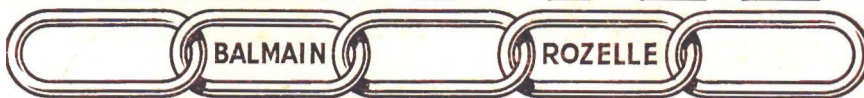

# Anti-litter Campaign Will Be Held Here

State Cabinet's decision to empower local Councils to impose on-the-spot fines on litterbugs means that Balmain, Rozelle and other sections of Leichhardt Municipality will be involved in an anti-litter campaign.

Cabinet's decision was announced last Wednesday.

The Premier, Mr Askin, said it had decided to introduce an on-the-spot fine of \$5 for people who thoughtlessly littered public places.

People served with on-the-spot notices would have the right to pay the fine within a certain time or elect to be dealt with by a Court.

Mr Askin said that at present, people taken before a Court faced the prospect of Court costs as well as a fine.

More serious cases, such as the deliberate dumping of rubbish and breaking of bottles, would continue to be dealt with by the Courts, and the legislation would provide increased maximum penalties for these offences.

### Power

At present, local Councils derive their power to control aspects of littering from a number of different ordinances under the Local Government Act.

Maximum penalties for offences vary from \$100 to \$200.

A spokesman for the Local Government Department said that the proposed law would be administered primarily by local Councils, although police also had power to deal with offences under the Local Government Act.

He added that whether the new law would apply to the dropping of such litter as cigarette butts, matches and bus tickets, would be up to the discretion of local Councils.

The Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, has already announced that Leichhardt Council would join in any widespread anti-litter campaign.

He considered that the primary need was one of educating the public. However, Council should, if necessary, apply sanctions against those who refused to cooperate, even in minor cases of littering.

"When the Government brings down regulations to provide for on-the-spot fines, Leichhardt Council will cooperate", he told "The Link".

"I think it is most necessary that Councils be given additional power to keep public places clean.

"Our attitude towards policing the problem has been in great contrast to the attitude of some places overseas. For instance, I note that a \$500 fine was imposed in Singapore for casting down a match in the street.

"The basis of our campaign, of course, will be of education, followed by the imposition of curbs against the unruly".

### Containers

Ald. Rodwell said Leichhardt Council now employed three bylaws inspectors, whose duties would include policing of the proposed new anti-litter powers.

It would remain to be seen whether three inspectors would be sufficient, although Council's Health Department staff would assist in any campaign.

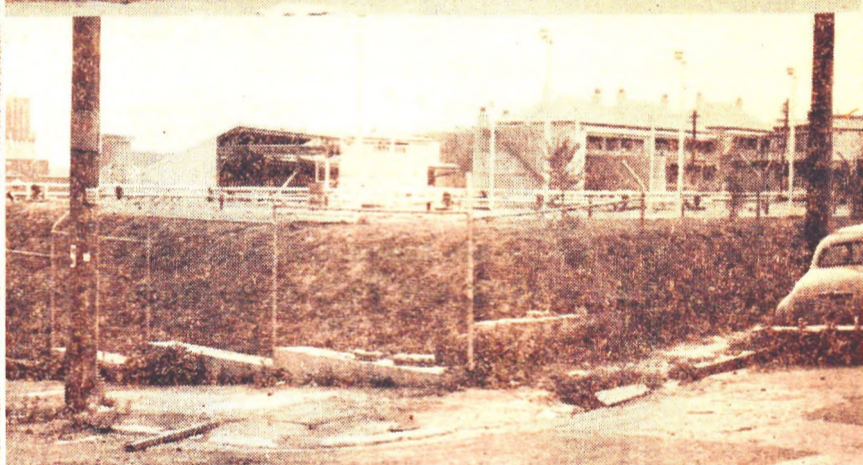
"The Link" reminded the Mayor that in Balmain, especially, rubbish containers in the main streets were often full to overflowing during the day.

This left the public no opportunity of using them for depositing their unwanted material.

Ald. Rockwell said that Council would have to provide more rubbish containers.

## Column NINE

### CONTAINER NUISANCES

Our correspondent, Mr R. Croall, sounds an ominous note in warning of the expected trebling of container shipping traffic at Balmain this year.

Local residents will be appalled unless industrial interests and the Government authorities concerned make greater speed in tackling the various community problems involved.

The Maritime Services Board and the State Government have promised to put into effect regulations designed to control the undue emission of smoke from vessels berthed at the container terminals, but they are certainly taking their time.

Why these haven't been in existence all through is one of the mysteries of the age.

Balmain residents demand also that regulations be introduced to control the extent of noise from the terminal operations.

Meanwhile we can but support the warning of our correspondent regarding the expected increase in the container-carrying road juggernauts through the lightly-built, twisting, hilly and generally most unsuitable streets of the Balmain peninsula.

That the road traffic situation has been allowed to develop the way it has, without any obvious interest by any Government authority, is a shocking indictment of those involved.

Whatever the ultimate solution—whether development of an adequate road system, use of harbour barges instead of road vehicles, building of a tunnel, or the predicted removal of all container traffic to Botany Bay—Balmain impatiently awaits some tangible official interest in alleviating the ever-growing nuisances.

**District School  
Enrolments  
Are A Record**

District high and Primary schools resumed this week after the long summer vacation to face anticipated record enrolments.

Figures supplied by the Department of Education indicate an expected seven per cent rise in enrolments at high schools and a 2% average increase in those at primary schools.

Figures are:

**High Schools:** Drum-moyne Boys, 820; Ibrox Park, 750; Leichhardt Girls, 580; Riverside Girls, 840; Rozelle Boys, 250.

**Primary Schools:** Balmain, 230; Balmain Infants, 190; Nicholson St., 115; Rozelle, 430; Rozelle Infants, 350; Orange Grove, 295; Orange Grove Inf., 240; Leichhardt Primary, 510; Leichhardt Inf., 380; Birchgrove Primary, 280; Birchgrove Inf., 255.

The Education Department's spokesman told "The Link" that only minor accommodation difficulties were expected to arise. For instance, at Leichhardt Primary School two temporary classrooms were being erected, but were not

available for the school resumption. They should be ready by the second or third week of the term.

The spokesman was confident that problems associated with the intake of migrant children would be no greater than in 1969, which, however, had been a very trying year.

The teachers had done a tremendous job in coping, and this had enabled the Department to lay the foundations for an exciting and valuable programme of migrant education.

At Leichhardt a full-time teacher of English for migrant children had been appointed, and at other schools special tuition was available for two or three days of the week.

In a comment at the week-end on likely school enrolments the President of the Teachers' Federation of N.S.W., Mr W. J. Whalan, said that hundreds of five-year-olds were likely to be turned away

when the schools re-opened.

He said: "There's a leeway to accommodate from last year. The schools didn't take five-year-olds from July.

They closed down on enrolments for the last term".

# CONTAINER TRAFFIC LIKELY TO TREBLE THIS YEAR

**Semi-trailer traffic to Mort Bay could increase 300 per cent before the end of this year, with a consequent steep rise in the level of noise being endured by Balmain residents.**

This is the view of Mr R. Croall, of Rose St., Birchgrove.

In a letter to the editor, he said he based his contention on the announcements that a new Australian-owned container ship would be launched on March 26, and that a new shipping service with roll-on roll-off technique was being commenced between Sydney and New Guinea.

In his letter he made the following points:

- The Minister for Shipping and Transport, Mr Sinclair, has approved the new shipping service subject to an immediate start being made on the building of two replacement ships.

- The new Australian-owned vehicle deck container ship, being built in Kobe, will be commissioned at the end of July.

It will be the third of the line to run between Mort Bay and Japan. The response to the new service has been phenomenal, and it is believed that additional tonnage will be brought in.

- The Sydney-New Guinea shipping line with roll-on roll-off technique will start in March, calling at North Queensland ports.

No doubt a large percentage of cargo for this will be containers in transit to and from Japan, and as ships on the Japan run do not call at Mort Bay, transshipment will have to be by road.

- Because the shipping line from Japan does not call at South

Australian or Western Australian ports, shippers between these and Japan will doubtless use the rail service commencing and terminating at Cooks River rail terminal.

No rail link connects White Bay and Mort Bay, so transshipment between Cooks River and Mort Bay will have to be by road.

- Troop movement by container vessels with roll-on roll-off method is now being examined. Containers could carry equipment and supplies for 250 men. These could be fairly large and would roll through the streets to Mort Bay.

- It is time Leichhardt Council, the Railways Department, A.N.L., D.M.R., M.S.B., and the Defence Department got together on the subject of an underground road and rail tunnel to Mort Bay.

Road traffic could use

this constantly. When it was required by rail traffic, the signals could be against road traffic while the train proceeded to Mort Bay, a distance of about 30 chains, causing only a few minutes delay to road traffic.

Such a tunnel would relieve the increasing traffic hazards caused by some semi-trailers continually breaching the Traffic Regulations—double-parking at bus stops.

This forces car drivers on to the other side of the road, and causes bus drivers to double-park and stop out in the middle of the road.

Mr Croall concludes: "Usually the offending truck drivers are in shops buying their lunch or are having a drink in a hotel. They show complete disregard for the people of Balmain.

"As they do not live in the locality they just could not care less".

# CENTRE EQUIPPED TO MEET MIGRANTS' NEEDS

Westside Centre, in Darling Street, Balmain, is now well equipped to play a vital role in community affairs, meeting the needs of migrant families constantly moving into the area.

This was stated yesterday by the Centre's social worker, Mr Moshe Saad, who said the most pressing needs of migrant families were in the following order: Accommodation; employment; education (parents and children); and some social services.

Mr Saad said he had homes and jobs available for migrants as they arrived, and local schools were providing special English instruction classes for migrant children to enable them to communicate as quickly as possible.

As regards adult migrants, Mr Saad said enrolment in the free English classes at Westside had more than doubled in the first week.

An initial enrolment of 12 had now reached 25, resulting in the appointment of an extra teacher to assist the chief instructor, Mr Sam Mohamed.

The new assistant teacher is Mr Samer Hanod.

Any migrant wishing to learn or improve his knowledge of English is welcome to enroll now for future classes.

Mr Saad said migrants who regularly attended the two-hour classes each Monday and Wednesday evenings would, in six months, be able to speak and write English sufficiently well to meet their immediate requirements.

Social gatherings were being arranged regularly at Westside by a special integration committee whose task it was to see that migrants did not segregate themselves into national groups, but met and mingled with all others.

An added service the Immigration Department is providing at Westside is marriage guidance advice, offered through the personal, regular attendance of Mrs Joan Matheson, of the Department of Social Welfare.

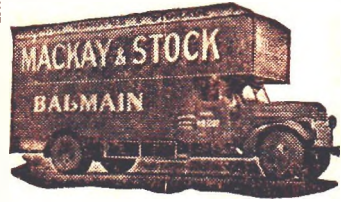
