

"It, doesn't matter where the central library is situated, so long as it is established in a busy, convenient place. And when the branch libraries come, they, too, should be in a busy place. But let us give heed to the advice of the Library Board experts.'

Mr. Smith said he had not seen so much interest in a local election in his time in the district. He hoped the complicated form of the election would not confuse electors, and that electors would take the trouble to vote.

"If you want libraries," he concluded, "see that you vote for those to you."
