Mort Bay Property Bids Queried

Fears are expressed by Balmain aldermen that carrying interests are trying to exert pressure on Leichhardt Council to permit the setting up of a big carrying concern at Mort Bay, despite Council's known views on the subject.

The aldermen believe no other interpretation than this can be placed on current moves.

Council has already disapproved the development application by one big firm anxious to set up a carrying complex in association with the Mort Bay container terminal.

This was from Thomas Nationwide Transport Ltd.

Disapproval of this was expressed by Council on the ground of the interference with residential amenity which would be inevitable as a result of traffic created by the development.

Recently Council approved an application by Johnfletcher (Customs Agents) Pty. Ltd., for permission to use the property facing the whole of the south-eastern frontage of Church Street, between Cameron Street and Curtis Road, for storage purposes.

A motion to rescind that decision, moved by Balmain aldermen on February 18, was defeated.

Now another applicant has entered the field—Tradex Transport Pty. Ltd.

This company has applied to Council for permission to use that property for warehousing, overnight parking of trucks, refuelling of trucks and light servicing in connection with the company's business of international and interstate forwarding Customs agents.

At the last meeting Council adopted a report by its Town Planner, Mr. A. Kenna, who urged rejection of the application on the grounds of the large number of traffic movements involved in the proposed development, particularly in Cameron Street.

That street carried heavy motor traffic to and from the shipping, container and road transport complex in the old Morts Dock area, he said, and the proposed development would inevitably result in serious traffic hazards in the comparatively quiet residential streets.

Mr. Kenna added that although not specifically stated in the application, it was felt that, because of the magnitude of the

applicant company, its use of the premises might involve the transfer of containers to and from the Tasmanian Ferry Terminal, Mort Bay, and probably White Bay.

That would result in intolerable traffic conditions in the residential streets.

In view of the closely settled character of the adjacent residential area, injury to the amenity would be inevitable.

Council agreed to refer the application to the State Planning Authority and the Police Department, as required, emphasising that Council strongly opposed it for the reasons stated.

A motion by the Balmain aldermen—moved by Ald. Wyner and seconded by Ald. Origlass—drew attention to the situation.

They said it needed investigation to see whether there were any connection between such applications and a further one which apparently was still to come from T.N.T.—whether some arrangement was contemplated for all of them to occupy the one place.

What intrigued them was that the easiest application to get through—that by Johnfletcher—mentioned that only a couple of trucks would be in use.

It seemed unusual that only a couple of vehicles would be used for such a big building.

The rest of the Council, however, refused to agree, and rejected the amendment.

Migrant Children's Language Problem

Influx into many schools of increasing numbers of migrant children with language disability in English is a problem to classroom teachers, according to Miss O. A. Nichols, District Inspector of Schools in the Sydney city area for the N.S.W. Department of Education.

Miss Nichols says teachers not only have to provide for children from a known environment and culture, but also for those from differing ethnic groups.

"The first trouble arises when parents insist upon the mother tongue being spoken exclusively in the home", she says.

"The concept that it is in the child's best interest to practise English as much as possible is hard to instil, for communication with the parents is often difficult, if

not impossible.

"It is well known, for instance, that many Greek children leave school in the afternoons only to be confronted by another two hours of instruction in the Greek language.

"Confusion is inevitable, particularly when the children are not very able".

Miss Nichols adds that, where numbers warrant it, the most successful organisation is to provide special teachers to give intensive training for one or two periods a

THE FOOTPATH DRINKER

Balmain - Rozelle residents are justified in feeling concerned at further instances of undesirable behaviour at some hotels in the district.

Footpath drinking associated with bad language towards passers-by appears to be on the increase, and in some spots is getting out of hand.

These reports are substantiated by the local police, who say that their patrols are now devoting more attention to the practice.

It was about this time last year that this paper demanded strong preventive action by the Balmain police.

The police at that time pointed out that footpath drinking in itself broke no law, and that it was only when it created obstructions to pedestrians or involved offensive behaviour that they could lay any charge.

Police officials declare that there is a severe shortage of men available for patrol duty, and that there is no sign of results from the constant agitation to the Government for the allotment of more men for this work.

This shortage is said to be common in most areas of N.S.W.

The behaviour complained of is classified by the authorities as being in the "minor offences" region. However, minor cases of misbehaviour, if unchecked, have a habit of developing into major ones.

It is a challenge to the enthusiasm and sense of duty of our local force. We trust the challenge will be accepted and the practice cleaned up once and for all.

QUESTION OF PROPERTY RESUMPTION

East Balmain residents who feared property resumptions to enable a circular drive to be made from Darling Street along Gallimore Avenue and back to Darling Street could be relieved at a Leichhardt Council decision at last meeting.

Council adopted a Works Committee meeting recommendation that action be taken to remove a caveat placed on the title of property known as No. 8 Clifton Street.

The caveat had been placed on the land because of Council's intention to extend Gallimore Avenue through

that property into Simmons Street.

This would have permitted traffic to proceed thence into Nicholson Street and back into Darling Street.

Completion of the route would have involved a certain amount of property resumption, particularly No. 8 Clifton Street.

Gallimore Avenue is now a quiet, dead-end street.

Some residents felt that its extension, to cater for the increased traffic believed imminent from residential development in the area, would have altered the character of the area.

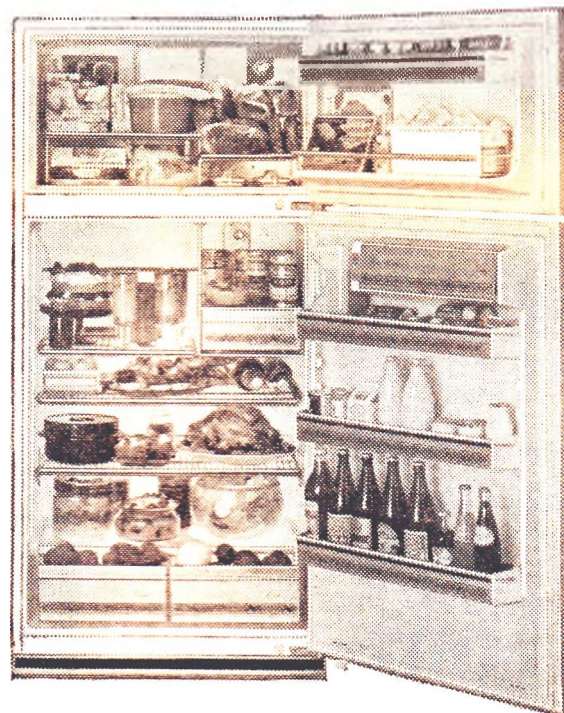

GOVERNMENT URGED TO ACT ON MORT BAY TRAFFIC

Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A., Member for the Balmain seat in State Parliament, has asked the Premier (Mr Askin) to intervene on behalf of residents in regard to the Mort Bay road traffic problem.

He said the other day that traffic conditions and the noise problem in Balmain would soon be intolerable unless the State Government took firm and immediate action.

Traffic generated by the Mort Bay container terminal was already causing serious problems for residents.

"The State Government must accept responsibility for the Mort Bay traffic problem", Mr Degen said.

"The Government should step in now and co-ordinate plans to protect Balmain residents.

"The Government has the power to impose rigid conditions on the movement of traffic to and from Mort Bay, but so far has refused to act".

Mr Crawford, however, was just as much in the dark.

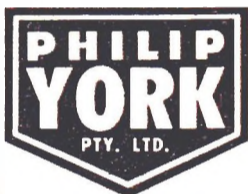

Gladstone Park Plants

Relaxing in Gladstone Park, I was pondering over the controversial cost of planting the raised banks as viewed from Darling and Booth Streets.

I wondered how to overcome the costly procedure of planting this area twice a year with seedlings, and the ensuing barrenness of the banks between seasons.

A local park is most important, being a people's sanctuary where one can meditate and enjoy the peaceful surroundings. As John Keats wrote: "A thing of beauty is a joy for ever."

I could visualise this area planted with dwarf trees of the Retinospora family (beautiful specimens with golden foliage): dwarf Junipers of prostrate habit, and erect; then on to the dwarf Thuys, the beautiful Rheingold, with here and there a colourful Japanese Nandina.

I would interpose these with varieties of flax and the many dwarf coloured Veronicas.

Between these I would plant herbaceous perennials, succulents and trailing plants to cover the sandstone.

Then, where there are little pockets of space, I would use seasonal plants such as Pansies, Violas, Petite Marigolds, Petunias, Portulaca and Verbena. One box would do the whole area.

This would create a potential of permanency and we would not have the barren area between seasons.

The initial cost would be practically the only one.

Perhaps some reader has other ideas?

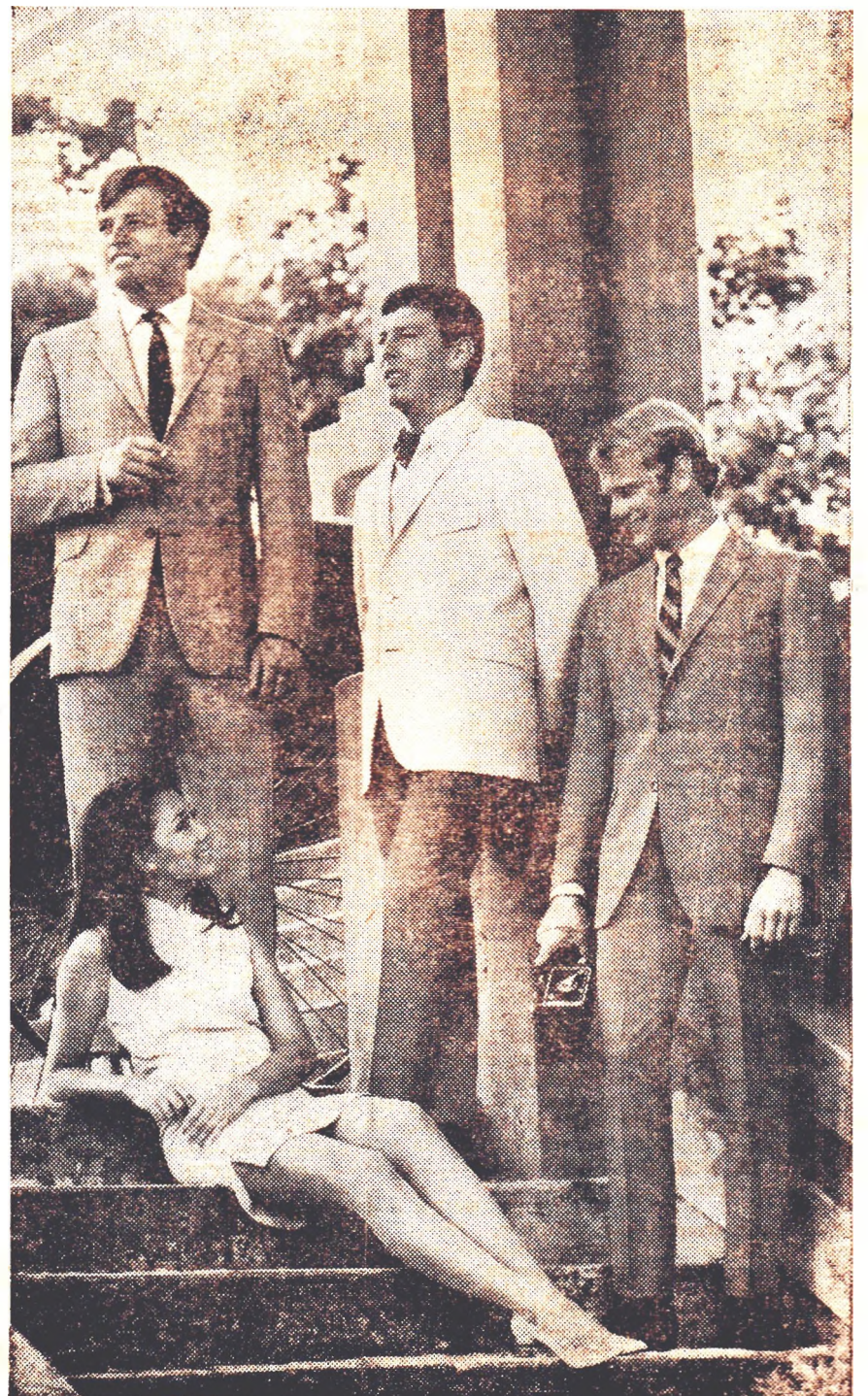
