

### TWO-WAY LIAISON

Many Balmain people will support the complaint of their ward aldermen and of The Balmain Association that the Maritime Services Board showed little regard for local feelings in its manner of constructing its container terminal.

The Board's major mistake, of course, occurred when it misled the people over the height of the shed it was to erect, and the manner in which it belittled Leichhardt Council when wav-ing the big stick of Government instru-

mentality.
That the Government itself did nothing to counter residents' complaints showed that it, too, thought

little of local feeling. Balmain's fight in this matter, though, would seem to have some effect, since the Premier has announced that regard will be paid to liaison with the local Council and to preservation of living amenity when it tackles a similar situation at Botany Bay.


