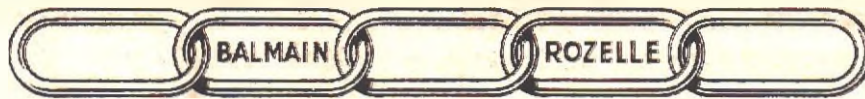

# BALMAIN HOMES PROBLEM

One of the most important subjects calling for attention by the new Leichhardt Council is the problem of "Homes for Balmain". This newspaper considers that the future of the Balmain peninsula as a residential area could be influenced considerably by Council's approach to the question of zoning and planning.

"Old Balmainites" are anxiously awaiting result of the Council's consideration of objections to its planning scheme. Council will now have an opportunity to reconsider its approach to the problem of development.

Adoption by Council of a neutral role—or one favouring further industrialisation of the district—would leave a completely free hand to Government planners who appear to have "written off" this area as a residential district. The Government would assume that local opinion was of little account.

On the other hand, local objections centred through the local Council must be beneficial in bringing home to the Government the necessity to tread more carefully in its planning affecting this district.

Only time will tell whether the new Council has any new thoughts to offer as the municipality's contribution to residential re-development.

## Long Range

Observers declare that while this must be a long-range plan, depending upon the degree of co-operation from the State Planning Authority and other Government instrumentalities in respect of zoning, the initiative must be taken by the local authorities (i.e., the Council).

This paper considers that the Council must accept the principle that the Balmain-Rozelle district will be irrevocably harmed unless its residential atmosphere is not only maintained, but restored to previous levels.

This cannot be done without favourable consideration of the objections to aspects of the Leichhardt Planning Scheme, such as some of

those contained in the report of The Balmain Association (summarised in "The Link" some months ago).

Without considerable rezoning of this district, designed to encourage large-scale development, it would appear that hopes for a display of interest by such developers as the N.S.W. Housing Commission are doomed.

Secretary of the Commission, Mr. J. M. Bourke, recently told Mr. R. Degen, M.L.A., that, because of adverse zoning, high cost of acquisition or unsuitable locations, none of the sites recently inspected by had been considered suitable for the Commission's purposes.

## Zoning

Mr. Bourke was replying to a letter from Mr. Degen requesting that the Commission investigate the possibility of acquiring land around the foreshores of Balmain vested in various statutory authorities with a view to further housing development.

Mr. Bourke presumed that the lands in mind would be those pertaining to Callan Park Mental Hospital, Maritime Services Board, White Bay Power Station, Electricity Commission, wheat terminal, etc.

Unfortunately none of those sites would be suitably zoned for the Commission's purposes, apart from the fact that the authorities concerned would no doubt require the lands for their own purposes.

The Commission had built several projects within the Balmain electorate, and had inspected quite a large number of additional ones.

It was continually seeking land suitable for high density develop-

ment, and would be pleased to investigate specific parcels available for acquisition within the electorate upon receipt of relevant details.

The Commission, added the secretary, currently held two parcels of land at Toelle Street, Rozelle. Architectural plans for the development of these had reached quite an advanced stage but could not be proceeded with as the sites were affected by the current proposals of the Department of Main Roads.

## Limited

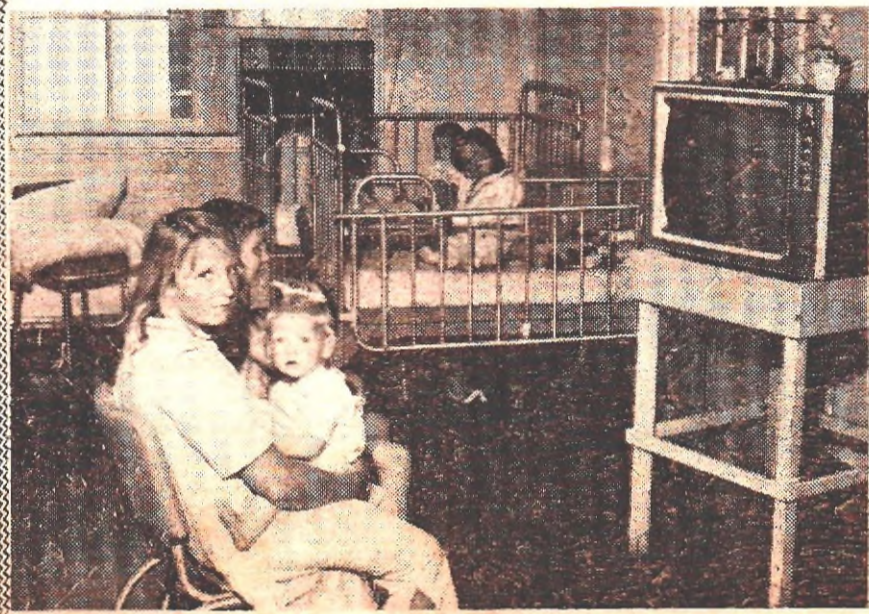
"The Link" was told by a spokesman for the Housing Commission that its resources were very limited. It could build only a certain percentage of its total programme in the metropolitan area, and had stretched its resources far and wide.

"Public housing is playing a fairly restricted role in the community—unfortunately, perhaps," the spokesman added. "Any large-scale redevelopment is not a very real prospect at present. We have looked at Balmain dozens of times, but land prices are against us, and are tending to go against us all the time."

The spokesman added that the Commission had to be guided by the planning authorities. It could not set itself up as a planner. It was not the Commission's function to be a major re-development agency, and people had to see that position realistically.

## ELECTION RESULTS

Voting in Leichhardt Council elections has resulted in the success of the three Balmain-Leichhardt Labor Party candidates for the Balmain Ward and the three Official Labor Party candidates for the Rozelle Ward.

Those elected for Balmain were Ald. N. Origglass, Ald. I. Wyner and Mr. A. Graham. Those elected for Rozelle were Mrs. A. Cashman, Mayor; Ald. D. Casey, and Mr. R. Heffernan.

Official figures were not available at the time of going to press. Counting for other wards had not been completed, but it would appear that Council will again be dominated by Official Labor.

It is understood that a special meeting of Council is planned for next Monday night, to elect the Mayor, and the ordinary meeting for next Tuesday night (when the year's rate will be struck).

Commenting on the Balmain-Rozelle results, Mrs. L. Roussos, campaign director for the

Balmain-Leichhardt Party, said the voting indicated tremendous dissatisfaction with the Council majority's policies.

"In Balmain the people showed they wanted aldermen who would protect the people's living amenities," she said. "The 'People Come First' policy was what they wanted."

"Also, it is important to note that the pressure of our campaign forced the Official Labor teams in the two wards to reverse some of their major policy points—including that on municipal libraries—so that they actually adopted the policies our party had put to Council but which were rejected some months before the election."

And what a shame when money is so hard to come by and time is the one thing no one can afford to waste.

"Disappointing" is the only word to describe the apathy displayed by residents, not only in this area, but in every municipality, towards the Council elections held last Saturday. The poor roll-up at all voting centres poses a problem which it is doubtful even the computer could solve.

# EDUCATIONAL "CRISIS"

The crisis that has occurred in education in N.S.W. was referred to by Mr. E. Smith, principal of Ibrox Park Boys' High School, at Speech Night on December 3.

The meeting, which was well attended, was chaired by Ald. Redwell, of Leichhardt Council.

Mr. Smith said that the changes that had occurred in education had produced a crisis. The solution was not hard to find, but hard to accept.

"With the population explosion, and the explosion in the standards of living," he said, "education is slipping back,

But so are the hospitals, and so are the roads — not in themselves, for we are building some wonderful roads—but in relation to the demand; for no sooner do we see a wonderful road built than we find it jammed with traffic.

"There was a time when our schools were rated very highly indeed in the world. Now we are about 14th in the proportion of our national income that we spend on education.

"We will get good

schools, roads, etc., if we are prepared to pay for them. But while we are content to pay small taxation in comparison to other countries, we will not get them.

"We must be prepared to pay half as much again on education as is being done now, and you must demand from your politicians that this be done.

"We are in the position of a man who builds two-thirds of a house, and then, horrified by the cost, does not build the final third at all. So the house as a building is only partly efficient, and as an investment, much of the money already spent is wasted."

"We waste money on education because we don't spend enough on it for it to function as it should. It is the biggest and best investment we make, but we want high returns on small capital outlay. That won't work."

Mr. Smith said that the aims of the course

had been widened because the public thought that things other than academic achievement were desirable—things like training in leadership, ability to speak, and courtesy to others.

Obviously only the school was in a position to evaluate achievement of this kind, and in 1968 half the marks taught for each subject were left in the hands of the principal to allot to the pupil for his school record over two years, taking into account his academic progress and the other matters mentioned.

Hence it was probable that many pupils would pass the School Certificate because they had been given a high assessment by the principal.

# Talks On Ferry

The Minister for Transport (Mr. Morris) has undertaken to have a discussion with the chairman of the Sydney Harbour Transport Board with a view to effecting further improvement in the Balmain ferry service.

Mr. Morris will also take an opportunity of discussing the subject with Mr. Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain.

Mr. Degen told "The Link" that before availing himself of the Minister's assurance that he would discuss improvements to the ferry service with Mr. Degen, the Member proposed immediately to seek submissions from all interested local organisations, business firms, trade unions and residents.

This would be done so that he could present the strongest possible case for providing Balmain with a satisfactory ferry service, to which the residents of the suburb were fully entitled.

Mr. Degen said he fully appreciated the points made by our correspondent, Thea Banks (Nov. 27), that ferry services to Hunter's Hill were incurring consistent yearly losses without threat to continuity of

operation, and that the recent extra charge of 3c a trip from Darling Street to the city imposed by the Askin Government in the course of an overall increase in fares on all forms of public transport was a further reason why a wider peak-hour and daily ferry service should operate from Balmain.

"The urgent need to improve the Balmain ferry service is a subject I have frequently brought to the attention of the Minister," said Mr. Degen.

"I have consistently refused to accept his answer that the service could not be improved as it was operating at a loss.

"The reason I have given to him for rejection of that answer is the same as that given by your correspondent—that, despite losses, some far greater than any incurred on the Balmain run, much better services

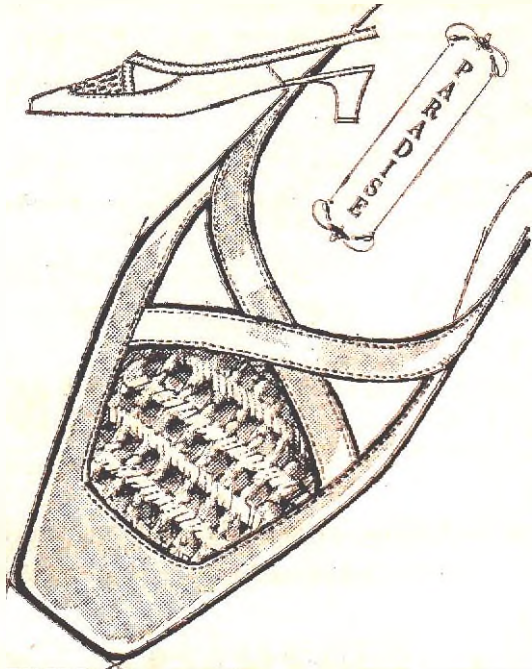

## College Commerce Courses

Mr. B. Bailey, Principal of West Sydney Technical College, reports the conclusion of the academic year for students in the School of Commerce at the College.

During 1968, courses were conducted in subjects of the Commerce Certificate, Commerce (Accounting Procedures) Certificate, Accountancy Certificate, and Post-Certificate Cost Accounting.

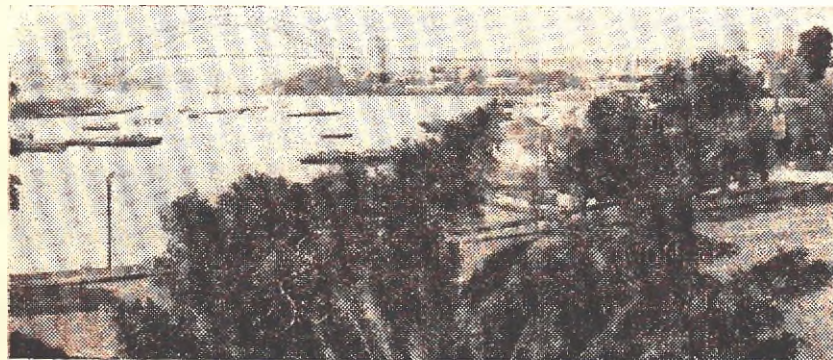
