

We might well ask: Why hasn't the Council initiated talks with the Department?

The Federal Miniser says that over quite a long time discussions have been held with Councils in the area around this container port.

When-with whom -and with what result? We haven't heard a word about talks, let alone any result.

What we want to see is a trace of enthusiasm by local people — the Mayor, aldermen, political candidates - in tackling these problems.




