Traffic lights placed only where conditions warrant them where an element of danger exists because of the volume and type of traffic.

The N.R.M.A. says that even though the light you are approachwith any of the club ing be green, drive up to it carefully, prepared to stop should the amber show.

Your speed should never be such that you have to take advantage of the amber period.

The amber appears only as a break to allow vehicles already in the intersection to be cleared.
