BIG HOSPITAL PROJECT

Campaign To Raise \$50,000 For New Building Block

Balmain Hospital has come one step closer to getting its new outpatients'-casualty department, but under the system of self-help the Government is asking it to raise the first \$50,000 of the cost. A campaign to raise this is being planned by a special committee of the hospital.

The committee will meet shortly to determine its plan of approach to the problem, which it realises is a severe one.

Raising the sum of \$50,000 in a public appeal may not be a difficult proposition in a wealthy district, but in the Balmain-Rozelle-Leichhardt area it could prove an extensive task (unless major help comes from wealthy organisations based here).

Plans for a new medical block for Balmain Hospital—to house a new outpatients' department—were announced by the President of the Hospital Board, Mr W. F. Pinerua, at the annual meeting of subscribers last November.

Critical

The project will cost over \$500,000 dollars, and will replace outpatients' and casualty facilities which, designed for 1900, are now stretched to almost breaking point.

The need for new facilities is critical. According to the Chief Executive Officer of the hospital, Mr K. R. J. Boylan, there is just no

alternative to provision of the new block.

Neither is there any alternative to raising the \$50,000 by public appeal.

The Government has adopted this method of financing the proposition, and the target must be achieved.

The amount named is ten per cent of the estimated total cost. The remainder will be borrowed by the hospital under the Public Hospitals Act, and the interest and capital repayments will be met by the Government.

The committee does not want to make a piecemeal approach to the problem of raising the money. It will tackle it in a businesslike manner, as a well-founded campaign.

Mr Boylan said he was hopeful that they would have the \$50,000 in hand when tenders were called for the work, which he anticipated would be towards the end of the next financial year.

"I feel that this effort will call for a great deal of goodwill and understanding by the people of the area served by

our hospital", he said.

"We are, of course, not unmindful of the demands made by the community. However, this is the first major appeal the hospital has conducted for about 20 years.

"We trust that all sections of the people will respond—private persons, business people, sporting and social clubs, and organisations generally.

"We would like to hear from people who are prepared to help us. They could write to me for information on this matter.

"I would specially like to hear from anyone prepared to form a group, or to arouse the interest of any organisation in this district.

"Meanwhile we are, of course, ready to accept donations direct—to be acknowledged, or anonymously if desired".

an architect full-time on preparation of working drawings, which is the advanced stage of planning, and these should be ready in about nine months' time.

The present outpatients' department is located in buildings constructed in 1900 and added to about 1920, when the hospital was far smaller than at present.

The new outpatients'-casualty department will be located behind Thornton House and will use the ground floor of Thornton House as a casualty unit.

It will make a marked difference in the service offered the public, incorporating such facilities as special audio rooms (for the testing of hearing), an eye clinic, and special cardiogram facilities.

In addition, the plans now in hand incorporate a proposal to convert the David Easton ward into an intensive care unit, to which will be added the new cardiac unit.

Meanwhile, of course, the hospital has to carry on with its ancient facilities, which cater for 21,000 patients a year in the casualty department and 65,000 in the outpatients' department.

Despite the inadequacy of these facilities, the work done in these directions compares favourably with that in other peripheral general hospitals throughout the metropolitan area.

ATTEMPT TO PREVENT RESUMPTION

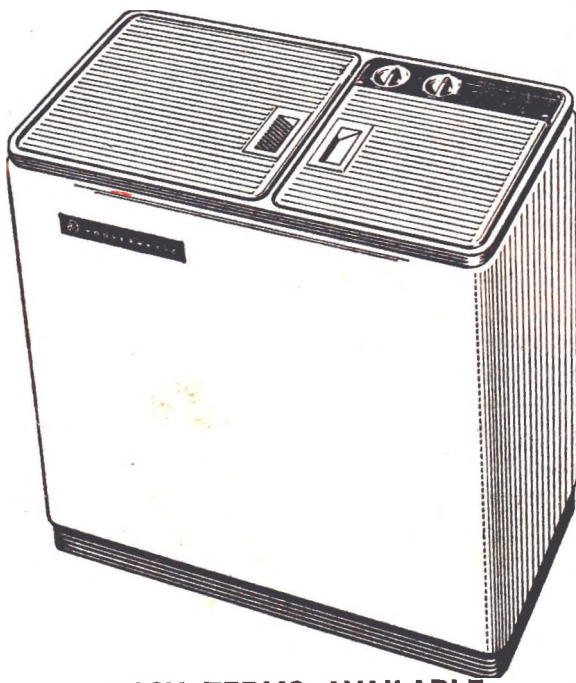

Balmain Trees

The street tree-plant-
 ing scheme of The Bal-
 main Association is com-
 mendable and has my

 of the Plane Tree as a
 street tree?

There are two types of
 Plane—Platanus Orient-
 alis, of the Old World,
 and Platanus Occidental,
 of America (commonly
 called Sycamore or But-
 tonwood). These trees
 have a spreading habit
 of growth, and as they
 grow to a height of 40
 ft. or more, one can im-
 agine the space in width
 they would occupy.

Both types are decid-
 uous, and from my ex-
 perience are prolific in
 growth. Consequently, as
 a street tree has to be
 continually pruned, this
 would be accentuated in
 Balmain's narrow path-
 ways. They would quick-
 ly create traffic hazards
 and would interfere with
 any overhead wiring.

I don't want to appear
 as a knocker, but unfor-
 tunately this beautiful
 tree is not suitable for
 our narrow streets. There
 are fortunately many
 that could take its place.

Smoke Control Regulations "A Nasty Joke"

The Balmain-Leichhardt Labor Party — the group formed by the Balmain aldermen — thinks the new Regulations governing emission of smoke from ships are "A nasty joke on the community".

Its latest circular issued to Balmain residents refers to the special message sent by President Nixon to the U.S. Congress on February 11.

This declared that industries that failed to comply with air and water anti-pollution standards would face fines up to \$8,929 a day. "Compare this with Sydney", the circular says.

"For two years we have been pressing for Regulations in regard to vessels polluting the atmosphere and residential areas. Now at last Regulations have been brought down by the Maritime Services Board.

"But what Regulations! If found guilty, the owner and the master of a vessel face a fine that shall not go beyond \$200.

"But they may blow as much smoke, fumes, ash, cinders, soot and dust as they like between sunrise and sunset seven days a week and, with the permission of the M.S.B., at any time between sunset and sunrise".

Blowing of "black" smoke (Ringelman 4), without permission, attracts a penalty only at

After hours the same number will put the caller onto "Harbour Control", who will immediately contact the "Duty Harbour Master".

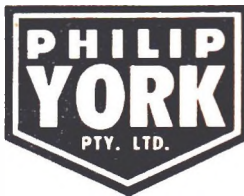
