

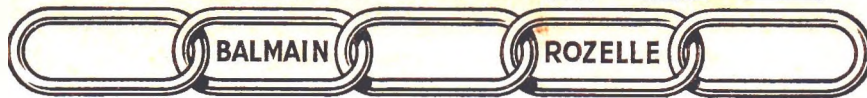

# Callan Park Opens New Unit For Old People

Old people in this district with mental and physical problems now have special facilities available to assist their recovery. Callan Park Psychiatric Hospital, Rozelle, has just opened its new "Psycho-geriatric" unit, described as the last word in care of the aged.

Old folk should find it easier to get better in this beautiful ward and its surroundings.

The unit is designed by imaginative experts who love old people and want them to get over their mental and physical troubles, and to get back to the world they used to know.

It is fitted with the most modern equipment used in geriatrics.

In the new geriatric complex are three wards—wards 16, 17 and 18.

Ward 16 is a star-shaped unit of four major dormitories, each of 11 beds, totalling 44 beds, and is given over entirely to "psycho-geriatrics"—which in layman's language means care of the aged who are mentally disturbed and physically infirm.

Alongside this is ward 17—a medical ward, controlled by a consulting physician. And nearby is ward 18, an "overflow" ward to cater for patients in need of longer care.

### Staff

Already there are ten patients in ward 16. These are existing patients at the hospital, but the new facilities will enable another 34 to be accommodated in this ward.

It is expected that the ward will be filled within a couple of months.

The special staff involved are of three types—physio-therapists, occupational therapists, and general trained nurses.

The special staff need-

ed for the unit is now being recruited.

The physio-therapists operate in a special area where there are rooms fitted with rails and such equipment as pedalling apparatus and exercising machines.

The occupational therapists have their usual equipment, for such purposes as working in ceramics, cabinet-making, etc., to get the patients interested in some particular activity, especially making things.

"When people get old they sometimes lose interest in what used to keep them alive", said Dr. W. J. Barrett, the hospital's Medical Superintendent.

### Features

"Our aim in this new unit is to get them mobile again, and once more interested in the world".

There are billiard rooms for male and female patients, with piped music in these and all other rooms.

All corridors are fitted with hand rails, and ramps are built in to obviate use of steps.

There is accommodation for wheel chairs throughout, with stainless steel at the corners.

Bathrooms are specially built.

They take wheel chairs in the shower recesses, which are fitted with flexible hoses to enable the occupant of the chair to be showered with ease.

Recesses are wide enough to take the wheel chair and an attendant.

Baths are high enough off the floor to enable a nurse to bath a patient without much bending, and are provided with a special lifting arrangement for the patient in the form of a small hydraulic crane.

Dr Barrett said that the team of medical, psychiatric and social workers, specially trained for geriatric service, would take over the responsibility of all persons over the age of 65 admitted to the institution.

As soon as the condition of the patients permitted, they would be returned to their homes, with the assurance that further care would be provided should this be warranted.

If their homes were unsuitable, or if they had no homes, they would be guided by the hospital's social workers.

### Admission

Before admitting patients to the institution the geriatric team would consult the district's medical men.

As a rule it was desired to admit patients only after consultation with their local doctor, or with the hospital's psychiatric-geriatric team for the district.

Dr Barrett said it was one of the hospital's major interests that it obtain the co-operation of relatives.

"It is almost a requirement", he said, "That relatives (if any) should contact us before we are asked to admit a patient".

## Terminal Not To Go Inland

Balmain residents need not fear that the Maritime Services Board intends going further into the hillside at Grafton Street for the purpose of extending the White Bay container terminal.

The President of the Board, Mr W. H. Brotherson, was succinct in his reply to the statement in last week's Column Nine that a lot of people feared that the Board's purchase of Grafton Street houses was not a charitable act, but was only the prelude to an extension into the hillside.

Mr Brotherson said:

"The fact that the Board commissioned sometime ago two Balmain estate agents to sell the first of the cottages it recently purchased answers your question".

## Dirty Water Complaint Investigated

Sydney Water Board decided at last Wednesday's meeting to investigate a published complaint about dirty water at certain times in Balmain.

District Board Member Ald. D. W. Sutherland (Mayor of Burwood) asked for investigation of the complaint published in the city Press from a Balmain resident, Mr John Mackenzie.

This was that when the Empress of Australia berthed at Balmain terminal and filled her tanks from the Water Board's mains, local residents found their tap water turned a turgid dark brown because of rust and sludge stirred up in the mains.

He said it had been going on for four years. Water Board inspectors shook their heads sadly and agreed that the water was disgusting, but nothing was done.

A Water Board

spokesman said it would appear that the problem would be different from the normal ones experienced by householders following a sudden increase in consumption, or following local flushing of mains.

The sudden increase in consumption after a period of low consumption—such as hot weather following the long period of cool, wet weather this spring—could disturb sediment lying in the pipes.

That would affect the whole metropolitan area.

Local flushing of mains, however, would produce only a local effect.

The spokesman added that investigations of the published complaint were now in hand.

## Leichhardt Mayor Is Re-elected

At its special meeting last week for the election of officers for 1970, Leichhardt Council re-elected Ald. L. J. Rodwell as Mayor, and Ald. J. L. McMahon as Deputy Mayor.

Council also re-elected the members of the three special committees appointed around the middle of the year to handle parking areas, municipal libraries, and parks and playgrounds.

The mayoral allowance was increased from \$3,000 to \$3,500.

Ald. Rodwell said Council felt the increase was necessary because of the forthcoming Captain Cook centenary celebrations.

Leichhardt Council would be playing its part in the general community activity connected with the celebrations, and would be holding special functions in addition to displaying bunting.

The Mayor has been empowered to draw up a programme, which would probably include

sporting events and entertainment for children.

He said he had approached most of the bodies concerned and hoped to announce something definite early

in the new year.

As regards the three special committees, Ald. Rodwell said he expected their activities to be very effective in the coming year.

## Column NINE

### SNUB FROM OFFICIALDOM

In refusing to recognise The Balmain Association as a party worthy of an adequate answer to its protest against the container terminal nuisance the Maritime Services Board was unkind and undiplomatic.

Some people might even say it was flushed with the success of its award by a commercial institute for "forceful activities" in organising construction of the White Bay terminal against "considerable opposition".

These people might be right. The Balmain Association was part of the opposition to the planting of the terminal in Balmain's residential area, and therefore would not be popular in M.S.B. circles.

It would have taken little magnanimity, though, for the Board to have sent a brief summary of what it was doing in regard to the smoke nuisance.

In a small area like Balmain you just can't dismiss the biggest public organisation as being unworthy of attention.

The incident proves again that the lot of the objector is not easy, and that he has to anticipate "forceful activities" or, as shown in the present instance, official indifference to the attitude of a representative organisation.

Balmain people will hope the Association will not be discouraged from taking an active part in the district's public affairs, which would be a tragedy.

Without it there would be virtually no public activity apart from that of the "elected representatives" of whom the M.S.B. speaks.

Incidentally, the Board's concern for the image of those elected representatives is an interesting development. We hope it is the start of a new era in that regard.

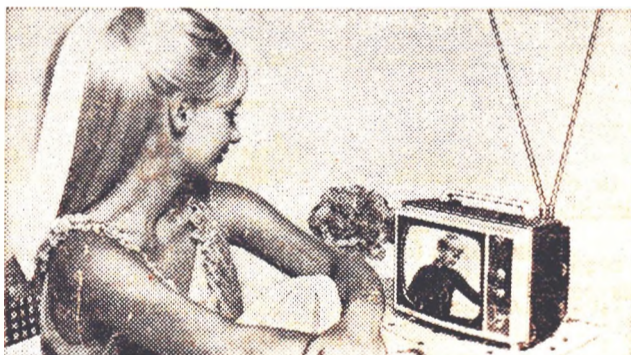

# M.S.B.'s Snub To Association Over Ship's Smoke

The Maritime Services Board has given a decided snub to The Balmain Association by refusing to explain its attitude to the problem of emission of smoke from ships berthed at the White Bay container terminal.

The snub was administered in its reply to the Association's letter on the subject.

The Association wrote to the Board about the third incident in which soot and smoke were discharged from a container ship at White Bay terminal.

It asked for an urgent investigation by the Board, and an assurance to residents that there would be no further "illegal discharge" from the container ships.

## "Appropriate"

The M.S.B.'s reply was:

"The Board has received complaints from other sources regarding the emission of smoke, etc., from ships berthed at the container terminal at Balmain.

"These complaints have been investigated and dealt with and appropriate letters addressed to the local Member of Parliament and Municipal Council as the elected representatives of the people of Balmain.

"The matter raised by your Association has been dealt with in this way and it is suggested that you direct your enquiry to the person and body mentioned as they have already acted in the matter for the people they represent".

Commenting on the reply, the Association referred to the special award to the M.S.B. by the Institute of Materials Handling. "Whose citation praised the 'forceful' way in which the M.S.B. rode over its opposition".

The Association added:

"The Association and the people of Balmain regrettably are in a position to endorse that comment by the Institute.

"However, it would seem that the M.S.B. has a tremendous advantage over any group or individuals opposing its actions, as it seems to be able to act just as it pleases.

"Nor are explanations to those directly affected necessary, judging by the unhelpful rejoinder to our letter".

## Watch House

Progress is continuing on the work of restoring The Watch House, in Darling Street, Balmain.

An Association member worked for several days to complete the laying of the verandah floor, and members will now be able to enter the

building without fear of broken limbs.

The owner of the adjoining land has accepted the suggestion that the Association keep the area cleared. Watch House workers have already cut the grass, making an impressive improvement to the outside aspect.

With the official opening scheduled for April, the Association is getting desperate for helpers, and says that a couple of hours would help.

Working bees are being held on Saturdays and Sundays and on some week nights.

## Ferries

The Association says it will continue to fight for a better Balmain ferry service.

It suggests that members and residents take up this campaign by writing to the Minister for Transport and Sydney Harbour Ferries, demanding some action on the promise of better services.

The Association said in its News Sheet:

"In spite of assurances that a larger ferry would be made available for the Balmain peak hour run, patrons are still forced to crowd on to a 120-person boat each morning.

"Roger Degen, M.L.A., has again raised the subject of ferries in Parliament, but it seems that no one is interested, except the people using them.

"By comparison with other ferry services, the Balmain run loses less annually, yet we receive less than token recognition from the ferry companies.

"Balmain's increased population demands a bigger and better service".

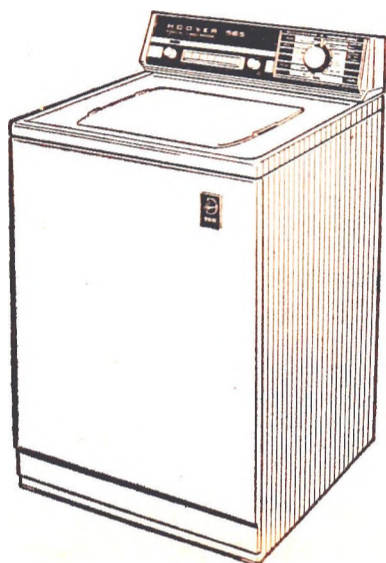

## Check Car Before That Summer Tour

A thorough mechanical car check-up is a wise investment for the motorist who plans a motor trip this summer, advises the N.R.M.A. Technical Department.

A breakdown in one of the more remote areas could be expensive, as spare parts may not be immediately available and may have to be freighted in at extra cost.

An added expense could be the accommodation bill while the motorist waits for his car to be repaired.

Therefore a little careful spending now could be useful insurance against later expense.

Driving to and from work or into town places little strain on a car, but at holiday time it is usually heavily laden, and driven over much longer distances at generally higher speeds than usual.

This type of driving soon shows up any mechanical weaknesses.

On setting out for a long journey don't overload with passengers or luggage, or tow a caravan too large for the car's horsepower.

The extra weight puts an added burden on the

brakes and suspension as well as the motor.

Also the chances of a breakdown which could mar a holiday — and cause an accident — are lessened when the vehicle is driven at moderate speeds.

For the handyman mechanic, the N.R.M.A. Technical Department gives this check list of components to look at in a pre-holiday inspection:

**Cooling system:** Check hoses and fan belt for weaknesses, and make sure the thermostat works. Check radiator for leaks.

**Electrics:** Points, plugs and high-tension leads should be looked at as well as the battery. The wise motorist also will have the coil and condenser tested.

**Brakes:** Check flexible lines for leaks, linings and drums for excessive wear.

**Tyres:** Check if possible inside and out for wall fractures, as well as flints or nails in treads. Watch also for flat spots

## CAR LABEL WARNING

The N.R.M.A. legal section reports that motorists are being served with infringement notices for displaying an expired registration sticker on the windscreen.

From explanations given by members it appears that many have received their sticker in time but have waited until the old one has expired before replacing it.

The N.R.M.A. warns drivers that the new registration sticker should be in place on the appropriate day and the old label removed.

on the tread as these could point to ailments in brakes, steering or suspension.

**Steering:** Check thoroughly for wear in all components.

**Motor:** Correct oil and petrol leaks and generally tighten around the motor. Clean or replace all petrol, oil and air filters or elements.

**Spares:** Those most useful on a long journey are a fan belt, spare spark plug, quart of oil for older motors, roll of insulation tape and the much-neglected tyre pump.

And make sure you know how to use your jack—and that it works.

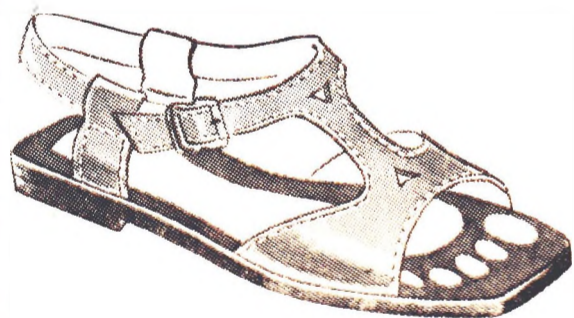

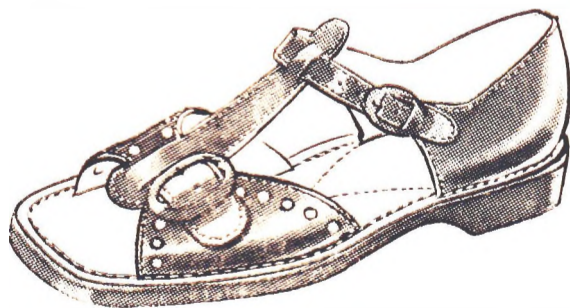

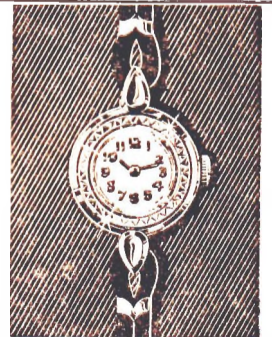
