

This is particularly noticeable in regard to the number of young drinkers spread over public footpaths outside hotels, whilst the publicans inside go merrily on their way to the cash register.

Before the liquor purveyors are entitled to any concessions they need to show concern about their antiquated premises and take pride in the overall administration of their business.

It is doubtful if any sympathy has been gained from their very costly campaign.

In fact, we believe most people will vote on Saturday week only because it is compulsory.
