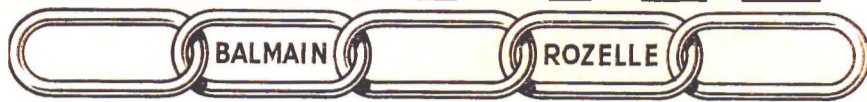

NEW MOVES IN BALMAIN HOUSING

Real estate moves in Balmain last week could result in the commencement of an important new era in home development in the suburb.

A big flat construction enterprise—the biggest yet for Balmain—is under way; and Leichhardt Council has decided to sell to private developers the unused land in its Balmain East housing project.

The new flat enterprise will be in the form of a block of 46 units in Gow Street, overlooking the harbour. The spot is near the junction of Glassop and Punch Streets.

Cost of the project is not known, but it will exceed \$250,000, and it is thought that it will be nearer \$500,000.

The land on which it will be built is a magnificent site, with a water frontage to Iron Cove near Elkington Park, and is believed to have a value of about \$100,000. It will permit of extensive views from the flats up and down the harbour.

The land is zoned "2 (b) Residential B" under the Leichhardt Planning Scheme.

At last Wednesday night's meeting, Leichhardt Council agreed to a development application for the enterprise, made by Kalbar Pty Ltd., a new investment company specially formed to develop the project.

Quality

Architect for the enterprise—Mr. S. Klein, of Edgecliff—told "The Link" that plans were now being prepared for the construction, but at this stage were only tentative.

The building would be of six floors, but as the land broke away sharply from Gow Street towards the water, only

two floors would be above street level.

It would be a very good quality structure, and would contain flats of one, two and three bedrooms.

It had not yet been decided whether the flats would be for sale, or for letting.

The building would be about 100 feet back from the water's edge. Plans included a two-level car park and improvement of an existing swimming pool, and could also embrace the building of a marina.

Detailed planning should commence shortly.

Council personnel made a works inspection of the site recently, and displayed enthusiasm regarding the enterprise.

Report

As reported in "The Link", Council made a works inspection a fortnight ago of the unused land in the Balmain East Council housing project.

This followed a recommendation from the four senior officers—Town Clerk, Engineer, Town Planner and Chief Building Surveyor—that the remainder of the land pertaining to the Brett Avenue housing project be sold to private developers.

The land is valued at \$176,000, and is owned by the Council, which had planned to use it in its municipal housing scheme, of which the "Yuruga" flats project was the first stage.

The officers' report said that the purpose of Council entering into a multi-storey housing project in Balmain was to set an example to developers and to indicate the potential of this particular area.

As an indication of the lead given by Council, a multi-storey residential block was in an advanced stage of construction on land next to "Yuruga".

A block of 24 residential flats had recently been completed and oc-

cupied at 15 Johnston Street, Balmain. Construction had commenced at No. 24 Pearson Street, Balmain (10 flats).

Building approval had been granted to the erection of 14 flats at No. 28 Pearson Street. An inquiry had been received for construction of at least 12 flats at the corner of Duke and Darling Streets, Balmain; also for the erection of a block of flats on land at the corner of Duke Street and Duke Place.

In addition, discussions had taken place with principals in regard to the erection of a 16-storey circular, tower-type residential flat building on land at Datchett and Union Streets, Balmain.

Reasons for the recommendation to sell were not given in the report.

The Mayor, Ald. L. Rodwell, told "The Link" that Council was not able to carry on with the project, for lack of funds.

No Funds

He thought that under private developers Balmain would be able to get something worth while in about two years, whereas it could take the Council ten years out of its own resources.

While Council owned the land it would not be securing revenue from it.

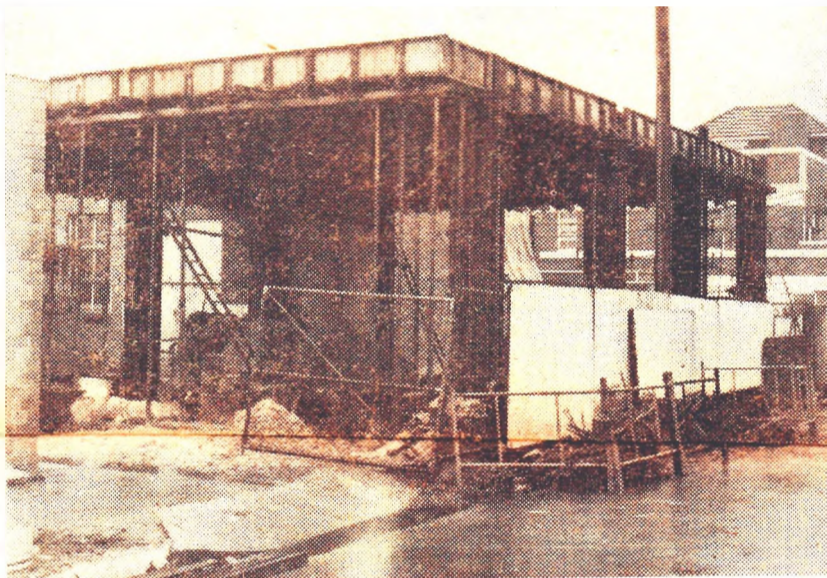
He did not think home building was Council's job. Council would be able to control the quality of any enterprise proposed for the area.

Also he thought that under private developers it was possible to have a marina and a swimming pool included in a development project.

At the Council meeting, the Works Committee report recommending adoption of the officers' report that the land be sold was approved.

The officers' report stressed that the first stage of the housing project had been a great success, and that Council had made a profit out

of it, at the same time being able to keep down the prices for the flats.

Objection to the move was made by the three Balmain ward aldermen—Messrs. Wyner, Origg and Graham.

Ald. Wyner moved an amendment to the motion for adoption of the report. This urged that the land be not sold and that the architect who designed the completed first stage be asked to prepare preliminary plans for a second stage.

Objections

He said that Council had set a pretty high standard because it was not out to make a huge profit. If they handed it over to private developers there was a fear that the construction would be down to a minimum standard because of the desire for profits.

Selling the land would be a very backward step, he said. When Council had bought the property it had done so on the justification that it would be the developer itself, and that this would commemorate the 100th anniversary of Balmain as a municipality.

The three Balmain aldermen, however, were the only ones voting for the amendment, which was lost.

An 8-week extension of contract, caused by the excavators striking unexpectedly hard rock for the foundations, will result in delay in completion of the building extensions to Balmain Post Office.

Our photo shows progress of the work, which is going on behind the existing structure.

The extensions are costing \$162,980, and are to both the Post Office and telephone exchange, at the corner of

Montague and Darling Streets.

They are due to be completed by early May (originally March).

The new extension to the existing exchange will comprise a single-storey brick and reinforced concrete structure, with provision for two future floors above ground level.

The work includes the addition of a single-storey postmen's room to the existing Post Office. This has already been completed.

LIVING IN BALMAIN

Recently a survey of the social standing of Sydney suburbs indicated that Balmain had moved up the ladder.

Unless this refers to the imaginative efforts by some homeowners to restore the original beauty and atmosphere of early-day homes, this statement is difficult to follow, particularly in view of the industrial expansion that has been allowed to take place here.

However, whether Balmain is No. 1 or No. 21 or lower in the social register makes little difference to residents for many years.

True Balmainites have always been proud to live here, and they make no secret of the fact.

The fly in the ointment has been a lack of planning, disregard for the beauty of the location, and a failure on the part of previous Councils and Parliamentary representatives to promote and encourage high density housing.

It is pleasing at long last to sense a more practical aldermanic approach—from Leslie Rodwell, the new Mayor, and his fellow aldermen of Leichhardt Council.

Disregarding political alliances, we may see from this man a very down-to-earth, sensible, business-like plan to correct the apathetic attitude that has existed here for far too long.

For years this column has pointed out the need for the adoption of business principles by Council. We will watch developments with extreme interest, in the hope that the strong condemnation we have been forced to make from time to time of aldermanic apathy will no longer be called for.

Meanwhile, CONGRATULATIONS, MR. MAYOR!

PARKING ACTION

The possibility of taking some action to improve car parking for shoppers in the Balmain business centre was forecast last week by the Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. L. Rodwell.

Our representative asked Ald. Rodwell for his view on the suggestion made by "The Link" that angle parking in Booth Street near Balmain Hospital be facilitated by slightly setting back the perimeter of Gladstone Park where it fronts Booth Street.

The Mayor replied that he had given some thought to the suggestion. Parking was one of the district's major

problems, he said.

He had had talks with some of the larger merchants of Parramatta Road, who were also faced with a parking problem for shoppers. Purchase of land there for such a scheme could be made only at a fantastic price.

There was a similar problem in Balmain, but conditions had so developed that Council would

have to do something about it.

"I think you will see something come out of it in the next few months," he said.

TRAFFIC NOISE AT MORT BAY

The Australian National Line had shown complete disregard for the rights of Mort Bay residents, the Member for Balmain, Mr. Roger Degen, M.L.A., said this week.

Mr. Degen was commenting on a reply from the Chairman of the Line, Mr. J. P. Williams.

Mr. Degen had sought assurances from the A.N.L. that the rights of local residents would be protected when Mort Bay was developed as a container terminal. He said the reply was most unsatisfactory.

He had now asked the State Government to impose rigid conditions on operations at the terminal.

Mr. Degen said he had sought voluntary restrictions by the Line to protect residents from noise associated with traffic movement and cargo handling.

Mr. Williams had replied:

"As far as practicable, hours of operation of transport vehicles will be

restricted to normal working hours, but it must be appreciated that there may be occasions where this cannot be rigidly adhered to.

"The Australian National Line has taken extreme care in programming ships' schedules to avoid as far as possible working outside these hours.

"You can rest assured that the Line will make every endeavour to restrict operation with a view to minimising disturbances by traffic cargo handling in the terminal area.

"This handling will be by fork-lift machines, and it is one of our requirements in the specification for such machines that they be fitted with efficient exhaust silencers."

Mr. Degen said that if the A.N.L. would not guarantee to restrict traffic movement to normal hours, then the Government must step in and protect the residents.

It would be intolerable if heavy transports were allowed to rumble through the streets at all hours of the night just to suit the convenience of the A.N.L.

Result of Loan

Subscriptions to the Commonwealth cash loan which closed on February 13 totalled \$201 million.

The loan was the second since abolition of the income tax rebate of 10 cents in the dollar on Commonwealth loan interest.

Over one-third of cash subscriptions were made by Savings Banks and superannuation and provident funds.

The total of \$201 million compared with \$113 m. for the November loan and \$124 m. for the February 1968 loan.

Although final figures are not yet available for the conversion offer to holders of \$120 m. of 5% securities which matured on Feb. 15 results so far show that \$81 have been converted.

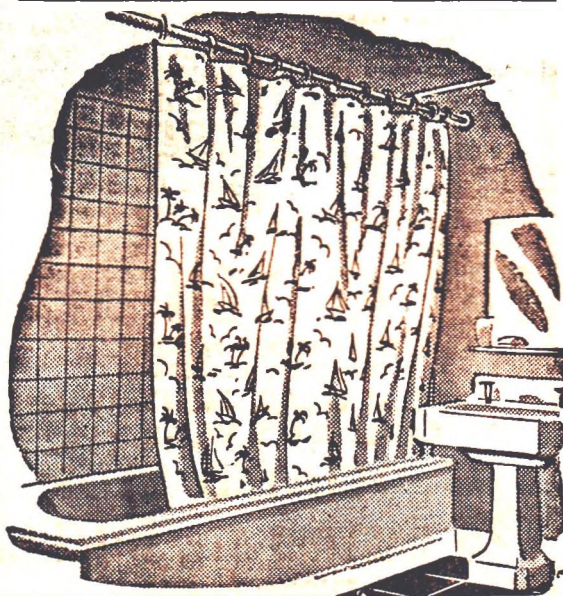

Power Station Safety

Mr. Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain, has strongly attacked "the lowering of safety procedures at Balmain Power Station".

He said that turbines at the station were being left running but unattended at night and at weekends.

In State Parliament Mr. Degen asked the Minister for Local Government, Mr. Morton—who is ministerial head of the Electricity Commission—to order the Commission to revert to previous safe working conditions.

Mr. Degen said the turbines were valued at many thousands of dollars. By leaving them unattended the Commission was increasing the danger of a serious breakdown.

He said the power station was being used only during the evening peak hours when other power stations on the coalfields could not cope with the demand.

The Electricity Commission had decided to leave turbines unattended except for the even-

ing shift, which was a complete departure from the previous safe working standards.

Mr. Morton admitted that Mr. Degen's information had been correct, but refused to order the Commission to reverse its decision.

Mr. Degen said that unions had been assured that no man would lose his employment as a result of the change, but he was seriously concerned about the employment future, and he would keep in touch with the employees to ensure that this assurance was kept.
