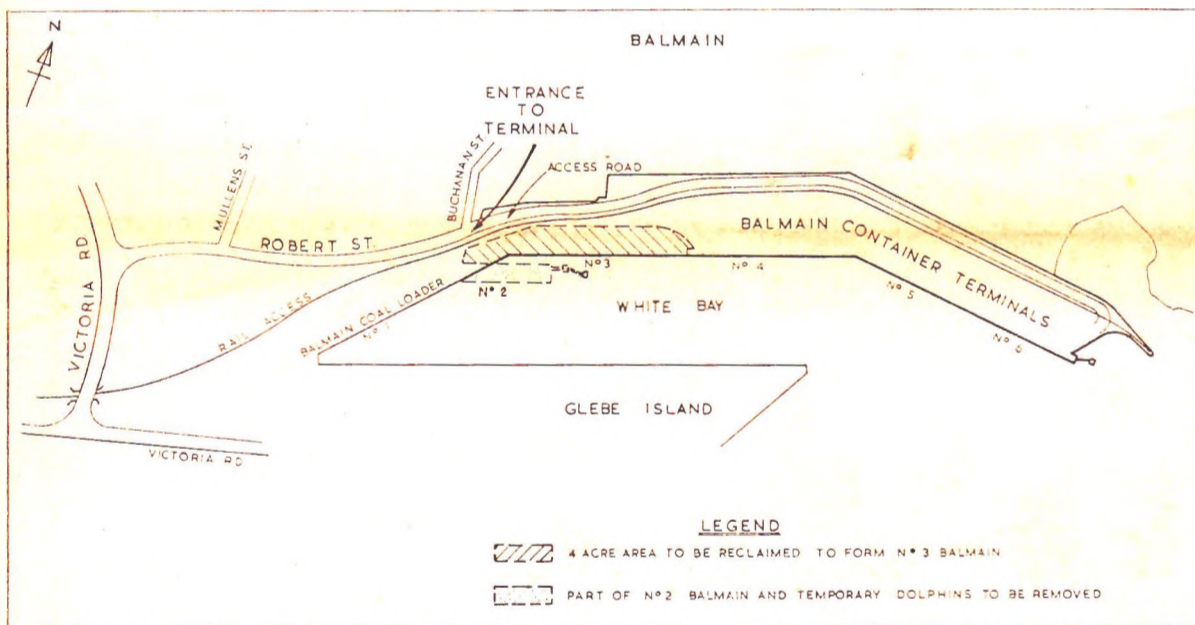

# New Container Terminal Is Being Built

Balmain and Rozelle residents will be interested in plans of the Maritime Services Board for extension of the container terminal facilities at White Bay, which involve operation of an additional general purpose container terminal.



This plan, drawn up by the Maritime Services Board, shows how reclamation work, and the demolition of part of the existing No. 2 Balmain berth and dolphins, will provide a further four acres of land and a fourth berth at the Balmain container terminals.

In the Legislative Assembly recently, the Premier (Mr Askin), answering a question by Mr Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain, said no extension of the eastern wharf at White Bay was contemplated "at this time".

The Maritime Services Board, however, reports that reclamation work and some demolition will provide a further four acres of land and a fourth berth at the Balmain container terminals.

The terminals at Balmain at present embrace

a total area of 27 acres of land, much of which has been reclaimed from the harbour, behind a seawall provided by 44 concrete caissons.

The land surrounding Nos. 5 and 6 berths embraces an area of 13.5 acres, whilst the remaining foreshore land to the rear of No. 4 berth also covers 13.5 acres.

### Next Phase

Next phase of the foreshore development provides for extension of the western berth in a westerly direction to join

the new section which will be constructed as a prolongation of the existing No. 1 berth.

The plan is shown in the accompanying drawing.

Original design of the western berth specially provided for the extension which will result in a further 4 acres being joined to the western terminal area.

The extension will also have the effect of creating a further berth, to be known as No. 3 Balmain.

In this way the total foreshore land will have an area of 31 acres, of which 13.5 acres will lie to the east and behind Nos. 5 and 6 berths, and the remaining 17.5 acres will be to the west and to the rear of Nos. 3 and 4 berths.

Space required for road and rail access and associated buildings is included in the total area.

Nos. 5 and 6 berths have a wharf face of 1,300 ft., whilst Nos. 3

and 4 will have a face of 1,800 ft., following the next phase of the development which will create No. 3 berth.

To make way for extension to the west, the temporary dolphins erected at No. 2 Balmain, and the jetty itself, will be demolished. When work is completed the foreshore will present an unbroken straight line appearance.

The eastern section of the terminal area, Nos. 5 and 6 berths, has been leased to Seatainer Terminals Pty. Ltd., which has installed the container equipment necessary for its operations.

### New Crane

The western end, No. 4 berth, will be completed later this year and will be operated by the Board itself as a general purpose container terminal.

A 45-ton twin lift container crane, similar in concept to that provided

## M.S.B. v. Residents: Board's Win Earns Silver Cup

Balmain residents who lost their bitter fight against the construction of the White Bay container terminal by the Maritime Services Board will be most intrigued to know that the Board has won a silver cup for its success.

The cup was presented to the Board at a dinner in Sydney last Friday night by the Institute of Materials Handling.

The dinner was attended by about 250 persons, including prominent personalities in the materials handling, transport, shipping and allied fields.

Each year the institute presents three awards to organisations which, in its opinion, have a record of achievement in the materials handling field worthy of recognition.

The award to the M.S.B. was of the S. E. Pike Memorial Award "for noteworthy achievement in the field of materials handling in the

transportation section". In advising the Board of the award, the chairman of the Institute, Mr N. Lancaster, wrote:

"It is recorded that the above silver cup is to be awarded to your organisation for its forceful activities in organising construction of the White Bay container terminal in the face of considerable opposition, and without which the overseas container service would not now be operating in Sydney."

"Also for its provision of other modern terminals and wharves for containers, and unit-load vessels and roll-on/roll-off services, which again could not operate in the port of Sydney without the Board's assistance".

## COMBATING POLLUTION

The effects of air contaminants and measures used throughout the world to combat pollution will be explained to the public and representatives of industry at a meeting to be held at Leichhardt Town Hall on November 6.

Millions of dollars are spent annually to combat air pollution, but the menace remains as industry expands and our motor car population increases.

Mr R. P. Murphy, principal Engineer of the Air Pollution Branch of

the N.S.W. Department of Health, will outline the present situation, with particular reference to local problems.

A film dealing with the effects of pollution will also be shown.

The meeting has been organised by the N.S.W. branch of the Clean Air Society of Australia and N.Z. in an effort to bring about greater public awareness of the true extent of this problem.

The society invites local residents to attend the meeting, which will commence at 8 p.m.

### ELECTION RESULT

Local issues obviously carried little weight in the election campaign in the Sydney electorate (in which Balmain and Rozelle are included).

The Liberal candidate, Mr Graham Robertson, and Balmain alderman, Mr Nick Origlass, both concentrated on local issues, but failed to dent the image of "True-blue Labor" which this area displays.

That the election overall resulted in a big swing of the Australian people's support from Government parties to Labor would, of course, be detrimental to the success of other than official Labor here.

In addition, local issues are never so important in a Federal election as in a State ballot.

However, supporters of the Balmain-Leichhardt Labor Party, which carried the Balmain ward in the municipal elections, and which fought so hard for "the people" in respect of the Glebe Old Men's Home, were expected to whip up more support than the 3,000-odd votes recorded for Ald. Origlass.

"Pensioner Power" also was not as strong as expected.

While Labor still has its hopes of getting into office, it would appear at this stage that it will remain in opposition. It will, though, be stronger than before, and this would augur well for Australia's immediate future.

Parties which continue to stand out head and shoulders above their opponents tend to become smug and unenterprising in their approach to public questions.

Meanwhile, we congratulate Jim Cope on his overwhelming success, and look forward to securing his co-operation in tackling problems of local significance.

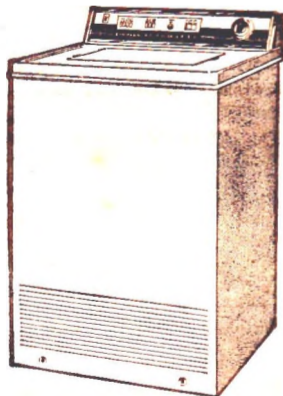

## Building Near Sewers

Many intending home-builders are running into unexpected delays and expense because of their failure to check on the existence of water mains, sewers and stormwater conduits.

A Water Board spokesman said that young couples could be particularly affected by the disappointment of having to change their house plans, or by the burden of additional expense, if they did not check these points before buying land.

He said that 3,300 miles of the 6,200 miles of sewers in the Board's area ran through private property.

Anyone buying a home, or intending to build or rebuild on land which included Board pipelines, should

be told that the Board had the right to withhold approval to the erection of any building over or adjacent to its works.

Building over water mains was prohibited, and very strict conditions applied to building over or near sewers and stormwater conduits.

The spokesman said that anyone buying property should first check, either personally or through their solicitor, as to the existence or otherwise of Board pipelines on the property.

If such pipelines existed, they should then avail themselves of the advice of the Board's "Building-over-sewers" section on the first floor of the Board's head office, corner of Pitt and Bathurst Streets, Sydney.

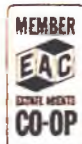

# COUNCILS SEEK MORE POWER OVER "DISORDERLY" ALDERMEN

Happenings at Leichhardt Council meetings during the quarrel between Balmain ward aldermen and the Mayor over the Glebe Old Men's Home had their sequel at the Local Government Association conference in Dubbo last week.

Leichhardt Council was represented at the conference by a team led by the Mayor, Ald. L. Rodwell.

Conference carried without dissent a motion from Leichhardt Council that the Association seek more powers for mayors and presidents to remove disorderly aldermen from Council meetings.

The motion asked that any alderman excluded

from a meeting—either of full Council or a committee—be required before being readmitted to tender a written apology, which was to be read to the meeting before its commencement.

Aldermen excluded from a Council meeting would be automatically excluded from all committee meetings pending a written apology.

The move is designed to write into the law an

explicit procedure for readmittance to a meeting.

Along with other motions requiring his attention, this will be forwarded to the Minister for Local Government (Mr Morton).

There was no move to seek definition of the term "disorderly", it being felt that this should be left to the mayor or chairman.

The intention of the conference was to define procedure on occasions which had been relatively few in Council history in N.S.W.

It was felt that there was need for clarification of the powers of mayors and presidents to avoid repetition of the Leichhardt situation, which had called for an application to the Equity Court.

Conference discussed a motion seeking more powers for Local Gov-

erment to deal with noise, especially at parties in flats, and that coming from ships berthed in areas controlled by the Maritime Services Board.

Conference decided that this was a matter best handled by the police rather than Councils. The strength of the police, it was thought, was needed to control noisy parties.

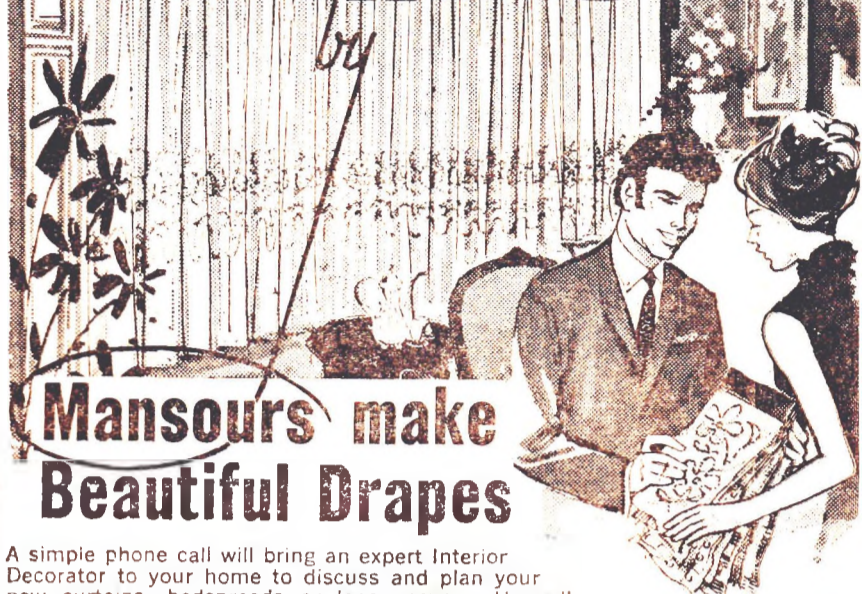

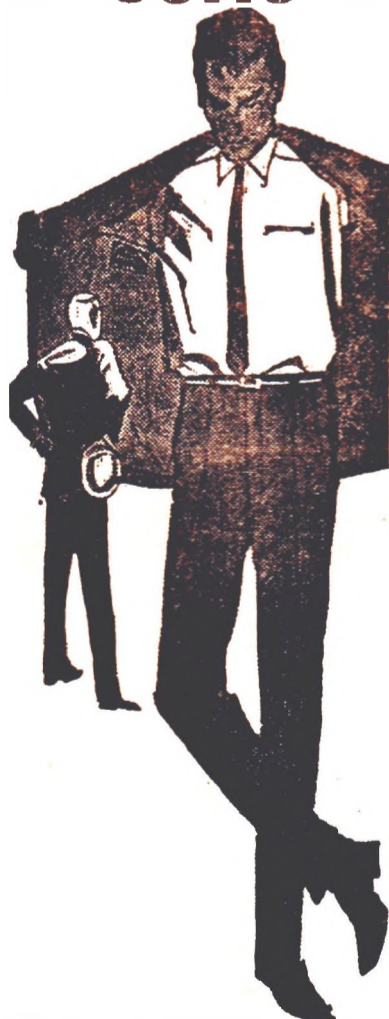

**ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR A PENSION?**

Under the new Tapered Means Test many people become eligible for a pension for the first time.

The Government wants to pay pensions to everybody entitled to them, but it cannot do so unless people claim.

You can get a Claim Form at any Post Office, or at any office of the Social Services Department.

Men over 65, women over 60, and invalids over 16 who have lived in Australia for the qualifying period are eligible for a pension if their Means as Assessed are under \$40 per week (single) or \$70 per week (married couples). People with dependent children may get pensions even beyond these limits.

A widow, divorcee or deserted wife, who has lived in Australia for the qualifying period may be eligible for a pension if her Means as Assessed are less than —

- \$36.50 per week (no children and over 50)
- \$57.00 per week (1 dependent child)
- \$68.00 per week (2 dependent children)
- \$79.00 per week (3 dependent children)
- \$90.00 per week (4 dependent children) etc.

These amounts will be higher by \$4 a week if the pensioner has a child under 6 or an invalid child requiring full time care. (If her Means as Assessed consist mainly of assets the amounts may be lower.)

**Means as Assessed is —**

Your earnings and other income (certain income, such as income from assets, is disregarded)

**PLUS**

Ten per cent of your assets (except your home and personal possessions) above certain exempt levels.

Thus if you have no income, except income from assets, you may be eligible for a pension if your assets are below these limits:

**Age & Invalid**

Single \$21,200  
Married \$37,200

**Widow**

With children \$26,960  
Without children \$19,380

Leaflets giving more detailed information are available at Post Offices and all Social Services offices.

If you think you may be eligible, obtain a claim form, fill it in and post it to your nearest Social Services office.

# BRINGING UP YOUR CHILD

There is much more to bringing up a child than seeing he has enough to eat, clothing, and the proper schooling, according to Dr. R. Webb, Preventive Psychiatrist, State Health Education.

"A child is born without sense of right or wrong", he said: "He does not inherit habits, either good or bad.

"It is from the parents that a child learns what is expected of him and how to distinguish between good and bad habits and right and wrong behaviour.

"The character of a child is moulded early in childhood. The earlier he is given understanding, the better the chance of developing good mental health.

Dr Webb said that basic needs of children included the following:

**Love:** The feeling that his parents love him no matter what he does.

**Security:** The knowledge that he belongs; that in his home he is secure and that when he needs them, his parents will always be there to help.

**Protection:** The feeling that with his parents he is safe from harm; that he will always have their help in facing new problems.

**Acceptance:** The belief that his parents like him for himself, just the way he is.

**Independence:** The knowledge that his parents trust him to do things for himself and by himself, and have confidence in his attempts to develop new abilities.

**Guidance:** The example set by adults showing that it is possible to live in harmony with others.

**Faith:** The belief that the human values are worth-while and that there are moral standards that he must observe.

**Discipline:** The knowledge that there is a limit to what he is allowed to do and that his parents will be consistent in applying this limit.

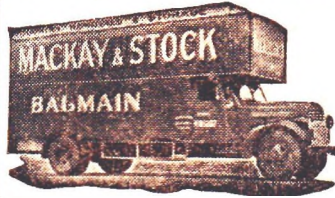
