ENGLISH CLASS FOR MIGRANT MOTHERS

An interesting and important project in acclimatising migrants has started at Rozelle Junior Boys' High School. Nineteen foreign migrant mothers are being taught English while waiting to pick up their children after school.

To appreciate the value of this project, understand that the mother of the family is the difficult member to approach when language difficulties are experienced by recent arrivals from overseas.

Dad goes to work and soon picks up enough English to get by. Junior goes to school and acquires a knowledge of English more quickly.

For mother there are classes in English at night, but when a family is young and there's work to do at night, mother is sometimes too busy to go out, and often is shy in such matters, anyway.

Junior often has to be her interpreter.

But she has to go to the school ground after school to bring junior home!

Then is the time—thought the school principal, Mr. C. J. Cox, and the Infants' Mistress, Miss P. O'Sullivan—to tackle their language problem.

The people concerned are mostly recent arrivals from Greece, although some are Italian and some Armenians.

Home Talk

Mr. Cox told "The Link" that this was a scheme which he and Miss O'Sullivan had had in mind for some time.

While tuition in English had been made available at night for eight or nine years, it was the male who usually attended.

In the home, children of foreign migrants started their lives with two languages—English and their parents' native tongue.

As they grew up they began to adopt Australian ways, and when they went to work they

tended to grow away from the family's former native customs, which meant those of the mother in particular.

When the grandchildren came, and grandma had not become proficient in English speaking, she felt left out, which was one of the reasons why so many elderly people went back to their native lands.

"We want to try to stop that," said Mr. Cox.

Letter

"This matter cropped up at a meeting of infants' mistresses with the Central Metropolitan Area Director of Education, Mr. E. C. Colman, who arranged for co-operation between the N.S.W. Department of Education and the Commonwealth Department of Migration.

"The Commonwealth is providing the teacher and the school is making the facilities available."

Mr. Cox said that a letter was drafted, for dispatch to mothers of migrant children attending the school, and this was transcribed into Greek by an officer of the Rozelle branch of the Commonwealth Bank.

There followed a visit to the school by Dr. Baras, of the Migration Department, who speaks about 10 European languages, and as a result enrolments in the class were made.

The class began last Wednesday, with 19 women attending. It will be held every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon from 2 p.m. to 3.20 p.m.

The teacher is Mrs. M. A. Beams, who since 1952 has taught English to thousands of migrants in Tasmania.

Mr. Cox said the class would not be confined to

mothers of infant children. Also, he hoped it could be open to migrant mothers without children who found it difficult to attend night classes.

Tuition was mainly in oral English. Students would learn to recite commonly used words, and fit them into various situations. They would then practise the situations—such as a visit to the butcher's.

Mr. Cox said that the secondary school was already conducting a special class for migrant boys in which they secured concentrated education in English.

As they became more proficient in the language they could be moved into the ordinary classes.

Boys could not be expected to progress in secondary education until they could read a textbook and express themselves adequately in English.

Rotary

Mr. Cox added that the Rotary Club of Balmain was also interesting itself in this type of work, and was beginning to work out ways of assisting in the assimilation of the New Australian.

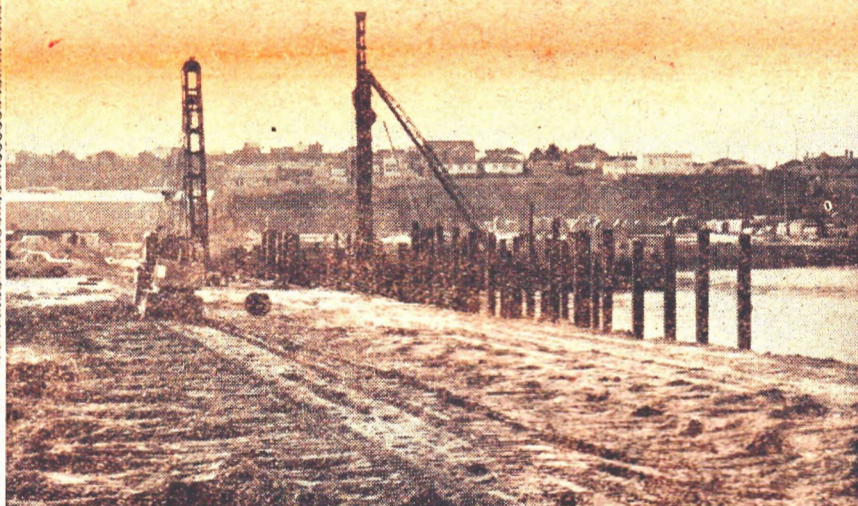
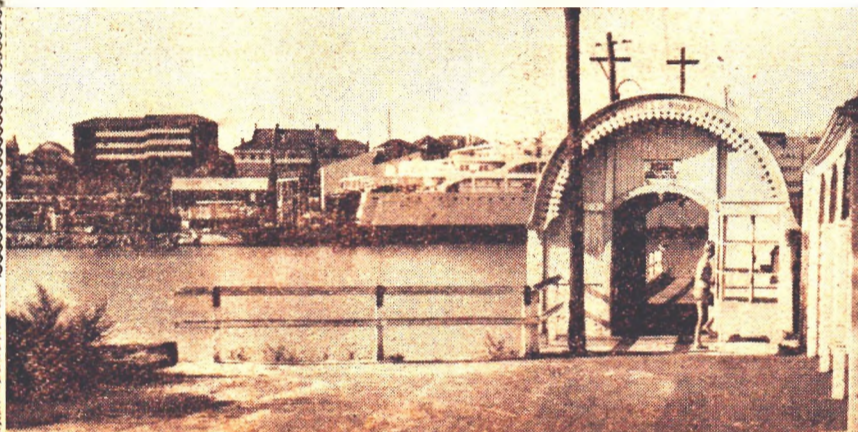
Mr. Colman, Area Director of Education, thought it was important that the migrant mothers were thus becoming more identified with the school which their children were attending.

"They are very fine people," he said, "and valuable to Australia.

"For the most part, though, they are shy and diffident. They don't like to make advances and enter into things because of language difficulties.

"We feel it will be a very good thing if they are able to take a greater share in the school activities."

DOG FIGHTS IN PUBLIC

Without judging the issue of the Glebe Home for Aged Men, whose cause has been espoused by Balmain aldermen, this paper protests at the conditions which last week resulted in Leichhardt Council meeting being closed after police had been called in following public gallery uproar.

Local Government was never meant to degenerate into public dog fights, and residents who don't play politics can be pardoned if they feel nauseated at the way public business continues to be disrupted in this municipality.

There is much important work to be done in Council, especially affecting Balmain - Rozelle — vital policies to be discussed, calling for clear thinking, moderation in approach, and sometimes compromise.

When this stops because of disruption from the gallery — whether this be justified or not by circumstances — it would seem it is not the police who should be called in, but the Government to decide whether this should be allowed to continue.

It was the political issue which saw administrators replace Sydney City Council. Should this happen in Leichhardt, those who play politics will be to blame.

This paper does not want it to happen here, particularly since there are signs of greater sympathy from the Council in Balmain problems. And we are supposed to be able to govern ourselves!

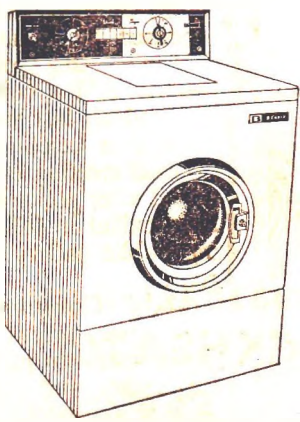
But moderation will have to be shown on all sides — by the "Rebels" who constitute the official opposition; by the Labor majority; and not the least by the public attending the gallery.

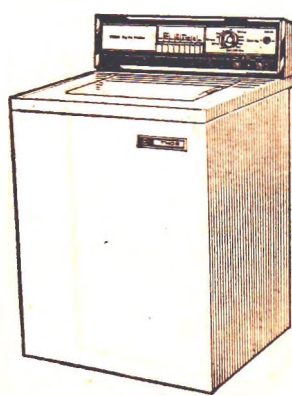

Council Surveys Development Of Waterfront

Following Leichhardt Council's participation in a recent inspection of the harbour foreshores by the planning authorities, a special Council inspection of the water-front in the municipality is being considered.

This could have a major influence on the Council's attitude towards waterfront zoning and its consideration of objections to its Planning Scheme.

Two representatives of Leichhardt Council took part in a boat trip recently organised by the Minister for Local Government and Highways (Mr. Morton) to consider the visual effect of the land from the water.

The party included the Minister, the chairman of the State Planning Authority (Mr. Nigel Ashton), and representatives of harbourside Councils.

S.P.A. Study

Purpose of the trip was to get personal first-hand views of Council representatives of the various implications of the Sydney Harbour Foreshore Study, made early last year by the S.P.A.

The trip was regarded as the final phase of a survey of the harbour carried out to provide a basis for determining policies and action, as a guide to future use and development of the harbour area.

The importance of the harbour to the public—it was pointed out by the

S.P.A.—is that there is a very close involvement of harbourside Councils in both control of development and the provision of recreational facilities.

The Minister hoped that following the inspection he would be able to give urgent consideration to what action was necessary to protect amenity and the beauty of the harbour.

Commenting on the inspection, the Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. Les Rodwell, said he thought it would be a good idea for Council now to make its own close and complete inspection of the harbour foreshores within the municipality.

This could be done by aldermen and officers,

say, in a small launch, so as to have a close look at all those developments against which complaints had been made.

He said that during the trip a complete survey of the Balmain peninsula foreshores had not been made, but they had looked into Johnston's Bay and Iron Cove.

One of the unattractive aspects commented on was the appearance from the water of the Elkington Baths.

It had been suggested that it would be a proposition for the Council to make a complete survey of the harbour foreshores from the water, where any unhappy effects of development could be clearly seen.

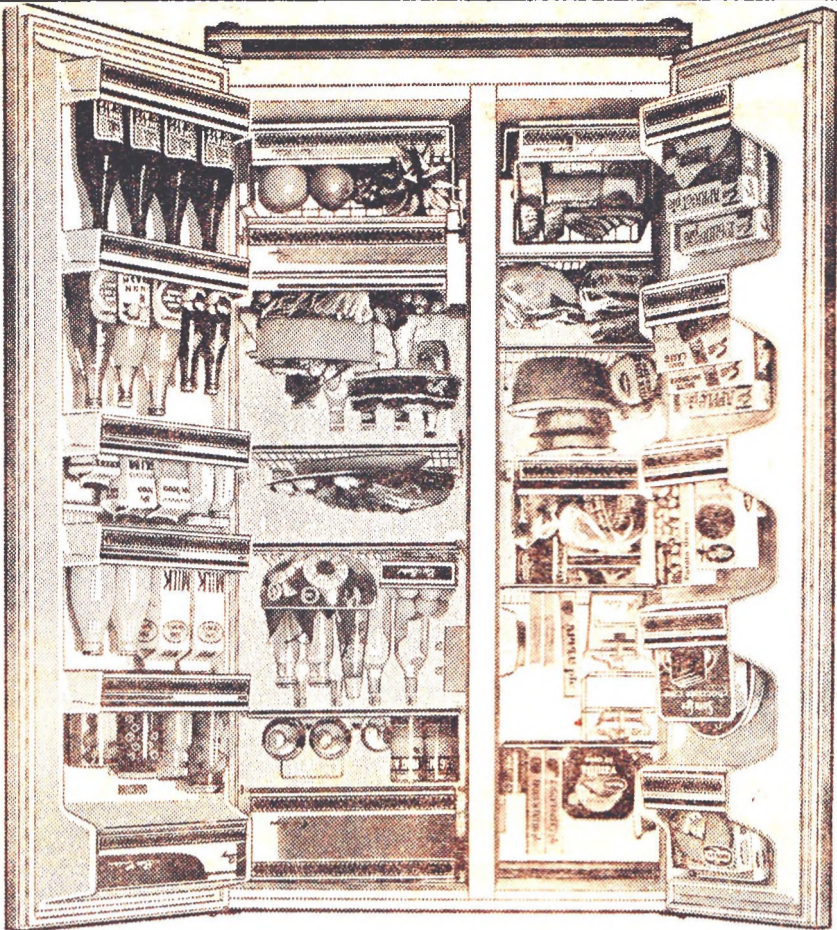

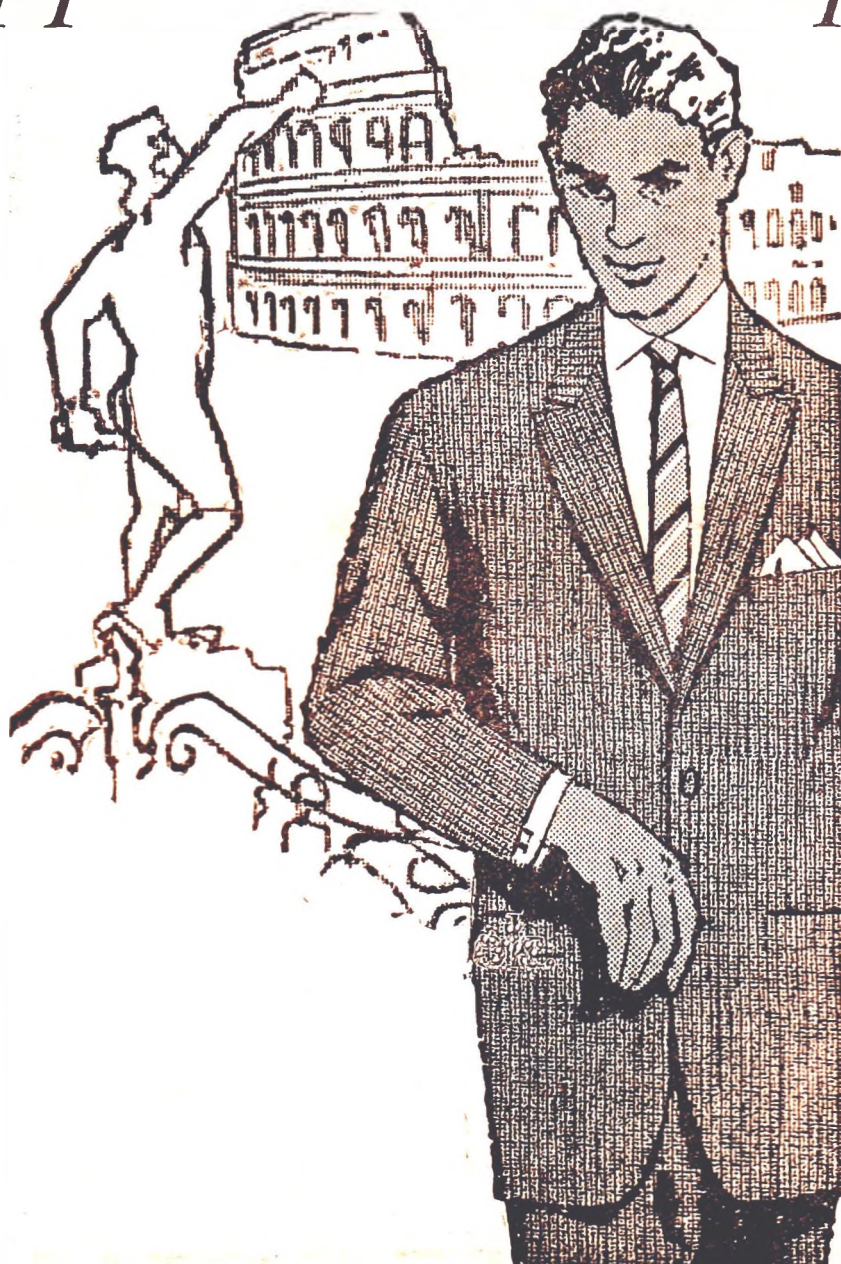
