New Housing Plans For Balmain Biggest Yet

Details of the developers' plans for the unused land in Leichhardt Council's Balmain East housing project show that these involve the biggest residential development scheme yet to come to the Balmain peninsula.

The plans are for five separate buildings—three blocks of 3-storey home units, one 14-storey tower block of units, and a group of ten 2-storey "Town Houses"—85 separate residential units all told.

Total cost is estimated at \$1½ million.

The developers are well-known Balmain operators—Karl Developments Pty. Ltd., whose managing director is Balmain businessman, Mr. Karl Fisher.

The company's tender for purchase of the land—for \$267,500—was accepted by Leichhardt Council at its last meeting.

Views

The land in question has frontages to Darling and Nicholson Streets, and Brett, Gallimore and Lookes Avenues, in a most strategic section of the tip of Balmain peninsula.

It is in the foreshore protection scheme and can therefore never be built out, preserving uninterrupted harbour views right down to Manly and across to the city and the North Shore.

The five buildings will be staggered up the hill in a way which will give all occupiers a view.

Also it is reported that there is little risk of existing residents losing any view they now have, especially since each building will occupy only about 30 per cent of the land on which it will be built.

As soon as final details are ironed out between the development

company and the Council, a start will be made on the project. It is expected that this will be in about three months' time.

A spokesman for the company said this would be the biggest and most expensive residential project to come to the Balmain peninsula to date.

He considered it would set the standard for any further development in that area.

"I am against knocking down pretty little houses (to accommodate home units) if they can be saved", he said.

"But all things being equal, if a house on a suitable home unit site is replaced by a block of units, it means that very many more people can enjoy the view formerly enjoyed by only one family".

He thought the development would increase the worth of Balmain East generally as a residential area. In any case it meant an increase in population there.

Details

The plans for the project are:

- A 3-storey block of 12 units — one 3-bedroom and three 2-bedroom units on each floor.

- A 3-storey block of nine units — one 3-bedroom and two 2-bedroom units on each floor.

- A 3-storey block of 12 units — four 2-bedroom units on each floor.

- A tower block of 14 storeys containing 42 luxury units (2- and 3-bedroom).

- Ten 3-bedroom

Town Houses.

Each of the units will possess individual laundries and covered car parking.

The tower block will be of special interest. It will be located right at the top of Nicholson Street.

A 52-ft. wide building, it will be of concrete construction faced with cream-coloured bricks.

Its 2-bedroom units will each have an area of nine squares, and the 3-bedroom ones 12 squares. They will be served by two high-speed elevators.

A swimming pool will be attached to the tower block, and the area around the block will be extensively landscaped.

Rustic

The ten Town Houses will provide another interesting variation — a cottage atmosphere with the concept of home-unit service.

Each will represent a 2-storey cottage with its own garden and balcony.

On the ground floor will be the living room, dining room, kitchen, laundry and toilet; on the upper floor the three bedrooms and bathroom.

The slope of the land will enable the Town Houses to have their own covered car parking. And in front, the unoccupied area of land will be landscaped.

Mr Fisher said that the idea of the Town Houses was to provide a rustic look, with sandstone and timber, to blend into the Balmain atmosphere.

It is expected that scale models of the various parts of the enter-

While agreeing with the views of the Mayor, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, that a strong effort should be made to prevent littering of streets in the municipality, some Balmain people believe that a lead should come from the Council staff.

This picture, taken during the morning of Tuesday of last week, shows a fairly usual condition in Balmain's main shopping centre.

Advice to "The Link" was that the footpath was in this condition overnight, and that no effort had been made by the Council staff to clean it up.

Moreover, when a local businessman complained to the Council's Health Department, he was told (according to our information) that owing to the staff position Darling Street could not be swept any Sunday or Monday night.

Ald. Rodwell told "The Link" that street cleaning in the main streets of Balmain was made exceptionally difficult by the continued presence of cars parked at the kerbsides.

"If they go away, they come back again at midnight", he said.

However, he said, Council agreed that it should play its own part in improving the situation. The Council engineer had distributed some more litter bins in parts of the municipality, especially near workshops.

"Basically", he added,

Anti-litter Campaign

A Balmain resident, Mr D. Giles, offers the following comment on the situation in a letter to the Editor:

Unless the anti-litter campaign of which Mayor Rodwell speaks ("The Link", Jan. 28) is directed to the right quarters, it will be useless.

His statement does not bode well in this respect. There is plenty about "the public" needing "educating", inspectors, policing, extra powers, on-the-spot fines, etc., but nothing about what is to be done about the two main sources of litter—delinquent industries and Leichhardt Council.

The Council's garbage trucks strew papers and rubbish through the streets of Balmain with complete indifference — witness Beattie St. or Darling St. after they have been through.

The Council could provide cheap plastic bags so that garbage could remain enclosed despite the handling it gets during removal; but instead it sends out circulars telling us not to use them.

When the Council has enforced the cleaning up of littered industrial land (especially on the foreshore), and has installed a 20th century garbage disposal system, it may then have the right to "educate" and fine the public.

If it continues to fail to attend to the problems of its own creation it will add to its performance over the Glebe home and the Balmain terminal a further reason to throw it out of office at the next Council elections.

Column NINE

TOO LITTLE, TOO LATE!

An example of the wrong way to do things is the protest of Mort Bay residents against Council approval of the use by storage interests of the derelict building at the foot of Church Street, Balmain.

Their views on keeping this region for residential purposes could have been very positive for a long time—as long as the building was empty?—but who has known them?

When "The Link" urged the rezoning of this area in July, 1968, there was not a ripple of public (or aldermanic) interest.

Nobody said "Good!" — or even "Tripe!"

Now, without warning, Council has approved an application for use of the building for industry.

Here is shown a real need for public access to a Court to protest against a Council's development decision.

As we publish this, Council is hearing a rescission motion on the subject by Balmain aldermen.

Whether this has been successful or not, residents hereabouts should start telling their local aldermen, and the Mayor, and senior Council officers, how they feel on such matters.

Of course they're up against the pernicious system of Party politics in Local Government, in which Council's decisions are made by Caucus beforehand, with practically no chance of success of opposition by the Balmain trio or anyone else.

Yet residents should become vocal on such matters. Tell your municipal and Government representatives how you feel. If things go wrong, at least you've tried — and you know better what to do at the next elections.

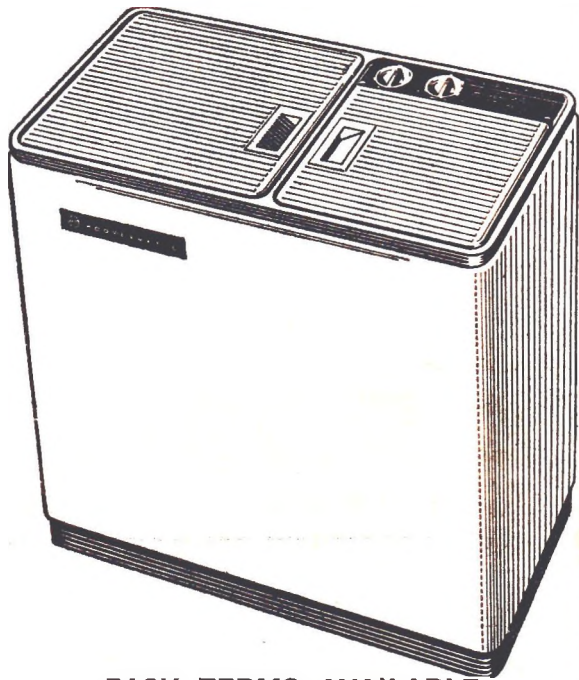

Many Players Enter For League Trials

Over 100 players trying out for inclusion in Balmain Rugby League Club's 1970 premiership teams will have their first severe testing at Redfern Oval on Saturday afternoon.

They will be opposed to players trying out for Eastern Suburbs in a series of trial matches throughout the afternoon.

These games will form the prelude to the opening round of the pre-season first grade competition at 8.30 p.m., Saturday, in which Balmain's Tigers will be opposed to Eastern Suburbs. The reserve grade match will begin at 7 p.m.

Discussing the new aspirants for places in the club's premiership teams, Balmain Secretary, Mr Kevin Humphries, said they comprised local juniors and young men from the country.

He said the large number would be gradually reduced by the selectors viewing the trial matches to be played. In five weeks' time, when the premiership

competition began, the club would have a total of 52 graded players.

Training squad members were elated at the form already achieved and the considerable amount of young talent available to the Tigers for the season ahead.

The pre-season competition will be used by selectors to decide places in the club's graded teams.

In the first premiership match on March 28 the Tigers will meet Manly-Warringah whom they sensationally defeated in last year's final. This fixture has been awarded "match of the day" in the opening round.
