SOOT BLACKENS BALMAIN

But A.N.L. Thinks The Problem Is Solved

Balmain people were "hopping mad" (in the words of one resident) at a repetition last Tuesday of the August 22 incident in which a ship berthed at White Bay container terminal showered the district with oily soot, reported to be much worse than on the first occasion.

The question of damages is now a legal matter.

The two occurrences are thought by some to be due to mechanical faults, now believed to have been corrected, although one commentator thinks they might have had something to do with the fact that both ships were on their maiden voyages.

An assurance to the people of Balmain that it was not a case of negligent blowing of boilers in port was given by the Deputy General Manager of the Australian National Line, Mr K. M. Hadden.

[It was the new A.N.L. ship, the oil-turbine Australian Endeavour, which caused the trouble. It berthed at White Bay last week on its maiden voyage from Europe.]

Mr Hadden, speaking to "The Link" from the company's head office in Melbourne, said a full report on the incident was being prepared.

A Fault?

"All we can say at this stage", he said, "is that we are not certain of the cause except we believe it was a mechanical fault, and that it has now been corrected."

"We have arranged to investigate specific complaints."

"It is not necessary to blow the boilers, certainly never in port."

"This was something that happened involuntarily. I assure the Balmain people that we realise it was pretty unpleasant while it was going on, and that we were not indulging in some activity without due regard to where we were."

"Nobody in his right mind would have black soot dropping all over the district."

The complaints of residents were similar to those published in this paper on August 27.

They said that black carbon deposit from the ship's funnel descended over their homes and settled in layers almost an inch thick. It even went under the doors.

The shower continued for about an hour.

The soot went as far afield as Mort Bay, where some residents thought it had come from the other A.N.L. ship berthed there—the Australian Enterprise—which was warming up its engines prior to sailing that day.

The Mort Bay terminal officials said the Enterprise was a diesel-engined vessel and that no deposit had emerged from its funnel.

Strike

The incident caused a temporary work stoppage at a Darling Street clothing factory—Freedom Pty. Ltd.—where the 28 women employees said they could not stand the oil soot entering the premises, and left.

The factory manager, Mr R. Lloyd, said Government action was needed to end the serious inconvenience to the Balmain community.

He said the soot blow-out went on for about an hour on Tuesday afternoon. When he opened the front door to enter the premises next morning he saw a layer of oily soot on the floor.

It took about 20 minutes for each girl to clean her machine sufficiently to start work, but later they said they could not stand the soot getting into their hair and eyes and falling down the backs of their necks.

"It was the type of soot that forms a smear and penetrates the skin, leaving a black mark almost impossible to wash off", said Mr Lloyd.

"They stopped work. They returned next morning, but even on

Friday small particles of soot were still falling, the wind blowing them through the ventilators".

Mr Lloyd said it cost \$824 to clean the soot out of the factory. In addition a considerable amount of white work was ruined, and the total damage would run into a couple of thousand dollars.

When told the A.N.L. report that the faults were thought to be cured, he said, "I hope so. Residents around here have had enough. It's appalling to think that in this modern age we can't have a ship enter port without showering the district with soot."

"This incident was three times worse than the previous one."

"Incidentally, on Friday the Lord Mayor of Grafton, Ald. N. Whyllie, rang me from that city, said he'd seen our trouble on TV, and suggested that our factory should move to Grafton where we wouldn't have such problems."

"Obviously other Councils are interested in Balmain's worries, even if our own doesn't seem to be very interested."

Council

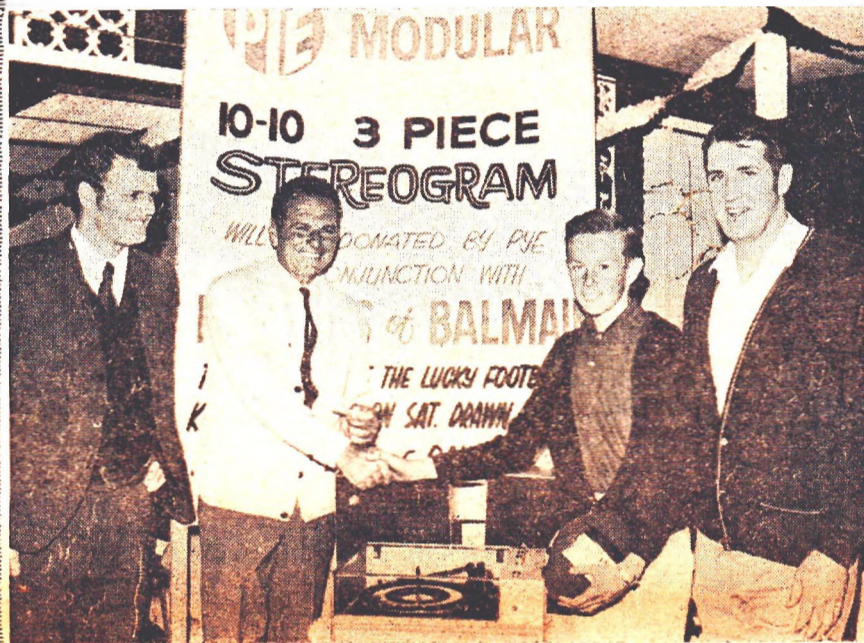
At Leichhardt Council meeting last Wednesday night Ald. Wyner (Balmain) sought at the start to have the standing orders set aside to allow debate of the situation as a matter of urgency.

He and Ald. Origlass wanted to have a special Council meeting held to discuss the problems created by the container terminals.

They wanted a meeting to be attended by shipping and traffic authorities, especially to discuss the Mort Bay terminal traffic problem.

was that we were only their plea. However, the two aldermen moved to that effect later.

The majority would not go along with the idea of a special meeting, but asked the Town Clerk to seek an interview with the Premier (as titular head of the Maritime Services Board) to discuss the White Bay position.

IS IT JUST ALL TALK?

Mr Jim Cope, M.H.R., official Labor candidate for the new seat of Sydney (in which Balmain and Rozelle are situated) asked a polite question in the House regarding Federal Government plans for solving Balmain's traffic and noise problems arising from shipping containerisation.

We could have told him the Minister for Shipping and Transport's answer before he asked it: That the Commonwealth had made available to the State sufficient new funds under the Federal Aids Roads Act to tackle this and similar problems around Sydney.

"The Link" said this six months ago, when it tried to tell Leichhardt Council that the time was ripe for an approach to the Department of Main Roads to secure special attention to Balmain peninsula roads to handle containerisation problems.

There followed dead silence, until the recent statement to this paper by the Mayor (Ald. Rodwell) expressing impatience at the failure of the D.M.R. to have talks with the Council on the matter.

We might well ask: Why hasn't the Council initiated talks with the Department?

The Federal Minister says that over quite a long time discussions have been held with Councils in the area around this container port.

When—with whom—and with what result? We haven't heard a word about talks, let alone any result.

What we want to see is a trace of enthusiasm by local people—the Mayor, aldermen, political candidates—in tackling these problems.

So far—except for the Council's opposition to the building of a special traffic terminal at Mort Bay—it seems to have been just a lot of talk.

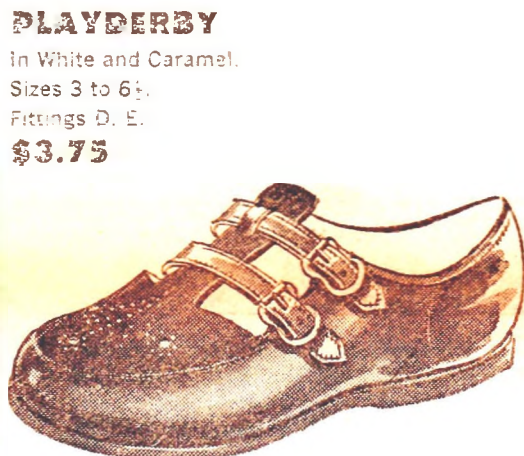

FEDERAL CANDIDATES AT WORK

Liberal Seeks Council Administrator

Broadway Branch of the Liberal Party of Australia has decided to ask the Minister for Local Government, Mr Morton, to replace Leichhardt Council with an administrator, because of its failure to handle the municipality's finances in a satisfactory manner.

The decision was made at the annual general meeting of the branch where Mr Graham Robertson, selected Liberal Party candidate for the new Sydney electorate at the forthcoming Federal elections, drew attention to the financial state of the Council.

He said that Council had shown disregard for the needs of the ratepayers in such matters as the A.N.L. terminal at Morts Dock, and lack of access thoroughfares to it; the Home for Aged Men at Glebe; the closing

of Federal Street bridge; and the lack of facilities for parking at Balmain.

After discussion it was unanimously decided that a protest be made to the Minister, with a request for appointment of an administrator.

The meeting was told that the Council's current year's revised estimates showed a deficit of \$154,304.

Mr Robertson said the current rates were already amongst the highest in the metropolitan area, and a rise in the

rate to combat the problem would be disastrous.

To cover the deficit the rate would have to rise by .175 cents in the dollar of the unimproved capital value of rateable land, but to cover the deficit for next year as well would require a rise of .350.

This would make the new rate 2.665.

Mr Robertson said this compared with the Marrickville rate of 2.25, Ashfield 1.60, Waverley 1.82, Woollahra 1.00 and City 2.35.

Labor Tackles Problems Of Terminals

Mr J. F. Cope, M.H.R., selected Labor candidate for the seat of Sydney, sought in the House of Representatives last week to learn the attitude of the Federal Government towards the problems faced by Balmain residents as a result of operation of the container shipping terminals.

He asked the Minister for Shipping and Transport, Mr Sinclair, the following question:

"Now that the container terminal at Balmain is in operation heavy trucks will be constantly used to transport containers to and from the terminal.

"What steps have been taken or will be taken to eliminate noise and the traffic nuisance which will affect residents living adjacent to the area?"

Mr Sinclair replied that over quite a long time discussions had been held with Councils in the area around the container port and the vehicular deck facility in Sydney about the frequency and the manner in which heavy transport used the road access.

Of course, he said, there had been a substantial increase in the funds made available by the Commonwealth under the Commonwealth Aid roads legislation, a substantial portion of which was going to the city of Sydney.

That would give the

N.S.W. Government an enhanced capacity to improve the road system.

"Some of the money", added the Minister, "may well go to providing broader road access and better through roads to the port area, enabling a quicker movement of vehicles.

"One of the traditional problems of the port of Sydney has been the marked congestion caused by moving cargoes to and from the wharves.

"Persons living in the area have the advantage of living on the waterfront, but the disadvantage of having cargoes moved along the roads near which their houses are built.

"If full benefit is to be obtained from the new method of cargo handling cargoes must be moved rapidly to and from the wharf area.

"I am aware that the problem referred to by the honourable gentleman concerns the residents of the area, but I think it is essential to confine operations to the working week rather than to week-ends.

"To the extent to which this happens it does mean that the cost of handling cargoes has increased and that the expected economies have not been achieved".

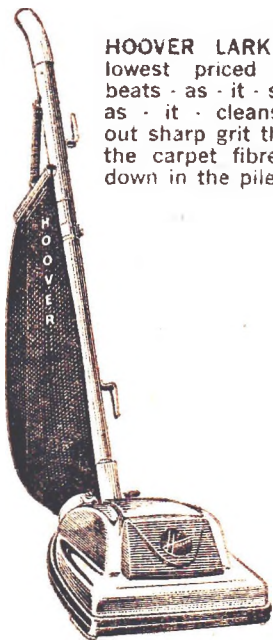

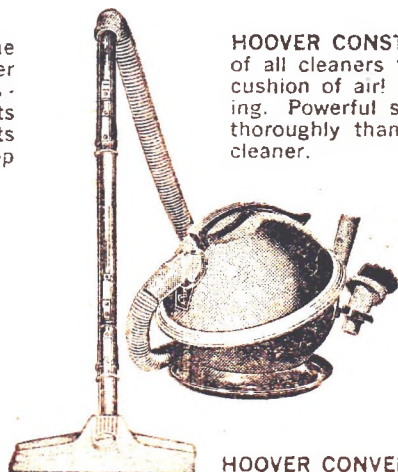

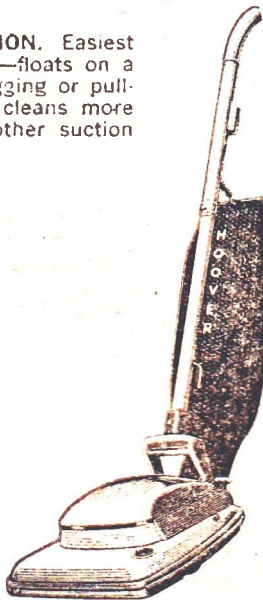

THIS WAS THE YEAR OF THE TIGERS!

One couldn't help feeling sorry that Keith "Golden Boots" Barnes was not out there when our boys did the lap of honour.

Other players who were not in the side due to injuries or suspensions can be proud that they helped get the Tigers into the grand final, and will be out there next season to keep the Tigers on top.

"Little in stature but big in heart" describes our hooker Peter Boulton, who did a giant's job in getting Balmain their share of the ball.

His general play, too, was outstanding, as he continually ploughed through the rucks and tackled like a Trojan. This boy's got a big future all right!

Barry McTaggart and Gary Leo got through an amazing amount of work and can be proud of their part in the win. They never let up, and Souths must have thought there were four of them.

Jack Spencer and Joe Walsh also gave great performances, tackling themselves to a standstill but still running like deers when the chance came. They lost nothing in comparison with Souths' famed second rowers.

The best little tackler in the game is almost certainly our tough five-eighth, "Chicka" Outten, who wrapped himself round any green and red jersey coming his way. Keith gave Dennis Pittard no room to move in, which was one of the main reasons Souths couldn't fire.

I feel sure Keith will represent his country one day, either at half-back or five-eighth.

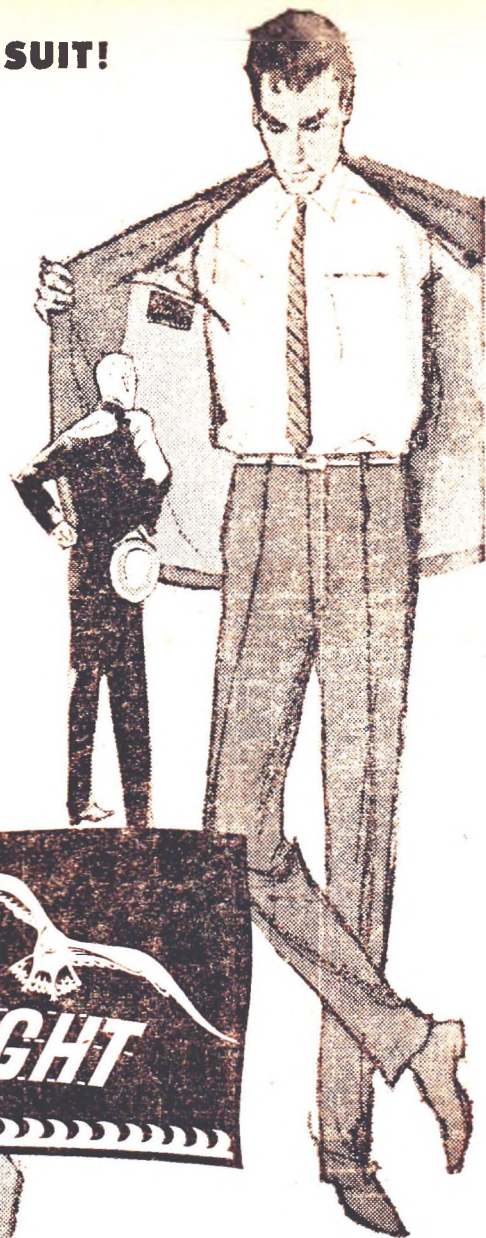

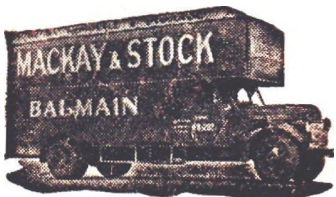
