COUNCIL OPPOSES PLAN

"Serious Hazards" In Mort Bay Traffic

The Mort Bay container terminal traffic situation has now developed officially. Leichhardt Council has decided to oppose strongly an application by a prominent transport company for permission to use property at Mort Bay as a transport and storage terminal associated with the A.N.L. enterprise.

The application was made by Thomas National-wide Transport Ltd., and was dealt with at last week's Council meeting.

Council's view was that, in view of the closely-settled character of the adjacent residential development, injury to the amenity of the neighbourhood would be unavoidable.

The application was for permission to use the property facing the whole of the south-eastern frontage of Church Street, Balmain, between Cameron Street and Curtis Road, as a transport and storage terminal.

The site was formerly

known as the Mort's Dock Church Street Property. Under the Leichhardt Planning Scheme, it is zoned "4 (b) Industrial, Light", but the Council has decided to object formally to this zoning in favour of "2 (a) Residential A".

On the Church Street frontage there is a building owned by Mort's Dock and Engineering Co. Ltd., known as the Church Street fabrication shop, with a floor area of about 39,000 sq. ft.

Current I.C.V. value of the property is \$195,000. The premises have been vacant for some time.

The proposed develop-

ment described by the applicant is:

Transport and storage terminal. Shipments arriving at the Mort Bay terminal would be stored here on a transit basis. Also assembly storage for shipments leaving through the Mort Bay terminal.

Estimated cost of improvements—Supplement to gantry, \$60,000. Building restoration, \$25,000.

Mobile handling machinery, such as fork lifts, would be installed.

All loading and unloading would be done on the vacant land at the Curtis Street end.

MAKE PARK OF THIS AREA!



This area of land in Rozelle is owned by the N.S.W. Housing Commission. It should be developed as park land, in the opinion of Mr. Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain.

The land is bounded by Manning, Callan and Toelle Streets.

It is subject to a road-widening proposal and therefore cannot be used for residential develop-

ment.

Mr. Degen said it would most likely be many years before the land was needed for the road project. In the meantime it would make an ideal park for local

residents and their children.

It seemed wasteful that such a valuable piece of land was going unused when inner areas like Balmain were desperately short of parkland.

OUR PARKING NEEDS

Although Leichhardt Council's hands have been full in recent weeks over the Glebe issue, those in charge of policy have had ample time since the December election to do something about honouring their campaign promises.

It is deplorable that not one promise relating to Balmain and Rozelle has been implemented.

Every member of the Council offered a new deal in tackling the long-standing needs of these suburbs.

Tree planting and beautification, and parking areas for over-burdened motorists, were two of the main issues. After seven months, we're still awaiting signs of action.

There is no provision for off-street parking in either suburb. Yet many people shop by car these days and they require somewhere to park.

Both suburbs need a 3-floor parking station. A design for this is easily obtained by a visit to Balmain Leagues Club, which has been conscious of the needs of its members in this direction.

And this matter of Council policy! This paper has been seeking for many years the appointment of a liaison officer, to provide information of Council's activities. This appointment, too, was promised. Where is he?

Generally, an inquiry from Council leaves one in the same position as before the request. Those in high positions say nothing; those in lesser positions apparently don't know.

The reason for this is that on Council's books is a decision that no member of the staff may give information to the Press.

This extraordinary position—unique in our experience—surely can't be allowed to continue much longer!

Town Planner's Views

The Council's Town Planner, Mr. A. Kenna, reporting on the application, said that to the north-east of the site was the Tasmanian Ferry terminal, otherwise the area was closely settled residential in character.

Access to the proposed loading and unloading area would be on the corner of Church Street, where the manoeuvring of heavy road transport, particularly articulated vehicles, would inevitably result in serious traffic hazards in the comparatively narrow, quiet residential streets.

Furthermore, establishment of a container terminal on the site, involving transfer of containers by articulated vehicles to and from the Tas-

manian Ferry terminal at Mort Bay, and probably White Bay, would result in most undesirable traffic conditions in the present narrow, quiet residential streets in the Balmain peninsula.

Operations would have to be co-ordinated with the turn-around of shipping. Hence, if Council approved the application, it would no doubt be held, as in the recent case of Howard Smith Industries Pty. Ltd. v. Leichhardt Council, that because of the nature of the industry restricted working hours could not be reasonably enforced.

Under these circumstances, and in view of the closely-settled character of the adjacent residential development, injury to the amenity of the neighbourhood would be unavoidable.

The Town Planner added, however, that, as the proposed development was in the category of a traffic generator, consultation with the Police Department was required.

And as part of the

site was virtually zoned "Waterfront Industrial W" under the County of Cumberland Planning Scheme, it was advisable to refer the application to the State Planning Authority of N.S.W. for its views, emphasising to these bodies that Council strongly opposed the proposed development for the reasons outlined.

Council adopted his recommendation.

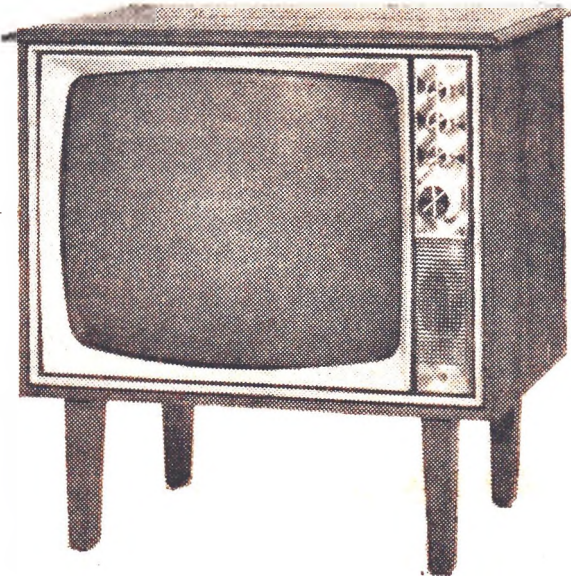

Balmain Plan For Grocery Supermarket

Plans for the construction of a \$100,000 grocery supermarket in the main shopping area in Darling Street, Balmain, were before Leichhardt Council last week.

Council decided to forward details to the Police Department for an expression of its views regarding possible effect on traffic, with the advice that it would be prepared to approve the application, subject to certain requirements, if the police raised no objection.

The application was by Mr. K. and Mrs. M. Fischer, who sought permission to demolish existing buildings on properties at 257 and 263 Darling Street and erect thereon a grocery supermarket.

No. 257 is on the north-western corner of Darling and Ford Streets (near Gladstone Park), with a frontage of 54 feet to Darling Street, and No. 263 has frontages to Darling and Ford Streets. Total area of the site is 9,032 sq. ft.

On the site now are a

single-storey brick shop with a galvanised iron roof, and a partly two-storey brick shop, used as a ladies' wear shop and grocery shop respectively.

Plans accompanying the application are for a grocery supermarket of partly two-storey construction, containing a trading area of 5,694 sq. ft., a storeroom of 1,672 sq. ft. on the ground floor, staff amenities and storeroom area of about 1,386 sq. ft. on the first floor, and basement parking for 28 vehicles, with access to and egress from Ford Street.

The whole of the existing premises will be demolished. Machinery to be installed will be refrigeration motors, approximating 10 h.p. Off-street loading and unloading will be by indented dock.

Reporting on the ap-

plication, the Municipal Health Surveyor and Building Inspector, Mr. R. S. Williams, said that, among other matters, means for storage, removal or destruction of garbage must be satisfactory to Council, and demolition and construction work must be confined to normal working hours.

He said that, as the proposal would generate a large amount of neighbourhood business in this locality, the provision of 28 off-street parking spaces would seem reasonable.

The proposed development was consistent with existing development and appeared to be satisfactory.

However, he added, as it was in the category of a traffic generator, consultation with the Police Department would be necessary.

Restoration Of Watch House Is Proceeding

Restoration of the Watch House by the Balmain Association is proceeding at a pace commensurate with resources and the voluntary labour available.

A National Trust property, the old Watch House at 179 Darling Street, Balmain, is being restored to provide a museum, children's library and community facilities, as well as headquarters for the Association's activities.

Built in the Georgian tradition, the Watch House was one of a pair of police stations designed by Edmund Blacket, Colonial Architect, the other being at Victoria

Cross, North Sydney. Works of construction was started in May, 1854.

It remained headquarters of the local constabulary until 1887, when the present Police Court and Post Office building was completed.

The Balmain Association says that with its too few willing workers it has achieved the following:—

- Erected iron grilles over accessible windows to secure the building.
- Arranged re-roofing.
- Demolished damaged ceilings and partition walls.

• Renewed water supply and sewerage connections; installed new front doors; repaired and reglazed practically all windows.

• Cleaned up much of outside and inside stonework; painted many areas; and arranged for connection of power and lights.

Recently, new front verandah posts were installed, with timber supplied by a local firm, and a start has been made on putting down new verandah flooring.

The Association says there is a great need for volunteers to assist in

cleaning down and preparing the old woodwork, walls and windows. Skilled and unskilled helpers can both make a worthwhile contribution.

Plans are in hand for renewal of the fencing, and help is required from experienced fencers.

The Watch House Committee is planning ahead, and hopes that in a short time a small kitchen will be provided, all the outside painting and stonework, completed, and grounds and garden begin to take shape.

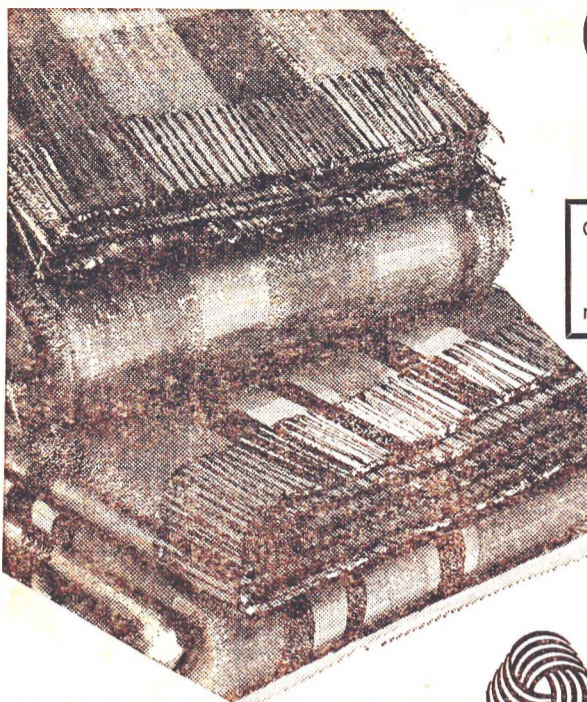

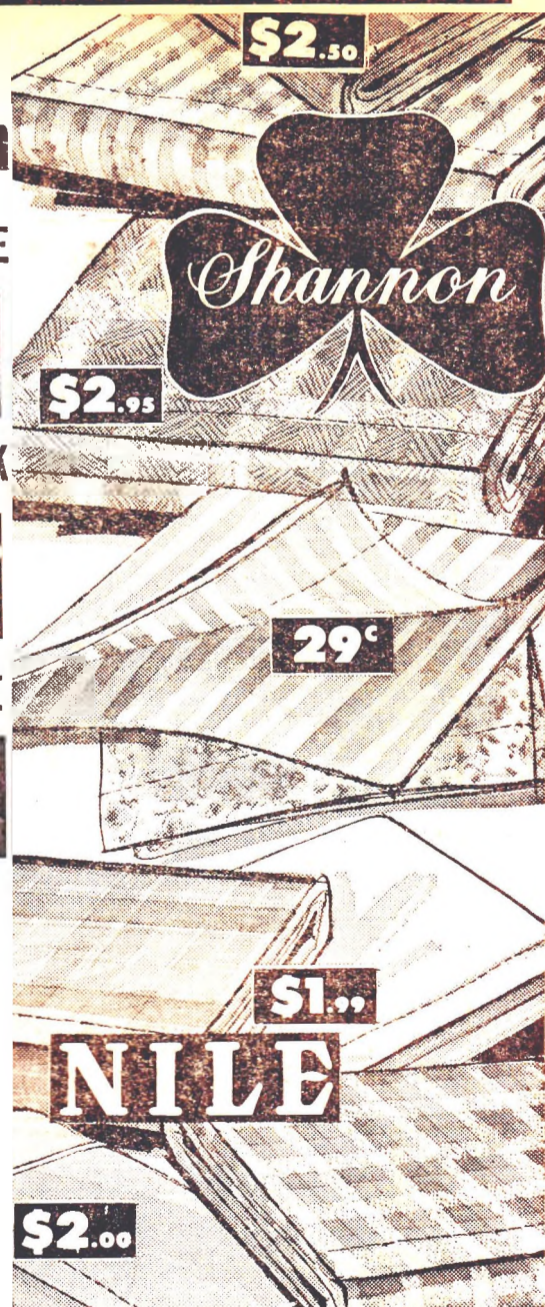

BALMAIN UNLUCKY AGAINST MANLY

In an incident-packed game at Sydney Sports Ground on Sunday, Balmain were most unlucky to go down 11-14 to Manly. The game was an exciting encounter.

It was highlighted by some dubious decisions by Referee Ernie Cook, which gave most Balmain supporters plenty to jeer about. By the same token, Manly also had a couple of decisions against them.

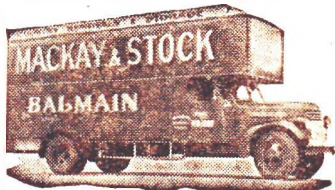
