# COUNCIL RATE: BIG RISE

**Leichhardt Council last week struck its rate for 1970 — 3 cents in the dollar on unimproved capital value of all ratable land in the municipality. This represents an increase of almost 30 per cent on the 1969 rate (three times the average increase of rates in other municipalities).**

In order to balance its budget even in view of that increase, Council made substantial cuts in the proposed estimates for the resurfacing of roads, construction and reconstruction of roads and footpaths, reserve for the replacement of plant, reserve for town planning and the Leichhardt depot amenities block.

A proposal by Ald. N. Origlass, seconded by Ald. I. Wyner, to defer the move pending a report from the Council's officers regarding possible savings from elimination of the Duke-Nicholson Streets open space extension plan, was defeated.

Ald. Origlass said his proposal would enable Council to refrain from adding to the town planning reserve for a couple of years — the amount proposed this year was \$100,000 — and enable a lower rate to be struck for 1970.

## Charges

Commenting on the rate increase, the Town Clerk, Mr E. A. Bassett, said it was the first rise for some years.

The rate was 10d in the £ (4.17c in the \$) in 1954; 9d in the £ in 1960 (revaluation year); 7d (2.92c in the \$) in 1961; 7½d (3.13 c.) in 1964; 2.315c in 1967 (reduced because of valuation increases), and the same figure for 1968 and 1969.

Meanwhile, said Mr Bassett, the following increases had occurred since 1965 in the statutory charges levied by Government authorities:

Main roads — from \$76,190 to \$190,000.  
Street lighting — from \$56,800 to \$135,000.  
Fire Commissioners — from \$13,000 to \$27,400.

State Planning Authority — from \$10,240 to \$36,000.

And garbage removal costs had risen from \$152,900 to \$280,000.

The Mayor, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, said Council could not do a great deal in regard to the rate because it was faced with a 100% rise in statutory charges.

"We tried to carry them last year", he said. "But we have no control over them."

"We have become debt collectors for Government bodies, and have to bear the brunt of public criticism because of that."

"Some of the aldermen thought Council should do something more next year in regard to major works, but this would have meant an even higher rate."

"We would have liked to reconstruct Lilyfield Road, which is greatly in need of this because of heavy industrial traffic. However, the work has had to be deferred again."

"I think we should get greater assistance from the Department of Main Roads in this matter".

The Mayor added: "You can't compare conditions in Leichhardt with those in some other areas, because everything is totally different here."

"We don't have a minimum rate as some Councils have."

## Pensioners

"We provide assistance to pensioners, of course, by rebating their rate. And we didn't make a claim for the rates on their estates after their death."

"This has been the Council's policy."

"I don't think there would be a municipality which provides greater help to the old people in its midst".

Ald. Rodwell said that the 1970 estimates tried to provide for the appreciable increases taking place in wages, but of course could not anticipate what was likely to happen in current court considerations of wages.

Referring to the Balmain aldermen's move to effect saving in the town planning reserve allocation, the Mayor said Council was anxious

to build up some reserve for town planning so that it could provide open spaces and not encroach on existing parks.

## Average

The Secretary of the N.S.W. Local Government Association, Mr N. Miles, said that the average increase in Council rates for 1970 was ten per cent.

In some cases percentage rises could be much higher, particularly if a Council had previously adopted a policy of keeping the rate stable.

Council's general costs were rising by an average of 3.4% a year.

Statutory levies on Councils for the Department of Main Roads, State Planning Authority and the Board of Fire Commissioners continued to drain rate revenue away from local areas.

Mr Miles defended the general increases in rates on the ground that populations in Local Government areas were increasing rapidly through migration.

Although this provided extra rate revenue, the demand for Council services had grown more rapidly.

He said residents generally expected Council services in regard to such matters as libraries, swimming pools, etc., to be expanded.

If Councils raised their rates by only the same 3.4% as general costs, Sydney tomorrow would be the same at Sydney today.

# Column NINE Any Rate Increase Unfair

This column, the last for the year, normally carries a Christmas message. The editor, however, has allowed it to exceed its normal space because of the importance of the subject and its serious effect on Balmain.

The comments expressed here are intended to point out to everyone the unfairness of any increase in rates.

Unlike the Riviera, which is entirely for the rich, Balmain is a working man's suburb. Now this Council intends increasing the rates, apparently with little regard whether the working man can afford it.

It will cost you 30 per cent more to live here next year. Can you afford it? If not, kick now; don't cry later.

We hold top position in the rate race, and next year you can look forward to being elevated into the **untouchable** class.

Every facility or amenity that exists here was paid for by father or grandfather, and yet after all of their sacrifices we have inherited the most costly suburb in which to reside.

In the past Councils have failed to provide the needs of the suburb, and it appears that this Council has not learned by past mistakes.

Space is too limited here to elaborate on what is missing. Suffice to say that nothing constructive has been done, and not ONE election promise fulfilled.

It was stated last week that great things are expected from the new committees next year. Seems a strange thing that Council has been in office 12 months and there is still nowhere to park even a car. Yet we are expected to believe that big things will happen next year.

More than ever this area needs administration and control by a highly qualified, specialised person. Although with good intent, Councils are neither by pressure of their private employment nor training able to surmount the increasing costs without resorting to extra charges.

It is not good enough to be civic-minded. You must be cap-

able of controlling a situation that gets out of hand.

It is fully understood that every Council is more highly committed to semi-Government bodies than in previous years, but it is hard to reconcile increases in rates when for one thing the Mayoral allowance has been increased to \$70 a week.

Rather would it have shown leadership to have cancelled the allowance altogether and dispensed with entertaining until the business of adjusting the finances of this municipality are back on their feet.

A sick business needs a new approach, **NOT AN INCREASE IN PRICES**. When its income is insufficient it must find ways of economising, providing better service and enticing new clients. And so with Councils—they must encourage developers, thereby gaining more customers and extra revenue.

The cost of administration and rates of this area need overhauling. If you agree, contact your local State Member, Mr Degen, and the Minister for Local Government, Mr Morton, and make them conscious of your concern.

Real estate businesses surely will regard this increase as unlikely to encourage developers. Commercial business houses will not jump for joy, to say nothing of the feelings of the private resident.

Not one move has been made to establish parking stations — no public library — less street cleaning — no beautification — no encouragement to developers: these are but a few of the things that have not been done.

When private business finds it cannot solve its financial problems it engages the services of an expert to put its house in order.

You cannot bleed the last cent from the residents without causing a collapse. If this 30% increase eventuates, it will be the death of this area.

The solution of Balmain's problem is the return of the Municipality of Balmain, whereby locals have a knowledge of the needs of the suburb and its capacity to pay.

## Motorists' Christmas Festivities

The motorist's motto during the Christmas and New Year festivities should be "None for the road".

This is the advice of Sir William Hudson, Chairman of the N.S.W. Road Safety Council Board of Management.

He said it was not a difficult resolution to follow because the average driver was not a confirmed drinking-driver.

But there were so many motorists who, when December came, acted completely contrary to their normal character.

They let themselves go, indulge perhaps not too wisely but too well, then got into their cars and—if they were lucky—made their way home.

Sir William warned that very many of the drivers involved in acci-

dents between Christmas Day and the first working day of the new year were under the influence of alcohol.

# SUPERMARKET PLANNED FOR BALMAIN

Plans for the construction of a supermarket in the main shopping centre of Balmain were before Leichhardt Council last week.

Council considered a proposal by Westfield Development Corporation Ltd., real estate developers, to establish a supermarket, with a car park attached, in the Loyalty Square area.

The land to be used is at 276-288 Darling St. and 1 Palmer St., and is owned by J. B. Sharpe Pty. Ltd.

Plans accompanying the application showed a partly two-storey building to cover the entire site.

The building would contain a trading area of about 14,000 sq. ft.

There would be a loading dock at the rear, with access via Watson Lane, on the ground floor.

Storage would total 4165 sq. ft., and there would be a staff amenities room of about 612 sq. ft. on the first floor.

The business would operate at normal retail hours.

The proposal involves demolition of all existing buildings on the site, but no residents would be displaced.

The car park would provide open air parking for 81 vehicles, with access and egress via Watson Lane.

Although that thoroughfare is only 20 ft. wide, the site has a 41 ft. 10 in. frontage to Palmer Street.

Council decided to favour the proposal, and to refer it to the Police Traffic Branch for an expression of its views, required when a project is of a traffic-generating nature.

The applicant did not proceed with an earlier proposal to include construction of two 3-storey residential flat buildings, to contain 20 flats in all, in Sorrie and Palmer Streets.

### Shoppers' Parking

No doubt many shoppers will curse the inadequate parking in the Balmain and Rozelle centres during the next frantic week.

They should be sure to curse the right people.

Certainly curse Leichhardt Council for not paying enough attention to this problem, but

curse more vigorously those shopkeepers who

believe it is their right to park all day and every day in restricted parking areas.

The stupidity of this inconsiderate action should be obvious. That they do this with apparent impunity from parking police is yet another reason to curse — and wonder.

# Barge Use For Mort Bay To Be Studied

The possibility of using barges to transport container cargo to the Mort Bay container terminal — to ease the problem of traffic in Balmain streets—is to be examined by the Australian National Line, operators of the terminal.

The proposition, which has been made in "The Link" by the Balmain ward aldermen, was discussed by Captain Menzies, General Manager of A.N.L., at a recent meeting with the Noise Abatement Advisory Panel of Leichhardt Council.

A report of the discussion was given by the Mayor, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, at last week's meeting of the Council.

Ald. I. Wyner (Balmain ward) spoke about the punishment being inflicted on the people of Balmain by the semi-trailer traffic to and from the Mort Bay terminal.

## Wool

He claimed that the street pattern was not suitable for this type of traffic.

The alternative was not to make a large reduction in the number of houses in order to pro-

vide adequate roads, but to use cargo-carrying barges on the harbour.

Captain Menzies told the panel that 80% of the outgoing cargo was wool, most of it coming from Walsh Bay by semi-trailer through the city traffic.

The proposition put to him was the possibility of using barges from Walsh Bay to Mort Bay.

One advantage of this was that the traffic would not have to negotiate two opening bridges and all the city traffic congestion.

Another was that while a semi-trailer carried only one 20-ton container, a barge could carry four.

On the return trip, said Capt. Menzies, cargo went from Mort Bay to the Villawood centre.

Ald. Wyner said that barges could also possibly be used to take

cargo from Mort Bay to the railway at White Bay for direct rail transport to Villawood.

Capt. Menzies said A.N.L. was naturally concerned with the high initial cost of any such proposition, but he agreed that on his return to Melbourne he would make a further investigation into it in the nature of a feasibility study.

## Difficulty

He added that wool was sent to the berth sometimes nearly up to the time of the ship's sailing.

That presented a difficulty in that the crane would not be able to reach over the ship to unload the barge.

That difficulty applied only to that part of the cargo which arrived in the later stages.

The Council's Health Inspector, Mr R. S. Williams, suggested that A.N.L. consider also the practicability of establishing heliports at Walsh and Mort Bays for the transferring of wool by helicopter.

That would similarly eliminate the traffic noise and save wear and tear of the lightly-constructed Balmain streets.

## Unauthorised Collectors

The State Secretary of the Returned Services League of N.S.W., Mr W. G. Osmond, warns the public of the growing practice of unscrupulous persons posing as collectors for local hospitals.

Mr Osmond said the collectors wore R.S.L. badges and sold books of jokes, claiming that the proceeds were to help aged Ex-service-men.

He said the police would proceed with the full weight of the law, but the public must cooperate in providing reports of instances to the police so that evidence could be obtained to substantiate court charges.

# Social Worker Appointed For Balmain

A full-time social worker employed to assist in the settlement and problems of migrants in the Balmain and Rozelle areas has commenced duties at Balmain.

He is Mr Noshy Saad, formerly a social worker in Egypt who migrated to Australia three years ago.

A graduate of Alexandria University, Mr Saad speaks three languages fluently and has a working knowledge of two others.

He is employed by the Westside Centre, Darling Street, where he was originally assisted to find temporary employment pending acceptance of his social worker grading in Australia.

His employment is being sponsored by the Department of Immigration under a new scheme to subsidise accredited private welfare agencies actively working in migrant assimilation, and the Westside Centre was chosen for this area.

Mr Saad told "The Link" that he was appalled at the lack of facilities offered to migrants in the all-important field of assimilation.

He said that hundreds of cases had already been handled by volunteer workers at Westside, and many of these people, some with high qualifications, lacked direction in putting their skills to work before coming to the Centre.

This was a serious waste of manpower in a city needing skilled workers, and caused endless frustration among the new settlers.

Loneliness among new arrivals was one unfortunate aspect of the "Bulk" migration scheme from foreign countries, particularly among those with language difficulties.

However, with proper direction and encouragement this and other early problems could be set right and new migrants could thus promote a friendlier attitude towards the local population, resulting in better relations all round.

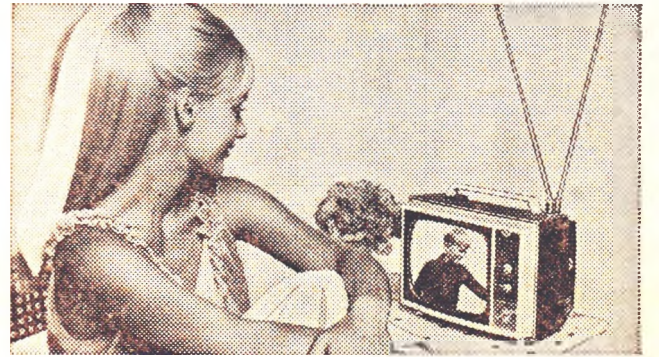
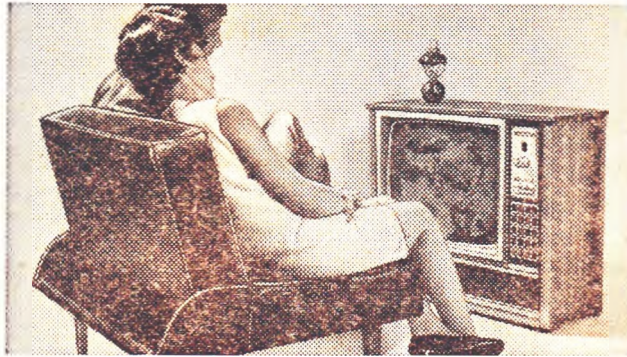
It was important, said Mr Saad, for new arrivals to be correctly guided in language, employment and personal problems at an early stage, and he issued an invitation to new settlers to come forward and seek advice.

Mr Saad emphasised that his services were entirely free.

## TERMINAL NOISE: COUNCIL TO EXAMINE LAW

Leichhardt Council is to seek legal advice from its solicitor as to the probability of success in an application to the Supreme Court for an injunction restraining Seatainer Terminals Ltd. from carrying on its activities at the White Bay container port.

The injunction sought would be because "Such activities have created an average noise level which constitutes a public nuisance, and which represents a potential danger to the standards of environmental health of the neighbouring community".

Council made this decision at last week's meeting when it adopted a recommendation to that effect from its Noise Abatement Advisory Panel.

The recommendation also included a request to the operating company to send a representative to the next meeting of the panel, to be held next March.

### Smoke

Council also received a report from its Smoke Abatement Advisory Panel in regard to air pollution arising from

ships berthed at the White Bay terminal wharf.

Mr R. A. Reid, Branch Secretary of the Australian Institute of Marine and Power Engineers had attended the panel meeting.

From discussion ensuing, the following points had been mentioned:

- Because of automation, the number of engineers employed on ships had been considerably reduced.

- The reduction in the number of engineers employed had caused a reduction in efficient maintenance of boiler plant.

- The emission from the Australian Endeavour had probably been the result of human error.

- When regulations were in force, drastic penalties (if provided for) should keep smoke

# Home Restoration: Bright Future Predicted For Area

A bright future for the Balmain peninsula as a residential area marked by attractively restored homes, particularly of the terrace type, is confidently predicted by Rozelle real estate man, Mr. F. A. Baker.

After an office warming gathering at the new premises in Hancock St. of the firm of F. A. Baker, Silver Pty. Ltd., of which he is chairman of directors, he told "The Link" he believed Balmain and Rozelle had become part of an inner-Sydney "restorative area".

A semi-circular area, this would take in Glebe, Broadway and Paddington.

Any property in that area would be sure to rise in value, said Mr Baker.

## "Introverts"

Paddington was the leader in this sphere, but Rozelle was being upgraded in status as a desirable place in which to live.

He said that the terrace-style home was the most important and most interesting type of residence to be treated by the restorer.

"This type of building can be restored to a quality home quite inexpensively", said Mr Baker. "Although a lot of work is involved.

"It would seem that to be interested in restoring a terrace house you must be an architectural introvert—to be interested only in the interior and disinterested in such exterior features

as a garden.

"This compares with the architectural extrovert, who likes all his pretty picture to be on the outside.

"The other day I stopped outside a house in Mort Street — and shuddered. But when I went inside, my eyes opened wide. It was really beautiful".

Mr Baker thought the authorities should give a lead in regard to restoration of old residences.

In U.S.A. the local authorities laid down specifications for restoration, which produced a charming effect.

He stressed that any effort to improve the external appearance of an old home should keep in mind the need for architectural harmony, and the danger of incompatibility (which could link modern red brick fences with lovely old iron lacework verandahs).

## Offices

The firm's new Hancock Street offices, which are additional to those in Victoria Road, are an example of the restored terrace style home.

They are in what was formerly a broken-down terrace of two homes, with an attached mews (the old home's original

stables).

The terrace was built of sandstock bricks about 1870.

Each room — bedroom, parlour, kitchen, etc. — has been restored in the gracious mid-Victorian style, and is used as an office for the specialist staff.

The firm has employed additional staff to cater for the expansion taking place in this field.

Specialist sales men and technical advisers are offering clients advice on such matters as detecting and rectifying structural faults in old buildings.

Mr Baker believes the offices are possibly the only example of their kind in Australia.

The enterprise is an imaginative one intended to impress upon the public the graciousness and charm of the restored terrace house and the importance of Balmain and Rozelle as a desirable inner-city residential area.

## Plan For Park Not Dead

Despite lack of real activity on the area, the Maritime Services Board's proposal to provide a new public park at Peacock Point, Balmain, has not been shelved.

It is "proceeding according to plan", according to the President of the Board, Mr W. H. Brotherson.

## CEREALS FOR GOOD NUTRITION

Cereals and cereal products such as bread are an important part of your daily meal pattern.

They supply fuel for activity, and essential minerals and vitamins.

Wheat is the cereal most widely used in Australia. Its most important nutrients are the B group of vitamins (especially thiamine) and iron. In the milling of grain to produce whiter, more easily digested flour, some of these vitamins and minerals are lost or discarded. Hence white bread has a lower nutritional value than whole-meal or brown bread.

Breakfast cereals, widely used, may be prepared from a number of different cereals, including oats, wheat, maize or rice. Porridges such as oatmeal, rolled oats and wheatmeal contain a large portion of the whole grain, so that their nutritive value is high.

Ready-to-eat cereals are baked at high temperatures during their preparation, destroying much

of the thiamine, but frequently these products are enriched with vitamins and iron by the manufacturers.

Breakfast cereals eaten with plenty of milk provide a nourishing breakfast.

The amount of cereal you need depends on your energy requirements, as cereals are a major source of calories. However, even if you are trying to lose weight, do not omit all the bread and cereal from your diet, but rather limit the amount to two or three serves.

You still need to include all the essential vitamins and minerals for good health as well as to count up your calories.

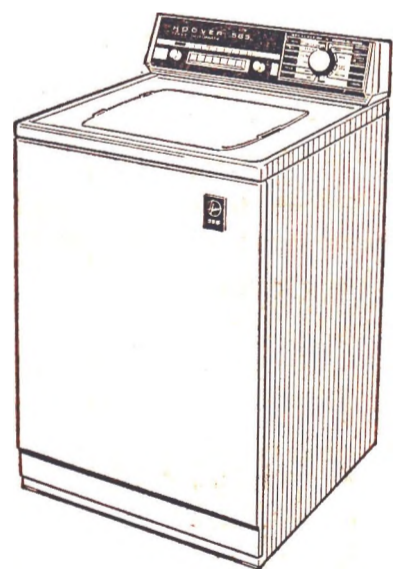
