

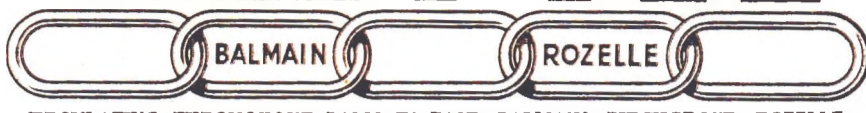

BECOME A "PINK LADY"!

Hospital Scheme For Service

Balmain and District Hospital has started a new scheme of enrolling a band of voluntary women workers, to be called "Pink Ladies", to assist the staff in many avenues of day-to-day hospital work.

The "Pink Ladies" scheme is already operating with marked success in several big N.S.W. hospitals.

In addition to being of great practical help to hospitals, it offers women with time on their hands (and possibly wondering how they can remove their boredom) an opportunity to employ this usefully.

The new volunteer band will be known as the "Pink Ladies' Auxiliary".

The kind of work they will do includes the following:—

- Helping in the wards.
- Feeding patients unable to feed themselves.
- Assisting with flower arrangement.
- Directing visitors to various departments.
- Minding children.
- Washing and setting patients' hair, and cutting it if skilled in that direction.
- Folding linen.
- Helping patients with their mail, such as writing letters and posting and delivering mail.

The matron, Miss J. MacLaren, told "The Link" that a scheme along these lines had operated at the hospital at one time, but it had died out after the war

when many women sought employment.

Success

Her enthusiasm for the scheme had been kindled after a recent conference at Hornsby Hospital, which had been operating the plan successfully for some time. 300 Pink Ladies being enrolled there.

The Pink Ladies' Auxiliary would be quite different to the normal hospital auxiliary, for it was designed to assist in the day-by-day running of the institution.

Two Pink Ladies had already been enrolled by Balmain Hospital. One was on duty between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Sundays; the other would be rostered for Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

"To inform Pink Ladies of their duties," said Miss MacLaren, "we are preparing a folder to hand to them outlining the scheme and the requirements."

"We shall stress the professional ethics in-

involved and the essentials for an effective volunteer programme, such as being reliable in attendance when rostered for duty.

The Hours

"However, as regards the time they will spend helping us—that is in their own hands. Their hours of duty will be arranged to fit in with their convenience."

"We shall provide each of them with a pink frock—their badge of office, to distinguish them from the regular staff. And on their days of duty, lunch will be provided."

"Probably the age group from which we would expect Pink Ladies to come would be 'middle age to not too elderly'. Naturally, though, we would not reject younger women."

"Women with time on their hands and available to help for a few hours a week should certainly find their voluntary service both interesting and rewarding to themselves—rewarding because they will know they are easing the burdens of their sick fellow women."

Council At Last To Receive Mort Bay Plans

The Australian National Line is at last about ready to submit to Leichhardt Council its building plan and specifications for the new container terminal site at Mort Bay.

Replying to a question in the House of Representatives by Mr. Bill O'Connor, M.P., the Minister for Shipping and Transport, Mr. Sinclair, said that the plans for the cargo shed and single-storey administrative building were in course of preparation and should be submitted within the next few weeks.

This followed the Minister's previous advice that the main buildings at the terminal would be an administrative building of single-storey height, and a cargo shed approximately 200 feet long, 75 feet deep and 20 feet high.

Readers will remember the A.N.L.'s evasive reply (published in our April 30 issue) to the question by Mr. Graham Robertson, Liberal candidate for the Sydney seat, seeking information about the Line's building plans.

On that occasion the only information coming

from the Line was this: "All property plans and other drawings have been progressed through the requisite authorities prior to the commencement of any structural work."

"The Link's" own reaction to the situation is: All's well that ends well! But why not advise the public in the first place, seeing that A.N.L. is in a first-class position to know the public's feelings in this kind of situation?

Rates "Not Answer To Council's Finance Problems"

Some other system than rating of property is required for the financing of Local Government, in the opinion of Ald. L. Rodwell, Mayor of Leichhardt.

He commented last week on statements at the Shires' Conference in Sydney.

One of these was the declaration by the Acting Minister for Local Government, Mr. A. H. Jago, that the Commonwealth Government should contribute to the Local Government Assistance Fund which had been set up recently by the State Government.

Some Councils — including Leichhardt — have received or been assured of aid from the fund, which was set up as "The Government's answer to recommendations from a Royal Commission that Crown properties be rated."

The fund, however, consists of only \$4 million a year, a figure which was severely criticised by the conference.

It adopted a motion expressing dissatisfaction "in the strongest possible terms" at the size of the fund and urged the State Government to increase it substantially.

Ald. Rodwell said that if there were substantial additional funds available from State or Federal Government sources it would be the best possible thing for Local Government.

"I don't think rating of property is the answer to our financial problems," he said. "Once you start rating people out of their environment you reach the end of the section."

Protection For Bus Passengers

Added protection against the weather will be provided for bus passengers at the waiting shed opposite Balmain Leagues Club, Victoria Road, Rozelle.

Mr. Roger Degen, M.L.A., advises that a panel will be erected at each end. The area is open, and the existing shed provides little protection.

Work is expected to follow formal Council approval.

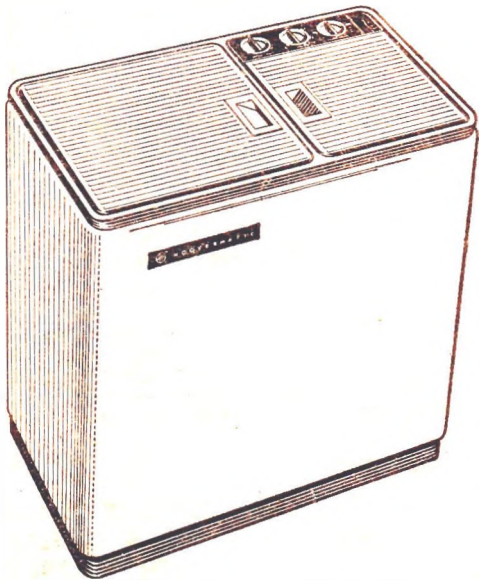

Terminal Noises Continue To Annoy Residents

Although agreeing that a fair trial should be given to the noise abatement efforts being made by the Balmain Terminal operators — Seatainer Terminals Ltd. — Grafton Street residents report their concern at a continuation of noises at night, especially during the early hours of the morning.

At a meeting last Thursday night they exchanged recent experiences of night noise at the terminal.

Mrs. J. Sherlock, secretary of the Local Action Committee, said that experiences reported at the meeting included that of an angry resident who was wakened at 2 a.m. by banging on containers.

"When approached by the resident, the workmen stopped their banging and walked away," said Mrs. Sherlock.

"It would appear that the men are working their own hours. There can be dead silence until 11 p.m., then, even when no ship is in, the crane starts working, with bangs and crashes following.

"Last Wednesday (June 4) I got no sleep after 1 a.m. Even if you're not a bad sleeper you are wakened when one container is dropped on another.

"We are quite ready to give the remedial measures a fair trial — but there is a matter of sleep. Surely we have the 'freedom to sleep'?"

The committee has written to the Department of Labour and Industry supporting the application by Seatainer Terminals Ltd. for amendment of the regulations to permit flashing lights or other soundless or muffled devices to be used on the terminal crane in place of hooters or sirens.

Chemicals

The meeting discussed the Vincent Street chemical tank farm and residents' fears concerning dangers there, especially during loading or unloading of motor vehicles.

A resident demonstrated that tanks could be approached from the harbour side of Stephen and Vincent Streets, a safer method than from above.

Mrs. Sherlock has written to John Swift & Co., operators, asking whether that method could be adopted.

She sought from the company information as to the types of chemicals being stored or proposed to be stored; methods of filling and emptying tanks; and safety measures and warning devices being installed.

Mrs. Sherlock has also written to the Department of Health expressing the hope that safety regulations would be fully policed in this matter.

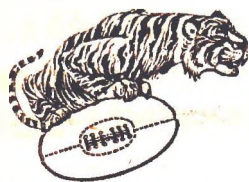

Inspiration

I thought David Bolton stood out in both attack and defence. He mesmerised Norths' defence on numerous occasions with his elusive running, and brought off some really good tackles when most needed.

Dave was an inspiration to his team throughout, and lifted them to greater efforts when headed by Norths.

Jack Spencer was knocked cold in a tackle early in the second half, yet fought back like the Tiger he is, and was going strongly at the end. He did a great deal of tackling, and will no doubt be pleased to have Peter Provan back next week.

Gary Leo had a great game and made many penetrating runs down the middle. He tackled well, and is playing right at his top.

Barry McTaggart gave Norths' forwards plenty of headaches with his barging runs from the rucks, and tackled vigorously throughout.

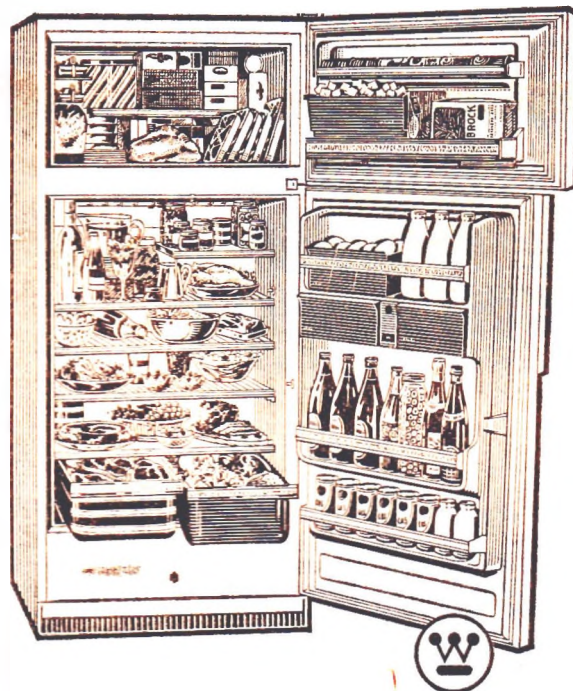
