BIG BALMAIN PROJECTS

Council Approves Home Unit Supermarket Plans

Leichhardt Council last week approved three private projects which will be of major importance in the development of Balmain as a residential area. They were for two big home unit enterprises and a supermarket in Darling St.

The projects are:

Balmain East: Highest tender for the unused land in the Council's housing project — \$267,500—was accepted.

This was from Karl Developments Pty. Ltd., who propose to erect three 3-storey blocks and one block (of either nine or 14 storeys) of home units, the total number of units being about 70.

Fitzroy Avenue: A development application by Parkes (Sydney) Pty. Ltd. for the erection of six residential flat buildings containing 80 two-bedroom units will be referred to the State Planning Authority and the Police Department for their views.

Council will be prepared to approve the proposal, subject to some conditions.

Supermarket: Council approved the development application by Westfield Development Corporation Ltd., real estate developers, to estab-

lish a supermarket, with car park attached, in the Loyalty Square area.

The land to be used is at 276-288 Darling Street and 1 Palmer Street, and was owned by J. B. Sharpe Pty. Ltd.

The application had been referred to the traffic police for their views on traffic and car parking, and when these were received (involving some work by the applicant) Council agreed to approve the application subject to the car parking plans being completed.

The name of the applicant's client and the type of supermarket planned have not been made available.

The Fitzroy Avenue project will cost more than a million dollars.

It embraces the whole of the 1½ acres of land owned by S. G. White Pty. Ltd., marine engineers and boiler makers, and will face the harbour.

Each of the 80 2-bedroom units will be approximately nine squares in area, of a high standard of finish, with a family atmosphere.

They will be fully self-contained, with their own laundry facilities, and each will have its own under-cover car park.

Three of the blocks of units will be on the lower section of the land, below the level of Fitzroy Avenue, and the other three on the higher section, rising about two stories above the level of that street.

The applicants propose "planned environment" to open up the area and improve the amenity of the district.

Views

They plan to build a swimming pool on the upper level of the property (which overlooks the Dawn Fraser swimming pool).

The roof of the car park will be landscaped in Fitzroy Avenue to convert it into a park along the edge of the street, with a frontage of about 450 ft.

It is expected that a start will be made on the project this year.

When this application was being discussed at last week's Council meeting the Balmain ward aldermen — Ald. Wyner, Origlass and Graham — raised the question of the effect the buildings might have on the views from Fitzroy Avenue residences.

They pointed to the information given by the applicant that although

EXAMINATION SUCCESSES

There was a 100% pass rate in the School Certificate examination by boys from the Christian Brothers' school at Balmain in 1969.

All the 47 boys who sat for the exam. were successful.

Among the passes were those of five boys who gained six advanced passes — M. McFarland, F. Salz, J. Bolzan, R. Small and R. McDonnell; and two with five advanced passes — M. Crothers and S. Large.

Seven boys obtained State bursaries, which will help them financially with further studies for the Higher School Certificate.

There would be wide spacing between two of the blocks on the Fitzroy Avenue level, allowing plenty of view, there would be only 23 feet on the other side.

They also thought it wise to defer consideration of the matter for a fortnight to learn whether local residents had any objections to the proposition, seeing that the Government was considering the question of giving people right of appeal against Council development decisions.

The majority of the aldermen, however, did not agree with the contentions.

Aldermen Fight Against Plan For New Store

Against the strong opposition of the three Balmain aldermen, Leichhardt Council last week approved of the use for the storage of ships' stores of the vast empty building at the foot of Church Street, Balmain.

The Council's Town Planner, Mr A. Kenna, recommended approval of an application for use of the property for the storage of ships' stores and non-toxic, non-hazardous bulk storage.

The applicant was John Fletcher Pty. Ltd., Customs agents.

Ald. I. Wyner moved an amendment that the application be not approved, and he was supported by Ald. N. Origlass and Ald. A. Graham.

The amendment was defeated—only the three Balmain aldermen voting for it—but Ald. Wyner gave notice of a re-consideration motion, to be moved at the next Council meeting.

Ald. Wyner's amendment made the following points:

Two-thirds of the subject site was zoned living area under the County of Cumberland

planning scheme. Leichhardt Council had already decided to object to its own zoning in the Leichhardt scheme of "light industrial" in favour of "2A residential".

A substantial part of the subject property was within the foreshore scenic protection area.

Any further generation of traffic in that area must destroy the now-affected living area amenity.

The applicant was already a major transporter to the A.N.L. terminal and the new proposal would be linked with that activity.

Noise generation from within the property was inevitable, and it would be difficult to restrict the hours of use of the store.

The enterprise would intrude into a closely-settled residential area.

The proposal was not in the public interest.

Column NINE

MAJOR HOME DEVELOPMENT

Announcement of major home unit and shopping developments in Balmain, following the opening recently of a quality social catering enterprise in Rozelle, is really good news.

It would appear that the worrying nature of operations at the two container terminals has not frightened away residential developers.

The million dollar home unit plan for Fitzroy Avenue and the major home unit plans for the residue of the Council's East Balmain land add up to more families for the area, and two more desirable waterfront locations barred to possibly undesirable industry.

Leichhardt Council would be justified in really chortling over these developments, as Balmain-Rozelle supporters generally would be.

With such major residential development occurring, the Balmain peninsula is becoming less industrialised than ever.

That industry is still very active here is of course evident. As old industries go, new ones arrive—such as the proposed use by storage interests of that vast, derelict building at the bottom of Church Street.

The Balmain aldermen don't like the idea of this, fearing it will seriously affect nearby residents' amenity. They could have a point.

It's to be hoped Leichhardt Council has carefully weighed—or is weighing—all the pros and cons of that situation.

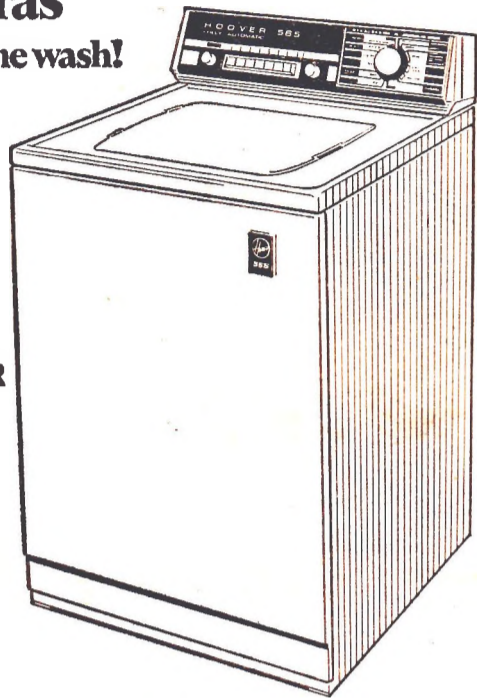

Washing Shirts

Here is a method of washing shirts, suggested by well-known Balmain men's wear authority, Mr Wal Dickson:

Wash as lightly as possible, using a washing soap to remove any excess dirt. Rinse well, leave all the water in the shirt, then place on a coat hanger to dry.

Do not spin dry or wring out. Do not peg up by the tail, as all the water will thus run down into the collar.

The more water you leave in the shirt when hanging out to dry, the better the result.

Washing by this method will lengthen the life of your shirts.

IS THIS THE START OF LIBRARIES FOR MUNICIPALITY?

By its decision last week to purchase a property in Leichhardt to accommodate its Baby Health Centre, Leichhardt Council could well have taken the first step towards the establishment of municipal libraries throughout the municipality.

The property is big enough to accommodate both the Health Centre and a central library for the municipality.

Council had this possibility in mind when deciding to purchase the property, adopting in principle the idea that a building would be erected which could cover both.

A new venue for the Health Centre is necessary because the Council is required to move the Centre from its present location.

The Mayor, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, told "The Link" that Council had not come to any firm decision yet to set the library movement in train.

Before this could be done, Council would have to adopt the Library Act, so as to benefit from the State Government's subsidy for

municipal libraries. However, he considered that there was little doubt that this would be done. Neither was there much doubt that one of the branches would be located on the Balmain peninsula.

"Yet I have heard of some opposition to the setting up of free libraries in our municipality", the Mayor said. "Some people have asked: 'Why do we want libraries?'"

"My reply has been that the election platform of the elected aldermen was for the provision of free municipal libraries.

"I believe we will see our libraries start this year, and that they will be of a high standard".

The property being acquired by the Council is an old building adjacent to the Town Hall at the corner of Marion and Renwick Streets.

It is to be altered, renovated and extended.

A single-storey property, it has a frontage of 40 feet to Marion Street and extends 99 feet along Renwick Street.

Council is in process of purchasing the property and an adjoining one with a 25 ft. frontage to Renwick Street.

The completed structure will be mainly of one storey, with a small second floor area to house the library offices and office of the Chief Librarian.

Council is still awaiting the provision of detailed plans, specifications and cost estimates by its architects.

Complaints Of Air Pollution

Billowing clouds of thick black smoke as heavy as a naval smoke-screen blacked out Glebe Island Bridge last Thursday evening.

Describing it as one of the worst instances of air pollution within recent memory, East Balmain residents said the nuisance emanated from a tall chimney stack at Pyrmont.

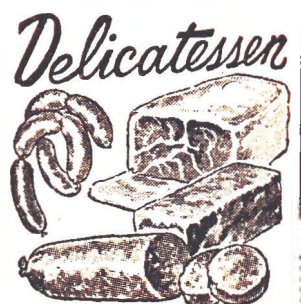
When the outpouring was at its height just after six o'clock it completely hid Glebe Island Bridge and its dense evening traffic streams.
