## Club Solves Car Problem

# BALMAIN BATHS "MUDDY"

## Column NINE

### SHOPPING LOCALLY



Balmain Leagues Club members will soon have their car parking problem solved. A \$350,000 building to provide parking for an additional 175 cars close to the club premises is now approaching completion.

Under-cover parking for members visiting the club is now restricted to about 40 vehicles. Since club membership is over

10,000, this is patently inadequate.

The new facilities will be in a building next door but one to the club, with entrances and exits from both Victoria Road and Waterloo Street.

There will be four parking levels in the rear portion of the new building, and three levels in front.

The new premises are expected to be completed about April 20, and the club anticipates it will satisfy all normal demands with the additional accommodation.

Even with 10,000 members, Balmain Leagues Club is held to be only an average-

ties of this type in Sydney, but it occupies an important spot in this district's life.

It was founded and organised 12 years ago by "The Tigers" — Balmain District Rugby League Football Club.

In turn, Balmain Leagues Club has played an important role in actively sponsoring many of the district's sporting activities, such as clubs for swimming, rowing, bowls, golf, cricket, basketball, snooker, fishing and table tennis.

They declare that while conditions are reasonable at high tide, they are certainly not so at low tide, when silting up in the shallow parts of the pool has robbed children of their swimming area.

One mother told us: "My 8-year-old son said the other day he didn't want to go to the baths because the tide was low. I asked him why. He answered: 'What will happen if I get stuck in the mud?'"

"I replied: 'Rubbish. You won't get stuck in the mud!'"

"He answered: 'Well, cousin Robert did!'"

### "Concern"

The mother added: "Discounting some boyish exaggeration, I do know that other mothers are concerned about the state of the pool."

"At low tide there is no water in the special children's enclosure, and the kiddies have to go to the shallow part of the main pool. But this is really bad then. Come and I'll show you."

Our representative went to the pool, where a bather obligingly strolled through the shallow section. The water was up to his ankles mostly, and as he dragged his feet through the water he stirred up quite a quantity of mud.

We were informed that at times on low tide green weed on the surface of the water has been quite thick. Also stones have shown up on the muddy bottom.

### Too Late

The complainants stressed the urgent need for dredging of the shallow area, and the provision following this of a supply of sand to cover the bottom.

The deeper (southern) section of the pool has been dredged from time to time. The last occasion was in September last year, but work was

started too late for it to be finished before the opening of the current swimming season.

The shallow section has not been adequately dredged for over 40 years, according to our information.

Residents declare that it is imperative that this district should have a first-class swimming pool, as fares are too high for them to travel to other districts for their swimming.

### Problems

On the other hand, many people from outside the district come to the pool because they desire salt-water swimming here.

"The Link" has been told that residents feel Leichhardt Council has become disinterested in the pool, and that it is looking to the time when the baths may be closed altogether—which would be tragic.

Ald. I. Wyner (Balmain ward) informed us that the subject of the pool's condition has been reported to the Council's staff from time to time.

There were some problems associated with the dredging, he said, as part of the baths had to be pulled down to allow a dredge to get in. He thought this could be overcome by use of a pump known as a "sand sucker".

He thought there was a feeling in the Council that the baths should be allowed to "go".

Some years ago, he added, Balmain ward aldermen had asked the Council's engineer to prepare plans for a new pool in the vicinity. A number of suggestions had been forthcoming, but nothing concrete had eventuated.

He felt that the maintenance work on the baths was being commenced too late in the year to be completed before commencement of the swimming season.

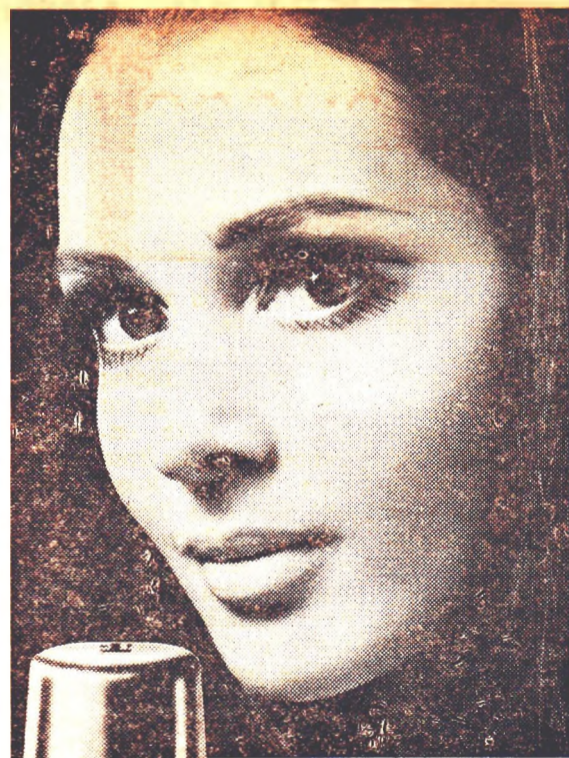

## Eating System Devised By Balmain Man

Mr. A. S. Roberts, a retired school teacher of Balmain, claims to have devised an unorthodox way of eating that not only reduces excess weight, but also promotes a healthy longevity.

He says the system he has devised effectively banishes the unsuspected cause of most common ailments, whose effects reduce the human life span.

Mr. Roberts says his system of dietary reform enables the body to rebuild its weaknesses and return to normal working. The three basic rules which must be adhered to in order to assist the more mature body back to completely automatic working are:

1. Carbohydrates, and especially all kinds of flour, must be fully saturated with saliva. All flour-containing foods must be restricted to a limited few that are free from grease and all other fluids when placed in the mouth.

2. Proteins should be finely minced or well chewed, and also well separated from all liquid intakes to ensure their

full breakdown by the undiluted gastric secretions.

This means that both eating and drinking should be done on an empty stomach. Therefore drink at least 45 minutes prior to eating and not within two hours after any solid food intake.

3. Fats require a preliminary emulsifying contact with saliva, and should also be well chewed, with some conscious retention in the mouth before swallowing.

Mr. Roberts adds that, while no one can stop the ageing process, the dietary reform outlined constitutes a new deal for the body that prevents early onset of health problems and postpones a premature state of immobilisation, senility and loss of independence.

# EATING ADVICE FOR THE THIN

There are diets for those who are overweight in almost every paper you care to look at, but what if you are underweight?

The treatment seems simple enough — eat more!

But for the thin person, eating extra food is often much more difficult than it sounds.

If you are very much underweight, the cause may be a disease and you should consult a doctor. However, often irregular eating and poor food selection are responsible for an inadequate calorie intake — one that does not meet your energy requirements.

The Nutrition Section of the N.S.W. Department of Public Health advises you to plan to eat three regular meals each day.

Don't skip breakfast or make it a hurried snack. It is worth the effort to get up a little earlier, and to relax over a substantial breakfast that will stop you feeling fatigued during the morning.

Your other meals, too, should consist of sensible foods. Include milk, meat, eggs, cheese, fruit, vegetables, cereals, bread and butter in your diet every day.

However, the emphasis should be on foods that are not too bulky, but that have a high calorie value and are easily digested.

For example, adding extra powdered milk, egg, sugar and cream to your milk drinks will increase the calories. Similarly, eat more butter, cream, creamed soups, milk puddings and ice cream in preference to large quantities of raw salads and clear soups.

Eating too many sweet foods, although supplying calories, will dull your appetite for your meals. Also, indiscriminate eating between meals will tend to spoil your appetite. It is better to plan your mid-meal snacks as you plan your meals.

Sensible snacks consist of such things as milk drinks, sandwiches, fruit, fruit juices, cheese or nuts.

## MORE FLIES LIKELY

An increase in the fly population could be expected following the recent warm, moist weather, the Department of Public Health said this week.

The Department's Chief Health Inspector, Mr. Harry Evans, said that improved sanitation was the first step in fly control.

Insecticides should be used to supplement but never to substitute for sanitation.

The yard should be clean and free of decaying vegetation and manure, as flies bred readily in decaying vegetable matter and compost.

Grease traps should be kept clean, and garbage kept in a container with a firmly fitting lid. All garbage should be wrapped in newspaper before being put into the bin.

If a pan closet was kept on the premises, place a half cupful of kerosene in each pan immediately it was received.

Immediately kill any flies which got into the house.
