

Balmain To Lose Historic Building



Balmain is <mark>about to lose one</mark> of its historic buildings — the E.S. & A. Bank building at the corner of Darling and Mort

Deterioration of the building has caused the bank to put into train plans to demolish it and replace it with a new structure on the same site.

A head office spokesman said this week that plans were not precise at this stage, but in view of the historic associations of the structure they would use the old materials as much as possible in the new building.

He added that reconstruction was imminent.

The Balmain branch was established in 1883. The building (pictured) was recently included by The National Trust of Australia (N.S.W.) among a number of buildings in Balmain listed as buildings "Of historic interest, the preservation of which should be encouraged."

This classification is considered to be an authoritative statement of the architectural and historical importance of the buildings in question.

Balmain's atmosphere darkened several shades last Friday when a vessel at the White Bay container terminal showered a wide area with thick soot during boilerblowing operations.

Residents are furioous — especially the ladies who saw their washing fouled up.

Whether the incident was subject to any degree of accident we can't qute figure out, but it would appear to have been an accompaniment of engine maintenance inspection.

If that be so, it's got to stop.

This, we believe, is the third occasion recently of a ship blowing its boiler tubes at this wharf, and public interest demands more than the mere waving of an admonishing finger by the Maritime Services Board at shipping officials.

We are advised by shipping authorities that it is both unusual and unnecessary to blow tubes at city wharves. However, the fact is that it oc-

The M.S.B. is not armed with legal power to discipline or punish offenders in this direction. It should be. The Board should have full power, by regulation if necessary.

At the moment, it appears that the only recourse to law by the public affected is through the Equity Court - a too cumbersome and expensive procedure for the average man.

Deliberate blowing of boiler tubes in a closely - settled residential area amounts to contempt or utter lack of concern for public opinion and comfort.

Hasn't it yet percolated into the minds of people in the shipping industry that the people of Balmain should be let live in reasonable quiet and comfort?

They had gauged the levels of noise existing in the nearby residential area as a result of use of the terminal and operation of its equipment.


