NEW CO-ED HIGH SCHOOL FOR ROZELLE

Land Bought For School

Good news for Balmain-Rozelle in the sphere of education: The district should soon have a brand new co-educational high school, built in Terry Street, Rozelle, on a choice 8½-acre block of land now in the process of being acquired by the Education Department.

It is understood that when the new school has been built, the present Rozelle Junior Boys' High school accommodation will be retained for infants and primary school activities, and that the Department has plans to modernise existing accommodation there.

The Education Department announces that it is acquiring the block of land fronting Terry Street, formerly partly occupied by Hardy's timber mills and now by J. C. Clarke Pty. Ltd., for the construction of a new high school.

The school will be known as "Rozelle High School". (This means that it will be a co-educational establishment.)

A departmental spokesman said the Department was anxious

to clear the site to erect high school buildings which would not only serve the Balmain peninsula, but would also relieve pressure on existing high schools at Ibrox Park and Drummoyle.

The new school would also allow for rearrangement of feeder areas of high schools at Riverside, Ryde, Burwood, Petersham and Leichhardt.

In its plan to acquire the site the Department was concerned with high density housing in Leichhardt municipality, and the effect this would have on the area's schools.

The spokesman added that the Department was not in a position at this stage to announce details of the proposition, which had not yet been gazetted.

Neither could it now say when building would commence, as this depended on availability of funds.

The Department has not advised us of the purchase price of the land, but we believe it would be well over \$500,000.

"The Link" assumes that construction plans will go ahead fairly quickly, because of the urgency of the need for school accommodation in this district and for the need to rearrange feeder areas.

Also, the Education Department realises that the site of Rozelle Junior Boys' High School is unsatisfactory for present-day needs. This knowledge was one of the factors influencing the decision to build a new school in the district.

considerable increase in population in this district.

There will be insufficient room to meet the needs of pupils wanting to enrol not only next year, but for the remainder of this year as well.

Headmaster of the school, Mr. C. J. Cox, said that as more high density housing came to Balmain and Rozelle, so would the number of children requiring school accommodation increase.

More and more migrants were coming to live here, especially from Greece, who were accustomed to high density housing conditions and found this district convenient as a stepping-stone on arrival in Australia.

Some, who spoke no English, were taken into the homes of fellow nationals until their funds and occupation

permitted them to move to other parts of Sydney.

"There is quite a big fluctuation of children in the infants' department at Rozelle," said Mr. Cox.

"In the past three years only about one in three of the children enrolled at the school have been there for three years.

"Such a fluctuation makes it very difficult to assess with any degree of accuracy the needs of this area for any period.

"I have been asked by the Department to make a survey of the area to find out what additional accommodation will be required. This is meant to tide us over until the new high school is available."

Mr. Cox said that the Department was considering the erection of additional demountable

Zoned "waterfront industrial", the land was owned by J. C. Clarke Pty. Ltd., manufacturers of bedroom furniture, with headquarters at Botany.

It has the Monsanto chemical factory on its western border, and has a 720 ft. frontage to Terry Street and about 400 ft. water frontage to Iron Cove.

The land drops about 90 feet from Terry Street to the waterline, but is tiered.

Accommodation Problems

Accommodation difficulties are now acute at Rozelle Junior Boys' High School.

Some temporary relief has been secured this year by the hiring of the Presbyterian Church Hall adjacent to the school. This has enabled one class to be accommodated there.

This, however, has met the problem only of the additional children enrolled at the beginning of this year, so that further action will have to be taken immediately in view of the

ZONING KNOTS

Erection by the Education Department of a new high school in Terry Street, Rozelle, will prove to be a lesson in the matter of zoning.

Formalities are not yet complete. The area is zoned "waterfront industrial", and the process of cutting through the zoning knots will now be in full spate.

Final decision rests with the Minister for Local Government and Highways, but it is inconceivable that any objections to use of this land for high school construction would be successful.

Local residents will be cock-a-hoop. They will not only be getting a much-needed new school, but they'll also be relieved of any fear that this land would be devoted to unpleasant industrialisation.

To cut through zoning knots you have to demonstrate urgency of need, and this isn't easy in this district, apparently, since various authorities stress competing needs.

We must, however, draw to the attention of all authorities that the greatest need of the Balmain peninsula is to improve its housing conditions. Hence we feel that the Housing Commission should become emboldened by the actions of the Education Department and set about acquiring land here suitable for high-density housing.

This is a desirable residential area, because it is so near the city and because its position above the harbour ensures inspiring views.

With the wind of change stirred by the school authorities, our central and Local Government representatives should bestir themselves into demanding similar action in respect of housing.

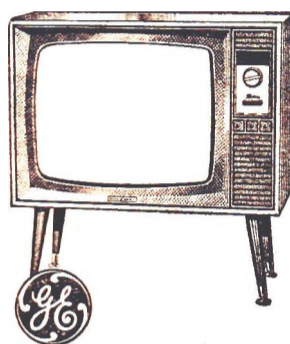

Death of Library Worker

The recent sudden passing of Mr. Fred Willson, of 10 King Street, Balmain, will be regretted by those who knew him.

Mr. Willson served with the R.A.A.F. in the last war, and devoted a great deal of his life to endeavouring to improve the conditions of fellow-citizens in the field of Local Government.

Four years ago he conducted a single-handed door-to-door research in regard to obtaining a municipal library, and obtained over 1,000 signatures to a petition for such a scheme.

Mr. Willson compiled statistics which he obtained from 30 municipalities setting out the population, rate income, cost of libraries, etc., which he distributed to interested persons.

He was President of the Libraries Association of Leichhardt Municipality, and did a great deal of honorary work in having posters painted to

set out the need for a library scheme.

At the 1965 State election and the 1966 Federal election he was campaign director locally

for the Liberal Party, and due greatly to his efficient work a record vote was recorded for them.

This could make the tyre unfit for retreading.
