# Mort Bay Faces Traffic Nuisance

With their fears of having their views cut off by a huge building allayed, residents in the region of the new Mort Bay container terminal area are now faced with the second major threat: road traffic nuisance.

The stage is set for development of plans to handle container traffic by road vehicles from the terminal.

It is believed that detailed plans are in process of implementation, and that official moves are imminent.

The situation has obviously been allowed by the Government authorities to develop without adequate examination of the problems involved.

Observers believe that no attempt has been made by any of the parties to get together on the question of traffic nuisances and hazards.

They fear that the position is developing in which heavy trucks will be operating at times around the clock, caus-

ing traffic hazards in the narrow and tortuous Balmain streets during business hours, and severe annoyance to local residents at night.

It would appear that all authorities have been waiting for the A.N.L. cargo-handling plans to develop, with the intention of dealing with the associated problems only as they arise.

This "hit-and-miss" method, in this paper's opinion, is a matter for severe condemnation.

Leichhardt Council, however, would have an opportunity to emerge from the situation with considerable credit (for a change!).

It possibly has more power in this than it did at White Bay.

Residents hope that, should the precise traffic plans pose a major threat to their amenity, the Council will oppose them strongly.

It could refuse to agree to development without a favourable report from the traffic police, and could throw the whole proposals into the lap of the State Planning Authority.

Observers say that, while the S.P.A. would keep closely in mind the need for waterfront facilities, it could not ignore a threat of danger to traffic even if it ignored residents' amenity.

The position is delicate, although it offers some hope that residents' interests will be protected more adequately than in the past.

## White Bay Terminal

Answering public criticism of the White Bay terminal project, the Maritime Services Board has emphasised that the waterfront area adjacent to Grafton Street had been proposed for wharfage development for half a century.

Its views were forwarded to Leichhardt Council by the Premier (Mr. Askin).

The Board said it had made its development proposals known some years in advance of actual construction, to give maximum notice to land-owners and prospective purchasers.

The foreshore had been zoned "Special uses" since 1951, so no land-owner in Grafton Street could rightly claim

lack of fair and ample warning.

It had offered to purchase at current values the property of owners who considered they were specially affected, but only a small number had accepted.

The M.S.B. added that it was unlikely its developmental activity would meet with the unqualified approval of those whose businesses or residences were affected.

However, it was confident that the increased efficiency in the handling of cargoes which would follow the development would justify it and maintain Sydney as a leading port.

Commenting on the letter, Ald. N. Origlass (Balmain ward) said it was an attempt to justify

wrong siting of the terminal.

"Opinion continues to develop," he said, "that the Balmain peninsula is the wrong place for a terminal, and that no time should be lost in developing Botany Bay as the main container and unit load complex for N.S.W."

"This was the view expressed recently by Captain G. H. Manley, operations general manager for Wilh. Wilhelmsen Agency Pty. Ltd., speaking at a Melbourne conference.

"Capt. Manley asked how could consideration be given to the fragmentation of services in one area, cold stores in other areas, depots in yet other areas and terminals

## Column NINE

### PEDESTRIAN DANGER

During the past three months there have been numerous near misses on the pedestrian crossing in Darling Street, Balmain, almost adjacent to Ford Street.

This crossing is at a very busy point in the shopping centre, and motorists can be excused, as they are upon the crossing before it becomes noticeable.

Cars are parked on both sides of Darling Street here, making it impossible to notice a pedestrian leaving the footpath.

Last week two small children narrowly missed being hit when they ran out on to this crossing. No blame could have been placed on the driver, and only his instant reflexes saved a very nasty situation.

If this pedestrian crossing is necessary, it should be policed to see that no vehicle is parked right up to it, thus making it impossible for oncoming drivers to observe someone leaving the footpath.

And, in view of the congestion in this area, there should be an overhead blinking sign to warn motorists beforehand.

Not all drivers have spontaneous reactions, so before someone is killed at this crossing, make it a safe and practical one.

Lines drawn across the road are not sufficient. Motorists are entitled to have an obvious sign to alert them.

Also, the parking position is most unsatisfactory around here. It may be wise for the police to bring some pressure to bear on the Council to carry out their forgotten promises of providing parking areas.

Seems as though the promises were election gimmicks. Now the excuse probably will be cost—or some other point to stall on!

# Terminal Noise "Increased", Say Residents

**Grafton Street residents declare that the noise abatement measures promised by the terminal operators — Seatainer Terminals Ltd. — have been ineffective.**

Secretary of the Local Action Committee, Mrs. J. Sherlock, told "The Link" that, rather than decreasing, the noise coming from the terminal at night had actually increased.

"We believe we have given a fair trial to their efforts to dampen down the noise," she said, "but we are completely dissatisfied.

"Sometimes everything is quiet, then, without apparent reason, work starts about midnight and continues until 7 a.m. By that time everybody has to get up."

Mrs. Sherlock said that the company's written promise to keep closed at all times the door leading to Grafton Street (from the big crane) was not being kept. The door was hardly ever closed.

Also, containers were still being dropped on

others, and the "bashes and crashes" were continuing.

An additional noise was now being heard, sometimes around 2 a.m. and sometimes 4 a.m. This was a type of "screaming" that sounded like the swinging around of a crane which needed greasing.

Mrs. Sherlock said the noise of the bell on the big crane was worrying people as far away as Johnston Street, a resident there having complained about it to the police.

The company's letter to her dated early in May, she said, advised that the remedial measures would commence on May 12 and were expected to take about one month to complete.

That time had long since passed, and residents were becoming increasingly worried about the situation.

# LITTLE OLD LADY TYPICAL CASE OF WINTER NEED

This is a true picture of a little old lady living in Balmain, taken from the files of The Smith Family to illustrate the need behind its Community Clothing Appeal launched last week.

She is little and old, and doesn't hear too well, nor can she get around as well as she used to.

Many years ago she had a much fuller life. She had a husband and children who loved her. But she lost her beloved Jack, and can't remember when the children came to see her last.

All day she sits in her shabby little room, which contains only a small cupboard. The walls are peeling and there is a large, damp patch over the window.

At night the lights of

passing traffic often keep her awake a long time.

She shares a bathroom with about ten others, but is frightened to light the gas heater, so usually has a cold bath. She laughs and says she must have been brought up tough—but you can see she is really kidding herself.

The trip to the bathroom, by the way, takes quite a lot out of her, and she has to lie down when she gets back.

A neighbour does her shopping. She prefers tinned baby food, which she can manage to heat on the gas ring.

Her only companion is the "telly". Even if she can't hear what the people are, saying she can look at the pictures.

She hates the winter. Even if she stays in bed until later in the morning, it takes her hours to stand upright afterwards, so she often stays in bed all day.

She used to have a kerosene heater, but one day it exploded. She was lucky to escape injury,

but her dressing gown was ruined. Ever since she has been afraid of heaters.

## Welfare

Her only visitor is The Smith Family welfare officer, who pops in whenever she can, sometimes delivering the special baby food and staying to make sure the old lady has at least one meal.

The welfare officer has given her warm nighties and a dressing gown to replace the burnt one, also warm skirts, jumpers and underwear.

She managed to find some flannelette sheets, too, which were hailed as a Godsend.

Our little old lady and thousands like her will be cold this winter and (if still alive) next winter and the next—that is, unless you help.

**New Loan Interest Rates Up**

The Treasurer (Mr. McMahon) has announced terms for a new Commonwealth cash loan offering interest rates up to 6%. It will be open for subscription between July 10 and 17.

An offer of conversion will be made concurrently to holders of \$325 million Commonwealth securities maturing on July 15.

Four securities will be offered in the cash and conversion loan, all with issue prices par and with maturities varying from just under 3 years to 36 years.

These are: 5.4%, May, 1972; 5.8%, May, 1979; 6%, Oct., 1991; and 6%, July, 2005.

Interest rates offered in the May loan ranged from 5.2% to 5.4%, and maturities from 3 years to 35 years.

**Special**

A new series of special bonds—Series "T"—is also announced, offering an interest rate which increased to 6%.

They will carry a rate of 5.2% from date of application to May 31, 1972, then 5.6% until May 31, 1974, and then 6% until maturity. They will be finally redeemable on June 1, 1977, at a price of 103%.

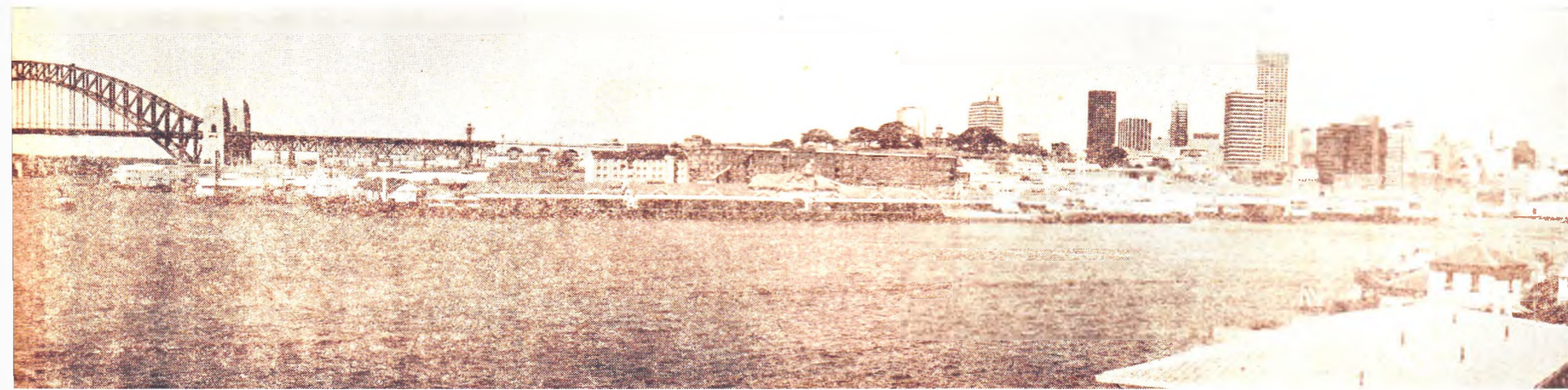
