# Hospital To Specialise In Heart Treatment

Thanks to public support of its auxiliary's efforts, Balmain Hospital is about to establish a cardiac unit for specialist treatment of patients suffering from heart trouble.

The hospital has just purchased \$6,000 worth of special equipment and is preparing to employ additional nursing staff for the purpose.

It hopes that the unit will be established very shortly.

Approval has been received to employ the required additional staff, and advertisements are being published for the appointment of three experienced sisters.

In the near future a special ward will be devoted to the unit. Until that is available two existing two-bed wards will be converted for use for this purpose.

### Qualified

There is a cardiologist on the medical staff of Balmain Hospital, qualified to operate the new equipment.

In addition, the hospital has arranged liaison with full-time cardiologists of another Sydney hospital to assist in its establishment and operation.

Mr K. R. J. Boylan, Chief Executive Officer, said he specially wanted to thank the public members of the hospital's auxiliary, and all other parties who had helped raise the funds over the past two years to set up this unit.

"It is a very forward step", he said. "And the hospital administration and staff are really glad it has eventuated. It means that anyone who has a heart attack and is brought to our hospital will be given the most modern and most successful method of treatment available to the medical world.

"It will take us a little while to establish our unit, but when it is fully equipped and functioning, anyone who has a heart attack will automatically be placed in it, and receive intensive and highly specialised care, with the assistance of the latest equipment.

"This equipment is electronic, which monitors the patient and shows any changes taking place in his condition.

"The trend overseas and in other parts of Sydney is to set up special cardiac units in hospitals where people suffering from the same type of condition are treated collectively.

"We now have 200 to 300 patients a year with some form of heart condition.

"At the moment they are treated in the intensive care ward. But other patients there may be worrying in some cases to heart-condition patients, hence it is advisable to put them by themselves".

## Balmain To Lose Historic Building



Balmain is about to lose one of its historic buildings — the E.S. & A. Bank building at the corner of Darling and Mort Streets.

Deterioration of the building has caused the bank to put into train plans to demolish it and replace it with a new structure on the same site.

A head office spokesman said this week that plans were not precise at this stage, but in view of the historic associations of the structure they would use the old materials as much as possible in the new building.

He added that reconstruction was imminent.

The Balmain branch was established in 1883. The building (pictured) was recently included by The National Trust of Australia (N.S.W.) among a number of buildings in Balmain listed as buildings "Of historic interest, the preservation of which should be encouraged."

This classification is considered to be an authoritative statement of the architectural and historical importance of the buildings in question.

## NO SITE YET FOR SAILORS

Balmain's young men of the sea are still searching for a site for a new home.

Snails Bay Sailing Club, forced out of Snails Bay by shipping conditions, has failed to convince the authorities that it should be permitted to erect a club house in a corner of King George Park, Rozelle.

The Minister for Lands has advised Leichhardt Council that his Department does not favour the proposal.

The Minister said that exclusive use of any part of the park by a sectional group, especially on the waterfront, would be contrary to public interest.

## Column NINE

### BLACK DAY FOR BALMAIN

Balmain's atmosphere darkened several shades last Friday when a vessel at the White Bay container terminal showered a wide area with thick soot during boiler-blowing operations.

Residents are furious — especially the ladies who saw their washing fouled up.

Whether the incident was subject to any degree of accident we can't quite figure out, but it would appear to have been an accompaniment of engine maintenance inspection.

If that be so, it's got to stop.

This, we believe, is the third occasion recently of a ship blowing its boiler tubes at this wharf, and public interest demands more than the mere waving of an admonishing finger by the Maritime Services Board at shipping officials.

We are advised by shipping authorities that it is both unusual and unnecessary to blow tubes at city wharves. However, the fact is that it occurs.

The M.S.B. is not armed with legal power to discipline or punish offenders in this direction. It should be. The Board should have full power, by regulation if necessary.

At the moment, it appears that the only recourse to law by the public affected is through the Equity Court — a too cumbersome and expensive procedure for the average man.

Deliberate blowing of boiler tubes in a closely-settled residential area amounts to contempt or utter lack of concern for public opinion and comfort.

Hasn't it yet percolated into the minds of people in the shipping industry that the people of Balmain should be let live in reasonable quiet and comfort?

# BALMAIN SHOWERED WITH SOOT FROM SHIP ENGINES

Last Friday was a black day for Balmain — literally black. A large section of it was covered in thick soot which shot out of the funnels of the container ship *Discovery Bay*, berthed at the White Bay terminal.

Irate residents of the area spreading from the Terminal as far afield as Mort Bay complained to "The Link" that their homes were showered with soot.

It penetrated through open windows and doors, and played particular havoc with the household washing (including a large number of babies' nappies), on very many lines as a result of lack of drying because of the wet weather.

Mrs J. Sherlock, secretary of the Local Action Committee of residents living near the terminal, said that when the soot was being shot out of the ship's funnels it was accompanied by a great noise from the steam being sent through the ship's boiler tubes.

"It went on for hours and nearly drove everybody mad", she said.

"The soot came into my kitchen, which is on my balcony facing the berth. It was in lumps half the size of a pea, which when wiped off turned into grease.

"I even saw two dogs covered with it—the first time I've ever seen black Golden Labradors.

"One very irate resident of Vincent Street went on board the ship and demanded to see the captain. That gentleman told him something had gone wrong with the ship".

Captain J. W. Gray, N.S.W. manager of Seaterminals Ltd.,

the terminal operators, told "The Link" that he had approached the ship's agents and expressed his alarm about the incident.

### Alarm

He understood strict instructions had gone forward that the action of cleaning ship's engines at the berth was not to recur.

The ship concerned was the *Discovery Bay*, owned by Overseas Containers Ltd., and is powered by 32,000 h.p. remote-controlled fully-automated oil-fired steam turbines. It had just completed its maiden voyage.

An official of the P. & O. Company, representing the owners, said that the incident should not happen again. The emergence of soot occurred when the engines were restarted at the wharf after a routine maintenance inspection.

The official added, however, that investigations by their representatives indicated that, although there was no doubt that some washing had been affected, the effect was not as great or as numerous as they had been led to believe.

A spokesman for the Maritime Services Board said that the Board did not condone that type of behaviour by ships in port.

The Harbourmaster, he said, had been in touch with the shipping

# Terminal Noise Unacceptable, Say Experts

Acoustic experts declared last week that the noise abatement measures adopted by the operators of White Bay container terminal had failed to reduce the noise to an acceptable level.

One expert told "The Link" that he had carefully read the reports published in this paper in which the N.S.W. manager for the operating company, Seatainer Terminals Ltd., had advised Grafton Street residents of measures to dampen down the noise of operation.

These included the report in the August 6 issue in which Mrs J. Sherlock, secretary of the Local Action Committee, had expressed appreciation of the company's efforts to lessen the noise, which residents had agreed had dropped recently as a result of those efforts.

The report was satisfying, the expert said. He added that he was impressed with the patience shown by the residents.

He said, however, that while the noise level had dropped at night, it was still not down to an acceptable level.

Acoustic sample surveys taken very recently had shown some reduction, but the level was still too high to be accepted by the community.

## Panel

Leichhardt Council's Noise Abatement Panel, which meets every three months, reported to Council last week the results of "Before and after" noise level surveys at the container terminal.

The surveys had been made prior to the opening of the terminal, and again after it had been operating for a period.

They had gauged the levels of noise existing in the nearby residential area as a result of use of the terminal and operation of its equipment.

The second survey showed that the noise level had increased in the residential area, and that the evening noise levels were in excess of what was considered acceptable.

The panel's report added that Council had been in receipt of complaints from residents in regard to noise disturbing the amenity of the neighbourhood.

It desired advice as to the measures being taken by the company to

reduce the noise levels as noted in the area bounded by Grafton, Ewinton, Adolphus and Wallace Streets, Balmain.

The experts whose report had been quoted by the panel had advised that the noise generated by the major items of equipment within the terminal could be reduced by introduction of sound attenuation equipment.

Council adopted the panel's report.

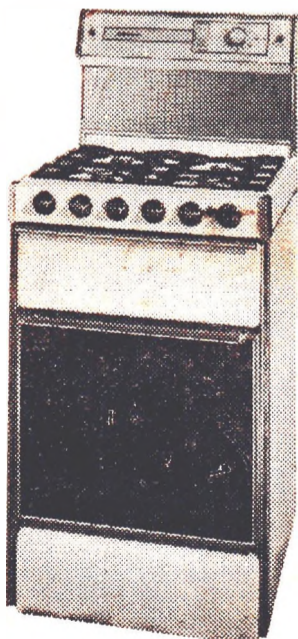

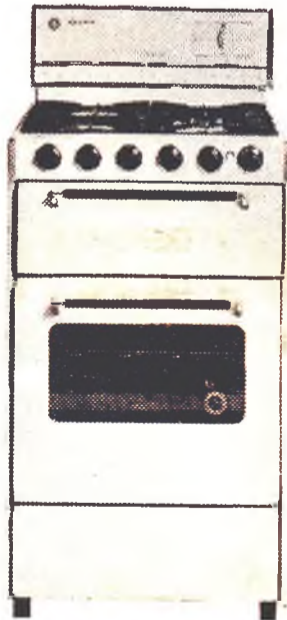
