This introduces a sparkle into a situation which normally would be an orthodox fight between representatives of major parties.


There are some interesting personalities involved, and on this count alone the results will be watched with much interest.

There are also some rather different policies than usual to be evaluated. These include the desire to stir up Parliament, which could possibly appeal to some because of its fundame n t a l soundness

Following the alter-ation of boundaries. Balmain and Rozelle have been grouped with many other inner suburbs into the new seat of Sydney. which observers declare should be a Labor stronghold.

However, local issues could assume some importance. While a Federal Member might not be in as favourable a position to sway Parliament in regard to local matters as his State counterpart, a live man could still do a deal of good
