Mort Bay Traffic A "Hot Potato"?

Failure of the authorities to take any action yet to solve the new Mort Bay terminal traffic problem is regarded by observers as evidence that the situation is considered to be another "hot potato".

"The Link" suspects the authorities are holding their hands because they feel the situation has the makings of acute public controversy between residents and Government instrumentalities.

They fear another situation like that faced by the Department of Main Roads in its effort to put an arterial road through Paddington.

If this should not be the case, then this paper considers all authorities involved are washing their hands of the situation, declaring it is nothing to worry about.

This would accentuate the bitterness of that section of Balmain people who have been fighting so hard to keep further major industrialisation away from the peninsula.

Views

This paper has been interviewing various authorities to learn their views about the traffic problem in the Mort Bay area. Here are their reactions:

DEPARTMENT OF MAIN ROADS:

The Department will not initiate any move to upgrade local roads for the better handling of industrial traffic unless approached either by the Maritime Services Board or Leichhardt Council.

The Department is concerned with through traffic, and there is really none of that precise nature on the peninsula.

MARITIME SERVICES BOARD:

The Board's functions are not involved. It considers the matter to be one affecting the local Council and the main roads authorities.

THE MAYOR (Ald. L. J. RODWELL):

There is no sign of any action by the Department of Main Roads to handle the heavy industrial road traffic. He is surprised the Department has had no discussions with Council on this subject.

There is so much movement of heavy traffic here that action by the Department in classifying at least one route as a main road just has to come, in his opinion.

Mullens Street will have to be classified as a main road in due course, although widening of it would be a great problem, involving extensive property resumptions.

(Editorial note: The Mayor did not say whether the Council had asked the Department for talks on the subject.)

Ald. I. WYNER:

He has been seeking a report from the Council's Town Planner regarding the possibility of instituting one-way traffic movement to and from Mort Bay.

This, however, would mean some traffic from the new terminal would go via Church Street (now overloaded from the Tasmanian termin-

al), and this would produce a class of home-owners who are converting old buildings into modern ones (all with one or two cars per family).

Balmain traffic officers are specially watching the Mort Bay developments, and are doing their best to keep empty vehicles off the streets. They have not had much trouble in that direction.

One-way

Use of water transport for the carriage of Mort Bay terminal containers is the ideal solution. The Mort Bay region is now experiencing the real weight of road transport, which has got out of hand. Container loads are on the streets at all hours, day and night.

The traffic police could co-operate by watching traffic in certain streets.

Ald. N. ORIGLASS:

The real solution is to use harbour lighters to take containers to and from Mort Bay. This method is used successfully overseas.

The only alternative to water transport is the widening of some roads in Balmain, which would involve a great deal of property resumption.

In siting the terminals at Balmain there has been hardly any regard for the effect they would have on the people.

BALMAIN POLICE:

Complaints are being received continually about industrial traffic from residents who want Balmain kept as a residential area.

The Police Traffic Branch is aware of the situation, and has asked local traffic officers to keep a close eye on it.

There has been a considerable increase in motor traffic in Balmain,

CANDIDATES COMMENT ON ELECTION RESULT

Mr J. F. Cope, M.H.R., elected in the recently concluded Federal poll for the new seat of Sydney, has advised "The Link" that he will set aside one hour each Monday to interview constituents in the Balmain area.

The time for this arrangement, which will commence early next year, will be announced later.

Mr Cope said it would provide a service to constituents living in the Balmain-Rozelle community.

Discussing the election result, Mr Cope said it proved to be an overwhelming victory for the A.L.P. in this electorate.

He had received a total vote of 31,822, with an overall majority of 14,764 for him over his six opponents.

Mr Cope said that the A.L.P. in Sydney, Australia's first city and second only to London in the Commonwealth of nations.

"Although tempers are sometimes frayed during elections, the Sydney electorate campaign was clean and incident-free, and I congratulate my six opponents on making it so".

Mr Cope said that the Gorton-McEwan Government, with a loss of 17 seats, had been returned because of the

ANOTHER LOCAL BODY

Welcome to The Annandale Association, the third organisation formed in Leichhardt Municipality for the promotion of local well-being.

That Annandale people have found it necessary to form such a body is an indication of their dissatisfaction with official efforts to preserve natural assets, and with the town planning affecting their area.

The Labor Caucus controlling Leichhardt Council probably won't like The Annandale Association any more than it likes The Balmain Caucus: The Annandale people forming the new body also dislike party politics in Local Government.

We're afraid, therefore, that the Annandale body will have to be prepared for some indifference from the Council's personnel — and at times antagonism.

Labor people here continue to demand that party politics shall reign supreme in Local Government — an attitude that is obviously bad for the community.

"My party right or wrong" is the dictum of those who subscribe to that policy. That the party has been wrong on occasions has been painfully obvious.

Equally obvious is the refusal of the majority to have anything to do with ideas proposed by the Balmain "rebels", whether good or bad.

Wouldn't it be gracious to recognise at times that the "Rebels" have some good ideas and that they were voted into office by the people of Balmain?

Maybe one of these days the Leichhardt Council Caucus will demonstrate that its concern is more for the community than the party!!

system of listing candidates alphabetically in the ballot paper.

This gave candidates in the top positions the marked advantage of receiving the "donkey vote" (i.e. voting straight down the paper).

The seats of Phillip and Evans in N.S.W. and Lilley and Griffith in Queensland, had been won by the Government on the donkey vote.

Mr Cope added that about 10 years ago he had unsuccessfully moved on behalf of the Labor Party to draw out of the national ballot paper positions, as done in Senate elections.

"Protests" Disregarded

Ald. N. Origlass, who had contested the election as an independent under the banner of "Set Labor Free" campaign, said it was noticeable that "Protest" candidates were generally unsuccessful in the poll.

The result was a landslide to Labor on a national scale.

The great bulk of the population looked on the election as a choice between the two big parties and disregarded all "protest" candidates and those raising local issues.

"I think this had the effect of reducing my vote in the Balmain-Rozelle area", he said.

"I don't think it would affect the future voting on the municipal level".

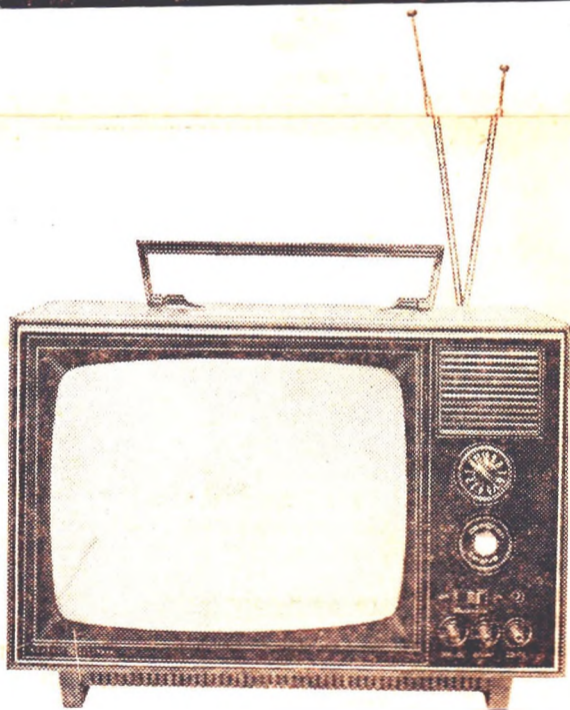

ANOTHER BODY FOR PROMOTION OF LOCAL WELL-BEING

Formation last week of The Annandale Association, along lines similar to those of The Balmain Association and The Glebe Association, means that more than half of Leichhardt Municipality now contains organisations dedicated to the promotion of local well-being.

A number of Balmain residents have already joined the new organisation, and The Balmain Association has offered any assistance it is able to give.

A meeting of about 100 people in Annandale Council Chambers formed the new association.

Its objects are to work for the preservation of the natural assets of the area, to stimulate interest in its history and character, encourage town planning and architecture of a high standard, and increase the number of open spaces.

Among the audience were representatives of The Balmain Association,

and Ald. Brady and Ald. Origlass, of Leichhardt Council.

The meeting was an inaugural one, to adopt a constitution and elect office bearers.

It is intended to set up a planning committee and an historical buildings committee, there being quite a few buildings in the area which the National Trust would like to classify.

Ald. Brady (one of the Labor majority of Leichhardt Council) raised the issue that the new organisation should delete from its constitution the word "Party", contained in the term "Non-Party-Political" (used to define the Association's attitude towards public affairs).

The President of The Balmain Association, Mr W. Haesler, objected to Ald. Brady's proposal.

He said the experience in Balmain had been that party politics had interfered with Local Government with such disastrous results that they were "fed to

Mr Haesler said there was no room for party politics of any colour whatever in Local Government.

Ald. Brady's motion was lost. The new body will remain "Non-party-political".

Ald. Brady, who said he could not in all conscience join the new association while that term was in its constitution, said Leichhardt Council had one of the best town plans in the State. Council, he added, had been very conscious of the preservation of historical buildings in Annandale.

Mr Robert Irving, Past-president of The Balmain Association, retorted by displaying a photograph of a modern block of flats, which he said had been erected on the site of one of the most historic buildings in Annandale, demolished for the purpose.

Ald. Brady attempted to have membership of the new body restricted to residents of the district, but the meeting declined to do so.

Real Estate Men Discuss Property Values

Except in the vicinity of the White Bay Terminal, the increased industrialisation of the Balmain peninsula has not had any detrimental effect on real estate prices.

That is the view of prominent district real estate men, who say that the property boom has certainly not passed this area by.

Major points made by them are:

- Prices for land and desirable residential properties have risen sharply.

- There is a keen demand for houses, especially of the terraced variety, and those with charm, which are in very short supply.

- There is very little suitable land available for home unit development.

Mr D. A. Turner, manager of Balmain Estate Agency, said that during the past 12 months prices of property on the Balmain peninsula had risen very sharply for the more interesting types, such as terrace houses and those built of stone.

Weatherboard cottages, however, had not shown any significant rise.

Comparative

The increase in values had been in proportion to that taking place in other parts of Sydney.

The values of business properties in the district had taken a sharp rise about 12 months ago, since when they appeared to have become fairly stable.

Mr Turner said the position regarding home unit development was difficult, because of the small allotments of land on which so many houses were built in the area.

It was not generally a proposition to acquire house properties for home unit development, since the value of the house frequently outweighed the value of the land on which it stood.

He thought home development in the district would continue to go along the line of restoration of older houses.

Mr Turner said that the coming of the container terminal at White

Bay had had a depressing effect on property values in the immediate vicinity.

Any general effect on values in the whole district, however, had now been lessened, and he believed no damage had been done.

Mr A. R. Young, of George Clubb & Sons Pty. Ltd., Rozelle, also said that prices were rising quite a deal for both residential and industrial property in most parts of the district.

The demand for terrace houses, especially those with iron lacework and offering a view of the harbour, was particularly high.

There were not nearly as many of that type available as was desired.

Mr Young said that fancy prices were being offered for land suitable for home unit development, particularly on the waterfront.

However, the value of home units themselves was not increasing, in view of the availability of new ones in many areas.

Except in the Grafton Street area, the new container terminals, Mr Young thought, had not had any detrimental effect on home property values.

New Trend

Mr A. P. Van Beurden, sales director and valuer for F. A. Baker, Silver Pty. Ltd., Rozelle, says there is a marked new trend in home purchase and occupancy on the Balmain peninsula.

The so-called "Working man" is moving out, and academics, professionals and artists are moving in, attracted by proximity to the city and the Paddington-type development.

This is occurring throughout the area.

from East Balmain and Birchgrove to the western section.

Newcomers include quite a few medical men and student nurses.

Another trend is the investment nature of home purchase. A return of about 18% is being received by people who buy cheaper homes, spend several hundred dollars in renovation, and let them.

"Arty" properties, sandstock brick houses and semi-detached buildings are most popular.

Rents run to \$22-23 for 2-bedroom homes and \$25 for 3-bedroom, furnished and unfurnished.

Mr Van Beurden said: "It is rather a seller's market. If a place of the right type is available, 10 to 12 people are after it."

Right-of-way?
 There is a good deal of misunderstanding among motorists of the legal meaning of the term "right-of-way". This could give rise to many of the fatal and other serious intersection accidents following failure to observe the so-called "right-of-way" rule.

Teaching Migrants English

Rozelle Boys' Junior High School has asked the Education Department to allot to the school for permanent duties a specialist teacher of English to migrant children.

The headmaster, Mr C. J. Cox, said he thought the number of migrant children attending the school justified the appointment of such a teacher to impart the fundamentals of English speaking, reading and writing to new arrivals.

He anticipated Rozelle might be favoured with a special appointment in view of the fact that such teachers had been appointed to schools in other parts of the metropolitan area, and because the Rozelle district was an important staging area for new arrivals in Australia.

Mr Cox said there was a need for help in both the primary and secondary departments of the school.

Special tuition was needed to enable the children to cope with a normal school education.

Some children passing

through the school at present were not receiving a proper grounding because of their language problem.

Effort By Commonwealth

The Minister for Immigration, Mr Snedden, said last week that the Commonwealth Government would increase its efforts to give migrants and migrant children more opportunities to learn English.

It would provide funds so that this could be done, and would seek the co-operation of various authorities concerned in developing ways to break the language barrier.

He said: "We are now ready to proceed with developing the programme announced by the Prime Minister in his policy statement on October 8.

"This was that new initiatives were necessary to ensure adequate opportunities for children and adult migrants to develop their command of English quickly".

He expected the cost would rise quickly to a figure of at least 1.5 million dollars annually.
