude in the owner.

By all means enjoy the pride of ownership of an attractive pet, but keep it in your own surrounds where, if your dog has not been properly trained, its animal actions affect nobody but yourself and your family.

Dog-lovers should remember that any irresponsibility they may show in the control of their charges brings animal-loving generally into disrepute.

This paper appeals to them to display responsibility, and to the authorities to play their part in ensuring that this is done.

# New Site For High School

The Education Department is negotiating for a site for a new Rozelle Junior Boys' High School.

The Minister for Education, Mr. Cutler, gave this advice in State Parliament last week to Mr. Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain.

Mr. Degen, who has been agitating for a new school since he entered Parliament last February, told the Minister that the present school was grossly overcrowded.

The situation was so bad that pupils had to have staggered recess periods because the small grounds could not accommodate them all at the one time, he said.

In his reply to Mr. Degen, the Minister said negotiations had commenced to acquire a new site for the school. A very large sum of money was involved.

Mr. Cutler said he could not disclose details of the site at this stage, because such disclosure could prejudice negotiations.

He promised to give Mr. Degen full details of the site and the Department's plans as soon as the negotiations had been completed.

## Teachers' Problems

Teachers from Balmain district schools interviewed the Member for Balmain, Mr. R. Degen, at Parliament House, last week.

The teachers from Ibrox Park Boys' High School, Rozelle Junior Boys' High and other schools, pressed their

claim for adequate staffing for schools, a reduction in class sizes, provision of adequate relief staff, Teachers' College scholarships for all suitable and qualified applicants, implementation of the Government's promise to introduce a minimum of three years' training for teachers, increased trainee teachers' allowances, and re-opening of current salaries agreements.

Mr. Degen promised that the Labor Party in Government would immediately establish an Education Commission. It was pledged to do everything possible to impress on the Government the urgency of the problem of teacher shortage.

He said his party had already decided on its

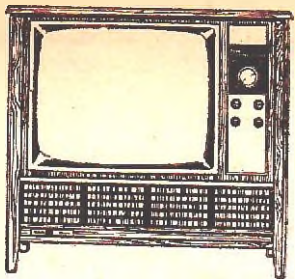

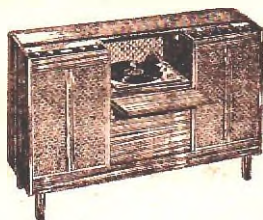

# PLEA FOR PRIVACY

Support for some of the main arguments used by "The Link" and other champions of the Balmain-Rozelle district as a living area comes from a prominent N.S.W. judge.

He is Mr. Justice Else-Mitchell, of the N.S.W. Land and Valuation Court.

In an address to the N.S.W. division of the Australian Health Surveyors' Institute, he said that some grave planning mistakes by metropolitan councils had forced people to sell their homes and move because their privacy had been destroyed.

Most of the errors were in allowing industries, flats and licensed clubs in or close to living areas. This had often changed the whole character of a locality irretrievably.

Mr. Justice Else-Mitchell said the gravity of such mistakes was highlighted by the fact that once a consent was given it could not usually be withdrawn — or only with compensation.

Home owners generally had no appeal against erroneous decisions, but developers who had applications rejected had the right of appeal to the Land and Valuation Court, a most serious anomaly and one which councils did not seem over-anxious to correct.

He added that council's willingness to allow piecemeal development, inadequacy of access to roads, and the presence, or non-presence, of public reserves

were causing problems in closely built areas.

This was fast reducing closely built areas to conditions of brick and concrete aridity, which would become residential blots, if not the slums, of the next generation.

He urged councils to refuse a development in cases of doubt and let the courts decide the matter.

"The Link" regards the judge's statements as most important, demanding close examination by the Leichhardt Council.

"Grave planning mistakes" is a charge which could well apply to that body, especially in regard to the absence of any real plan.

In our Column Nine of the issue of July 17, we said: "Unless a real plan of reorganisation is proposed, this area will gradually become wholly industrial. You can't progress with a haphazard mixture of factories and homes side by side."

Our view on that occasion remains the same, except that it strengthens from week to week.

## VICTORIA ROAD IS CLEARWAY

Victoria Road, for practically its whole length between the central city area and Church Street, Parramatta, is now a "clearway".

This means that during the times specified no car may even stop in the street on the side used by peak traffic.

These are between 7 and 9 a.m. on the inward side leading to the city, and 4-6 p.m. on the outward side, on the section between the Pymont Bridge area and Marsden Road, Ermington; and 6.30-8.30 a.m. on the side leading to the city, and 4-6 p.m. leading out, between Ermington and Parramatta.

The Minister for Transport (Mr. Morris) says that the advantage of a clearway over the proliferation of individual restrictions is that it is perfectly clear that no vehicle is to stop (for

parking, standing or unloading purposes, even for the setting down of passengers, except by buses).

This allows motorists to use with confidence all usable lanes marked down on the road.

Most of Victoria Road

in the Balmain-Rozelle area has, of course, been a prohibited area for peak-hour standing. The declaration of a clearway strengthens the confidence drivers may have in ability to use the kerbside lane in the direction of peak-hour traffic.

## Terminal Use On Sundays

In view of steps taken to restrict activities on Sundays in the A.N.L. terminal area at Balmain, the Minister for Shipping and Transport, Mr. I. Sinclair, is confident that grounds for complaint will not occur in the future.

This advice was given by the Minister to Mr.

W. P. O'Connor, M.P., in reply to representations made on behalf of Leichhardt Municipal Council following use of the terminal on Sunday, July 21.

Mr. Sinclair added that, while he was concerned at the effect on local residents of the considerable movement of vehicles in the vicinity of the terminal on that day, he was satisfied that use of the terminal then was in the nature of an emergency arising from a series of incidents beyond the control of the line.

## Municipal Library

As the mother of two young children—and, until we moved to Balmain, a resident of Woollahra, where we had the use of an excellent municipal library—may I say how deplorable I think it is that Balmain does not have its own library, or, at the very least, a branch library?

No one can deny the need for good and well-stocked libraries for the use of our children, and particularly so when our schools are so poorly supplied with books and our education system demands more and more reading.

I understand approaches for a public library made to Leichhardt Council were rejected on the grounds that the municipality could not afford one, and that, as a large proportion of the population were migrants, they couldn't read books written in English!

That surely is the right way to perpetuate ignorance of our language!

## Industrial Road Use

In a recent issue "The Link" dealt with a question of major importance for the Balmain peninsula and its residents—the increasing attraction of heavy vehicles to the district and the totally unsuitable road system to sustain them.

The Australian National Line is proceeding with a container cargo terminal at Mort Bay, to cater for which resump-tions and roadwork to the tune of \$3½ million are estimated as necessary by the Council engineer.

But, as you point out, the Department of Main Roads has no plans whatever for the peninsula. Nor has the A.N.L., which is concerned only with sea carriage.

As far as the authorities are concerned, this leaves the onus squarely on the local ratepayers to foot the bill, on the theory that if their Council approves industrial development, it thereby assumes the responsibility of providing satisfac-

tory roads for their operation.

Leading British architect, engineer and town planner, Professor Colin Buchanan, speaking to the State Planning Authority on July 9, 1968, stressed the need to integrate transportation and land use planning. He said: "I am astonished that it has taken so long to recognise the need for such studies."

Not only is a continuing nightmare in preparation for the people of the Balmain peninsula, but they will be expected to dig deep to pay for it.

Because of the complete absence of co-ordinated planning so essential for the establishment of viable undertakings, the fate of the Balmain peninsula bids fair to become a standing indictment of the State Plan-

**FIRES IN THE OPEN**

The N.R.M.A. reminds the public that the bushfire regulations, which operate from March 31 next year, pro-October 1 this year to prohibit all cooking fires in the open except those set in properly constructed fireplaces which are not less than 15 feet from any log or stump.

The surrounding area must be cleared completely for five feet.

Motorists who either use fireplaces built by councils or who build their own should make sure the fire is out when they are ready to leave.

Fire experts say the only sure way of doing this is to cover the embers with soil and stones. Dousing a fire with water is not good enough.

Motorists should never toss burning cigarettes or matches from cars. The penalty for doing this can be severe. A first offence can bring a \$200 fine or six months gaol (or both).

## Don't Block Intersection

It is not only a discourteous act for a motorist to drive into a blocked intersection and thus prevent cross traffic passing through—it is also a traffic offence.

N.R.M.A. officials have observed that many drivers are still not aware, or are ignoring, regula-

tion 67B of the Motor Traffic Act introduced a few years ago.

This says that, notwithstanding the direction of any traffic control light signal to proceed, a driver shall not enter or attempt to enter any intersection if the carriageway directly beyond it, or one into which he intends to turn, or the intersection itself, is blocked by vehicles.

Mr. W. Mason, N.R.M.A. General Secretary, said the regulation was directed at making people exercise a basic courtesy towards others.

Under present-day traffic conditions, motorists must make the best use of the limited facilities, he said. Leaving intersections clear was one way they could personally make some contribution to a smoother traffic flow.
