ACTION TIME FOR ROADS

Opportunity For Balmain

Lovers of Balmain-Rozelle: Get together now and push as hard as you can to get a breakthrough in your roading problem. There now exists, probably for the first time, an opportunity for successful action to cater for the growth of heavy traffic.

In the case of "main roads", the Department pays the whole cost of reconstruction and maintenance. In the case of "secondary roads", it pays half and the Council half.

The case for upgrading a Council road would rest on the amount of traffic generated outside its own area.

Balmain's case, therefore, would relate to the heavy industrial traffic to and from the major industries, especially the container terminals (including the new one being built at Mort Bay).

And what a case it is! Heavy goods to and from interstate and overseas trundled over narrow, twisting, hilly, lightly-surfaced Council roads, paid for by local ratepayers!

Two Roads

Failure of the various authorities to do anything about this up to the present has amounted to extraordinary indifference to their responsibilities.

The "insufficient funds" plea by the Department of Main Roads will not now be so convincing, however. So let's see a real effort to persuade it that action is now indispensable, since availability of more funds will make it possible.

Leichhardt Council, of course, has other areas requiring assistance, but these also affect Balmain ratepayers.

Last August Council deferred reconstruction of Lilyfield Road and Balmain Road because

of lack of money, and the work was shelved again when this year's estimates were passed recently.

Reconstruction, at a cost of \$200,000, is held by the Council to be an essential and urgent project, but in view of its finances it has no option but to defer it.

These roads are classified by the D.M.R. as secondary roads, calling for 50-50 financial responsibility. If they were upgraded to main roads, the D.M.R. (which wants to reconstruct them) would not have to wait for Council participation.

When "The Link" referred this matter to him, the Mayor, Ald. L. Rodwell, said Council would undoubtedly have a look at it now that the D.M.R. would have more funds for urban work.

He said it was essential that such a Council road as Mullens Street, Balmain, should be upgraded into "main road" classification to cater adequately for the heavy traffic using it.

Such a road should not be the responsibility of the ratepayers, but of the central roads authority, he said.

Bridge

Ald. Rodwell added that Leichhardt Council could not afford to rebuild Federal Road Bridge, closed because it was dangerous. Reconstruction, however, was necessary to cater for traffic using it, including bus traffic to and from Balmain.

The Minister for Local Government (Mr. Morton) had advised recently that the Government authorities had declined to take any responsibility, and the City Commissioners had also declined.

Ald. Rodwell said that in view of the availability of more funds for urban work he felt Council could make out a case for re-classification of that road, to allow of some financial help from the D.M.R.

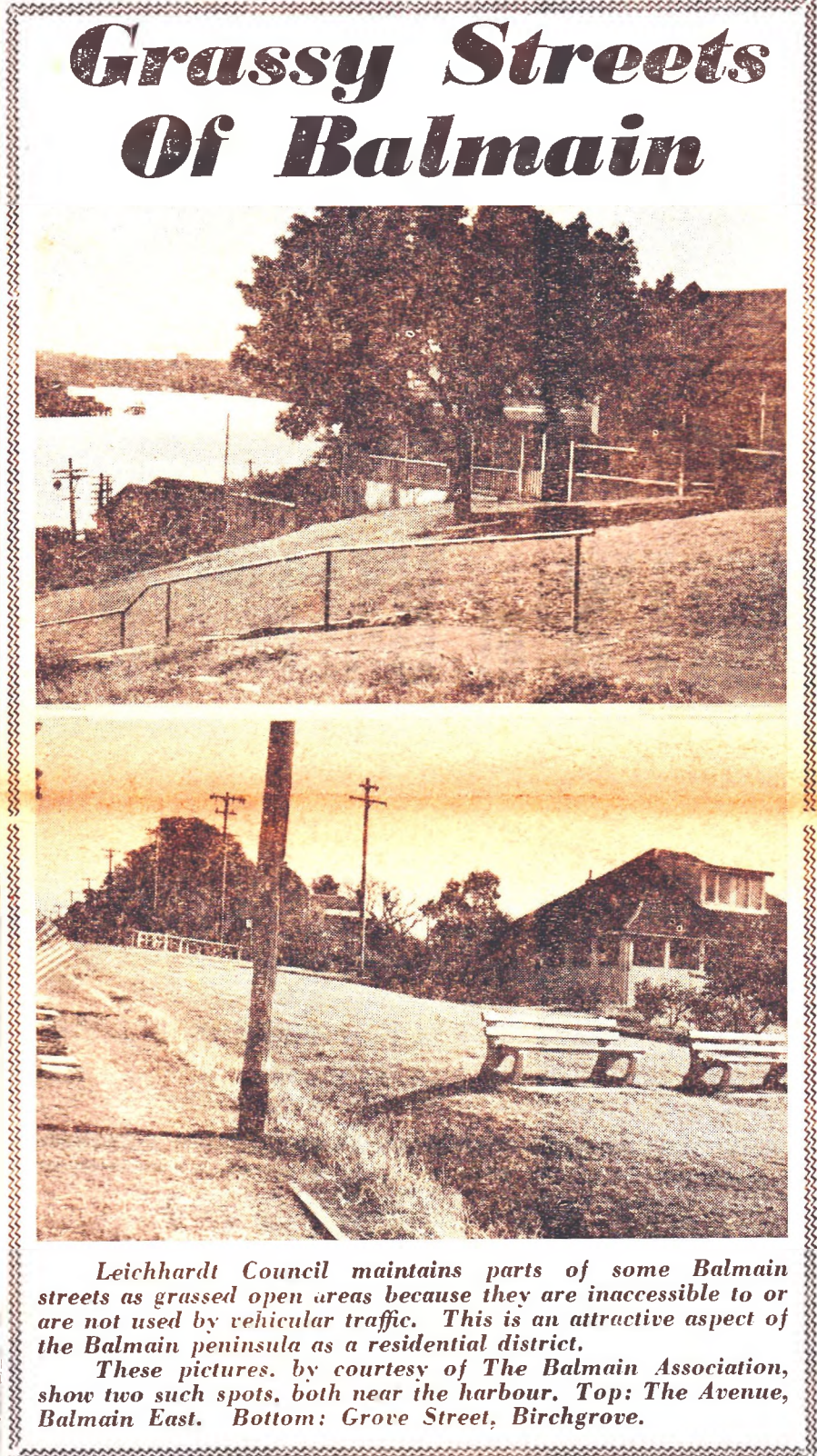
This is the view, of observers following last week's announcement of the new Commonwealth Aid Roads Agreement, by which greatly increased priority will be given to road work in the major cities.

Upgrading

Nearly 50 per cent of the total Federal aid for the next five financial years will be for urban roads.

"The Link" calls on all responsible persons and bodies in this district to get together and hit hard—and often—in an effort to cut through the maze which has prevented the building of proper roads here.

Federal and State politicians—Leichhardt Council—The Balmain Association—Balmain Industries Association—Chamber of Commerce and other business groups—now is the time to sink political and other differences and make a concerted appeal to the State roading authorities for the upgrading of

local roads to solve the traffic problem of the peninsula.

Every livewire Municipal Council in Sydney will now be thumping on the doors of the Minister for Highways and Local Government, and officials of the Department of Main Roads, seeking the upgrading of some of their local roads.

This upgrading is necessary to produce

central assistance in the work of building and maintaining local roads which are serving traffic from other areas more than their own.

Upgrading is not effected unless conditions demand it. However, such conditions exist in so many Sydney areas that it is inevitable that many will have to wait until the most urgent are attended to.

Upgrading by the De-

partment occurs generally on application by the Council concerned, although sometimes the Department acts on its own initiative.

Now, there is no doubt that Leichhardt Council can make out an excellent case for the classification of some Balmain peninsula roads as either "main roads" or "secondary roads", instead of their remaining merely Council roads.

Column NINE

TERMINAL OPENING

Observers have been wondering whether opponents of industrialisation would allow the official opening of the White Bay container terminal this Friday to go unheralded in local circles.

Obviously they won't. Both the Balmain-Leichhardt Labor Party and the Balmain Association announce in this issue that they are arranging meetings this week to protest against anticipated conditions.

It will, of course, be a red-letter day in shipping history. If we're any judge of local sentiment, it could also be an important day in the "Hands Off Balmain!" campaign.

Some residents have declared vehemently that their rights to ordinary living amenity have been trampled on by both Government and the planning authorities, and that the local municipal Council—Leichhardt—has been indifferent to their plight.

This was the main point at issue in the last municipal elections, and Balmain ward voters showed their resentment to the official Labor attitude by electing all three representatives of the breakaway group, which had campaigned so strongly against loss of living amenity.

The protests arranged for this week are aimed at stirring officialdom into doing everything possible to prevent development of nuisances from use of the new terminal, particularly noise.

Whether the fears are justified will not be known until the terminal is in full operation, but evidence of nuisance will, we understand, be produced.

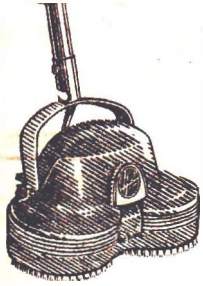
The terminal operators must keep these fears in mind and act with full awareness of their responsibility. If they do not, the law should step in to protect the public.

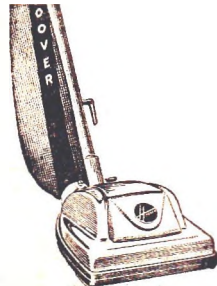

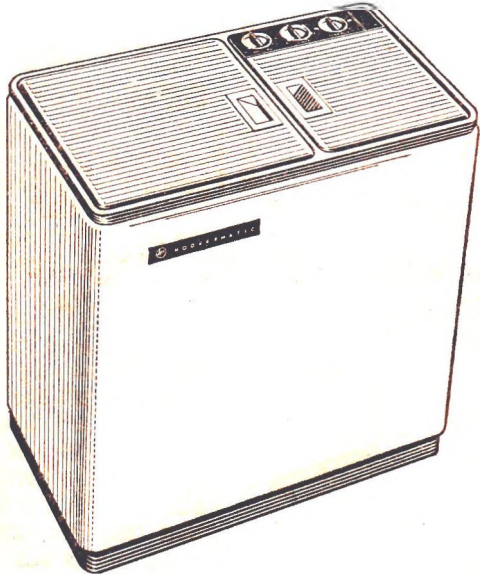

Watch That U-turn

City and town traffic is often brought to a standstill by vehicles making illegal "U" turns.

The N.R.M.A. Legal Department says "U" turns are prohibited—

- If the vehicle would cross any unbroken line marked on the roadway.
- Where a sign "No U-Turn" is displayed.

- At any intersection controlled by traffic lights.

- At any other place where danger of collision with another vehicle exists or where interference with the free movement of traffic is likely.

The last-mentioned restriction places a definite responsibility on the turning driver not to interfere with the flow of traffic, which includes forcing traffic to reduce speed while a turn is made.

Many instances of breaches of this law reported by the police have occurred at "T" intersections, particularly on divided roads where the intersection provides the only break in a median strip.

The N.R.M.A. says it is far wiser and safer to drive around the block than attempt to negotiate a "U" turn on busy or narrow roads, particularly where the manoeuvre cannot be completed in one movement.

The law in N.S.W. places a heavy onus on a driver who makes a "U" turn. When a collision occurs it is more than likely that the turning driver will receive a summons for negligent driving.

Shopping Locally

Support for local shopkeepers might improve if the shopkeepers themselves really sought it.

As a new resident I have been surprised at the poor attitude of the public shown by a significant number of traders in the district. A customer doesn't care to be regarded as an interloper or as a potential thief.

Certain service stations are worse in this regard. If a service station proprietor, through his staff, acts as if doing an ordinary job for a customer is an undeserved favour, he's not too interested in winning support. I found two local service stations to be like this, and now my business goes to a far better man in Randwick.

Worse still is the implication that the customer is a thief — "We don't take cheques". My cheque wouldn't buy a car battery at a service station in this district, but met no demur from a city supplier who didn't know me from Adam. I won't be back to the local station.

Other local traders

have also rejected my cheques and my wife's — in one case politely, in the others brusquely. For those requirements we now shop outside the district, where our cheques are accepted.

We still do most of our shopping in the Balmain-Rozelle district, because most of the shopkeepers here, as elsewhere, show us the respect we show them — and a Rozelle self-service store readily accepts our cheques. But a few traders, by chasing custom out of the area, can lose business not only for themselves but also for the others.

NO LOSS IN POPULATION!

The picture of declining growth in Leichhardt Municipality, painted by Commonwealth statistics, is not a true one, in the opinion of the Mayor, Ald. L. Rodwell.

He was commenting on the census analysis completed last week by the Acting Commonwealth Statistician, Mr. P. J. O'Neill, which showed that at the 1966 census seven parts of the Sydney metropolitan area showed a population loss.

These were led by Sydney City, down 7.56 per cent; and Leichhardt Municipality, down 4.24 per cent.

Ald. Rodwell said that in his opinion the population of Leichhardt Municipality had not fallen since the previous census; on the contrary,

it would have risen.

He was supported in this view by a statement published in "The Link" from education authorities concerning increasing pressure on school accommodation in Rozelle.

He understood that the census figures related only to persons born in Australia and to naturalised persons.

All the inner Sydney areas (including Leichhardt Municipality) had attracted migrants, and for every 200 of these who became naturalised, there would be another 1,000 who had not yet done so.

"Figures", he said, "Do not always tell a true story".

Bad news, with the passing away of Charlie Wark's wife, Irene (nee McGlenn). Deepest sympathy is expressed by the club and sub-branch.

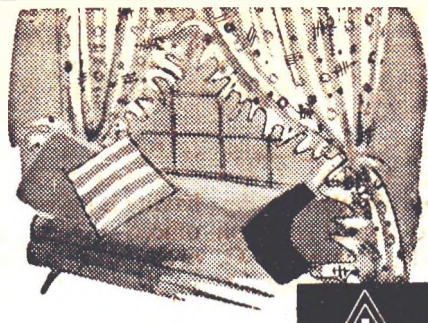
"Noise" Petition

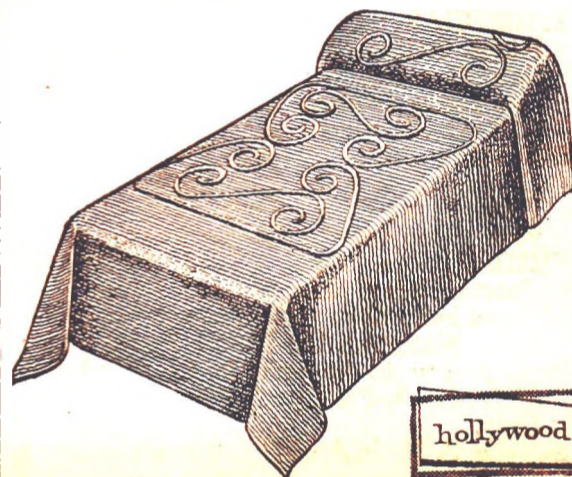

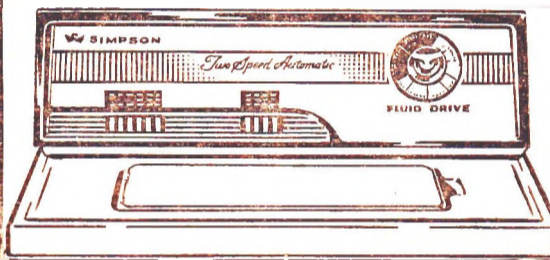

There were 35 deaths from electric shocks in N.S.W. in 1968, which was 15 more than in 1967.

The figures were released by the Chairman of the Electricity Authority of N.S.W., Mr. F. H. Campbell.

number of deaths in 1968 nor the exceptionally low number in 1967 indicated any trend. The number fluctuated rather widely from year to year, the average being now 28.

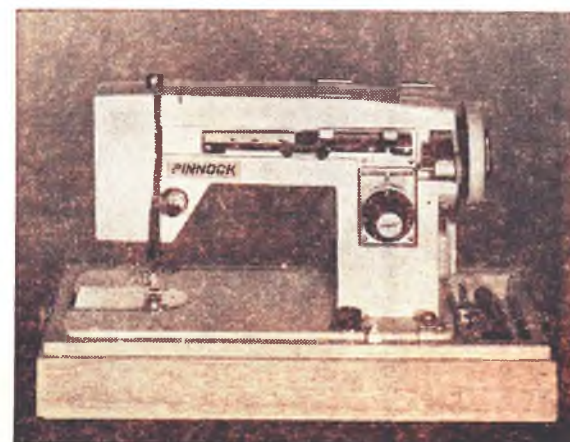

PROBLEM FOR VEGETARIANS

People on a vegetarian diet should keep in mind the problem associated with securing sufficient protein, according to the N.S.W. Department of Public Health.

Those who embark on large quantities of vegetable foods must be careful to work out to supply enough of the essential amino acids.

The Nutrition Education Section of the Department says that vegetarian diets which include animal products such as milk and eggs are more likely to be nutritionally adequate than the diet with purely vegetable and cereals are the best sources of protein in a purely vegetarian diet.

All body tissues means "of first importance". When meat is left out of a diet, care is needed to ensure that the diet contains enough iron. Actually proteins are built from smaller chemical units called amino acids. When proteins are digested, it is the amino acids which circulate in the blood to nourish the tissues.

Over 20 amino acids are known, and of these eight are essential for life and must be supplied in food. Animal proteins contain all the essential amino acids in satisfactory quantities. Vegetarian proteins do not. Here lies the problem of the vegetarian diet.

The problem is very serious. The vegetarian diet since these foods contain all the essential amino acids. If a variety of foods are eaten together, the amino acid lacking in one food can be made up by the other; e.g., cereal with milk or peanut butter are better together than if eaten separately.
