

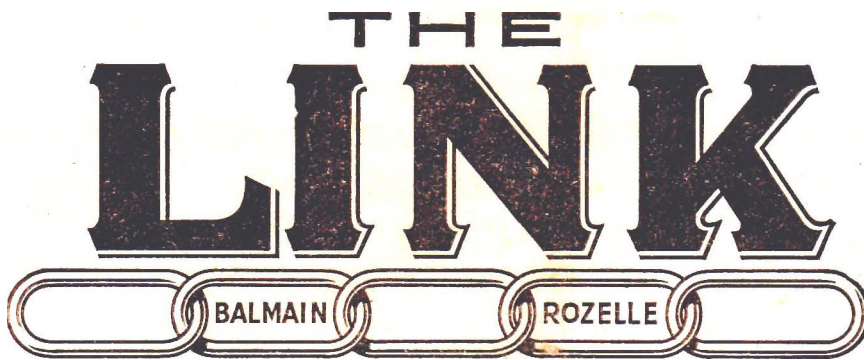

"Rebels" To Get Writ Over Court Costs

The tidying up of the Equity Court case by the Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, against the three Balmain aldermen, following the unruly Council scenes in regard to the Glebe Old Men's Home, is not proceeding smoothly. A writ of execution has now been taken out against them by the Council for payment of Court costs.

The Equity Court case, which confirmed the attitude of the Mayor that he had a right to remove from the Council meeting any alderman he considered unruly, was heard in the middle of July, 1969.

It resulted in an unreserved apology by Alderman Origlass, Wyner and Graham, who were thereupon readmitted to Council meetings.

Later explaining his attitude, Ald. Origlass (the Court case against whom was taken by the three aldermen as a test) said the trouble had arose over his attempt to take a point of order on the Mayor's intervention in a debate in opposition to an amendment moved by Ald. Origlass.

He (Ald. Origlass) said he considered the Mayor's prerogative must not be stretched to

give him the right to intervene in opposition to a proposition. However, the Court had ruled against him.

Court costs assessed by the Deputy Master in Equity amounted to \$1873.44 — representing \$997 in the case against Ald. Origlass, \$479 against Ald. Wyner, and \$396 against Ald. Graham.

A letter advising them of this was written by the Leichhardt Town Clerk, Mr. E. A. Basset, who said that the costs were due to be payable to the Council within 14 days from February 17.

The subject was raised at last week's meeting of the Council, when it was reported by the Finance Committee that as the costs had not then been paid, the Mayor had instructed the Council's solicitor to issue a writ of execution, to be handed to the sheriff.

Council resolved that the Mayor's action be endorsed.

In the report (from the Finance Committee) advising the facts, a letter was included from the three aldermen in which they asked for time to pay the costs, by instalments.

The committee's report (which was adopted) was that no action be taken over the request.

When this was before Council, Ald. Origlass rose to seek a ruling from the Mayor that he could discuss the matter in open Council.

He said that this was a different matter to that covered by the Local Government Act (which ruled that an alderman with any pecuniary interest in a matter before Council should as soon as possible after the meeting opens declare his interest).

The Mayor ruled that under this clause of the Act the aldermen concerned could not discuss the matter in open Council.

Later Ald. Origlass told "The Link" that he considered Council's refusal to allow payment of costs by instalments to be vindictive.

He said it was Council's policy to allow debtors time to pay. This applied particularly in the case of payment of rates, 12 months being allowed.

The Mayor has not been available for comment.

FIRST RESPONSE TO HOSPITAL'S APPEAL FOR FUNDS

First definite response to the article in "The Link" last week reporting the commencement of a campaign by Balmain Hospital to raise ten per cent of the cost of a big new block came early Monday.

This was a promise by Mr. Philip Bray, of Bray's Books, Darling Street, Balmain, of a donation of a portion of the proceeds of his business during one week.

He told Mr. K. R. J. Boylan, Chief Executive Officer of the hospital, that he would donate to the new building fund 25 per cent of all sales over \$1 from his store during the week April 10-16.

Mr. Bray said that the week in question would coincide with the first

birthday of his business in Balmain.

His donation would be his way of saying "Thank you" to the district for supporting him.

The campaign being planned by a special committee of the hospital is to raise the first \$50,000 of the \$500,000 cost of building a new outpatients-casualty department.

This new block will replace outpatients' and casualty facilities which were designed for 1900, and are now stretched to almost breaking point.

The need for new facilities is critical.

"The Link" strongly supports the appeal, and draws the hospital's very great need to the attention of private persons, clubs, institutions, and business organisations in the district.

The Department of Public Works has placed an architect full-time on preparation of working drawings for the new block, and these should be ready in about nine months' time.

The reason for the hospital's appeal for \$50,000 to help finance the work is that this is

the method adopted by the Government of financing the proposition, under the system of "Self-help".

The remaining 90% of the cost will be borrowed by the hospital under the Public Hospitals Act, and the interest and capital repayments will be met by the Government.

Donations to this appeal may be claimed as income tax deductions.

In addition to monetary donations, help is being sought in the way of organisation of money-raising groups.

Those interested are asked to contact Mr. Boylan, Chief Executive Officer, at the hospital.

Cremation at Rookwood Crematorium followed a well-attended service at St. John's Church of England.

A SUGGESTION IS IGNORED

Readers of this newspaper who pass along Booth Street, Balmain, and note the sudden appearance of some new built-up stone-enclosed garden beds on the back edge of Gladstone Park may be pardoned for scratching their heads.

They will recall that 12 months ago we published a suggestion that this spot be used in conjunction with a part of the adjoining footpath as an area for angle-parking of cars.

Neither the sloping section of turf nor the section of footpath was regarded as having any real value to the public.

On the other hand, parking space was badly needed by visitors to the hospital and by shoppers patronising one of the busiest sections of the Darling Street shopping area.

We brought our idea personally to the attention of the Council several times and were assured it was to be examined sympathetically.

Well, what happened? Was our idea stupid — impractical — too revolutionary — or isn't newspaper opinion worth considering by Leichhardt Council?

Leaving aside our justified annoyance at being so patently ignored, since the Council didn't think it worth while to advise us of its decision, what about the public's welfare?

We know parks are extremely important, but so are the needs of motoring citizens in their daily activities.

Council has promised to tackle the Balmain shoppers' parking problem. What has it done, apart from threatening to impose an additional local rate to provide the "free" Council parking stations so blithely promised during last election?

Precisely nothing! Has it really got a policy at all?

START ON NEW PARK AT BALMAIN EAST

The President of the Maritime Services Board, Mr. Brotherson, said last Friday that a start would be made this week on construction of the park promised by the Board at Peacocks Point, Balmain East.

This park is in substitution for the unoccupied section of Commonwealth land which has been regarded as being available for general use by the public, and which now forms part of the Balmain container terminal.

The Board has promised that it will be available by April 29, the date of the Captain Cook bicentenary celebrations.

It will be for pedestrians only, with no provision for motor vehicles.

It will have a distinctive Australian atmosphere, as it will be planted with native shrubs and trees. A top-quality effort is anticipated.

Mr. Brotherson said that the Board's contractors would be in the area this week to carry out development of the park according to the Board's plans.

Surveying

"The Link" has been advised by a representative of residents of Datchett Street, Balmain, that they were worried last week by the presence of surveyors, who said they were from the M.S.B.

The residents expressed concern at the possibility of the Board closing

ing their access to the harbourside.

Being a statutory body, they said, the Board was not under an obligation to apply to the local Council for permission to indulge in further development.

What they feared most was extension to the east of the White Bay terminal wharf.

Asked to comment on the report, Mr. Brotherson said he did not know anything about the matter.

"Probably this is routine work," he told "The Link".

Dwarfs' Problems Subject Of Sydney Meeting

The world's leading authority on the problems of dwarfism, Professor Victor McKusick, will visit Sydney later this month.

He will give an address on all aspects of this community problem at a meeting of the Little People's Association of Australasia in the Maitland Lecture Theatre, Sydney Hospital, Macquarie Street, at 2.30 p.m., Tuesday, March 24.

Dr. McKusick is attached to the Moore Clinic of John Hopkins Hospital, U.S.A. He and his colleagues are the leading investigators in U.S.A. into the causes of dwarfism, and possible remedies for it.

The L.P.A.A. is a recently formed body whose aim is to tell the world that "Little People"—those affected by all forms of dwarfism—are little only in stature.

It says that their physical malformation has no effect on their character or personality except perhaps to make them happier than those of normal stature.

Objectives

The Association's President is Mr. G. Whitaker, of Port Macquarie, and the Chairman of the Council is Mr. F. McHugh, of Henley, N.S.W.

Specific objectives of the L.P.A.A. include:

- Education of the public to full realisation of the humanity of "Little People".
- Collection and dissemination of information to parents, doctors, employers and educational authorities.

- Guidance of Little People and/or their parents to appropriate sources of medical, social and vocational guidance.
- Creation of employment opportunities.
- Liaison with manufacturers and designers to meet Little People's material requirements.
- Encouragement of solutions of Little People's medical, social and educational problems.
- Co-operation with medical and scientific research workers on human growth and development.

Invitation

Mr. McHugh, who is a well-known Rozelle businessman, said that **except in rare cases there was at the moment no known cure for the bone growth diseases that brought about dwarfism.**

These apparently could strike without apparent reason in any family anywhere.

"Until recently many dwarfs here were hidden by parents who were too embarrassed to let them live reasonably normal lives," he said.

"There were organisations for spastic children, mentally retarded children, deaf and blind children — but not for dwarfed children.

"Now at least they are able to talk over their problems."

DELAYING MOTION REJECTED

An unsuccessful effort was made last week by the three Balmain aldermen to delay a decision by Leichhardt Council favouring high density development in Wharf Road, Balmain.

At the previous Council meeting Ald. Origlass, supported by Ald. Wyner, had moved that the matter be deferred until all objections to the Leichhardt Planning Scheme had been determined later in the year.

They pointed out at last week's meeting that a good case had been made out against high density housing in narrow Wharf Road.

They ridiculed the contention that the developer concerned would suffer hardship if his application stood in abeyance until all objections to the local plan had been resolved.

Their motion, however, was defeated by the block vote of aldermen from other suburbs.

Petition

Council also declined to take action regarding the petition by 625 Balmain residents, who protested against approval of the Johnfletcher application.

It decided to "Receive and note" the petition.

Ald. Origlass commented that the Balmain Labor Party Branch had unanimously called on the Council Caucus to reject the application. Aldermen from outside Balmain, he said, were continuing to defy the wishes and interests of Balmain residents, and were acting against Labor principles.

Change in Terminal Traffic Nuisance

The drivers of a considerable number of semi-trailers carrying containers from Mort Bay are obviously finding the outlet via Mort Street too difficult.

According to residents' reports, many vehicles are being driven from the container berth across the tarmac to the area of the Tasmanian vehicle ferry, and then up via Ballast Point Road and Rowntree Street.

"This is against the agreement with Leichhardt Council", said one

"We already have extreme annoyance from ordinary traffic to and from the Empress terminal. It's just too much to have to take this additional annoyance.

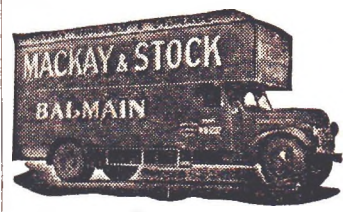
