# Watch House Opening Brings Back The Past

Darling Street, Balmain, was the scene last Sunday of one of the most interesting activities yet to take place in the preservation of early Australian—the official opening of the restored Watch House. The ceremony culminated four years of dedicated work by members of The Balmain Association.

No greater effort in the national interest has been made by a private organisation in Australia to preserve for posterity some evidence of our country's early days.

The Watch House was one of a pair of police stations built in the mid-1850's from the design of Edmund Blacket, Colonial Architect. It was used as local headquarters of the constabulary until 1887, when the present Police Court and Post Office building was erected.

It is now ready to be put into use as headquarters of The Balmain Association, which will hold its sub-committee meetings there. Until now these have been held in private homes.

## Functions

The building will become a community centre, with a display gallery, a children's library, an arts and crafts area, archives room, simple entertainment facilities and landscaping.

Already in position is an historic exhibition of Balmain's past, in the form of photographs and etchings. The children's library is expected to be opened shortly.

An important part of the work has been the restoration of the charge room and one cell to their early Victorian appearance and character.

The proposal for restoration was made in

1965, when the newly-formed Balmain Association asked the National Trust of Australia (N.S.W.) to support an appeal to the Minister for Lands for the preservation of the building.

This request was received sympathetically, and the State Government vested the building in the National Trust.

A lease was then drawn up whereby with the approval of the Minister the Association would undertake urgent repairs, long term renovation, and the authentic restoration of some parts.

## Ceremony

The official opening was quite uncoloured by politics or other controversial aspects.

It was performed by the Minister for Lands, Mr T. L. Lewis, in the presence of over 200 people.

Among those present were the Federal Member for the Sydney electorate, Mr Jim Cope, M.H.R.; the State Member for Balmain, Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A.; the Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, and local aldermen; Mr Jack Shaw, former Commissioner for Main Roads; members of the Annandale Association and the Glebe Society; and members of The Balmain Association.

The ceremony was conducted outside the

building, and the gathering spilled out widely on to the road.

To add colour to the scene, members of local jazz bands, dressed in unusual costumes, marched down the street, and after the ceremony entertained the gathering on the lawns of the Watch House.

This was an impromptu activity, not organised by the Association, but considered by many observers to be a pleasing gesture.

In his remarks the Minister, Mr Lewis, paid tribute to the enthusiasm of The Balmain Association in its restoration work, and said he was a believer in the principle of conserving the things of the past.

He had been told that, in terms of money spent, the cost of restoration had been \$4000, but he knew much more than that had been spent in hard work by members of the Association and well-wishers.

## Derelict

Mr Lewis added that when he had first seen the building, before restoration commenced, it was a derelict structure.

He had been closely involved in the negotiations which resulted in the Association taking over the building on lease.

Mr Cedric Flower, Vice-president of The National Trust, also

He also thanked a number of firms and organisations which had donated much material and made available considerable manpower to aid the cause.

After the ceremony, the official guests were shown over the building. All said how impressed they were with the work that had been performed.

Afternoon tea was served.

### Our Untidy Streets

Any civic-minded and house-proud person must have been sadly disappointed at the disreputable state of our main road last Monday morning.

Recently the Mayor asked for civic pride. But Council must show ITS concern! The blame should not be borne by the residents only.

Overseas, Council employees are neatly dressed in white trousers and a jacket, and push a rubbish trolley to keep the streets clean.

This sort of example of a uniformed cleaner is a forceful visual lesson in resident education.

Mr Mayor — how long is it since you walked through this suburb?

We recently published a photograph of portion of the main shopping centre showing footpaths and gutters littered with rubbish.

Still the position is unchanged.

The present rubbish tins are not nearly plentiful enough, and in some places where posts indicate the positions allotted to them the tins have been absent for months.

And they are hopeless little receptacle that hold practically nothing.

May we suggest the provision of many more containers, and of a practical size—say 18 inches square and 3 feet high?

And place them where people alight from the buses, not 25 feet away. Life is strenuous enough without people being expected to walk 25 feet to deposit their bus ticket.

When residents have to pay so much in Council rates, surely it is not asking too much that the streets be kept clean?

There is little doubt that better supervision is needed. Let us allow the streets to deteriorate.

The players instrumental for the sudden scoring spree were Big Artie Beetson, "Chicka" Outten, Jack Spencer and Peter Boulton.

Big Artie's crashing runs and unloading of the ball from the second row were a constant menace to Norths' defence, which had to wilt under the pressure.

# HOSPITAL DESIRES MORE TRAINEE NURSES AND AIDES

Like most hospitals these days, Balmain is seeking to arouse young women's interest in making nursing a profession. This institution points to the important position it occupies as a training school for general and midwifery nursing and as a venue for the enrolment of nursing aides.

The matron, Miss J. MacLaren, points out that all hospitals are at the moment experiencing some difficulty in securing trainee nurses.

This has been brought about by the introduction of the three-year training period, compared with the four-year training formerly in operation.

As a result, some of the practical work formerly done by trainees—such as dressings and treatment of patients in the wards—is now being done by trained nurses.

The trained nurses, incidentally, are finding this more satisfying than the clerical work formerly included in their duties.

## Successful

Matron told "The Link" that the hospital was anxious to enrol more trainee nurses, as well as more nursing aides.

She said that girls who enrolled at Balmain Hospital were receiving excellent training.

"Our hospital is a successful training school for general and

midwifery nursing, and a satisfying place for the enrolment of nursing aides," she said.

"Nursing is a rewarding and interesting career for intelligent, well-adjusted young ladies with a sense of service.

"The hospital offers free professional training, security of employment, and superannuation benefits on retirement.

"The minimum age for general nursing aids (the latter perform the more practical duties) is 17 years, and for midwifery nursing 19.

"For trainees there are educational requirements, the minimum being the School Certificate with a pass in English and Mathematics, or an Educational Certificate approved by the N.S.W. Nurses' Registration Board.

"For nursing aides, however, no educational requirements are stipulated".

The matron added that uniforms were provided and laundered without cost. Recreation leave was six weeks per annum, and the

hours of work were 40 per week.

Balmain Hospital has an excellent, well-equipped training school, and provides excellent training in medical and surgical nursing, operating theatre procedure, casualty department duties, and intensive care and maternity nursing.

## Conditions

The period of training is three years for the general nursing course, 16 months for a psychiatric trained nurse, and one year for the midwifery course if the trainee is already a general trained nurse.

For nursing aide enrolment the period of training is one year.

Recreational facilities available to staff include a swimming pool, tennis, and an excellent reference library.

A brochure issued by the hospital authorities outlines all these points, and concludes:

"On completing the appropriate course the nurse is a unique person, blending practical experience with theoretical knowledge—a person with a sense of purpose, faith in oneself, and the ability to inspire others to work for a common goal".

## COURSE FOR AGENTS

West Sydney Technical College will conduct this year a course of instruction to persons desirous of obtaining a licence under the Auctioneers' Stock and Station, Real Estate and Business Agents' Act.

This will be held on two evenings per week (Tuesday and Friday) for 18 weeks, the course fee being \$18.

The course will be available at the College in Crystal Street, Petersham (phone 56-8351), and enrolments will be taken on June 29 and 30 (during the day) and July 1-2 (afternoon).

## Trees In The Streets

## YOUR OPINIONS

In the past few weeks the subject of street tree planting has aroused considerable interest in Balmain.

As a background to this, Leichhardt Council has been considering more adequate legislation to cover landscaping requirements for medium and high density home units developments.

Such action would indeed be commendable and bring the Council into line with some of the more progressive Sydney municipalities.

We have all looked with disgust at the now too-familiar concrete "steppes" of car parking

associated with such developments.

The past few weeks have also seen work beginning on the new park at Peacock Point — a park which will be a valuable asset to the people of Balmain.

Should we now be thinking in much broader terms — thinking how these developments relate to one another and their significance in the total environment?

It is not enough to expect a developer to provide a few square feet of so-called "landscape" if this does not relate to a proposed street tree planting scheme and does not take into ac-

count the special urban character of the area.

It is not enough to have a wonderful new park at Peacock Point if many of our existing parks are languishing without any realistic programme of replanting which will give us parks in 50 years' time.

It is not enough to begin a tree planting programme on a piecemeal basis if this will give us only unrelated pockets of green. The strong unifying possibilities of urban landscape must be fully exploited.

When we look at the beautiful tree-lined and canopied streets of King's Cross and parts of Surry Hills, we appreciate the work of a foresighted generation of people.

The procedure of "green" masterplanning is not a new one, and is a logical extension to a well formulated town plan.

We should look towards our Council planners and their advisers to define their policies—giving us a comprehensive plan which every householder and civic body can contribute to and augment.

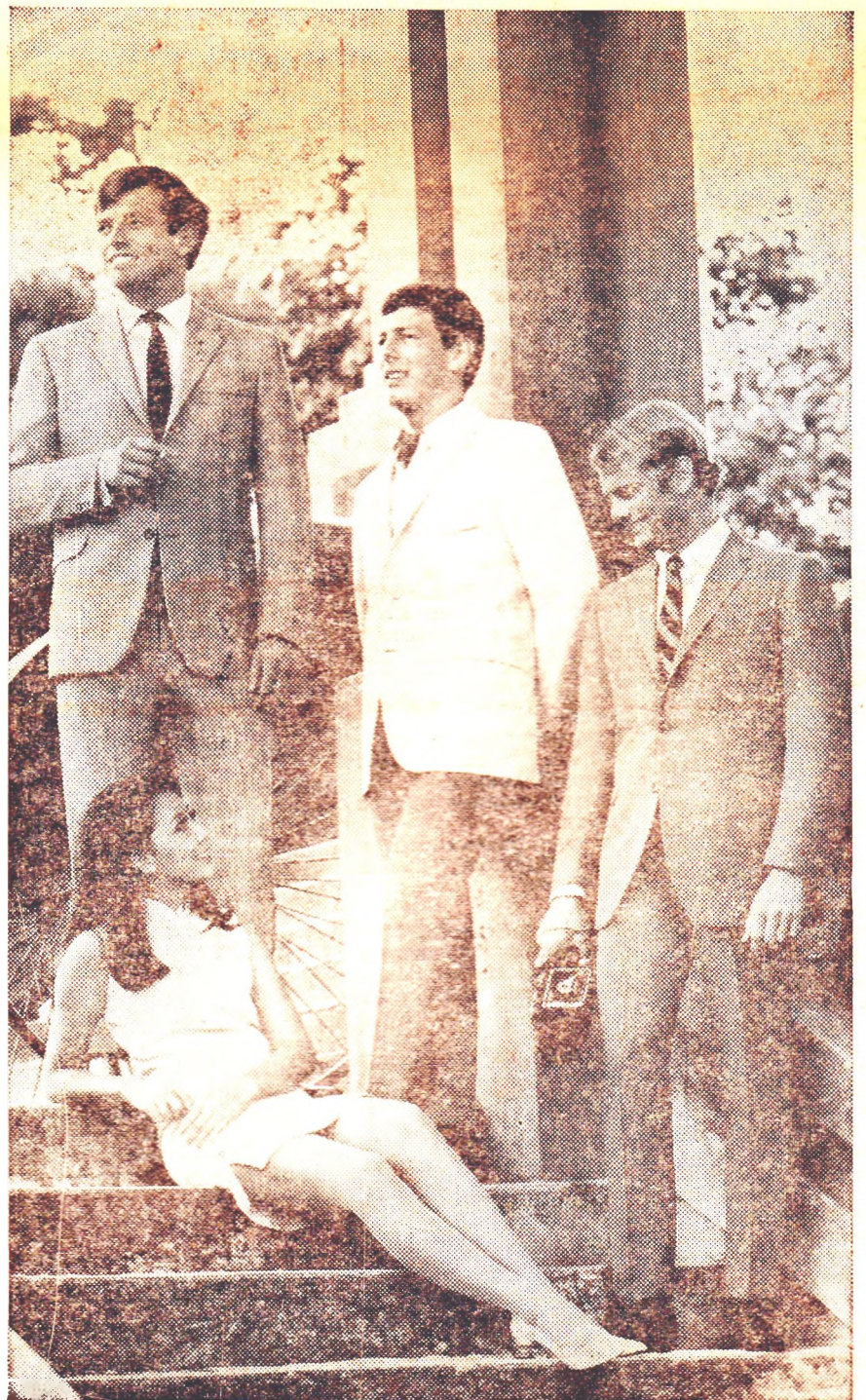
