Only time will tell whether the new Council has any new thoughts to offer as the municipality's contribution to residential re-development.

Long Range

Observers declare that while this must be a long-range plan, depending upon the degree of co-operation from the State Planning Authority and other Government instrumentalities in respect of zoning, the initiative must be taken by the local authorities (i.e.. the Council).

This paper considers that the Council must accept the principle that the Balmain-Rozelle district will be irrevocably harmed unless its residential atmosphere is not only maintained, but restored to previous levels.

Limited

"The Link" was told by a spokesman for the Housing Commission that its resources were very limited. It could build only a certain percentage of its total programme in the metropolitan area, and had stretched its resources far and wide.

"Public housing is playing a fairly restricted statutory authorities with the spokesman added. "Any large-scale redev elopment is not a very real prospect at present. We have looked at Balmain dozens of times, but land prices are against us, and are tending to go against us all the time.'

The spokesman added that the Commission had to be guided by the planning authorities. It could not set itself up as a planner. It was not the Commission's function to be a major re-development agency, and people had to see that position realistically.



College Commerce Courses

Mr. B. Bailey, Principal of West Sydney Technical College, reports the conclusion of the academic year for students in the School of Commerce at the College.

During 1968, courses were conducted in subjects of the Commerce Certificate, Commerce (Accounting Procedures) Certificate, Accountancy Certificate, and Post-Certificate Cost Accounting.

The Commerce Certificate offers a general training in commerce with a bookkeeping and accounting strand.

For students who wish to undertake training in accountacy, the Commerce (Accounting Procedures) Certificate offers a more specialised training in this topic.

Mr. Bailey said that during 1969 the college would be conducting courses in the above certificates, and in stages 3 and 4 of the Accountancy Certificate. Classes would also be available in Cost Accounting subjects for students who wished to qualify as cost accountants.

Enrolments for 1969 commence on January 20 at the college in Crystal Street, Petersham, and are effected by completing the necessary enrolment form and paying the prescribed fees.

Mr. Bailey said that this date applied also to the full-time Day Secretarial Course and Evening Shorthand and Typewriting classes.




