WHO'S WHO IN ELECTION

Points About The Candidates

Seven candidates have nominated for the seat of Sydney in the Federal elections on Saturday, October 25. They are representatives of the three major parties — Liberal, Labor and Democratic Labor Party — and four independents.

The Balmain peninsula is now included in the Sydney electorate, whose boundaries are as follows:

Rozelle, Birchgrove, Balmain, Glebe, Campdown, Darlington, part of Erskineville, Alexandria, Rosebery, Zetland, Waterloo, Redfern, Surry Hills, part of Darlinghurst, and Woolloomooloo.

Other suburbs are inside the boundaries, such as Chippendale and Pyrmont.

Before the change in boundaries the Balmain peninsula was included in Dalley, represented by Mr W. P. O'Connor, M.H.R., but that seat also was abolished under the boundary alterations.

Mr O'Connor failed to secure Labor Party endorsement for Sydney.

When the rolls closed on September 29 there were approximately 58,000 electors enrolled for the electorate.

Nominations

Following are the nominations for the Sydney seat in alphabetical order, with their addresses and affiliations:

Boyle, Mrs Norma F. Blues Point Road, McMahon's Point.—D.L.P.

Channell I. B., Norton Street, Leichhardt — Independent.

Cope, J. F., William Street, Redfern—A.L.P.

Lewis, D. H., Smart Street, Fairfield — Independent.

Origlass, N., Nicholson Street, Balmain East—"Set Labor-Free Campaign".

Robertson, G. P. Broadway—Liberal.

Watson, S. A. C., William Edward Street, Longueville — Independent.

Mrs Boyle, a widow, is the official Democratic Labor Party representative.

Mr Channell gives his occupation as "Wizard". He is employed by the University of N.S.W.

Mr Cope, the official Labor representative, was M.H.R. for Watson in the old Parliament. Watson was one of the seats abolished under the redistribution.

Mr Lewis describes himself as an independent, but says he represents the small group known as "Pensioner Power Association".

Mr Origlass is one of the three Balmain ward aldermen of Leichhardt Council, and one of the persons expelled by the Labor Party for their part in fighting against Caucus policy in regard to Balmain domestic problems.

Mr Robertson, the Liberal Party candidate, is licensee of the Lansdowne Hotel, Broadway.

Mr Watson, independent, is a medical consultant.

Liberal Thinks Seat "Winnable"

Liberal Party candidate, Mr. Graham Robertson, thinks Sydney "A winnable seat" for him. He gave the following reasons for his view:

The success of the Civic Reform Party in the City Council elections.

Redistribution of the electorate boundaries.

The fact that the Labor candidate, Mr J. F. Cope, has been preferred by the Party over others who might have

been selected.

"I think Nick Origlass will split the Labor vote, and the seat will be won on preferences", he said. "I have a good chance".

Mr Robertson said another reason—a major one—for his confidence was the fact that he was a keen supporter of Bal-

main Rugby League team, whereas Jim Cope was a South Sydney fan.

"The Tigers beat Souths for the premiership", he said, with a chuckle. "In the election Balmain, supported by Glebe, will beat South Sydney again".

Candidates Give Views

Four of the candidates — Messrs Channell, Lewis, Origlass and Robertson—responded to the invitation of The Balmain Association to address its general meeting at Balmain Town Hall last Thursday night.

Mr Channell, in an entertaining and not very serious speech, said that if elected he would go to Canberra "to stir up Parliament".

He wanted bureaucrats to start thinking about people instead of themselves and their position in the hierarchy. And he wanted politicians to think about people instead of their position in Parliament.

Mr Lewis said his main concern was the welfare of pensioners. Of the 58,000 electors in Sydney, 27,000 were of pensioner age. He wanted a better deal for them.

He wanted an increase in the pension rate to make it equal to the basic wage. He also wanted the abolition of the means test, and free medical and hospital service and free transport for pensioners.

Mr Origlass explained that he had been expelled from the Labor Party "for taking the view of the voter rather than the party", even though since then there had been cases of other people doing the same thing without being expelled.

He claimed he had a mandate from the people because they had supported him in past elections, and he would be taking to Parliament the views of the people instead of those of the party.

Mr Robertson confined his remarks to a discussion of local problems, in which he was taking a close interest.

These included the new Morts Bay terminal traffic conditions, the difficulty of shoppers to secure parking space in Balmain and Rozelle, and the general policy of Leichhardt Council.

Labor

Mr J. F. Cope, M.H.R., official Labor candidate, told "The Link" that the parts of Labor policy which were very impressive were those relating to social welfare, education, shipbuilding and shipping.

He was commenting on the policy speech of the party leader, Mr Whitlam.

He said Labor would: • Immediately increase aged, invalid, widow and repatriation pensions by \$1 a week, and thereafter provide an additional \$1 in each successive Budget until the value of the pension rate was at least restored to 25% of average weekly earnings, with successive adjustments to accord

with rises in earnings.

• Abolish the means test over a period of six years.

• Replace the 114 different health funds with a single Commonwealth health insurance fund. Taxpayers would contribute 1 1/2% of their taxable income to the fund, with a ceiling of \$100 for a family.

• Establish an Australian Schools Commission to do for all primary, secondary and technical courses what the Universities Commission is doing for universities.

• Abolish conscription of youth for overseas service.

• Introduce forms of assistance to companies building and operating ships which already apply throughout North America and Western Europe.

• Take steps to follow our long established policy of constructing, chartering and operating (under A.N.L.) enough ships to carry a fair share of our trade.

Mr Cope said the money to finance Labor policy would come from the natural increase in Commonwealth revenue. In 1968-69 that increase was \$800 million. In 1969-70 the increase would be \$1,000 million.

Column NINE

FEDERAL ELECTION

The number of candidates — seven — contesting the seat of Sydney is far higher than in the average Federal election.

This introduces a sparkle into a situation which normally would be an orthodox fight between representatives of major parties.

There are some interesting personalities involved, and on this count alone the results will be watched with much interest.

There are also some rather different policies than usual to be evaluated. These include the desire to stir up Parliament, which could possibly appeal to some because of its fundamental soundness.

Following the alteration of boundaries, Balmain and Rozelle have been grouped with many other inner suburbs into the new seat of Sydney, which observers declare should be a Labor stronghold.

However, local issues could assume some importance. While a Federal Member might not be in as favourable a position to sway Parliament in regard to local matters as his State counterpart, a live man could still do a deal of good for this district.

The matters in mind include keeping an eye on shipping and shipbuilding problems, such as those arising from extension of containerisation and interstate and overseas trade by the Federal instrumentality, the Australian National Line.

The day should not have passed—and will not have passed, if the right man is chosen—for our Federal Member to show leadership in matters involving national policy.

This is the day of party politics, but in the end it is always proved that a party is as good only as the men it comprises.

Idea For "Little Man" To Appeal Against Planning

Informed observers in Balmain support the move made in the N.S.W. Legislative Assembly recently for the establishment by the Government of a body to hear appeals against official town planning decisions

The move was made by the Chairman of the Parliamentary Labor Party, Mr R. J. Kelly, M.L.A.

His motion was that a Select Committee be appointed to inquire into the feasibility of the establishment of a standing committee or other accepted body to hear appeals by any person, corporation or statutory body against the decisions of any governmental, statutory, public, local government or semi-local government body where such person or body, etc., claims that he or it has been injuriously affected and against which at present there is no right of appeal.

The Select Committee would also examine the methods of enforcing such decisions of the standing committee or an acceptable alternative.

Observers point out that the present law allows a disappointed developer to take his rejected application to the Land and Valuation Court, but denies local homeowners a similar right if the same application, however ill conceived, is given a Council's blessing.

Balmain people would have a special interest in such a move.

Although it is now too late to affect the White

Bay terminal situation, the scheme could be of value in any future move governing this vulnerable area.

"The little man" — in this case the local resident, whether home-owner or tenant—would at least be able to raise his voice in an official way without having to try to persuade official or semi-official bodies to speak for him.

Had such a body been in existence before the White Bay terminal plans became firmly fixed—it is thought—the "Hands Off Balmain" campaign would have been listen-

ed to officially instead of only through publicity.

The Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. L. Rodwell, is one who thinks such an idea worth while.

He told "The Link": "Often the little person is not considered as much as he should be.

"We are faced with overall policies, and sometimes the little fellow who is so vitally concerned is overlooked.

"I think a responsible Government would see the value of such a body.

"The powers of Local Government are too restricted to meet the situation satisfactorily".
