

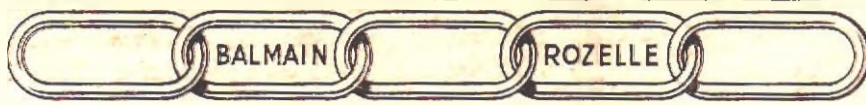

CONTINUED STAGNATION, OR A NEW START?

This Is To Be Your Decision Next Saturday

Never have Balmain and Rozelle faced a more important election than the one you will decide next Saturday. Voting is not compulsory. However, there is an obligation for all residents to show they are interested in local affairs.

Column NINE

You will elect a new Council to administer this area for the next three years. And make no mistake: three years is a long time. It can mean development, or it can mean complete destruction of these suburbs as residential areas.

It is common knowledge that a top-heavy Labor vote has left little opportunity for any opposition on major points which vitally affect this area. The bulldozing by weight of numbers has had a marked effect on the general appearance of the suburbs—VERY noticeable to long-standing residents who have witnessed the decline that is visually evident here.

We have lost a tremendous number of our real Balmainites for many reasons, major ones being the following:

- Dissatisfaction with the scars of industry which have been allowed to crowd them out.
- Ridiculously inflated property values, which fooled them into thinking they were making huge profits by selling, then to find that the money they received represented only a deposit on homes in more progressive areas.
- Council rates have increased, together with water rates, to a point where in some instances they are ten times greater than 20 years ago. In fact, the highest rated suburb in Sydney to live in is Balmain, which has always been basically a working man's suburb.

THIS IS WHAT HAS HAPPENED THROUGH ALLEGIANCE VOTING TO LABOR ASSOCIATED CANDIDATES.

For the past two years this column has stated that there is no room for political parties in

the selection of aldermen. They must be elected with complete disregard of any party, and chosen WHOLLY because they are conscious of the needs of their ward, and with one interest only: To promote and develop a modern suburb for the residents as well as industry (but industry in its proper perspective).

Now, let's analyse what is possible in the forthcoming election: A breakaway party opposing official labor, and two independents (in the Balmain ward).

Firstly, the Labor candidates now openly state they will beautify by street tree planting and provide parking. This paper has constantly pointed out that these things are essential. WHY has it taken this election for them to become conscious of the need? They have had two years to make a move. What certainty is there that they will bring about the existence of these things if elected?

Now the breakaway candidates: Some of them have been on the Council for a considerable period, and now hope for a majority or strong representation. Why did they accept the block voting of the Labor supporters without demanding some type of inquiry?

Credit must be given to the breakaways for their opposition to chemical storage, and for this the voters certainly need to show appreciation.

So it appears that if you, together with residents of many other suburbs, now realise that politics have NO place in local affairs, you will elect free-thinking men and women without any political pressures. This, of course, means independents (where standing).

Independents have no directing body or back-up from any party, therefore their overriding incentive is the question of improving the area in which they live. They do not work to elevate any political party within their municipality.

We hope we have given you a run-down on what has occurred and what could occur in the future.

EVERY DOLLAR YOU HAVE INVESTED HERE NEEDS TO BE PROTECTED.

On Saturday become a completely unattached, free-thinker and make your vote count for a "New-Deal" Balmain and Rozelle. VOTING DETAILS

Only those persons enrolled on the municipal roll of electors in the respective wards made in 1968, and who retain the requisite qualifications, are entitled to vote at the election.

Electors must vote at one of the polling places fixed for the ward in which they are enrolled.

The method of voting and counting of votes will be according to the preferential system (and not the "proportional" system as in the past).

Applications for postal votes have already closed. Postal ballot papers (which have been issued

by the Returning Officer) must reach him by 5 p.m. on Friday next (if delivered) or before 6 p.m. Saturday next (if posted).

Three aldermen are to be elected for each ward. Voting will take place between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on Saturday at the following polling places:

 "It is essential that any provision of parking space—either for workers or residents—should not be at the expense of the people's amenities, including facilities for open-air enjoyment and exercise for children.

Activities of this type must also result in further encroachment on the waterfront. This must be prevented. We already have far too little access to the waterfront in this district."
 Mr. Churton said that one of his own important planks was establishment of a senior citizens' centre in Balmain, with suitable occupational activities.
 That idea, however, warranted something better than mere use of a back room at the Town Hall. A building should be erected specially for the purpose.

Work Of Balmain Hospital

There were 601 babies born in the maternity section of Balmain and District Hospital last financial year.

This was one of the interesting set of statistics in the annual report of the hospital, submitted to the annual meeting recently.

During the year ended June 30 last, the number of outpatients treated was 28,011. In-patients totalled 5,757, with an average stay of 10.9 days. The adjusted daily average of patients was 210.9.

There were 2,558 operations performed in the operating theatres.

The President, Mr. W. F. Pinerua, reported that one of the difficult tasks faced by the administration was a complete revision of staff duties and rostering, due to introduction of the three-year nurses' training programme.

This had caused a major upheaval with previous staff organisation. To ensure that trainees obtained the maximum training and experience in the shortened period (from four years to three years), the services of a management consultant were secured to review the duties of the entire staff and to do a work study in depth.

Mr. K. R. J. Boylan, Chief Executive Officer, reported that the planning for a number of projects had been completed or substantially advanced. If adequate finances became available, it was hoped that the following would be undertaken in 1968-69:

New medical records room and facilities, additional air-conditioning equipment for the lower ground floor operating

theatres, extensions to the resident medical officers' quarters and to the clean linen storage area, remodelling of the kitchen, and installation of an automatic x-ray film processor.

Following appointment of a fees collection officer, a notable improvement in the overall cash collection rate was achieved. This was now 97.1%. Outstanding fees at June 30 totalled \$123,888 of which Workers' Compensation and Third-party cases amounted to \$84,056.

The expenditure budget was exceeded by \$3,957, and the hospital completed the financial year with a small trading loss—\$4,002. These results were viewed as satisfactory.

Balmain Must Take It

The Police Traffic Branch has not viewed sympathetically the petition by 810 Balmain, Birchgrove and Rozelle residents urging action to remove the danger and nuisance arising from use of local streets by heavy transport vehicles.

Since this is "an industrial area", residents must expect the annoyances referred to, in the opinion of Traffic Superintendent Lindsay.

The superintendent's letter in reply to the petition was read to last week's meeting of Leichhardt Council.

The Council had declined to deal with the petition under its own Local Government powers and had forwarded it to the traffic police for attention.

Supt. Lindsay said that the matter had been fully investigated. His view was that the area was an industrial district and the presence of heavy vehicles must be tolerated.

As in other areas where heavy vehicles were used, action had been taken in cases of vehicle defects. The police were fully aware of the difficulties in the area, in regard to work on the container wharves, but drivers concerned had agreed to co-operate with the police in reference to transport of earth.

Existing traffic rules

amply covered the situation, and suitable action had been taken by the department in any case of insecure load or inadequate covering.

The superintendent added that the route followed by the vehicles in question had been carefully considered before being approved. Although turning in the area was difficult, the position would not have been obviated by the choice of any other route.

Any instances of speeding or other traffic breaches had been taken care of. However, the accident history of the area indicated that heavy vehicles were being driven with reasonable safety.

"The annoyance referred to by the residents," he wrote, "must be expected in an industrial area such as this. Nevertheless this department is taking all necessary action to alleviate the position."

"NOT TRUE"

Ald. N. Origlass told Council that the superintendent had been misinformed about the nature of the district. It was not true to say that it was an "industrial area". Not more than 12 per cent of it was devoted to industry.

He urged Council to do more than merely "receiving" the letter and "noting" the remarks.

Ald. I. Wyner expressed annoyance that police should expect "industrial areas" to "take it".

Ald. E. Lewis thought the superintendent was wrong. He said that any district was entitled to protection from such conditions.

Without comment, the Council "majority" decided that the reply be "received and noted".

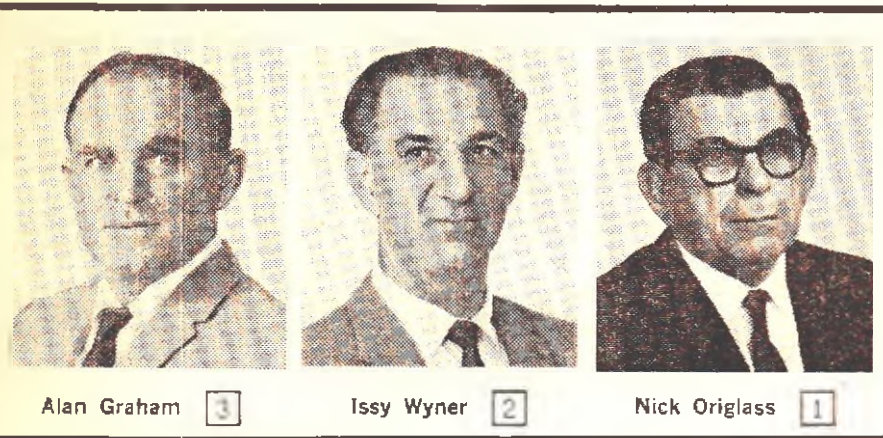

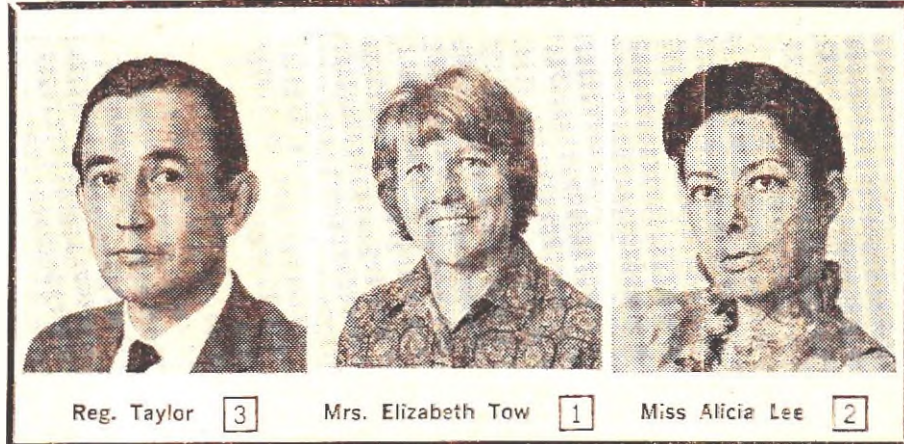

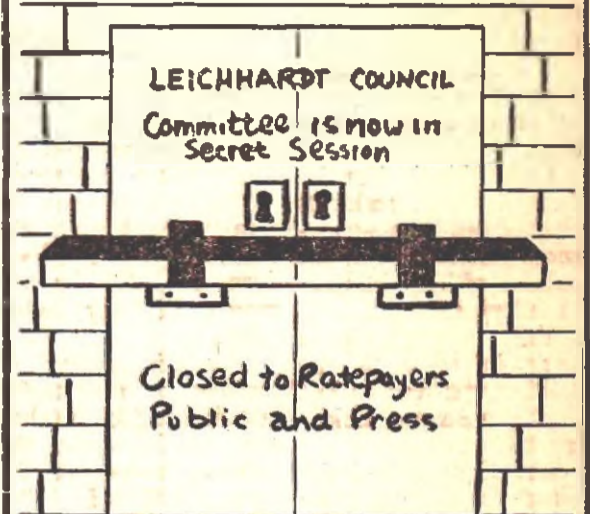
A recent decision of the State Government abolished compulsory voting in Local Government elections.

RULES "STOP BUILDING"

The reason that large-scale residential re-development is not taking place on the Balmain peninsula is to be found in the operation of local and State regulations, which combine virtually to prohibit the building of flats and units.

That is the view of Mr. B. A. Shaw, realty expert, of Darling Street, Balmain.

Referring to "The Links" consistent advocacy of a policy of re-development, Mr. Shaw said there was no doubt that this area possessed more natural amenities than most other inner suburbs, was close to the city, and had alternative forms of public transport.

It was logical that as many people as possible should be encouraged to live here.

Most, if not all, the candidates offering themselves for election to Council for this locality appeared to be strongly in favour of this policy also.

Mr. Shaw said that the only way accommodation could be provided for additional population was by erecting blocks of residential flats or units on sites at present occupied by single dwellings.

"It may seem strange," said Mr. Shaw, that large-scale development is not taking place when conditions appear to

favour it so strongly. The reason is to be found in the operation of certain local and State regulations which combine virtually to prohibit the building of flats and units.

"These regulations are designed to prevent undesirable development, but in this area their effect has been to prevent owners rebuilding on their land and has driven builders to other districts.

"The two main considerations are:

• **The Planning Scheme.** Under this, flats and units may be erected only in sections zoned 'Residential 2 (b)'. Approximately 25 per cent of Balmain has been zoned in this fashion, which means that flat construction is prohibited in three-quarters of this area.

• **The raising of minimum site standards.**

"Ordinance 71 states that residential flat buildings can cover no more than 35% of the allotment, and a 3-storey building must stand at least 9 ft. clear of the boundaries on either

side. This regulation effectively controls over-development of any site, but at the same time permits erection of buildings of various sizes, according to the size of the block.

"However, in Leichhardt Municipality there is a local regulation which says that flats will be permitted only on sites of 7,000 sq. ft. or more, and that these sites must have a minimum frontage of 60 ft. at the building alignment."

Mr. Shaw added that the only way in which large-scale residential development could be encouraged was, firstly, by reverting to the minimum standards laid down in Ordinance 71; and, secondly, by extending the "Residential 2 (b)" areas substantially, preferably to cover the whole of the Balmain peninsula.

He was positive that if the restrictions were to be eased, the building of flats and units would be encouraged and the residential character of Balmain would rapidly reassert itself.
