Announce m e n t of major home unit and shopping developments in Balmain, following the opening recently of a quality social catering enterprise in Rozelle, is really good news.

It would appear that the worrying nature of operations at the two container term in als has not frightened away residential developers.

The million dollar home unit plan for Filzroy Avenue and the major home unit plans for the residue of the Council's East Balmain land add up to more families for the area, and two more desirable waterfront locations barred to possibly undesirable industry.

Leichhardt Council would be justified in really chortling over these developments, as Balmain-Rozelle supporters generally would be.

With such major residential development occurring, the Balmain peninsula is becoming less industrialised than ever.

That industry is still very active here is of course evident. As old industries go, new ones arrive-such as the proposed use by





This Friday night will be the men's prawn night, the artist being Ugly Dave Gray. He and his wife are described as being the best comedy duo in N.S.W. at present.






