# Council Will Explain Its Ban On Plastic Bags

In an attempt to overtake its inadequate public relations approach to the use of plastic garbage bags, Leichhardt Council last week decided at its meeting last week to make a press announcement explaining the reasons for its ban on use of the bags.

The advice to residents of the municipality forbidding use of plastic bags was in the form of one paragraph at the foot of a card placed in residents' letter boxes last October.

Last week's Council meeting had before it a report from the Council's Health Surveyor.

R. S. Williams, extending on the reasons published in "The Link" fortnight ago why use of the bags was not considered desirable.

In brief, these were:

- The system of using water spray for collection of garbage in the Council's vehicles was not suitable where plastic bags were used.
- Garbage in the bags could be attacked by animals and rats when it is in the streets.
- They gave no protection to garbage collectors if they contained broken glass.
- They were dangerous to children in regard to suffocation if placed on their heads.
- When placed with other garbage the bags did not rot.

Mr Williams quoted Council the terms of Ordinance 51 of the Local Government Act, which gave Councils authority to accept or reject any type of receptacle for handling garbage.

Mr Williams said the aim of the bag manufacturers that it was approved under the Ordinance

was misleading, since the Ordinance said that plastic or paper bags might be used in lieu of pans "If the Council so approves".

### Survey

A quick survey of other metropolitan Councils showed that a number had not approved of plastic bags.

These included Marrickville, Woolahra, Fairfield, Hunter's Hill, Sutherland and the City of Sydney.

Hornsby and Ashfield would remove the bags if they were placed in the standard garbage pan.

Ald. I. Wyner (Balmain ward) pointed out that the card issued to householders advising that use of the bags was not permitted was not much good and many people would not have bothered to read the final paragraph in which

the ban was announced.

He commended Mr Williams on his report.

Ald. Wyner moved that there should be a public announcement in all the local papers advising the public that the use of the plastic bags for garbage removal was banned.

Council also should issue a statement refuting the "misleading information" attached to the bags when purchased that their use was approved under Ordinance 51 of the Local Government Act.

Speaking to the motion, the Mayor, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, also commended the Health Surveyor on his report, and said that people should be made more aware of the problems associated with use of the plastic bags.

The motion was carried without further discussion.

## Council Acts On Critical Report

Following criticism by its auditor of several aspects of its accounting methods, Leichhardt Council last week took action to increase its "Working Capital" and to set up special funds for staff long service and sick leave.

Before Council for its consideration was the auditor's report, which went beyond the more or less formal document it usually represents.

His report pointed out that the "Available funds" of Council had dropped by \$152,137 between December 31, 1965, and December 31, 1969.

At the end of 1969 the available funds surplus stood at \$20,601.

He considered that this surplus should be in the vicinity of \$150,000 to \$200,000, and that provision for this should be made in the estimates.

The auditor also said that the Council had no reserve fund for long service and sick leave. Council should set aside a special amount for each of these items each year.

This had never been done, and he recommended that something be done about it.

Under the present arrangement 1.5 weeks per annum per man was accruing for long service leave, and this amount should be charged against the revenue for the year in which it accrued.

Another point he made was that to ensure efficiency and proper control it was important that only approved systems be followed by staff (especially relieving staff).

He suggested that a "Manual of Procedures" be compiled to cover all facets of Council's operations.

In moving that the report be received Ald. Newton remarked that there should be funds as recommended by the auditor—to make up the leeway of accumulated funds and to provide for long service and sick leave, and that there should be a Manual of Procedures compiled.

Ald. I. Wyner (Balmain ward) moved an amendment that Council noted and was concerned at the auditor's opinion regarding the deficits in available funds over the past four years and the lack of reserve funds for long service and sick leave.

In view of this, said Ald. Wyner's motion, Council should call on the Town Clerk to prepare a report explaining

## Column NINE

### Weak Public Relations

Why was the work of advising residents of the municipality of the Council's ban on the use of plastic bags done in such a weak manner?

It was quite an important matter for many residents, and deserved far greater accent than it received.

Why, for instance, was the local Press not informed? Surely this is a way of scotching possible public criticism?

The reasons for the ban will no doubt appear sound to most people, although some may be disappointed, but why not make them known to the public from the start?

We now learn that there is wholesale complaint, and considerable disregard of the ban, wittingly or unwittingly.

Does the failure to inform the Press stem back to that absurd motion on the Council's books that its officers are not permitted to make statements to the Press?

Lack of liaison between the Press and the Council's senior officers is probably unique in this State.

It is a denial of the public's right to full knowledge of the Council's activities, and is an exceedingly unwise stand from the aspect of the Council's public image.

The present Mayor, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, has to some extent helped, when available, by discussing Council's policy, but even he failed to mention the plastic bags matter.

The system is utterly bad. Before and after last election we were promised better public relations, with the appointment of a special officer.

Like other promises by this Council, it has not been honoured. It should be—and that forthwith.

Continued from page 1 why these customary procedures had not been adopted.

The Mayor, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, said that Ald. Newton's motion included some of these matters.

Ald. Wyner took the point that Ald. Newton's motion had stated that he had spoken to the Town Clerk about these things. That was not sufficient. The Town Clerk should have put it on paper and given "A proper run-down on the whole set-up".

His amendment was defeated.

Council carried a motion that the auditor's report be received and noted, and that Council set up a fund for long service and sick leave; that it set aside \$40,000 a year for four years to bring up the available funds surplus; and that a Manual of Procedures be compiled.

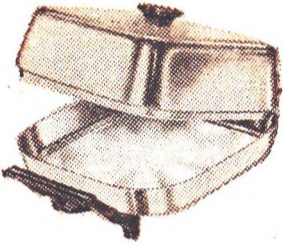

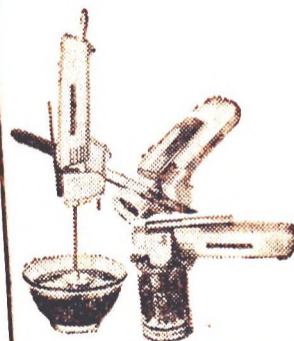

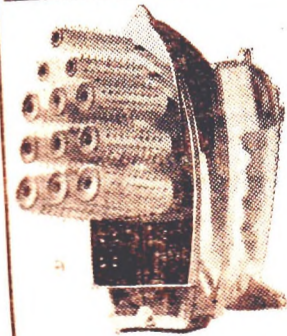
