







**MUNICIPALITY OF LEICHHARDT  
NOTICE**

It is an offence under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1919, as amended, and Ordinances thereunder, to use cartons and other non-approved garbage containers for the storage of household garbage and refuse.

A garbage container must conform to the following standard:—  
Be cylindrical in shape, water-tight, fitted with a close-fitting lid and be not more than 2 cubic feet in capacity (a container 16 inches in diameter and 18 inches high approximates 2 cubic feet).

Ordinance 51 makes it compulsory for—  
(a) every owner or occupier of premises to provide a sufficient number of garbage pans for the reception of garbage and refuse arising from or existing upon such premises;

(b) every occupier to cause all garbage pans and covers in use on the premises to be kept as clean as possible; to be maintained in good order and condition and not allow garbage pans to become a nuisance.

**NOTE:** It is an offence to place garbage and refuse out for collection unless contained in an approved garbage container.

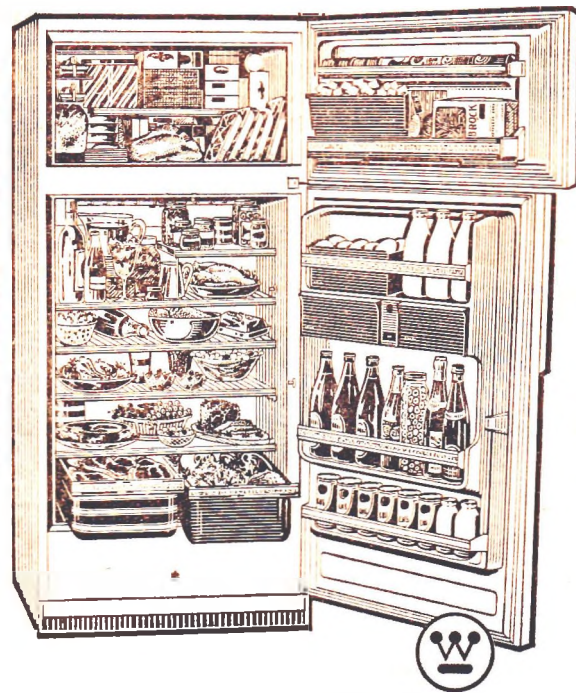

# OFFICIAL PLANS FOR MORT BAY TERMINAL

Fears that the new Mort Bay container terminal for the Australian National Line would involve erection of a giant storage shed, cutting off nearby residents' views, are dispelled by the Federal Minister for Shipping and Transport.

He says that the buildings on the extended terminal on the southern shore of Mort Bay will consist of a cargo shed approximately 200 feet long, 75 feet deep and 20 feet high, and an administrative office building of single-storey height.

The cargo shed will be positioned at the foot of the rock face bordering Short Street, and the administrative building will be at the entrance to the terminal area in Mort Street.

## Question

The Minister, Mr. Sinclair, gave this information in reply to a question in the House of Representatives by Mr. Bill O'Connor, M.P.

Mr. O'Connor asked what were the plans of A.N.L. for the current development at Mort Bay, as to the size, type and siting of buildings; traffic to be generated; estimated cargo tonnage;

and the flow of traffic across Balmain to and from the White Bay terminal facilities.

He also asked for the proposed hours of operation, anticipated noise generation, and the effects upon the living amenity of local residents.

Mr. Sinclair said A.N.L. was developing the shore to provide a berth 435 ft. long, capable of accommodating a ship 650 feet long.

The entire area on the southern shore of Mort Bay bounded by Mort Street, Cameron Street and Church Street right-of-way extension was being developed as an additional terminal area, having an approximate coverage of eight acres.

The wharf would be provided with a stern ramp and a travelling crane, capacity 25 tons. The wharf would ultimately accommodate Australian coastal vessels

and the ship now under construction for the Australian/Japanese trade.

## Unit Loads

Gross inward and outward traffic was estimated at 175,000 tons per annum in unit loads approximating 15 tons per receipt and delivery.

The Minister added: "There is so far no plan for the transshipment of overseas cargoes between White Bay and Mort Bay terminals.

"Hours of operation will be dictated by the shipping schedule. As far as practicable, ships' schedules will be programmed to coincide with normal working hours.

"It must be appreciated, however, that there may be occasions when work outside normal hours might have to be undertaken.

"The Line will make every endeavour to restrict terminal operations

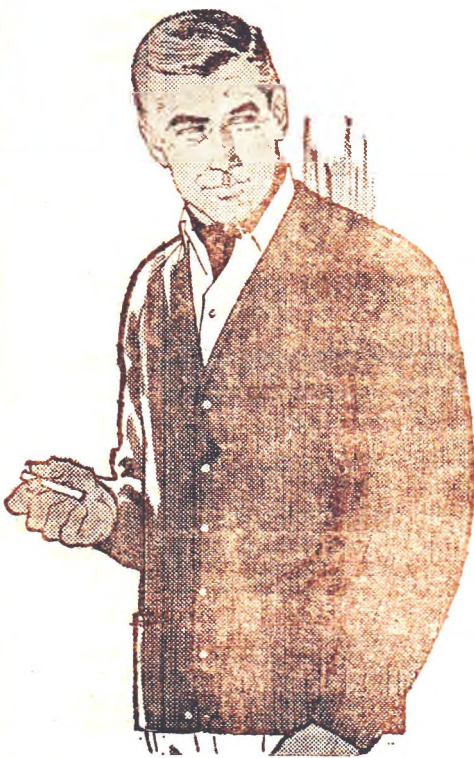
