- Strongly object to the dismissal of their Manager, Mr. L. J. Campbell.
(Mr. Campbell has administered the Home for the past 12 months. The Repatriation Department's recent reclassification of the Home from "a home for derelicts to A1 accommodation" speaks for itself. Mrs. Campbell, a qualified nurse, opened an infirmary to care for the sick and infirm. Her seven-days-a-week, sometimes 20-hour days, are voluntary. She does not receive one cent from the Board of Management.)
- Are dissatisfied with the Board of Management. The Fraud Squad is now investigating certain conduct at the Home.
(This investigation was initiated by Mr. Campbell in the interests of the residents.)
- The resident committee, in conjunction with Mr. Campbell, are more than qualified to administer THEIR home on a self-supporting basis, free from political and religious interference.
(The Board of Management, according to the Mayor of Leichhardt, Alderman Rodwell, lost \$5000 in a "few months". The resident committee at present is operating on a \$500-a-month income excess.)
- Appeal to all people of integrity in the Leichhardt Municipality to assist us in our just cause by attending Leichhardt Council Meeting on Wednesday, April 30, starting at 8 p.m.
(The question of the Glebe Home for Aged Men has been listed for discussion by Council for the past few months, but each time Aldermen have successfully blocked all moves for such a discussion.)
